ACROSS THE AUCTION BLOCK

Wristwatches clocked the highest bids at Schmidt's

YPSILANTI, Mich. — This year's annual Fall Clock Auction hosted by Schmidt's Antiques, Inc. provided a dazzling array of clocks, watches, and

music boxes. Hosted at their spacious facility in Ypsilanti, the auction was simultaneously presented to online shoppers as well. The 359 lots included rare and fascinating time pieces originating directly from private collections. The quality and variety of the inventory was exceptional. Prices listed do not include the buyer's premium.

While there were many large clocks, the two top bid winners at this sale were wristwatches. The 18k vintage Rolex President model gentleman's

wristwatch featured an automatic wind movement with diamond encrusted dial. Complete with outer box and original bezel, it drew a final bid of \$7,500 despite some wear. The other was a Patek Philippe 18k "Golden Ellipse" gentleman's wristwatch with champagne dial on an 18k gold mesh Patek Philippe band. Showing minor wear, it finished with a high bid of \$5,000. A 1990s Rolex Oyster Perpetual Datejust gentleman's wristwatch with automatic wind movement, 18k gold/stainless case and a Rolex "Jubilee" bracelet closed at \$3,750.

There were many shapes, sizes, and styles of clocks offered, each

Oyster plates are good no matter what the season

There are a lot of myths surrounding the eating of oysters. Legendary advice is that you should only eat oysters in the eight months of the year that contain the letter "R" in the name,

which means September through April. The other four months of the year — May through August — are considered off limits or suicidal. However, modern-day oyster farming and strict environmental code enforcement have changed the myths sur-

rounding oyster eating. Most oyster experts agree, "It's now safe to eat oysters year-round."

If you travel any coastal highway, oyster bars are everywhere, or so it seems. However, for the sheer love of eating oysters, Victorians can't be beat.

In fact, Victorians, both in England and here in the States, once ate oysters in record numbers. If you remember your grade school poems, you may recall Lewis Carroll's "The Walrus and the Carpenter," found in "Through the Looking-Glass" (popularly

called Alice in Wonderland). In the poem, the Walrus and Carpenter, while walking upon a beach one night when both sun and moon are visible, discover a bed of oysters. When they leave, to resume their walk, many of the oysters follow them,

though the poem does mention, "the oysters have no feet." Finally, when the Walrus and Carpenter decide to return home, the Carpenter addresses the oysters, "O oysters," said the Carpenter, "You've had

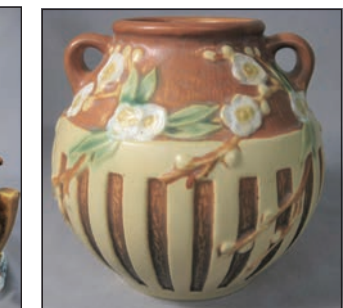

clocks, with 33 individual examples being offered, including the highest-selling clock of the sale. This remarkable example was the 19th century Terry type Connecticut banjo clock. The 30-hour wooden works time and strike movement featured a painted wooden dial with Roman numerals while the mahogany three-section case featured a clear glass dial door with a reverse painted scene. This 35-inch-tall time piece had undergone some restoration, but still greatly exceeded expectations, closing with a high bid of \$5,000. Two nearly identical 19th century Howard 8-day banjo clocks each in a cherry case with “Rosewood” grain paint, reverse painted throat and lower

door glass standing 50 inches tall drew final bids of \$3,750. For a completely different look, there was a 19th century Sawin & Dyer, Boston banjo clock with a painted iron dial, a brass eagle finial over a molded brass dial door and a tapered throat panel with reverse painted glass flanked by brass side arms. This 34-inch-tall example closed at \$3,500. Other beautiful clocks filled out this category, but there was also a novelty banjo clock from the 19th century described as a blinking eye clock. The cast iron clock with porcelain dial featured a 15-inch-tall gent playing a banjo that housed the clock face. It was claimed with a final bid of \$375.

A rare 19th century three-dial Vienna Regulator calendar wall clock drew much excitement. This unusual clock featured day, month, and

date dials in addition to the porcelain main clock face. The mahogany case consisted of a scrolled top, shaped crown, and numerous fine details. This 49-inch tall, highly desirable item finished with a high bid of \$4,500. Sixteen other calendar clocks were also offered.

Two gilded clocks proved to be very popular. First, a late 20th century Ted E. Burleigh “L. Curtis Patent” Girandole wall clock featured an ornate case with painted white body, gilded front, and a carved eagle finial above the circular brass upper door. The convex glass body sported a reverse painted wedding scene entitled “Marriage”. This elaborate 45-inch clock finished with a high bid of \$4,500. The second one was a truly eye-catching 19th century French gilded bronze lyre-shaped clock by “Vincenti, Paris”. The hand-painted floral swags and filigree hands were housed in a marble case with exceptional decoration topped off by a mask of the Sun God Apollo. This incredible,

22-inch-tall masterpiece was claimed with a high bid of \$4,250.

Possibly the oldest clock offered at this auction was a fascinating mid-19th century Timby Solar Timepiece by Lewis E. Whiting. It featured an 8-day brass movement and a Joslin’s 6-inch terrestrial globe which completed one revolution per 24-hour period. There was an orb mounted above to represent the sun and an arrow pointing to the hour as well as the point on the globe where it was high noon. It was all housed in a walnut case with arched top. This 26-inch-tall antique left with a high bid of \$2,000.

There was an attractive selection of wood carved clocks that were in excellent condition. Leading that group was a massive 40-inch-tall late 19th century German carved oak wall clock with chased bronze decoration. The case featured an arched crest, turned columns, foliate carvings and a drop with an applied bronze angel. It is

difficult to describe the complexity of this design, but the buyers were eager to claim it, reaching a high bid of \$1,700.

A small selection of skeleton clocks provided more variety. The turn of the century French “Great Wheel” skeleton clock mounted in a brass frame on a marble base proudly displayed the inner workings of its mechanism. Complete with porcelain chapter ring, cobalt blue border, Roman numerals and gilded filigree hands, this fully exposed specimen drew a final bid of \$1,200. A delightful early 20th century British skeleton clock with brass filigree dial and Roman numerals surrounded by brass Gothic style plates on a marble base presented a very unique display and was happily claimed with a high bid of \$750. A similar, less elaborate Brit-

ish skeleton clock finished at \$475.

Along with the numerous clocks being offered, there were a few music boxes. Most were tabletop models housed in hinged wooden cases, but one stood out from the rest. This floor-standing, 47-inch-tall turn of the century Swiss cylinder music box played eight tunes on each of three 13-inch interchangeable cylinders. The handsome Burl Amboyna case featured rosewood banding and multi-color inlaid floral decoration with mother-of-pearl detail. It required a bid of \$4,000 to own it.

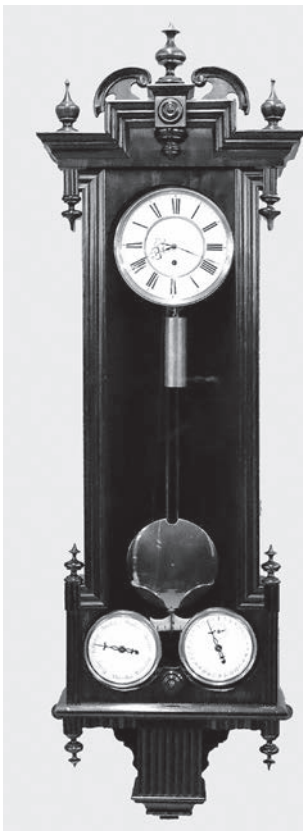

American Legion Post sells Rockwell for \$3.6m

WINCHENDON, Mass. (AP) — A veterans organization in Massachusetts sold an original 1945 Norman Rockwell painting for \$3.6 million at auction in order to raise funds after years of dwindling revenue made worse by the pandemic.

American Legion Post 193, located in Winchendon, acquired the painting through a donation in 1959 from a local priest's art collection. Coral May Grout, a former Post president, said that after weighing whether to sell for nearly two decades, it was time.

"Home for Thanksgiving" depicts a soldier seated beside his mother, who looks at him lovingly while he peels potatoes. It was commissioned for the

Nov. 24, 1945 issue of "The Saturday Evening Post." The auction listing described the painting as "the tale of the first Thanksgiving after the Allies' victory."

The artwork hung near the Legion's main door for years, with most members assuming it was a reproduction. They got the painting appraised in the early 1980s after someone offered to buy it for \$500, the newspaper said. The Norman Rockwell Museum in Stockbridge has since kept it safe, occasionally displaying it in special exhibits.

But faced with the choice of closing the Post permanently or parting with the Rockwell, members decided to sell.

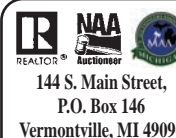

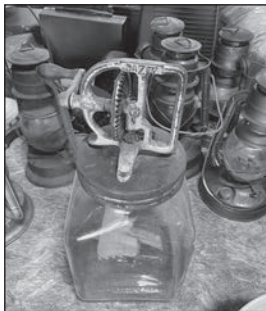
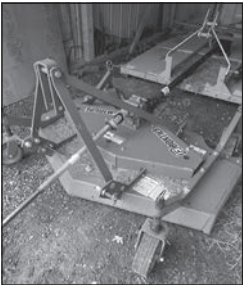

Sand, American Girl Dolls and Risk inducted

ROCHESTER, N.Y. — The record number of nominations has been deciphered and tallied. The national selection committee, a group of a dozen or so objective historians, collectors, and “creative types,” has narrowed the field down to 12 candidates. And the final votes have been cast. Announced the first Thursday of November, the 2021 inductees into the National Toy Hall of Fame, hosted by The Strong National Museum of Play, are (drumroll, please!) American Girl Dolls, Risk, and sand.

The three winners beat out tough competitors, including Battleship and billiards, Cabbage Patch Kids (their fourth time to the “dance,” having been “white hot” in 1983) and Masters of the Universe, Mahjong (no matter how you spell it) and the Fisher-Price Corn Popper (an homage to beginning walkers). In addition to the usual challenges, this year’s winners had to weather a surge from an enthusiastic bloc of supporters hoping to see Hess toy trucks take home the honors.

And that’s not even mentioning piñatas (with origins in, get this, 13th century China and with a name

corrupted from the Italian), as well as something called “The Settlers of Catan,” a 1995 German game that evidently set off a Euro-gaming frenzy.

But back to the honored three. The winning formula for inclusion into the Hall of Fame is four-pronged, according to The Strong’s chief curator, Christopher Bensch: Longevity (at least 20 years continually on the market, thereby appealing to at least two generations), recognizability (“you would know them from a hundred paces away”), play value (of course), and innovation (which “might be the trump card that earns you points and gets you into the Hall

of Fame”).

Founded in 1998, the National Toy Hall of Fame was originally based in a Salem, Oregon, museum. It moved cross country in 2002 to The Strong, located in Rochester, N.Y. As for this year’s winners, Bensch not-

ed, “All three winners are playthings of the imagination,” likely reflecting families spending an increased amount of time together.

A few more statistics: In a normal year, there are somewhere between 5,000

and 8,000 nominations (this year there were approximately 55,000 nominations); last year, some 700 different toys were nominated in write-in ballots, but this year, the number was closer to 940. Might






this be the result of working from home, Bensch queried, or perhaps because of organized lobbying?

Whatever the case, American Girl Dolls, introduced in 1986, are “not just a doll, or a character from a media-driven source,” Bensch said. With accompanying books, they have “a place in history, plus play

value.” Further, he suggested they offer “positive role modeling,” all the while not being “sexualized like so many girls’ toys.” Their “commitment to diversity” was a plus. It was probably unfortunate for Cabbage Patch Kids that they, like American Girl Dolls, were competing for the fourth time (“they have everything it takes to be inducted”).

As for Risk, the board game was also a four-time finalist before this year's induction. Based on the original French game “Le Conquete du Monde,” Risk has undergone “various iterations over the years” that have kept it fresh (think the “Game of Thrones” version). Compared to chess, Bensch suggested, where each game is “a symbolic battle,” Risk, “with a map of the world, makes it graphic. You are taking over the world” (which appeals to inner Bond villains and great general wannabes).

And then there's sand, perhaps the oldest toy in the world. It's free for the taking, if you happen to be at the shore, or cheap when purchased at a home im-

provement store. Wet it, and it's a whole other story, the raw material for fashioning amazing sandcastles on the beach.

Although there were no red carpets and teary-eyed acceptance speeches, the announcement can be viewed on YouTube, complete with thank-you videos from Mattel (for American Girl Dolls) and Hasbro (for Risk). The maker of sand, however, was not available, Bensch laughed. For those wanting to see the National Toy Hall of Fame up-close-and-personal, visitors to The Strong can view a portrait gallery of classic toys, orchestrate a “dazzling music and light show” with the Crayon Piano, and pose in front of an oversized Etch A Sketch. Bensch pointed out that The Strong Museum is only about an hour and a half car's drive away from Niagara Falls. “See two Wonders of the World in one day.”

And, if your favorite didn't make the cut, there's always next year. Voting is already underway at museumplay.org.

Oyster plates

a pleasant run! Shall we be trotting home again?" But answer came there was none. And this was scarcely odd, because they'd eaten everyone."

The poem, in its whole, is considered Carrol's allegory on Victorian values, so it is easy to see how The Walrus and the Carpenter points to not only the eating habits of Victorians, but also their social manners with guests.

As with all things Victo-

rian, if Victorian ladies were going to eat raw oysters, it was expected that they be served in a fitting style. Hence, appropriate tableware was needed, and companies such as Wedgwood, Limoges, Minton, and Haviland responded with extravagant oyster plates. These Victorian oyster plates have remained collectible for over 100 years.

Victorian oyster plates, produced by most factories, came in three basic styles: deep welled plates to provide for oysters on the half shell in a bed of ice; plates

for oysters on the half shell without ice; and plates for oysters without shells.

The depressions allowed for oysters on each plate vary; however, five or six depressions are most common. It is fun to look for plates that contain only a few depressions, such as two or three since these plates are harder to locate. And Victorian oyster plat- ters may contain up to 24 depressions, so the collect- ing field is quite large since the combinations of plat- ters are a smorgasbord themselves.

Oyster plates make spectacular wall displays. With their variety of shapes, patterns, colors, and decorations, few dis- plays offer a more dazzling appearance. Following the Industrial Revolution, Vic- torians developed a broad- er palette of jewel tones to please contemporary patrons. Oyster plates from this era are often found colored in emerald green turquoise, sapphire, blue, pink and yellow.

Due to Majolica's bright colors and unique styling, Majolica oyster plates are often considered the pièces de résistance of any collec- tion. When searching for Majolica plates, look for shell patterns and sea creatures since these are the most popular and bring the best prices. If you decide to add a Majolica plate to your collection, carry a deep pocket while shopping for it. Plates made by famous Majolica makers such as George Jones, Minton, or Wedgwood cost hundreds of dol- lars to purchase today. A signed plate from George Jones would carry a hefty premium. For instance, a sea foam green oyster plate made by Minton around 1870 with six shells and seaweed decoration sells today for about \$1,900, while a nine shell Minton plate, circa 1870 also, with Impressed Minton Mark

sells for about \$2,000. And, if you have some truly seri- ous money to invest, a Min- ton Majolica oyster plate with six fish shells and turquoise center, made in 1883, sells for \$4,000, even when showing wear. So, it is easy to see why collec- tors look for these amazing plates.

Take note that lots of Victorian Majolica oyster plates have been repro- duced in the 20th and now, the 21st centuries. Most of the reproduced ones are lighter in both color and weight and less skillfully decorated than true Victo- rian Majolica.

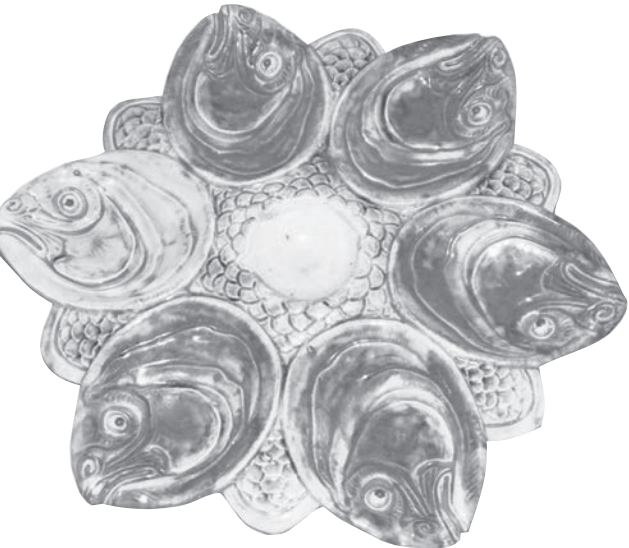
There are some very fine oyster plates from less- er-known factories, some with unusual Majolica designs. These might be worth looking for, but again, if the plate is not signed, how do you truly know its origin? Unmarked plates should always be less expensive.

As with all collectibles, condition and rarity set the price of Victorian oyster plates. Look for plates in mint condition if you want to be able to resell them later.

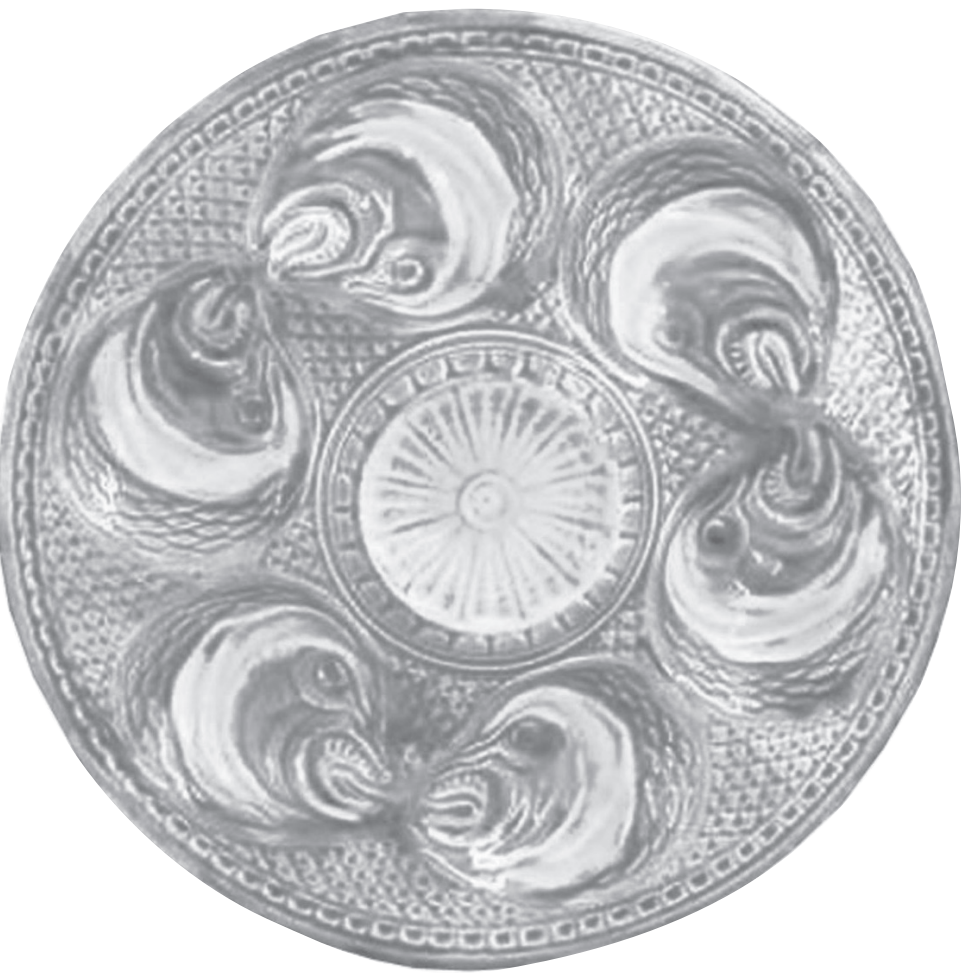
Right: This rare President Hayes "Turkey" oyster plate by Haviland Limoges of France is valued in the range of \$760 - \$2,000.
