Springfield rifle took aim with \$800 at Pace & Hong

ALPENA, Mich. — Considered a "sportsman's" auction, 352 consignments ranging from hunting and fishing items to timepieces, keys, and trains were auctioned online by Pace & Hong Auctions.

Taking the auction's highest bid was a Civil War Springfield model 1861 Musket Rifle. This was a Minié-type shoulder arm used by the U.S. Army and Marine Corps during the American Civil War. Commonly known as the "Springfield" (after its place of manufacture, Springfield, Mass.), it became the most widely-used U.S. Army weapon during the Civil War. The piece took \$800 right out of the gate. On its heels was a Colt 36-caliber black powder Navy Arms revolver that went to \$400 with 113 bids. One of several long-guns was a Wards Western 12-gauge pump Shotgun that sold for \$170

Strong bidding continued into the clock category starting with a statue clock from the Classic Clock Company. Even in non-working condition, 16 bidders took the piece to \$130. Three different antique Seth Thomas shelf clocks, in various condition, went for \$110 each. A vintage advertising clock for GE Flash Bulbs, working and with a new movement, reached \$100. Another \$100

picked up a Flying Scotsman commemorative train cuckoo clock from The Bradford Exchange that featured a train that moves around a track and makes authentic sound and a stationmaster who sounds on the hour.

The railroad clock preluded a good collection of model train and railroad items. An antique coal oil-burning Game Jr. railroad stove, used to heat fare like coffee or soup in a train's engine or caboose, sold for \$110 with seven bids. A collec-

Wurlitzer jukeboxes make sweet music for collectors

Jukeboxes, especially during their heyday years (1938– 1948) were designed to soothe the eyes as well as the soul. In fact, today's collectors primarily seek out the most beautiful old jukeboxes that depict the charm and romance of the 1930s and '40s.

While jukeboxes have been continuously made since the 1920s, it is the 10-year period, from 1938 until 1948, that attracts collectors. Collectors pay top dollar for jukeboxes made during these years, especially boxes manufactured by the Wurlitzer Company.

There were 13 Wurlitzer jukeboxes manufactured during this era, all with 24-record capacity. Paul Fuller, a Swiss master designer, designed 11 of these Wurlitzer jukeboxes, beginning with the 1938 model. Fuller's Wurlitzer model 950 is one of the rarest Wurlitzers since it was the 1942 model and most raw materials were earmarked for war usage. Wurlitzer manufactured only 3,497 model 950s, of which fewer than 200 are known to still exist. The 950s are also prized for their beautiful decorations — illustrations of the Greek god Pan playing his pipe. The model 950 truly embodies all of the romance of a Wurlitzer jukebox. The



tion of four Lionel "O" gauge steam engines (two #681s, #1668, and #244E) got picked up for just \$160. And, a set of eight mostly metal-bodied Lionel cars (milk car, Rock Island #16500 caboose, gondola car #657, Lionel "O" gauge engine, Lionel flatcar, automatic dump Car #3459, and a Bucyrus Erie Railroad crane) went for another bargain at \$60.

Beyond model trains, toy fans had items like a classic vintage Mr. Potato Head funny face kit - the early kind that used actual potatoes that was snagged for \$28. Also grabbed for \$28 was a 1964 Danmark Passport good luck pirate troll bank, sans his shirt. For the retro video gamer, it was an original Nintendo NES in

working condition (\$130), with two original controllers, duck hunt gun controller, Super Mario 4, Duck Hunt, and Jeopardy game cartridges.

Beyond virtual duck hunting on the Nintendo, hunters and anglers had plenty to keep their attention, including multiple lots of waterfowl decoys. A set of three vintage wooden duck decoys no era cited and in rough shape - sold for \$30. A dozen goose decoys paired with an Avery carry bag sold for \$45, while a set of 13 duck decoys with a Flambeau-Higdon Rig 'em Right waterfowl storage bag scored \$28.

The auction had several standout items. Sportsmen undoubtedly ogled the 1998 Suzuki 4 WD Quadrunner; it sold for \$620. Antiquers had an 11-inch brass Asian opium pipe with fruit

pipe would be an unusual item at any auction. It sold for \$30.

etching and Asian engraving that went for \$30. The most curious piece was probably the antique Hamilton M a n u f a c t u r i n g Company wood garbage box - yes, a trash can which picked up \$24!

Virtual convention huge success for Quad-A

The clouds of COVID-19 threatened to stop people from attending the Antique Advertising Association of America in early July. However, the members of the organization were not to be deterred.

Working together, they found a silver lining in that cloud which easily may impact the future of such large get-togethers. Using the Zoom meeting platform, more than 100 members were able to conduct many of the activities that typically take place at AAAA conventions, including buying and selling vintage advertising, seminars, a Favorite Advertising Exhibit, informal socialization, business meeting and even raffles.

When it came to sales (room hopping), the number of participants picked up to more than 200. "Sellers sold a ton of stuff," said Paul Lefkovitz,

who conceptualized and planned the virtual convention. "Room hopping is one of the most important events of our convention. Buying, selling and trading is what we do best.'

The buying and selling activity was conducted through the AAAA website, which members and the public can access. True to form, the buying and selling site had a virtual site complete with sellers' names on the "hotel" room doors.

Lefkovitz was totally unfamiliar with Zoom when the decision was made to hold a virtual convention. But working with other members and consulting available online resources, he was able to bring the convention to a successful close. Participating members were so fired up at the convention, they are now planning a "Winter Virtual Retreat" on Jan. 23.

"Enthusiastic attendees reported they had


great fun, learned a lot and delighted in seeing wonderful examples of antique advertising," Lefkovitz said.

"On the second day of the convention, the large group was broken out into seven smaller groups for nearly an hour ... All groups were observed to be quite active. Participants reported they had a great time meeting new people and re-connecting with old friends."

The virtual convention is new, cutting-edge technology which offers a myriad of options. The concept of adding capabilities such as conducting raffles, seminars, business meeting, with "break out" social times sprinkled among the event, and access to easy buying and selling may be a glimpse of the future.



What glassware comes in an opaque, bright white or pink, blue, green or brown and dates back to the 16th Century? Surprisingly, it is the ever-popular milk glass.


This wonderful glassware offers collectors so much including fun, functionality, color, designs, affordability and accessibility. It's fun for collectors because of the wide variety of shapes and sizes, designs and the color, especially the bright white pieces. It is fairly easy for collectors to find milk glass plates, vases, pitchers, cake plates, platters, cups, bowls, butter dishes and the list goes on.

Because of the beauty and the affordable price of most milk glass items, collectors can use them for parties, family gatherings and everyday gatherings.

Milk glass is known for its milky white color. The intention was to make it look like porcelain and china while making it affordable for the average household. Milk glass has a long history dating back to the 1500s. While collectors can certainly find this early milk glass, much of what is found on Collectors will delight in the pieces that have a pattern that simulates lace around the edges.

According to dustyoldthing.com, "When it came to milk glass, the French were the trendsetters, ushering it into its golden era and inspiring American

the market today is from the 20^{th} century. Milk glass was popular during the Depression years as well as in the 1960s.

While white is the color that got milk glass started, it can be found in other milky colors such as green or the popular blue color. It can also be found in pink, yellow and amethyst.

The many shapes or designs include glasses, dishes, jars, perfume bottles, figurines, match holders and much more. Animal shapes include barnyard animals such as cows and roosters. Some milk glass is hand painted and some pieces are hobnail with a pattern of small glass bumps.

Wurlitzer models 850 of 1941 are also rare, as are the model 1015 produced in 1946. Collectors value the model 1015 for its beautiful rococo design as well as its rarity.

The World War II Wurlitzer Victory model was built on chassis and mechanisms from leftover parts of other models. Wurlitzer simply concealed the older parts under a new. highly decorated case. Two additional Wurlitzer models that are considered rare and collectible are the model 1080, which was garishly designed and sold only a few, and the model 1100 of 1948, the last Wurlitzer designed by Paul Fuller, the last jukebox to play 24 of the oldstyle 78 rpm records, and the jukebox that effectively ended the golden era of jukeboxes.

the huge One of differences between Wurlitzer jukeboxes and other companies' products is the viewing window found in

Wurlitzers. Wurlitzer jukeboxes all have viewing windows that allow you to see the records revolving and the changer mechanism working. This visual delight, along with flashing lights and Fuller's designs make Wurlitzer the crème-de-lecrème of jukebox collecting.

Like all old, mechanical devices, the golden-era jukeboxes often need restored when found. And all restoration for jukeboxes pose problems since the original manufacturer will not have parts for these antique machines, and finding spare parts is often harder than simply locating machine. another Cannibalizing one Wurlitzer to repair another is an option, but where are you going to find two of them so that you can cannibalize one?

Before purchasing a jukebox, plug it in to a wall socket and test the recordchanging mechanism and the selection buttons. These two mechanisms are the hardest part of a jukebox to repair and often, if broken, are considered un-repairable. If these mechanisms work, but the jukebox needs rewired or other mechanisms don't work, that's okay. All

wiring can be replaced and most other things, besides the selection buttons and record-changing mechanism, can be repaired.

Most jukebox collectors also collect the company brochures and advertising promotions that jukebox manufactures used to promote their products. Jukebox advertisements, for all models, can still be found in the magazines of the day. Also, companies such as Wurlitzer provided cafes

and bars with all sorts of promotional materials, such as drinking and eating accessories, swizzle sticks, and menus. If you can't find the Wurlitzer jukebox you dream of owning, you may still find a pot of gold at the end of the jukebox promotional rainbow.



glassmakers to follow suit. Today, French milk glass is particularly valuable."

A short list of manufacturers of milk glass includes Anchor Hocking, Gillinder & Sons, Imperial Glass Company, Westmorland, New England Glass Company, Fosteria Glass Company, Fenton, L.E. Smith Glass Company, Mosser Glass and Thai Soojung Glass Company Limited, among others.

Most pieces found today were made by Westmoreland (started making milk glass in the 1920s) and Fenton (started making milk glass in the 1940s).

There are some fakes out there and it can be difficult to determine if a piece is authentic milk glass. Experts recommend holding a piece up to the sunlight to find an iridescent color along the edges known as the "ring of fire" which can help determine an older ver-

sus a newer made piece. Maker's marks can be found on many pieces. The maker mark can also help determine the age of a piece.

If you really need to know the authenticity and price for a piece or a collection before purchasing, it's best to consult an expert appraiser.

There are many books and articles available that provide great details about the production of milk glass. One such source is The National Milk Glass Collectors Society (nmgcs.org). It's an online reference where new collectors can go to for articles, photos and much more.

NMGCS and other references offer many tips for new collectors. The tip list that follows is a good starting point to adhere to before buying that first piece. Most collectors buy pieces because they like them and not necessarily for the future value. Getting a few tips like the ones that follow can prevent you from paying too much for a piece.

Buy the best pieces

you can afford. It is often best to buy one really good piece versus several not so good pieces. It is always a good idea to research the piece before buying it.

Be careful using price guides for buying or selling items. Some experienced collectors recommend using reference books that give you the history, maker, rarity and other details that price guides may not offer. The best price guides you can find is generally your own personal interest and your own bank account. Those are the two best price guides to use to determine if a price is right on a piece for you.

NMGCS offers this tip their website: on "Beginners should be aware of 'marriages' where a cover made by one manufacturer and a base by another are joined in a union that was never meant to be. One should be aware, however, of the difference between a marriage of convenience made accidentally (or intentionally) through the years as opposed to factory originated correct combinations which might seem wrong only because they are rare variants."

Buying "as is" pieces is often a choice of some collectors because these pieces are generally sold at lower costs. Some collectors only buy as is if it is a rare, hard to find piece. On the flip side, many collectors only want the pristine condition pieces. It is really a personal choice for what kind of pieces to build your collection.

To keep or not to keep is the question when it comes to buying pieces with parts of the paint missing. Once again, it comes down to personal choice. Be aware that paint doesn't necessarily determine the age of the piece.

The website. dustyoldthing.com offers this about this wonderful glassware, "Milk glass is (quite literally) a centerpiece of American history, and today collectors gush over rare one-of-akind pieces that highlight nation's the past. Prominent figures often had milk glass produced in their honor, whether it

was the bust on a casserole dish or a relief on a serving platter. If you're a history buff, keep your eye out for plates featuring a border of 13 stars and George Washington's likeness. Also of great fascination are the milk glass plates that launched the 1908 presidential campaigns of William Howard Taft and William Jennings Bryan. There's even a rare platter featuring a Lincoln relief so ornate it's speculated that the piece was part of dinner service at a commemorative event."

The price of milk glass varies greatly depending on factors such as age, condition, and design of the piece. Other considerations when identifying and estimating the value of milk glass include:

• The pattern on the piece: Notable 19th century milk glass patterns include Arches, Block, Fan, Ribbed Grape, Holly and Button. These patterns are especially valuable.

• Age: While it is rare to find milk glass that dates back earlier than 1850, most any piece in good condition from the 19th century is of value. Milk glass items produced during World War II are highly sought after.

· Designs or Shapes: The design or shape can help determine the age. For example, there are certain shapes or designs from certain eras that hold higher values such as figurines, candy dishes, and glasses, which were produced predominately during the 1880s.


· Color: While there are many colors of milk glass, there are a few that hold more value than others. As with the shapes, the color can determine the age of a piece. The 19th century milk glass is a deep white color, more opaque than 20th century counterparts. Production of colored piece of milk glass became more popular in the 20th century.


Milk glass is just a fun item to collect. The white color makes it fit in any home or in any collection. The designs of certain eras can make a piece functional and one can use it for serving at gatherings. The availability of pieces makes it an easy find and easy to get started with a collection. 




Although the "touch and feel" part of buying is absent, the costs to members (travel, meals and hotel rooms) are minimized.

There were lots of challenges," Lefkovitz said. "Rather than run a Zoom meeting, it was my objective to reconstruct our traditional convention experience as much ing and one-of-a-kind as possible onto a "virtual" online platform.

Although collectors are, by nature, very independent and adaptable, the new concept of meeting on a virtual level came with its usual fears of technology and mistrust of all things digital.

"One event I wanted to be sure to include was the "Favorite Advertising Exhibit" which is a long-established tradition in the nearly 30 years of Quad-A conventions. There are five categories in the event. Photos of 47 entries were presented to the participants in the meeting. After each item was viewed twice, virtual convention-goers voted on their favorites.

Seminars were deftly presented. Advanced collectors Remey Rubin and David Briggs presented a virtual tour of their



Briggs collection of Victorian-era posters, Lefkovitz said: "Enthusiasts of early lithography were over the moon as they viewed breathtakexamples of truly stun-

ning early posters." This tour was accompanied thoroughly by a researched, docent-style presentation of the detailed history and significance of each piece they featured, according to Lefkovitz.

Longtime antiques restorer Chuck Kovacic shared his expertise in the seminar "Damaged Goods, Restored Values," demonstrating the steps in the restoration of antique advertising. In addition to "before and after" examples of his art, he also conducted a PowerPoint presentation, in addition to sharing simple tools and techniques that can be attempted by non-experts.

As noted, Quad-A members were so smitten by the virtual Convention that, during their business meeting,

"I was very gratified that so many of our members overcame their apprehensions to participate as attendees, buyers, sellers and presenters," Lefkovitz says.


