SPRINGFIELD, Ohio — Having charted some waters running a handful of smaller events including a March show - during Covid restrictions, Jenkins Management was confident and

better. As early as the first week in May, the CDC began loosening its guidelines for vaccinated people. While the agency still suggested avoiding crowds, on May 13 official word came down — fully vaccinated people could stop wearing masks outdoors. That was quickly expanded to indoor settings. "Fully vaccinated people no longer need to

wear a mask or physically distance in any $_{\mathrm{the}}$ CDC setting," affirmed.

Ohio's Governor Mike DeWine followed nearly lockstep. In mid-April, fully vaccinated people were given the green light to be unmasked in socially distanced outdoor settings. On May 14 - Extravaganza's opening day DeWine announced in a press conference, "Those who have been vaccinated no longer need to wear masks."

And so, the smiles came out. Extravaganza goers clearly embraced the edicts, with perhaps two-thirds of the attendees going mask-free. It was nice seeing people's faces again.

Even before the mask restrictions were lifted, Jenkins' team the seemed to sense a groundswell, noting, 'We are expecting a large, nearly record vendor turnout." There were 2,000 spaces spread outdoors and inside six full buildings. Extravaganza, it seemed, reopened to its amazing self.

Even the weather smiled, providing a near-perfect weekend. That and the lifted mask restrictions drew visitors to the Clark County Fairgrounds in droves. By all accounts, there were tens of thousands of attendees. Even Friday morning, police were on-hand, directing hundreds lining up on Charleston Pike waiting to enter the fairgrounds. staffmember А observed, "It was the largest crowd I have seen in a long time. I would guess at the gate, close to 40,000+ on Friday. Saturday had to be close to the same."

Once inside, staff and members of the Clark County Sheriff's Office ensured traffic flow and safety. One visitor remarked, "Wow! What an amazing show. I came early Friday and have not seen them parking cars in areas they were in years. Also, I've never have seen so many vendors!"

Vendors heartily attested to great results. One Ohio dealer exclaimed, "What a show! Overall, the best we have done in 20 years!" Echoing similar sentiments, an Indianapolis dealer said, "It was a record-breaking show for me."

For the most serious buyers, a special period called Line Buying was available on Thursday. Vendors opened the back of their vehicles to buy and sell among themselves while waiting to move to their spaces. Admission for that opportunity was \$50 and included re-admission for the rest of the show.

Early bird shopping was offered on Friday from 7-12. Admission for it was \$15, which included re-entry for all three days. For the remainder of the weekend, entry was \$10 per day, with children under 16 free.

The acres of dealers meant a tremendous amount of walking for shoppers and those with carts and wagons had a distinct advantage. No driving was allowed on the grounds but fortunately, porters were available to help move large purchases to customers' vehicles.

accepting Dealers credit cards were more common than in previous years. However, since cash-only remained most typical, the onsite ATM proved a great asset. There were also plenty of food options spread about, including a food court

set up in the center of the activity. Diners had access to choices ranging from fair food to Hungarian cabbage rolls, German fare from Columbus' Schmidt's Sausage Haus, and even wine slushies and beer.

The next Extravaganza runs Sept. 17-19, with a smaller show in August.

Collectible cats come one, come all Donald-Brian

The Naming of Cats is a difficult matter, It isn't just one of your holiday games; You may think at first I'm as mad as a hatter When I tell you, a cat must have THREE DIFFERENT NAMES. T.S. Eliot, The Naming of Cats

Cats. They put the "purr" in "personality." Down through the ages, the individual personality traits that cats possess (or, at any rate, the individual personality traits we ascribe to them), have inspired creative talents in almost every artistic medium.

Mark Twain wrote about them. Sly black cats were pictured accompanying witches on their broomriding escapades. Dick Whittington, the frequent English subject of pantomimes, was said to owe his appointment as London's Lord Mayor to the acclaimed rat-catching abilities of his pet cat. And what childhood was complete without tales of the swashbuckling "Pussin-Boots?" (In recent years, thanks to the movie Shrek, "Puss" became famous all over again.)

cats as there are. cats. Who can forget the nimble-footed musical prodigy evoked in "Kitten on the Keys?" "Batman's" slinky nemesis "Catwoman?" Cartoon included icons have gluttonous "Garfield," always-optimistic "Felix," and X-rated "Fritz." There's "Sylvester," on the hunt for "Tweety" . . . "Tom," in perpetual pursuit of "Jerry". . .blank-faced, button-eyed "Hello Kitty". . .the eyerolling "KitCat Clock," his pendulum tail swinging to a perpetual beat. . . plus that embodiment of '60s ultra-cool, "The Pink Panther."

Over the centuries, one of the most popular figural depictions of the cat has been Japan's Maneki Neko or "good luck cat," its raised paw a welcomer of good fortune. In the 1700s, Staffordshire and Meissen were among those producing prized renditions of cats in pottery and porcelain. By the 1800s, pet cats had become so ubiquitous that advertisers took note. That's why you'll find 19th century felines serving as pitch-cats for everything from rat poison (kind of a logical choice), to cigars (kind of a stretch.) Much of what's collected figural-cat-wise in the United States today dates from the mid-20th century. By then, the cat had moved up the ladder from utilitarian

mouse exterminator to indispensable family member. This was due in part to the introduction of commercial cat litter; "indoor" cats could now actually remain indoors, increasing both their lifespans and likeability. And, during the uncertain years of World War II, "keeping the home fires burning" became an even cozier prospect when there was a cat dozing by the fireside. Plenty of cats meant plenty of cat-lovers, eager to be reminded on a regular basis of their feline favorites. That fact wasn't lost on the makers of decorative giftware. Across the country, from the 1930s onward, neverending litters of cat figurines scampered forth from factories. Ceramic cats. Glass cats. Chalk, tin, wood, papier-mâché, and cloth cats. The medium didn't much matter. If it was a three-dimensional representation, buyers

were primed to pounce.

By far, the most prevalent mid-century cat figurines are those fashioned from ceramic. Hand-carved molds allowed for realistic, catlike body curvature, and the smooth consistency of ceramic lent itself well to colorful glazes and detailed surface decoration. Few ceramic firms could resist the urge to turn out at least one member of the menagerie. Madison's Ceramic Arts Studio even used Betty Harrington's kitten design, "Bright Eyes," as a test piece for would-be CAS decorators. If they could successfully give "Bright Eyes" her signature inquisitive gaze and colorful neck bow, the iob was theirs. Ceramist Howard Pierce went for the abstract: the eves and ears of his creations were exaggeratedly catlike; the rest was left to the viewer's imagination. Cats by See Collectible Cats page 7

Haeger Potteries, solemnly posed, and drenched in multi-hued drip glazes, intentionally were reminiscent of Egyptian temple guardians. Roselane's "Sparklers," their rhinestone eves glittering forth from bisque faces, took cat depictions to a new, and somewhat unsettling, level. Perhaps the most unique version of a ceramic cat was that championed by shortlived manufacturer Elzac. Luridly colored, in shades ranging from Pepto-Bismol pink to fluorescent blue, Elzac cats were outfitted with Lucite bows and tails. (Elzac co-founder Elliot Handler later found much greater success with another venture, "Mattel.") Glass cats were also These could popular. be pressed, molded, blown, fused, or created through a combination of glassmaking techniques. In a blown glass figurine,

interior bubbling added texture to the cat's "fur." Fusing meant that other elements could be added to the mix. Flexible wire legs and whiskers imbedded in the glass body, for instance, allowed the cat to be "posed" in true catlike style. On the high end of glass cat making were Lalique, renowned for cats of clear crystal, and the glassblowers of Murano, who made the most of vivid coloration in their stylized fantasy-cats.

There were "folk art"

cats too, the designs as individualized as cats themselves. Some were the factory equivalent of folk, simply mimicking the style of handicraft, but many were the work of independent artisans. Regardless of origin, every material, from clay to shelf mushrooms to Mayan marble, seems to have been used at one time or another as a basis for folk cat figurals.

Most common are wooden cats, hand-carved and hand-painted, their styling deliberately primitive. Metal proved adaptable as well. During the 1800s, metal cats fashioned from iron, pewter, and even silver plate were all the rage, but by the mid-20th-century, frugal buyers in the mood for metal opted for tin. Lightweight and inexpensive, handcrafted tin cats were often brought back as souvenirs from trips south of the border.

Because they were produced in such quantity, vintage cat figurines remain both accessible and affordable.

July 13, 2021, marks the 150th anniversary of the first "official" cat show, held at London's Crystal Palace in 1871.







From ancient Egypt to the modern day, collectors have been enchanted by cameos. A cameo is a picture produced in relief from a material often containing multiple strata layers of different colors. Layers are removed from the material to create a 3-D picture. If the material layers vary in color, the artist can expose the different

colors in contrast to accen- onyx, malachite, bloodtuate the details of the subject matter.

Cameos have been made from many different materials including shell, lava, glass, ivory, coral, plastic and multiple types of stones. Stones are harder to carve than shell and glass, so they required more skill and different tools. Some types of stones used over the years include agate, sardonyx, opal,

stone, turquoise, jasper and cornelian.

In general, historians believe that cameos were first created in Egypt around 332 BCE. Prior to that, expert and mediocre carvers had been creating "seals" - objects used to make an impression in soft clay or wax. Seals were used to mark and secure personal property and documents. A seal would identify the owner and serve to

discourage tampering. Seals and engraved stones were also used as amulets to protect against evil and to bring the bearer good luck. Different color materials had different meanings.

The introduction of sardonyx, a multi-layered stone from India and Arabia, inspired carvers to create the cameo type carving by removing the different color layers to create pictures. Skills and tools from

making seals transferred to making cameos.

Early Egyptian, Roman and Greek cameos often featured the likeness of rulers, gods, Biblical characters and pastoral scenes. Over the years they were used to adorn a variety of items such as jewelry, helmets, breast plates, crowns, cups, dishes and just decorative ornaments for the home.

Many well-known people throughout history

have collected cameos including Napoleon and Queen Victoria. Queen Victoria's love of wearing cameos caused a collecting craze. Men and women alike wore cameos as fashion statements and sometimes with hidden meanings that could even be considered flirting, depending on the subject matter.

The widespread use of shells for cameos grew out of Italy in the early 1800s.

Easy to carve and exhibiting multiple color layers, shells were a perfect material for cameo making. The most used shells were carnelian, sardonyx shell and Helmet shells. Wealthy English Victorians taking a "Grand Tour" invariably brought home Italian cameos as souvenirs. During this time, the "habilles" form of cameo became popular. This is the process of making small holes in the cameo and attaching jewelry to the subject of the cameo. The profile of a woman might be wearing a necklace, earrings or a brooch set with diamonds in a habilles piece.

In a discussion of carved cameos there is another type of carving method that should be mentioned and that is intaglio. Intaglio differs from cameo carving in that the carving is recessed into the material so that it appears as a depression, whereas a cameo cut in relief appears raised from the surface. The subject matter and materials used for intaglio can be like that of cameos,

but intaglio carving is another whole subject altogether!

Cameos are still being made today. Although the ancient art of carving them has become much less common, new versions can be cut with a laser cutter or just molded from plastic. There are other methods of producing non-carved cameos and famous manufacturers such as Wedgewood and Limoges have even created cameos made from jasperware and porcelain, respectively.

Values for cameos vary widely based on age, material, craftsmanship, condition and rarity. The settings are important in the value of a piece as well. Naturally, a cameo set in a gold frame or bezel would be desirable, although base metals and other materials can be just as lovely.

Becky Couvillon of Huntsville, Ala., has a wonderful collection of cameos. Her interest was sparked as a child by a piece that her mother owned. She thought it was the most beautiful thing she had ever seen. Now Becky owns an enviable

collection of cameos in a variety of ages, materials and sizes. She even gives presentations about cameos to small groups in her area.

One of the star pieces in Becky's collection is a mourning cameo from the 1800s. It is set in gold and has a glass locket window on the back side to hold a lock of a loved one's hair. She can date the piece largely based on the clasp. According to Becky the hook type clasp was used prior to the 19th century where the common safety clasp that we are most familiar with now was a later development.

Becky has a handout she provides during her presentation that explains the care of shell and coral cameos. She advises cleaning them with a soft toothbrush and mild detergent. Moisturize a couple of times a year with baby or mineral oil applied with a cotton swab or your finger. Let the oil sit overnight then remove with a soft cloth the next morning.

Most cameos should never be cleaned in an ultrasonic jewelry cleaner or with any type of chemical. Some shouldn't even be cleaned with water, just dusted. These include turquoise and opal. Be sure to find out the proper clean-




ing method for each type of cameo material you have and store them individually, not touching where they could scratch or chip each other.

Fakes abound in the cameo world, so it is advisable to become familiar the different methods of determining whether a cameo is real or not. There is nothing wrong with buying a fake if you know what you are getting. With shell being the most common material used for cameos, it is important to be able to differentiate between shell and plastic.

Today, collectors search high and low for six shooter cap guns from the 1950s. Some collectors, at auctions, have been known to almost have a shootout themselves while trying to outbid another collector for a mint-conditioned six-gun.

While few true-life sheriffs and outlaws carried two-gun rigs in the west, television was full of hard shooting men who believed two guns were better than one. And these television westerners, armed with two pistols, often were ambidextrous, firing both guns at once, one in each hand. It was quite a sight, early on a Saturday morning, to see the Lone Ranger, Wyatt Earp, Roy Rogers, Gene Autry, or Hopalong Cassidv draw both of their six shooters and blast away.

While Mattel, Schmidt

Roundup

and other toy manufacturers made two-gun rigs for wanna-be gunslingers, it was Hubley Manufacturing Company of Lancaster, Pa., that truly popularized the two-pistol holster.

John Hubley founded Hubley Manufacturing in 1894, producing a wide range of cast iron, zinc alloy, and plastic toy cap guns. The first Hubley cap guns were produced in 1909, but it is Hubley's die cast zinc alloy western cap guns from the 1950s that capture collectors' imaginations.

Hubley quickly realized children wanted western character cap guns from popular television shows that would create a loud "bang" and emit puffs of smoke when the pistol's trigger was pulled. Cap guns were named for this small "cap" of exploding material.

Hubley gave kids what they wanted, manufacturing cap guns such as the Lone Ranger, Wyatt Earp, Wyatt Earp Buntline Special, Davy Crockett, Roy Rogers, and Gene Autry. As more and more western shows aired in the 1950s, Hubley produced more and more cap pistols.


Hubley also specialized, more than any other toy manufacturer, in manufacturing twogun sets with holsters.

But being a cap gun toting gunslinger in the 1950s came at a steep price. A Sears Christmas catalog from 1958 shows four two-gun sets that sell in the range of \$3 to \$6. Compare those prices to food prices in 1958 when 10 pounds of potatoes sold for 39 cents and white bread, the only kind of bread sold in 1958, sold two loafs for 39 cents. Six dollars could feed a family of four for two weeks in '58, so spending it on a toy cap gun was truly extravagant. However, today, that same \$6 twogun cap pistol set might easily cost \$600 or more

Times change, and cap guns have generally lost their appeal with parents and kids. But in the 1950s, with a broom handle for a horse, a ball cap for a Stetson, and a Hubley Lone Ranger cap pistol in his hand, many a Backyard Buckaroo fought imaginary outlaws while firing his trusty 50-cap six shooter in the air and screaming, "Hi, Ho, Silver. Away!"
