No need to check the gauge; petroliana was hot

COLUMBUS, Ohio -One of the country's biggest petroliana events, the Check the Oil Show & Auction returned to the Embassy Suites in Columbus June 25-26, after a year's hiatus. On all accounts, the event was strikingly successful, hardly reflecting any adverse effects from the lost year.

Promoters Andy Hussar and Aaron Hop were back in the driver's seat, eager to have the show running again after 2020s shutdown. Just like 2019, attendees and vendors booked out the entire Embassy Suites hotel over 220 rooms booked, and all vendor spaces sold out! Outside, vendors wrapped around the entire eight-story building, filling up all the building's adjacent parking lot. Inside, dealers

ballroom along with other first-floor spaces. But it was the four additional floors of "room crawls," where vendors displayed merchandise in their lodging rooms, which created a distinct vibe to the event.

A special participant this year was the Gulf Oil Historical Society. David Montgomery, the group's current president explained the group was founded in 1999 and currently has a membership of around 65 members. Its annual meeting is now held at the show. The group had merchandise for sale in the room crawl along with items offered in a silent auction on Fridav.

Check the Oil is free and open to the public, and it drew attendees as far as California and Canada. On whole, guests tend to be older and mostly male; but it's import-

ant to note the number of women (on both sides of the sales tables) and the growing number of Gen-X and Millennials just starting their collections.

Demographics withstanding, the show opened to an amazing crowd, with Friday as busy as would otherwise be expected on a Satur-

day. By 9 a.m. parking was at a premium and the throngs were shopping both the outside booths and filling the hallways inside.

Attendees were there to buy and not just browse. Pricing at authentic petroliana

William Moorcroft became "Potter to the Queen"

Moorcroft William (1872-1945) was born in Burslem, Stoke-on-Trent,



Staffordshire, England, and he studied art in Burslem, London, and Paris. He became a famed English potter, founding the Moorcroft Pottery Business.

Moorcroft joined James Macintyre & Co. Ltd as a ceramic designer in 1897. A year later, 25-year-old Moorcroft was promoted to director of Macintyre's art pottery studio where he specialized in designing the company's Aurelian Ware range of Victorian pottery. Aurelian Ware had transfer-printed decoration with bold colors of blue, gold and red. While at Macintyre,

Moorcroft created many high gloss glazes, using them in conjunction with oriental shapes, designs, and decorations.

In 1904, at the St. Louis International Exhibition (the World's Fair), Moorcroft won a gold medal for his famous Florian Ware pattern. With its translucent glaze, heavy slip, and color brilliance, Florian Ware, which was strongly influenced by the Art Nouveau movement, used tube lining (designs outlined in trailed slip) and hand painting to give the world a new and exciting line of ceramic ware. Tube lining techniques continued to be used on almost all of Moorcroft's art pottery, popularly distinguishing it from mass-produced

pottery of the era.

Owing to the success of Florian Ware, Moorcroft began the unusual practice of overseeing and signing all his designed work with his name or initials.

Largely owing to Florian Ware's popularity,

Moorcroft's designs and work quickly became the prominent designs at Macintyre & Co, causing jealousy and resentment among other Macintyre employees and management. In 1912, Macintyre decided to close its art pottery division, even

though it was still the most profitable division of the company, as a way



events like Check the Oil is not for the faint of heart. Amounts like \$500 or even \$5,000 are the norm - and matter-of-factly asked for items like porcelain signs and restored pumps. It's a result of vetting; all merchandise must be authentic, or in cases in which reproductions are appropriate (like replica globes for pump restoration), the pieces must be clearly marked. Buyers are prepared and confident to part with such sums for good-caliber items.

Gas pumps, perhaps more than anything else, attract the most attention. Pumps were all over

the outdoor venue, coming in the form of boneyard pieces priced in the low hundreds to com-

pletely restored examples typically running four figures. One dealer had a nice handful of pumps, including a Tokheim Texaco Sky Chief unit with globe for \$1,900, a circa 1940 Bennett pump branded to Mobilgas and ready to restore for \$2,200, and a Wayne Clock Meter branded to Magnolia Gas for \$2,500.

Then there were the signs and other forms of advertising pieces that seemingly dominated the landscape inside and out. Among the hundreds of Mobiloil and Texaco signs were some standout pieces like a crated Kaiser Frazer neon sign, which was working prior to load out, priced at \$9,500. A 30s-era steel Horton's Ice Cream sign from New York was marked at \$1,600.

All those big pieces like the pumps were limited to the outside spaces. Inside the rooms was merchandise that ran the gamut from smaller signs to oil cans and ephemera. While prices remained impressive indoors, that was where merchandise priced for those with smaller wallets was often found. Roadmaps and dealer catalogs, for example, ran as little as \$5. The Gulf Oil Historical Societv had numerous items under \$100, including a set of four Gulf cocktail glasses for \$10.



show, a 300-item no-reserve petroliana and advertising auction was held on Saturday, highlighting items from the Case Brothers collection, including many rare Pennzoil collectibles. A 50/50 raffle supporting the Special Olympics of Ohio was also conducted. And a ticketed buffet dinner was available for dealers and attendees on Friday.

If you didn't make it to the Columbus event, Iowa Gas is just around the corner the weekend of August 4-6.

Political memorabilia always has a story to tell

NASHVILLE. Tenn. -Many antique collectors appreciate an item for its "back story." One thing that is great for collectors of American political items, is behind nearly every campaign button, banner, ribbon and bow is a story.

A case in point, a 1904 pin-back button, commonly known as "The Equalitv Button" featured President Theodore Roosevelt and author Booker T. Washington dining in the



pictograph captures a buck leaping over a cannon to signify Buchanan.

"The first edition, released at the same time as a small poster of similar design was issued in a positive vein," according to Heritage Antiques. "It featured Booker T. Washington with clearly recognizable facial features and was meant to celebrate the occasion when T.R. invited Washington to dine at the White House, making him the first African American to be so honored.

"Subsequent 'knockoff' versions featured a generic black image and are thought to have been



"That was a story about our history," Carter R. Todd, a longtime member of the American Political Items Collectors (APIC) said. "There are hundreds of stories just like that."

\$10,000; Todd says. There are a series of different size buttons, one even illustrating a wine bottle on the table to further stir up fundamental non-imbibers. The smaller buttons decrease in value to a multi-color wine-imbibing button, depending on condition, being worth \$500.

Then, there's the elusive Cox-Franklin Roosevelt button, the "Holy Grail" among jugate (two-candidate) buttons we're talking an easy \$100,000 for the largest 1 1/4-inch button from 1920 presidential contest. The ill-fated 1920 campaign featured Ohio newspaper entrepreneur James M. Cox and a young Franklin D. Roosevelt.

As a prospective president Cox was perceived as a sure loser against Warren G. Harding. Due to lack of campaign funds, very few pinback jugates were produced. Today, a Cox-Roosevelt jugate as small as a nickel could bring \$30,000-\$40,000, Todd said. On July 28 through Aug. 1, all manner of political advertising will be displayed at the Sheraton Music City in Nashville, Tenn., during the APIC convention. Todd, chairman of APIC's convention committee, said they have already prepared more than 500 nametags and more requests are coming in fast.



of quietly forcing Moorcroft out of the company.

In 1913, Moorcroft fulfilled his heart's desire by opening his own pottery company at Cobridge, bringing along several of his old colleagues and staff from Macintyre. Backed by financial investment from Liberty & Co. of London, Moorcroft's new venture quickly became successful, selling most of its wares through Liberty & Co; although, Moorcroft did begin to immediately export pottery to Tiffany in New York, giving Moorcroft a presence in America. Moorcroft

bought out Liberty & Co's interest in 1962.

In 1928, Moorcroft received the highest award an English potter could receive - he was given a Royal Warrant making him "Potter to the Queen." From 1928 on, a mark indicating this title was stamped on all his pottery.

Moorcroft also experimented producing pottery using the high-temperature flambé techniques, but the pottery that Moorcroft Factory specialized in producing was mid-priced, domestic tableware, making Moorcroft ware popular with families in England and America. He did continue his famous hand-painted, tube lined art ware also,

giving him popularity among the wealthy as well.

Two of Moorcroft's most popular patterns were his Florian pattern and his Moonlit pattern. Florian ware is the pattern that launched Moorcroft to fame. This pattern was discontinued after 1906, but it is popular for its flower patterns including tulips, irises, and poppies. These blooms are rendered in a soft palette of colors and finished in a raised slip technique, giving a 3-dimensional effect to the work. Pieces of Florian ware still sell for record prices at auctions across the world.

Moorcroft's Moonlit blue pattern was first introduced in 1922, and it is similar to but harder-edged than the "naturalistic" ceramic wares that were common in the early 1900s. Moorcroft's Moonlit series has a somber, nocturnal sheen, using strong evening col-

ors for effect. Most of his Moonlit series is decorated with plant motifs, especially a variety of trees, often rendered in green or turquoise against a darker background.

Today, collectors love Moorcroft pottery for its elegant, organic qualities, but the original Moorcroft pottery, signed by Moorcroft, is quite expensive, making collection of it a rich man's game. Collectors flock to auctions offering Moorcroft vases, lamp-bases, jars, and display plates. Moorcroft vases and lamp bases are particularly sought in homes with a strong Art Nouveau influence.

William Moorcroft died in 1945, but his son, Walter, continued the company for many years, and Moorcroft Pottery is still producing pottery today.


