lanterns. In the collectible's category were die-cast cars, coins, advertising pieces, and older-generation video games. Contemporary goods included commercial mowers, shop tools, and hunting/fishing gear...

Prominent in the auction were bronze statues, most of which sold for impressive three-figure sums. A antique to modern 30-inch bronze Indian signs and advertising statue reached \$820 while an 18-inch bronze of a French soldier with a drawn sword sold for \$400. Another French soldier statue, 24 inches tall with a marble base sold for \$202.

More diminutive, the two-dozen silver over-

ary commanded much less than the bronzes. The highest amount of \$28 went for a 4.25inch sterling silver horse. A 3.5-inch bird reached \$26 while a larger 7.25 inch bull sold for \$25. Prices remained in the twenties for all but six of the remaining pieces which sold in the teens.

Four dozen lots of were also offered. The auction's second-highest bid of \$920 went to one of those items — a 36-inch Goodyear double-sided porcelain flange sign in good condition. Coming in at

there is no use in being upset over situations that have already happened and cannot be changed, such as when a cow kicks over a milking stool, upending both the milk bucket and the dairy farmer. For centuries. cows

were milked by hand twice a day in fields or in cowsheds. Farmers wherever they were, sically styled milking

even walnut or other hard wood with legs of ash or oak. Milking stools were made of a thick piece of wooden plank, approximately 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches by 8 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches in size, cut with a semi-circular shape. A farmer used a brace and bit to bore three holes into the stool's seat, into which stiff would carry milking wooden legs, approxibuckets and milking mately 9 inches long, stools to the cows, were fitted. A low, usually threelegged milking stool (three-legged so that the farmer could lean forward into the cow without toppling over) with a half-circle flat seat was specially made to help with the milking.

The finest milking stools were carved from elm, maple, hickory, or

stools have a short, 4 ¹/₂ inches long handle carved into the seat plank or attached to it. The handle is used to easily pick up and carry the stool.

The expression, "don't cry over spilt milk," originated from simple one-legged milking stools that enabled




Battle of Midway, and accessories. An Super Mario Brothers, and Duck Hunt sold for \$360. Another lot, with PlayStation 1 games, including Dare Devil Derby, Moto Racer, and Bogey Dead reached \$356. Yet another batch, with just 44 Nintendo Gameboy games, including several copies of Tetris went for a surprising \$303.

> For the die-cast car and toy collector. there were some exciting catches including a rare 1960s Lesney Matchbox G2 transporter set, manufacturer-sealed in error with one car lacking. For that, the hammer struck at \$267. Another rare Lesney Matchbox piece, landing \$178, was a mint-condition blister pack containing a cleansing service truck. Thirty-two additional lots of diecast vehicles offered including two 1:16 scale tractors (a Deere for \$18 and a Case Far

mall for \$17), four Maisto 1:18 scale cars in boxes averaging \$10, and four 1:24 scale boxed sets, grabbing \$12-\$13 each.

There was a broad array of antique and collectible items spanning the late 19th-century to around the 1960s. A circa 1900 Detroit-made Jewel Oak Stoveworks No. 18 wood burning stove, sold for \$231. From the same era, selling for \$312 was baker's cabinet by Wilson Kitchen Cabinet (sold by Sears) with glass-front doors, spice and flour bins, and original hardware. A good-cosmetic-condition wood Silvertone "tombstone" tabletop radio from the 1930s picked up \$81. From the 1980s came an untested 80 watt-perchannel Pioneer stereo amplifier, Model SA-9500 II landed for \$282. To go with it, two different metalized album pressings were available, both with certificates of authenticity. A copy of Pink Floyd's 1973 The Dark Side of the Moon sold for \$178 and a 1979 AC/DC Highway to Hell reached \$112.

Being a consignment auction, not everything offered was antique or vintage. The auction's highest bid of \$3,350 went for a modern Kubo-










time for showers (bridal and baby). All of which means that this is the perfect time for thinking about vintage gifts for women.

No piece of baseball equipment is as vital to any player than the glove. Next to uniform jerseys and bats, gloves are some of the rarest and costliest pieces of game-used equipment.

A 1997 Derek Jeter game-used model sold by Goldin Auctions showed great wear and two autographs by the Yankee great. The glove (which sold for \$5,000) still had remnants of pine tar and traces of infield dirt, and the outer thumb has 'Derek Jeter' embroidered in gold thread.

At a Sotheby's auction in 1999, the Hollywood star Billy Crystal plunked down \$239,000 for a Rawlings glove Mickey Mantle used in his 1966 season. The glove, with the elaborate Mantle stamped signature with looping Ms, was worn during the peak of Mantle's power.

One would need deep

pockets to own gloves from other stars. A Mac-Gregor model worn by Willie Mays, perhaps the best fielding center fielder ever, can range anywhere from \$10,000 to \$20,000. Rawlings gloves used by Ernie Banks, the talented Chicago Cub second baseman, go for roughly the same price.

Dave McCann, former owner of Sports View Investments in Illinois, has seen many vintage gloves cross his path the past 25 years. As with any high-ticket item, McCann warns "buyer beware."

"If you plan on spending big bucks on a glove you believe has been used by a particular athlete you need to make sure there is satisfactory documentation establishing a link between the player and his glove," McCann said. "I tell people to do their homework by matching photos on the Internet to models. Many times, the players don't even remember which glove they used. At a recent baseball card show, I turned down a \$400 glove that had been autographed by Detroit Tiger outfielder Rocky Colavito. While the autograph appeared genuine, the glove was made of inferior leather and it was too small to have actually been used in a major league game."

While there are those out there in search of a piece of history signed by an all-star player and willing to shell out thousands of dollars, others for any early baseball gloves, even those without a personalized signature.

"Over the past 10 years I've noticed more and more people in search of these relics, and that's just what they are," McCann said. "These old gloves look old, rustic, very worn and often musty smelling. What people are searching for are the embossed names

of stars of the past, regardless of the condition. Of course, the better condition the higher value, but having a glove with the name like Nellie Fox, Hank Aaron or other

known major league player brings back memories of games in the school yard. Collectors of these vintage baseball gloves and mitts are on the lookout for readable label and the embossed name of the player."

The first recorded instance of any player using a baseball glove







a farmer to keep precariously balanced on their two feet and onelegged stool, producing a tri-pod effect, as they squatted next to a milk cow. These stools were sometimes made from old stair banisters, table legs, or other turned pieces of wood, making them fancy looking and more appealing to farmer and collector both. One-legged milk stools were only one good swift kick away from being spilt milk.

Few milking stools were mass-produced. A farmer, who doubled as good reasonably а woodworker, would spend long hours winter during $_{\rm the}$ months, fashioning a milking stool in his barn or home, near a warm stove or fire. He used simple hand tools and produced smooth, rugged stools that would last a lifetime.

Today, hand-made milking stools are highly collectible as both symbols of simpler times and as symbols of the ingenuity that made America great.

Recently, I found an old milking stool for sale at a barn sale near Ben Hur, Arkansas. It was hand made by the seller's grandfather, and the price was just \$15. It now sits in our entry hall, near a window, with a potted plant on it. I'm not a true collector of milking stools since I only have the one, but there are big-time milking stool collectors around.

I read an article in an old Illinois Country Living magazine, April 1996, about a woman, Jean Mehl, who collected old milking stools. At the time of the article, Mehl had about 200 milking stools in various shapes,

colors, and sizes, but she wasn't just sitting around on her collection, she was still actively searching for more stools.


Another old article I once read described "sanitary" milking stools that were made of metal and could be easily and sanitarily cleaned. Companies began making these following the American Industrial Revolution, but they

became popular in the 1920s as small farms began consolidating and sanitation became important in the milk industry that followed.

Sanitary milking stools were mass-produced and sold in Sears & Roebuck and Montgomery Ward catalogs in the 1920s and '30s. Some of these sold new for around 50 cents back then.



dates to the season of 1869, when Cincinnati Red Stockings catcher Doug Allison first experimented with the idea of having a glove made for him by a local saddle maker. At that time, however, it was considered "unmanly" for players to seek protection for one's hands and the use of a glove was considered a sign of weakness.

In 1875, Charles Waite of the St. Louis Brown Stockings became the first fielder to wear a fingerless glove. Players disapproved of Waite's use of the glove and it would take a few more years before the use of gloves became accepted. With the speed of pitches now greatly increased, balls were hitting fielders' hands with much more force. Players then began adopting a tight fingerless glove for use in the field while catchers normally wore a pair of gloves on each hand.

Albert Spalding was a sensational ball player at that time, playing for the Boston Red Stockings and Chicago White Stockings. He retired in 1876 and opened a sporting goods store in Chicago, obtaining the rights to produce the official National League ball. Another star at that time, Alfred Reach, formed his own sporting goods store and earned millions. Reach Sporting Goods is one of the first manufacturer of baseball gloves.

"Strangely, baseball glove manufacturing varied by decade," McMann said. "The glove was simple at first and each decade evolved with improvements made, suggestions made by players themselves."

Gloves and mitts from the 1880-1899 period had no web and were referred to as "workman" style gloves. Gloves at this time were simple leather gloves with the fingertips cut off.

"These gloves are extremely rare and oftentimes had a wooden button with a metal attachment on the back strap," McMann said. "These are the most desired style in $_{\mathrm{the}}$ glove collecting arena.'

From the 1900-1909 decade came the development of the full web design. "Full Webs" are sewn directly to the thumb and forefinger. By 1910 the one-inch web design started to appear. From 1910-1919 came the development from the full web to the one-inch web. These webs were 1 to $1\frac{1}{2}$ inches wide and sewn directly to the thumb and forefinger. Manufacturers started using lace to connect the thumb and forefinger. Around 1915, gloves started to feature laces at the wrist as opposed to a sewn seam.

By the 1920s and 1930s, gloves had become specialized to a player's position. Catcher mitts included extra padding due to the increased velocity of pitches, and firstbase mitts were designed like giant scoops, since many throws from the left side of the infield were not always accurate.

Between 1920-1929, manufacturers saw the need to developing the "Lacing Device" and using lace between the thumb and forefinger, and this eventually led to the "Tunnel Loop", with leather strips laced between the thumb and forefinger.

"The next decade we start the modern style of web design," McCann said. "First it was a single tunnel, then the double tunnel, the T-web, and then by the early 1940s the triple tunnel and H-web designs were introduced. These were all separate webs that were laced to the glove. Until the late 1940s fielders' gloves for the most part have no lacing between the fingers, and collectors know these as "Split finger" gloves."

The development of glove design slowed during the war years but took off strong afterward as witnessed by the many other manufacturers besides Reach and Spald-

ing. Other makers included Denkert, Diamond, Draper & Maynard, Goldsmith, Dubow, Hutch, J.C. Higgins, Ken Wel, McGregor Goldsmith, Nokona, Rawlings, Simmons and Wilson.

"In the '40s, gloves were being designed to make it easier for infielders to pick up grounders and get the ball into the throwing hand quickly," McCann said. "For outfielders, gloves were designed to help the player snag a fly ball on the run. They also had deeper pockets so the ball would more than likely stay in the glove when the fielder hit the ground making a catch."

Jumping on the glove manufacture band wagon in the 1950s were Franklin, Marathon, Montgomery Ward, Sonnmett and Gelknap.

The web developed in the 1950s was a one-piece anchored, triple tunnel web with large triple lock web. A 12-inch size rule was incorporated in this decade.

Gloves of the 1960s involved solid one-piece webs, tightly laced to the thumb, forefinger and wider "U" shaped crotch. Spiral laced bridges emerged, as well as interlaced and basket weaved webs. Trapper webs continued to be used but begin to be built with a more solid bridge, after Rawlings introduced the Trap-Eze models.

In the 1970s, manufacturers began to make gloves as long as 13 inches and 14 inches. Full and hinged webs with different lacing devices dominate the 1980s, making it difficult to distinguish the age of the glove by the web alone.

Arthur Katsapis has been collecting vintage baseball memorabilia for more than 20 years. Through his website (found at www.vintage-baseball-gloves.com) collectors can browse vintage gloves, bats, balls and even clothing.

"The Internet has made getting gloves easier but many of us would agree

that it's taken the personality out of the hobby," Katsapis said. "We used to have glove get-togethers, talk on the phone about gloves, or trade boxes of gloves. Now it's eBay."

David Seideman, another collector for more than 30 years and former editor-in-chief of Audubon magazine, estimates there are a "few thousand hardcore collectors," and their ranks have been bolstered by aging baby boomers.

"Basically, they're collecting their memories," Seideman said. "But having people ransack their attics has also flushed out some valuable gems, like a Duck Web glove, the 'holy grail for collectors'," Seideman said, "or a Tornado Palm glove. Those rarities can go for as much as \$7,500."
