Ancient Greek flask outstrips estimate when it reaches \$6,000

YPSILANTI, Mich. - Schmidt's Antiques and Fine Arts Auctions Inc. has been a family business since 1911. When the antiques import business gradually slowed, the auction business grew and auction sales now account for about half their total sales each year. Dad's Root Beer: A summer time staple for 84 years

June is Dad's month with Father's Day leading the old man's praise. And is there a better way to toast dear old Dad than with a frosty mug of Dad's Root Beer?

Most root beers have their origins in the United States, and Dad's Root Beer is no exception. Ely Klapman and Barney Berns created Dad's Root Beer in Chicago, at the height of the Great Depression, in February 1937, and Dad's is still popularly sold today. Dad's was first brewed in the basement of Klapman's Chicago home, and the root beer truly became an overnight success. By the late 1940s, Dad's Root Beer was one of the most consumed root beers in America. Dad's rapid rise was due more to son Klapman's son Jules. Jules Klapman saw the opportunity to take Dad's Root Beer from a Chicago staple to an international drink. In his obituary, Oct. 11, 2002, The Chicago sells on the Internet for \$10. Sun Times quoted Rochelle Klapman, Jules' wife, "Jules never needed a contract. A handshake or a man's word would do."



Dad's Old Fashioned Root Beer took its name from Eli Klapman's memories of his dad making

homemade root beer for the family. This was a common practice in many homes in the early 20th century since root beer materials are easy to obtain.

Certain collectors seek items based on copyrights and trademarks, so Chicago Distilled Water & Beverage Company filed the first Dad's Root Beer trademark registration on Sept. 24, 1938, and The Dad's Root Beer Company filed the second trademark registration on Feb. 14, 1939.





To aid consumer product identification, Dad's Root Beer revolutionized soda packaging by being the first company to sell soda



in a six-pack format (still standard today). Dad's also introduced the halfgallon jug, and Dad's was the first root beer company, even before A & W, to market root beer in "Junior," "Mama," and "Papa" sizes, making collectors happy for the varied sizes of bottles. This full-family marketing allowed Papa to be a halfgallon size, Mama a quart size, and Junior a sixpack of 7 ounce or 10 ounce bottles.

Dad's Root Beer continued as a familyowned business until the 1970s when the Klapman and Berns families sold all rights to the Dad's label and logo to IC Industries. Since that time, Dad's has changed hands a couple of more

ill times.

Occasionally, collectors confuse Dad's Daily Drink with Dad's Root Beer. Dad's Daily Drink came much earlier. Ads for Dad's Daily Drink can be found as early as 1906. While Dad's Daily Drink was made from a root beer extract, it had 16 percent alcohol content, making it more of a true beer than a soda fountain drink.

Most soda collections begin with bottles. As mentioned earlier, Dad's had a variety of both bottles and soda cans to choose from. If you want a Junior, Mama, or Papa bottle, expect to pay from \$5 to \$35 for any of the bottles, depending on condition and labels.

Cans are somewhat less expensive since most cans show rust and may be dented. An unopened can of Dad's Root Beer, from the 1970s or newer, runs about \$5 on eBay. However, an older, rare Dad's Root Beer can from the 1960s, in opened condition, costs about \$20.

Collectors love old, metal bottle caps. Some collectors actually frame and mount the caps while others simply fill Mason jars full of soda caps. Either way, expect to pay about \$1 for old Dad's Root Beer caps, which make excellent checker pieces in a pinch.

Old, vintage soda signs have been reproduced extensively in the late 20th century. Fired porcelain over metal no longer denotes an old sign, so if you are purchasing a Dad's Root Beer sign, make sure of the age of the sign before spending big bucks on it. A new 18 gauge, porcelain over steel sign, costs between \$20 and \$60, depending on size, but a vintage, original Dad's Root Beer sign from the 1940s or '50s may easily

cost \$400 or more.

Another hot Dad's item is a Dad's Root Beer thermometer. These elongated thermometers were made to be outside, and the collectible ones were manufactured in the 1940s and '50s. Again, these have been reproduced, so be careful when buying. An original one in good condition should cost about \$65, and a reproduction should run about \$20.

While new Dad's Root Beer items are not considered worth collecting, the great taste of a frosty Dad's Root Beer is still worth savoring on a hot, summer day. Dad's Root Beer is celebrating its 84th anniversary this year, and there is no end in sight for this American-made treat.

12 inches tall, it was decorated in shades of brown with floral and bird images. Unfortunately, it showed significant wear as well as a damaged and glued rim, but it still soared well beyond the \$600-800 estimate, drawing a final bid of \$6,000. There was also a Greek Cypriot terracotta footed bowl, dated circa 700-475 B.C. This two-handle design was similarly decorated with polychrome geometric shapes.

Measuring 6 inches tall, it was claimed for a final bid of \$800 despite significant wear and large flakes missing on the rim and foot. A more primitive ancient Greek Cypriot black and tan terracotta vase, circa 2000-1700 B.C. measured 4.5 inches high. The bulbous design with slender neck and flared rim had experienced significant restoration to the neck with some losses and wear. It still proved desirable with a high bid of \$350.

A popular souvenir sold at the 1939 World's

Fair in New York was a lamp designed by Leon Houze. The theme that year was "The World of Tomorrow." The Art Deco style lamp featured the planet Saturn, this one in green satin glass, molded onto a step base. Measuring 11 inches high, the lamp had been rewired and showed slight wear. It still proved popular, requiring a high bid of \$1,700 to take it home.



Marx hit the right mark with tinplated steel toys

Those growing up in the 1960s are certain to remember the Rock'em Sock'em Robots game. In this tabletop game, each player controlled the jabs of their 9-inch tall, solid plastic robots using "hand boosters" until one player landed a punch that sent the opposing robot's springing upward. Marx Toys came out with this popular toy in 1966 and it was quite the rage.

But collectors enamored by Marx Toys know that Louis Marx began making toys in 1919, and his toys were made of die-cut tinplated steel. Marx was born in 1896 in Brooklyn, N.Y. He entered the toy business at age 15, working as a toy salesman for the F.J. Strauss & Company, one of the largest mechanical metal toy companies around in those days.

After serving in World War I, Marx returned home and established his own company (Louis Marx & Company) on Fifth Avenue in Brooklyn. There he and his brother, David, designed and contracted the manufacturing of a wide variety of toys, and the company copied toys made by other manufacturers, improved them, and sold them at lower prices. Needing some form of trademark, they used a circular logo with a big "X" behind "MAR."

Marx would lithograph toy patterns onto large sheets of tinplated steel, which would then be diecut, folded and assembled. Marx would often repurpose dies, using the same model for several different toys. The Honeymoon Express, a windup train on a circular track with a plane circling above, became the Mickey Mouse Express.

In 1921, Marx purchased the used tooling and product rights to two of the old Strauss products that were thought to have run their course: The Climbing Monkey and the Mechanical Minstrel Singer. Marx's salesmanship brought these two products back to life. Millions of these units were sold. Marx found even more success when it began marketing its own whistling yo-yos, branded as Lumars. Within a decade, the company had sold 100 million of these whistling and non-whistling toys. Marx used Sears, Roebuck, & Co., Montgomery Ward catalogs and Woolworths to market its toys. The brothers even developed a high-profile partnership with Disney and created several toys based on popular comic strip and radio show characters like Popeye and Charlie McCarthy.

down anytime soon.

In the mid-1930s, Marx toy factory workers were busy producing all kinds of toys in Glen Dale, W.Va., Erie, Pa. and Girard, Pa.

Marx also manufactured heavy-gauge metal vehicles and large non-mechanical toys. But his tin, windup toys were most popular.


Arguably the most popular lithographed tin windup toy ever made by the Louis Marx Company was the Marx Merry Makers mouse band. Originally marketed in 1931, the Marx Merry Makers band was of die-cut tinplated steel and sold for 91 cents. The Marx Merry Makers band was a group of four lithographed tin mice playing as a band. The overall form of this toy was a nod to the orchestras of the 1930s like Cab Calloway and others. The mice are dressed in period tuxedos with a white shirt, black tie and red vest. The dancer, pianist, drummer and fiddler move when the toy is wound with its key. The fourth mouse either serves as the band leader or plays the violin.

Marx cars often featured unexpected and lively elements. Comic Car, a 1932 jalopy featuring four college boys, curved forward, stopped, and then backed in an arc. This car, like the 1940 Charlie McCarthy Buggy, had big rear wheels, a pattern that could also be used for a tractor. The 1932 Amos 'n' Andy Fresh Taxi would move forward, stop, and shake. Sometimes Marx failures are the most treasured today. A 1936 tin train called Bunny Express, with a rabbit-shaped engine and open cars meant to pull candy, instantly flopped when it was released for the Easter season. Since few were made, collectors are always looking for this toy.

converting his toys factories to make munitions, detonators, bazookas and other war-related materials. Realizing a metal shortage, Marx began developing plastics that could be used to produce 100-piece playsets. These elaborate scenes, first issued in 1948, featured a structure like a fort or castle made out of lithographed tin, which formed the backdrops for scores of plastic figures in conflict, like cowboys and Indians, or Union and Confederate soldiers.

Almost any fictional or historical scene you could imagine was created by a Marx playset. While they came stuffed to the gills with toys, these sets usually sold for \$4-\$7 apiece. Many were made based on popular TV shots such as "Gunsmoke," "Ben Hur," or "The Untouchables." As space toys exploded in popularity, playsets with themes like moon base or Cape Canaveral were offered. The 1961 Prehistoric Playset, with its plastic dinosaurs, cavemen, trees, and rocks is particu-

ing die-cut tinplated steel toys to making cheaper plastic toys.

Thanks to the efforts at all three manufacturing locations, Marx became the largest toy maker in the world in the 1940s and 1950s. By the 1950s, Louis Marx & Co. was employing 8,000 fulltime workers. In 1955, Time magazine named Louis Marx "The Toy King."

The Erie factory produced mechanical windup toys and mechanical trains. In the 1950s the plant produced millions of mechanical cars, tanks and tractors annually. In the 1960s, the Erie plant began to produce blow-molded plastics including many of the rideon toys.

The Glen Dale factory produced dollhouses, trucks, service stations, airports, and the popular Big Wheel tricycle. 





"Granite Glass Co." (New Hampshire, 1847-1863), a Sunburst flask marked "Keene" (New Hampshire, 1820-1830), and а Cornucopia flask marked illegibly. With some wear and a small rim flake in the Cornucopia flask, they still left with an impressive bid of \$1,800. Thirty-seven pieces of Baccarat Crystal in the Massena pattern, including water glasses, wine glasses, and champagne flutes, all with etched marks, drew a final bid of \$1,100. A set of three early American blown glass bottles, two amber and one green, all with tooled rims and pontil marks to their bases, finished at \$650, and three 19th century American amber blown glass bottles closed at \$550.

Several handsome furniture pieces were offered, but the teak furniture proved to be the most popular. A handsome, mid-century modern teak sideboard by Moreddi, Denmark, featured four dovetailed drawers with incorporated handles, two sliding doors, and round tapering legs. It



retained its original medium brown finish with very minor wear. Measuring a massive 75 by 17 by 31 inches, it far exceeded the estimated value with a final bid of \$1,700. The companion dining set consisting of a $29~{\rm by}$ 68-inch dining table with round tapered legs and two 23-inch pull-out leaves, two solid teak armchairs and four matching side chairs also performed well, drawing a final bid of \$1,300. In addition, there were teak

dressers and shelf units. Bronze figures offered desirable home decorations and were appreciated by the bidders. An early 20th century bronze figure by Polish artist Stanislaw Lewandowski (1859-1940) depicted a male nude "Helmsman" on a stone plinth with an incised signature. Measuring 7.5 inches long and showing some wear, it still brought a respectable final bid of \$800. A 25-inch-tall bronze figure of an archer holding a horn and bow with prey at his feet entitled "Hallali" by French artist Eugene Marioton (1854-1924) drew a final bid of \$600, while a Paul Dubois (French artist, 1829-1905) 33-inch-tall bronze figure portraying a standing falconer holding a falcon and walking staff finished at \$500. A beautiful turn of the

century Chippewa/Ojibwe (Great Lakes region) velvet beaded bag featured multi-color floral beadwork decoration and expertly designed. The 8 by 15-inch pouch exceeded expectations with a final bid of \$850. Sterling silver always sells well, and that included an 86-piece set of Reed & Barton "Francis I" sterling silver flatware with an approximate 107.55 total troy ounces that closed at \$2,200. Finally, an attractive yet totally unexpected rarity, there was a vintage Rolls Royce grill complete with traditional "Spirit of Ecstasy" hood ornament. Measuring 22 by 34 inches and showing some wear, surface pitting and minor damage, it still proved highly desirable, requiring a final bid of \$600 to claim it.
