Frank Dudley painting of Indiana Dunes brings \$33,000

VALPARAISO, Ind. — Each year Kraft Auction Company holds its anniversary auction over several weekends in January. The restrictions for the Pandemic meant this year's event looked a little different, but prices remained high.

A LaMat Paris Civil War Confederate revolver fired an \$11,000 bid. It was a .42 caliber and was number matching on the barrel, frame, and cylinder. This revolver had a 6.78-inch octagon barrel. It was a great example of a very early first to second transitional model Civil War Confederate LaMat revolver.

Getting a respectable amount of bang for the buck was an early Daisy Model 21 double barrel air/BB gun. it was in nice original condition with some wear from use and age. There were some fancy engravings on the receiver. It was sold as untested and sold for \$7,500. Another early Daisy double-barrel BB gun was a model number 104. This one was in nice original condition with a bit of plate loss and wear from use and age. stock did have a crack and it was untested. This didn't seem to bother the bidders as it sold for \$7,250. It would be a nice display piece with engravings on the receiver.

A DWM German Luger Carbine with wood stock was offered up. It held its own with a selling price of \$7,000. The carbine on this one was in nice condition with a blue finish and an 11 ¾-inch barrel. The Luger was marked "DWN" on the toggle and it had the original walnut grips and forearm. The serial numbers all matched except for the magazine.

A life-sized carved elephant wall mount trumpeted to \$4,250. It was believed to be carved from African Ebony wood. It was quite heavy and was an amazing piece to use to anchor any collection or space. It measured about 50 inches tall from the end of the trunk to the top of his head. Ear to ear, it measured approximately 48 inches across.

Greyhounds have been racing into collectors' hearts

On a list of the fastest land animals, the greyhound is listed as the 14^{th} fastest. A greyhound can sustain a speed of 39.35 miles per hour with a top speed of 45 miles per hour, which is faster than a mule deer. It is the speed of this breed that has made it a favorite dog among humankind for nearly 8,000 years.



The ancestors of the greyhound were some of the first domesticated dogs. They were prized for

their speed and hunting abilities. Drawings of greyhounds, or their distant relatives, have been found on temple walls dating to 6,000 BC in Turkey, and in Iran a funerary vase from 4,000 BC was decorated with images of early greyhounds.

The exact origin of greyhounds has been difficult to pin down. Experts even argue over the dog's name. Some scholars trace

the term "greyhound" to the old English "grighund," which literally translates to "dog hunting" or "hunting dog." Until greyhounds were used as racing dogs, they were exclusively bred as the fastest hunting dogs on earth. The Celts believed that greyhounds originated in Greece and called them "Greek hounds." This was then shortened to greyhound. And finally, the simplest explanation is that the original color of greyhounds was grey — hence "grey hound." All





of this tends to indicate that the greyhound can trace its beginnings to the semi-arid regions of North Africa.

In ancient Egypt, greyhounds were used in hunting and kept as companions by rich Egyptians, including pharaohs, who often had their live dogs entombed with them upon death.

Since hunting has, at least until 200 years ago, been considered one of the sports of kings, greyhounds have

If your taste went more to hanging paintings, there were some impressive ones offered for sale here. Taking the top bid with \$33,000, was one called "Winter Solitude". There were a series of these paintings, all done by Frank Dudley. This beautiful oil on canvas featured the Indiana Dunes in winter. Dudley was an Indiana artist who began hiking the Dunes in 1911 with his painting supplies in tow. He spent a large share of his life promoting the preservation of the Indiana Dunes. With industrial development spreading along the shores of Lake Michigan from Chicago, he concentrated his efforts on preserving this beautiful area. This painting was signed in the lower right corner. Other Frank Dudley paintings brought good prices. One entitled "Thru Drifted Snow" sold for \$23,000. A "Summer Rolex Landscape" sold for Daytona \$16,000. "Wind Swept Dunes Visit" sold for long to sell. The stain-\$17,000 as did "Trails

Jewelry is always a draw. Selling for \$9,500 was a platinum diamond ring. This one came with an AIG appraisal which showed retail value of \$57,990. This ring boasted of 3.01 carat round brilliant cut center diamond which had been graded 11-H and was surrounded by thirty-nine square, marquise, round, and baguette cut genuine diamonds with a total weight of 3.32 carats. The ring was size 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ and the total weight of all the jewels was 11.4 grams. A diamond necklace and bracelet set were also sold with AIG certificates. The set had a retail value of \$62,000. They were fourteen-carat yellow-gold and natural ruby with genuine diamonds. The necklace measured 17 inches and contained an impressive 36 natural rubies with a total weight of 111.7 carats. It also had 647 round, brilliant diamonds with a total weight of 9.14 carats. The bracelet was 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches and contained 12 natural rubies with a total weight of 56.14 carats and 240 round, brilliant cut diamonds with a total weight of 5.14. The selling price of this



gorgeous set was \$6,500.

Watches offered up a great selection for the bidders. A very nice Swiss Patak Philippe watch featured an 18-carat yellow gold bracelet with a lapis face. It ran great and was in nice condition. A good cleaning would be in order, but that didn't detract from the value. As a bonus, it came in the original box with the original outer box and included the instructions. It had a letter of replacement value from the Henri Stern Watch Agency Inc. for \$17,500, which was written in 1992. Final selling price on this useful piece was \$11,000.

A beautiful 2000 Cosmograph Two-Tone wristwatch didn't take less steel and 18-carat vellow gold watch was in great used condition with the original box, instructions, warranty sheet, and outer box. It sold for a bid price of \$10,500.

Badges roused up some competitive bidding. A Chicago Park District ornate gold-

badge was offered for sale. This obsolete police chief badge was in nice condition with light wear from use and age. It had the original ninback and was marked "C.H. Hanson". It bought a high bid price of \$1,400. Coming in right behind the police chief badge was a United States Army Investigations Division badge. It was showing it belonged to P.J. Callahan. The badge was in nice condition, still retaining its pinback. The selling price was \$1,300.

A 14-carat yellowgold five-pointed star badge showed it was presented to Lee B. Clayton from his deputies. The badge was in great condition with the pinback and a safety clasp. The back was engraved "To Lee B. Clayton from Deputies 1947-1950." It took \$1,200 to claim this badge.

often been associated with royalty, especially European royalty. Once, from the 11th to the 14th centuries, English law decreed that no "mean person" could keep a greyhound. In the law, "mean" meant "common" or "poor." The penalty for breaking this law was death!

In today's culture, the most widely recognized greyhound is the fictional character Santa's Little Helper from the cartoon television series The Simpsons. Santa's Little Helper exhibits many of the intellectual and behavioral characteristics of a greyhound. Miguel de Cervantes used the greyhound image for humor also when, in his novel Don Quixote, the protagonist imagines that his flea-bitten cur of a mutt is a finely bred greyhound (then again, Don Quixote thought windmills were dragons). Perhaps the longest established use of the greyhound as a cultural icon is with the Greyhound Bus Company. The company's logo is a racing greyhound, and even a talking version of it has occasionally aired on television commercials.

Greyhound fans are quick to point out that the greyhound is the only breed of dog mentioned by name in the Bible (Proverbs 30:29-31). Homer, Europe's oldest

known author, mentions Odysseus' greyhound, Argus, in The Odyssey. And Chaucer in Canterbury Tales and Shakespeare in Henry V and Merry Wives of Windsor also mention greyhounds.

Greyhounds are the prototypical sighthound, a hound that pursues its prey by sight rather than scent, which is why at races, a mechanical rabbit leads the greyhounds. The greyhounds are not racing to see who is fastest, like horses do; they are racing to literally "catch" the rabbit. The greyhound is basically hunting as it runs around the track.

In the late 20th century greyhound adoption groups began springing up all over America. The earliest groups were formed out of a sense of concern about the treatment of greyhounds while living at racing tracks. These early groups began taking greyhounds from racetracks when they could no longer run and placing the dogs in adoptive homes.

It is estimated that prior to greyhound adoptive agencies, approximately 20,000 retired racing greyhounds were killed each year. Today, about 90 percent of National Greyhound Association-registered animals are either adopted or kept for breeding purposes; however, greyhound industry numbers still estimate about 2,000 greyhounds are killed each year when they can no longer race. Anti-racing groups in the United States put the death figure at closer to 12,000 yearly.

Not all registered greyhounds race. Some of the reasons why National Association greyhounds are not raced include the dog is too slow, the dog has physical defects, or the dog does not have the required temperament to race. Most greyhounds finish their racing careers between the ages of two and five years, so they are relatively young dogs still

Because greyhound owners, especially greyhound rescuers, are so fanatic about greyhounds, they tend to collect almost anything associated with the breed. And there are many items to collect. Many porcelain figurines of greyhounds exist. Some are quite collectible items such as the ones from Staffordshire, England. There is even a Lladro greyhound piece (number 5855) that is valued at \$1,200. Many earthenware jugs feature greyhound handles or relief. Greyhounds were featured animals on many Art Deco items, including pottery and umbrella stands. And the 1920 Ford Lincoln sported a greyhound radiator ornament, which is quite striking. Other collectibles include walking sticks, old race cards, and even a Barbie Doll (Society Hound Barbie) by Mattel with a greyhound dog. And, while signs in good shape are not easy to come by (at least not inexpensively), many collectors yearn for a Greyhound Bus sign to hang center point in their collections. The striding dog on the sign epitomizes the finest features of the greyhound.

Whether you love greyhounds or simply are looking for a collection suited for a king, greyhound collectibles might interest you. You will have competition at auctions though, for greyhounds are clearly a favorite on or off the track.

One of the most historical World War II airplanes, That's All, Brother, the C-47 that led the major U.S. airborne invasion of Normandy will be launching an exciting April "barnstorming" event from its World War II vintage hangar in San Marcos, Texas to several Midwestern cities.

That's All Brother was a specially equipped cargo aircraft that led more than 800 other C-47s that dropped over 13,000 paratroopers into a battle.

On June 6, 1944, That's All Brother, equipped with an elaborate communication and radar system under the plane's fuselage successfully honed in on Operation Overlord paratrooper "Pathfinders" who were dropped into Normandy earlier with the sole task of guiding the plane into the D-Day French battle zone. In short, it was the key element that guaranteed the success

of Allied troops on the beaches of Normandy.

That's All Brother was christened with the moniker by the 7-member crew as a message to Adolf Hitler, according to Dave Berio, a military historian and volunteer with the Central Texas Wing of the Commemorative Air Force (CAF). "It was a message to Hitler that's it's all over - that the United States has arrived to annihilate the Nazi regime ... that the gig is up," Berio said.

Summarily retired in

1945, That's All, Brother was sold to the civilian market and, during the course of many owners over the next several decades, the historical significance of the plane was lost.

The aircraft was rediscovered in 2014 by an Air Force historian

"This is a modern miracle," Stephan C.

Brown, CAF president and CEO, said. "The aircraft was within weeks of being torn apart, when its serial number was traced and it turned out to the actual lead aircraft for the D-Day invasion."

"She's a pretty special plane ... probably the most historical World War II plane flying today. She carried the 101st Airborne into Normandy. I remember when I first boarded her, the hair on the back of my neck stood up. A lot of the paratroopers dropped onto Normandy never made it back across the

campaign to restore the aircraft to its original 1944 condition.

"The scuttlebutt was that the Smithsonian and Air Force Museum turned down the project because they said they already had a C-47 in their collections," Berio said. "They failed to recognize that this wasn't any C-47. This was the aircraft that brought freedom to Europe.

"Sometimes, we Americans just don't get it," Berio continued. "If you go over to Europe and talk with the French, the Dutch, the people from Belgium, this is the Holy Grail of World War II. That plane symbolizes that single effort which was the beginning of their freedom."

By 2016, volunteers and contractors with the Commemorative Air Force had completed 1,600 hours of metal corrosion repair, in addition to purchasing essential electrical wiring,

with the goal of having the aircraft "flight ready" by late 2017.

By the end of 2017, the wings were rebuilt and most of the major mechanical work was completed.

In 2018, the engine repair and mounting had been done, with December marking the official rollout with the plane successfully completing its first flight.

In 2019, That's All Brother, flew with 14 other C-47 and DC-3 airplanes to re-create the epic journey initially made in 1944 over the Atlantic. After retracing the original ferry path from the United States to Canada, Greenland, Ice-Scotland land, and England, the aircraft joined more than 30 other C-47 and DC-3 airplanes in Duxford, England in preparation for a 75th Anniversary of D-Day.

On June 5, 2019, That's All Brother flew with 18 re-enactor paratroops who boarded the plane in England, flew over the English Channel, and made a successful paradrop flight over Normandy. On June 6, 2019, That's All Brother flew with 12 other C47 and DC-3 airplanes in formation to close out the D-Day commemoration over the U.S. Veteran Cemetery in Normandy, and then continued on to Germany for the 70th commemoration of the Berlin Airlift. Then, it was back to France for the Paris Airshow.

Berio said, he too, missed the significance of the plane until he began receiving numerous emails and comments from Europe during the 75th D-Day ceremonies.

"That's when it really dawned on me that That's All, Brother was a special symbol revered by the people of Europe," Berio said. "At the Commemorative Air Force, I received so many comments and emails from people throughout France, the Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Belgium - all of Europe - signifying how That's All Brother and the Normandy invasion saved

them from the horrors of Hitler.

"It was very touching. I was told how they cried when they saw or got on the aircraft. It's something we, in the United States, take for granted. We've never been invaded, but the Europeans understood all too well what war is ... anything connected to That's All Brother is precious to them. They still remember, or have heard the personal stories, and they still appreciate the sacrifices of Normandy."

That's All, Brother would continue to serve during the remainder of the war in Europe, participating in Operation Dragoon, Operation Market Garden, Operation Varsity and in the relief of the beleaguered defenders of Bastogne during the Battle of the Bulge.

As part of their April barnstorming event, the aircraft will be open for tours, actual flights and re-creations of paratrooper jumps.

After leaving San Mar-





cos, That's All Brother will be in Lexington, Kentucky April 9-11; Terre Haute, April 13-15; Hogan Field (Butler County Regional Airport) in Hamilton, Ohio, April 16-18; Grimes Field, Urbana, Ohio, April 19; the National Museum of the U.S. Air Force, Wright Patterson Air Force Base, Dayton, Ohio, April 20-22; and Xenia, Ohio, April 23-25, for the 100th birthday celebration for Jim "Pee Wee"

Martin, the last WWII-era American paratrooper to jump over Normandy.

Martin, one of the last remaining "Toccoa Originals" of 1942 (made famous by the HBO mini-series, Band of Brothers), is still serving as a representative of the veterans of the 101st Airborne who are no longer here, in an effort to promote and preserve the legacy and lessons of World War II.
