Springfield Antique Show shines 1 year after lockdown

SPRINGFIELD, Ohio - The weekend of March 19-21 was somewhat of a landmark date in Ohio, as it represented nearly one year to the day when the state shut down for COVID.

like all large show promoterally spring weather Collectibles from Athens, helped attract attendees. Saturday morning opened at the Clark County Fairgrounds to 48-degree temperatures and a virtually cloudless sky. By noon, temperatures had hit 60-degrees and jackets came off. The hundreds of shoppers were obviously enjoying the fresh air and sunshine, while the outdoor vendors were benefitting from the traffic. Everyone seemed upbeat, and to be cliché, the air was figuratively and literally, full of excitement.

While it was a smaller show, outdoor booths were spread along three thoroughfares flanking a pair of interconnected buildings that housed the inside venues. At one of the first spots along the main pathway was Grandma's

Ohio. With no shortage of shoppers in his booth, owner Chuck reflected, "It's turned out to be a super day. The crowds really came out." Among the wares drawing attention were a pair of duck decoys for \$15 and a small collection of vintage airplane models running \$25 to \$40. In the adjacent both, Tim, also from Athens was a bit more cautious. "OK comes to mind," he stated. Yet, it was only 10 a.m. and with alluring prices like \$14 for a 20-inch



Peter Cottontail still hopping down the bunny trail

Peter Cottontail is best known for his 1971 Easter television special Here Comes Peter Cottontail. The television special was based on Priscilla and Otto Friedrich's 1957 novel The Easter Bunny that Overslept.


Even before this popular television special, Peter Cottontail was famous. In 1950, Peter Cottontail enchanted Baby Boomer kids when popular western movie star and "Singing Cowboy" Gene Autry recorded the holiday classic song "Here Comes Peter Cottontail," which peaked at number 3 on the U.S. Billboard Hot Country Singles

The song Here Comes Peter Cottontail is still used, especially for television advertisements around Easter, and is one of the most popular secular Easter songs ever composed. The song had a catchy jingle -Here comes Peter Cottontail/Hoppin' down the bunny trail/Hippity hoppin', Easter's on its way—that all Baby Boomer children knew, and it informally gave the Easter Bunny a name—Peter Cottontail.

The full popularity of Peter Cottontail dates to 1910 when Thornton Burgess, an author from Springfield, Mass., published his Old Mother West Wind series of stories, which included a rabbit named Peter Rabbit. In 1914, Burgess published one of his best-known stories

The Adventures of Peter Cottontail. In this now famous story, Peter Rabbit, unhappy with his plain sounding name, changed his name to Peter Cottontail.

Silver Mill Brand Frozen Food can and just \$4 each for 70s-era Playboy tankards, his sentiments likely picked up as the day went on.

Four booths away, the owners of North American Resale from Dayton, Ohio, were selling merchandise as fast as they could put it out. Center-stage was a complete mid-century modern blonde wood living room set anchored by a boomerang coffee table, all priced for \$785. Out in front, a 40-inch lighted and working Dippitydoo's ice cream shop sign sat ready for a buyer with \$525 and a big chunk of wall space.

Across the aisle was Melanie who drove three hours from Temperance, Mich., to set up at the show. The Springfield "regular" complimented the show's attendance, saying, "There is a tremendous flow of customers, way better than I expected." She quickly added, "The cool morning temperatures haven't slowed things down a bit." Her merchandise was eclectic and the pricing very reasonable, like the pair of 1950s patriotic coin bank dolls for \$38 and a 70s-era globe upon a weather station base for \$39.95.

Along the east side of the building sat about a dozen dealers, including one who outfitted his booth to attract springtime buyers. Staged together front-andcenter was an early 20th-century double washtub for \$195, a "flower bed" made from a doll's bed filled with artificial flowers, and a perfect accompaniment to it all - a large vintage wicker basket filled dozens of seed packets priced five for \$1.

Antique tool vendors are a common sight at Springfield shows, many of whom offer tools exclusively. This time, tool sellers were conspicuously packed with buyers, enough so that it was often difficult to get near the tables. One of them, a vendor on the west side of the building, was stocked with all manner of antique block planes, both wood and metal framed. Pricing of \$65 to \$75 was typical.

As shoppers browsed, regular announcements were made regarding social distancing and required masking. Perhaps it was because vaccinations had reached the age 40 group in Ohio, but only about a half of all attendees (and vendors) were masked. Outdoors, that didn't seem much of an issue; inside, things were more disconcerting as it was often close quarters and uncomfortably crowded, making distancing difficult. ther affirmed how happy people were to attend the show.

One of the dealers inside, a 26-year veteran of the show, Fred from Columbus noted, "The crowd is great. It feels like Extravaganza." His booth, like so many, was filled mainly with smalls, including diecast cars, glassware, and assorted advertising pieces. Not far away was Brenna from Springfield. She and her family had sold at the show for about 15-years. "The attendance seems back up to pre-Covid," she stated, adding, "There are lots of buyers and plenty just shopping." Her booth was filled with toys, games, and other smalls, like a box of mini Barbie dolls priced at just \$1 each.

Whether indoors or out, furniture was in somewhat short supply at this event. It appeared as if vendors were being a bit cautious, focusing on smalls that, no doubt, made it easier for them to set up and take down. One of the few sellers offering larger

pieces was Roadhouse Antiques from Springfield. Co-owner Beth said, "It's been a great weekend so far." When asked what she indicated, "It's been a little bit of everything; primitives, Victorian antiques, and Arts and



ZIP code provides clue to dating of plush Mack bulldog

I have a plush, standing Mack Truck bulldog. One cloth label reads: "DESIGNED EXCLUSIVE-LY FOR MACK TRUCKS." A second cloth label has two Big Top tent silhouettes above "Animal Fair, Inc. / Chanhassen, Minn © / 55317 / HAND WASHABLE" beside which is a text block that begins with "CONTENTS: / ALL NEW MATERIAL / SHREDDED SYNTHETIC / FOAM." The bulldog has a light brown (tan) body, a yellow crown on its head, blue eyes, nose, and mouth, and a red ribbon around its neck. I believe it is scarce. Can you tell me when it was made, what the production run was, and how much it is worth?

though I found no confirming evidence on the Internet that your stuffed Mack Bulldog was part of the 75th anniversary souvenirs Mack Truck created, the concept remains in the "realm of possibilities."

A Feb. 1, 2017, article by Richard Crawford entitled "Stuffed toys were made in

was located on 78th Street in Chanhassen in a building that now serves as the High Timber Lodge that is part of Country Inn and Suites.

Girl Scout troops and school groups raised funds by selling stuffed plush animals created exclusively for them by George Grooms. Henry the Dog, with a small storybook attached to his neck, and an assortment of furry animal friends were Animal Fair. Inc.'s top sellers.

In the 1970s, George Grooms sold Animal Fair, Inc., to Guy Shoennecker. He gradually moved the majority of production to China. China created the "skins" which were sent to an Eden Valley, Minn., plant to be stuffed. The showroom and warehouse in Chanhassen closed in the

Your plush Mack bulldog dates between the late 1960s and the mid-1970s. No manufacturer or retailer ever releases production run information. My best guess is that production ranged from the mid-hundred to low thousands. As a result, your stuffed Mack bulldog is common rather than scarce.

Determining how it was

distributed requires additional research. It may have been a giveaway to a person who visited a showroom to look at a Mack truck or purchased a new truck. Mack also sold advertising merchandise.

A search on WorthPoint. com revealed 74 listings for "Mack Truck stuffed bulldog." The majority sold through on eBay between \$15 and \$30. I did not find an image that exactly matched your bulldog in this search. Using "Animal Fair Mack bulldog" as a search string, I found a 1971 Animal Fair Mack bulldog. It was not a match to your plush Mack bulldog.

The fact that I was unable to find an exact match does not discount the fact that your plush Mack bulldog is common. It has a secondary market value between \$20

Q I recently purchased a codfish weathervane for \$170 from the estate sale of a New England antiques dealer. The seller told me the codfish weathervane dates from 1900. The weathervane appears to be made from copper and painted over (rather roughly) with serval coats of gold paint. The previous owner added a heavy, more modern iron display and I have no intention of selling it. I would appreciate your thoughts on its authenticity, age, and approximate value.

Let's begin with a question you did not ask: "Did the seller lie about the age?" The answer is yes. Your weathervane is a 1960s decorator reproduction. It was made from molded copper. I found several unpainted and painted examples when I searched WorthPoint.com.

It is common for sellers to paint and otherwise falsely age reproductions (exact copies) and copycats (stylistic copies) to allow them to suggest (a polite term on my part) an older date of origin. My guess is that the only place this weathervane ever appeared was in an owner's den or living room

I wish more of my readers would tell me what they paid for something when sending me a question. Knowing the sale price allows for a high degree of interpretation. First, the sale price should have set off an alarm bell. An almost 125-years old period weathervane, especially one that exhibits outdoor use, does not sell for \$175. The asking price was a clear indication the seller knew the piece was much


Second, WorthPoint.com has multiple listings for idenPrices range from \$100 to \$150. One of the criteria of a "fair price" is a willing buyer and willing seller. You were a willing buyer and the seller was willing to sell to you. Since there are no fixed prices for antiques and collectibles, the \$170 you paid was "fair" at that moment in time. You paid slightly over the secondary market retail. Since you bought the codfish weathervane for display purposes and have no intention of selling it, my suggestion is to forget what you paid and simply enjoy the piece.

I have a souvenir booklet entitled "AMERICAN POLISH PAR-TICIPATION / NEW YORK WORLD'S FAIR 1939." It is over 100 pages in length. The colored cover shows one of the fair buildings and features the American and Polish flags. What is it worth?

struction. Its 70,000 square feet included space for 11,000 exhibits. The Polish Pavilion opened on May 3, 1949, and marked the 148th anniversary of Poland's first constitution.

The Court of Honor featured documents that stressed Poland's democratic traditions. Another section called attention to Poland's contributions to the settling of the United States. The building's Hall of Science featured more than 200 Polish inventions and also stressed its maritime

development. A bar, café, and deluxe restaurant were in a separate building.

The site also contained a bronze statue replica of King Ladislaus II Jagiello by Stanislaw K. Ostrowski, a sculptor, housed on a pedestal at the pavilion's entrance. The Polish government in exile presented the statue to the City of New York in 1945. It is now located in New York's Central Park. The Polish pavilion's murals are currently housed at Le Mayne College in Syracuse. New York.

On Sept. 1, 1939, Germany invaded Poland. A day later over 10.000 members of the Polish National Alliance gathered at the Polish Pavilion to express their support for a free and independent Poland. The Polish government in exile kept the Polish Pavilion open for the 1940 season. When the New World's Fair ended in autumn 1940, the Polish government in exile sent most of the artifacts to Chicago for storage in the Polish Museum of America. The pavilion itself

O old high school, college, law school, and nursing school diplomas and baptismal certificates dated from the mid- to early 20th century have any value?

With the exception of A family value, which is not a monetary value, the answer is basically no.

The possible exceptions are: (1) diplomas and baptismal certificates that belong to a person of national importance [valuable because of the name connection] or a major resident of a local community [possible value to a local historical society who will want them as a donation as opposed to buying theml, (2) have a large vignette of an actual building associated with the institution issuing the diploma [of minor value to a local collector, a few bucks each at mostl, and (3) printed by a collectible lithograph company such as the American Banknote Company [a long shot at bestl.

Offer them first to the family. If no takers, try the local historical society. If this fails, contact the librarian at each of the institutions [another longshot]. If these three avenues fail, consider the landfill.

> Burgess's use of the name Peter Rabbit for his furry protagonist has often confused both children and adults since eight years before Burgess named his character Peter Rabbit, Beatrix Potter, a British children's author, published, in October 1902, The Tale of Peter Rabbit, which featured a bunny rabbit named Peter Rabbit and was an overnight success. In fact, as early as

> > when Thornton Burbegan making up bedtime stories for his four-yearold son, the boy already familiar with Potter's Peter and loved the rabbit and its name. The boy insisted his father use the name Peter Rabbit in his stories, so Burgess "line borrowed" the name. He took line borrowing to a whole new level when he borrowed two from Potter—Cottontail and Peter, combining them into Peter Cot-

At the time Burgess borthese





names, the laws surrounding character identity theft were vague and lenient, so Burgess benefitted greatly from Beatrix Potter's literary success.

Today, Peter Cottontail is still the unofficial name of the Easter Bunny, and nearly all Peter Rabbit collectibles, and there are many of them, are based on Burgess's Peter Rabbit (AKA Peter Cottontail).

In 2002, Diamond Select decided to produce action figures based on the television special Here Comes Peter Cottontail. These action figures were limited to special markets (such as comic bookstores) in 2002, but in 2003 they were mass marketed and available everywhere toys were sold. Peter Cottontail and other action figures originally sold for \$7.99.

Peter Cottontail's action figure is 5 ½ inches tall and has an articulated neck, shoulders, and thighs, allowing children to pose him in various ways. Peter's ears were made of a softer plastic, so they retain a floppiness. This action figure comes complete with a basket full of Easter eggs and Antione the Caterpillar.

Three additional action figures from Here Comes Peter Cottontail are Donna, Peter's girlfriend, Irontail, Peter's nemesis and a "bad" rabbit, and Seymour Sassafras, who helps Peter give his eggs away.

There are many other Peter Cottontail collectables. Mattel Inc. released a metal wind-up Peter Cottontail in 1953 that can still be found in secondary markets for about \$30. And nearly every rabbit music box ever made plays the song "Here Comes Peter Cottontail," Above: Peter Cottontail toy figurine, circa







DORR, Mich. Vander Kolk Auctions & Appraisals recently held an online auction with over 350 lots of merchandise. There were some stand-out unusual items at this auctions that you just don't see every day.

A cranberry scoop brought a bid of \$29. This unique piece would also make a great conversation piece in your vintage farmhouse. A vintage rope twister may have caught your attention at the Vander Kolk Auction. This unique treasure brought a high bid of \$42. It was made to sit flat on a table and the rope was threaded through a maze of pulleys, which twisted the pieces together to make the rope Die Hard 1150 portawhich came out the other end, much stronger. These rope twisters came in many different configurations, ranging from extremely simple, to complicated to use. The one at this auction was in bad shape and would not work like it was, but some major cleaning would make it a conversation piece displayed on a porch or in a man cave.

A unique piano stool featured a very tall back. The legs ended with glass ball feet, and the dragons on the back made this a very different piece to use in your home. It could be used as bar stool seating, or displayed in a corner in your sitting room, and yes, even used for cabinet with playing the piano. It had a comfortable looking spindle back with a round piece of wood that swiveled on top of what appeared to be an ordinary dining room table seat. The final bid price on this piano stool was an impressive \$81.

David Winter cottages attracted a high amount of interest. a clue as to the origimade by John Hine, price of \$65. Media Arts Corporation and Enesco between 1980 and 2002. David Winter was the artist that supplied these conversation lifelike pieces. A combination of reality and imagination made them popular all over the world. Winter took to hiding a tiny mouse in many of his sculptures, in 1982. It was great fun to look closely and discover this tiny friend. In 1991, the mouse had disappeared and was replaced for a while with an owl. The owl was harder to find as it was often in the bushes and overgrown brush and many times got painted over in the production. When col-

lectors discovered the mouse had been replaced, they petitioned for it to come back, so it did in 1993, with the owl visibly flying away on a sculpture called "On the Riverbank". A group of 56 of these cottages made the hammer drop at the price of \$200.

Craftsmen were paying attention when a black Craftsman rolling tool chest complete with a few tools was put up for bid. It took persistence and \$150 to own this one. A Shop series RK7240.1 10-inch table saw was sold for \$101, while a Craftsman 6-inch bench grinder on a stand sold for \$73. A Central Machinery tabletop drill press with a vise brought a bid of

A matched pair of ble power booster packs brought bids of \$61 and \$52, and a Chicago Electric 90 amp wire welder sold for \$78. A Pittsburgh ¾ drive socket set sold for \$63.

If you were looking to update your kitchen display with a nice vintage piece, a general store pie safe could be had for \$123. This was a gorgeous piece in great shape that sold for a reasonable price and still retained the original wavy glass in the display doors along the front. Another general store display piece was sold. This one was a countertop display case that brought a bid of \$61.

There was a unique fronts on the drawers. It was missing three drawers and was in rough shape. 

Sticking with the vintage was a spinning wheel. It had a tag tied to it that said, "Brought from Netherlands




