Tall ships dropped anchor at the Cleveland waterfront

CLEVELAND, Ohio — It was the romance of the sea on the Cleveland waterfront July 7-10. The four-day maritime Tall Ships festival made its second stop along the Great Lakes. Visitors could view, go aboard, and even sail on a fleet of

seven classically-rigged replica and restored ships from the U.S., Canada, and Spain.

The Cleveland event was one of a series promoted by Tall Ships America. The non-profit, founded in Newport, Rhode Island, in 1973 focuses on youth education and leadership development through mari-

time education and preservation. Its mission is to, "Encourage character building through sail training, promote sail training to the North American public, and support education under sail." The U.S. Congress officially recognized Tall Ships America as the national sail training organization representing the United States.

Tall Ships America works with over 100 tall ship operators, and with host ports in the Great Lakes, and the Atlantic and Pacific coasts of the United States and Canada. In addition to sponsoring maritime festivals like Cleveland's, the organization holds sailing races, cruises, and educational events. Vessels are often crewed by young people and adults engaged in sail training programs, under the

FEATURE **Courtland left little history; but plenty of toys**

Although much of the 20th century was captured in more media hype than any other things, considered unimportant by social historians, have been lost for-

ever. The history and social significance of some 20th century toy manufacturers is a case in point.



fireworks at the harbor, illuminating the ship masts.

The lineup of tall ships was impressive. The local favorite was the U.S. Brig Niagara, an accurate reproduction of Commodore Oliver Hazard Perry's victorious flagship at the Battle of Lake Erie during the War of 1812. Maryland's Pride of Baltimore II drew a similar crowd. The replica 1812 Baltimore Clipper replaced the earlier Pride, sadly lost to a storm off Puerto Rico in 1986.

Also docked was the NAO Trinidad, a replica of Ferdinand Magellan's flagship during the first circumnavigation of the globe 525 years ago. Next to it sat The Empire Sandy, a 200-foot topsail schooner, built in England in 1943 and which now calls Canada home.

Included with the ticket was boarding on Cleveland's museum ship William G. Mather, a 618foot Great Lakes freighter built in 1925. Visitors could tour the freighter from stern to stern, seeing the cargo holds, pilot house, elegant guest quarters, crew areas, and four-story engine room. Entrance to another museum ship - the World

War II era USS Cod submarine - was also included. Plus, the U.S. Coast Guard cutter Hollyhock made a port call and was open periodically for tours.

A limited number of 75-minute day sails and 2-hour twilight sails were available at extra cost aboard a selection of smaller traditionally-rigged sailing vessels. Two that sailed were Bay City Michigan's 85-foot Appledore IV schooner and Sutton Bay Michigan's 77-foot Inland Seas.

Complementing the ship lineup was a multitude of food trucks, vendors, and artisans offering everything from face painting to festival-themed merchandise. Notably under-represented were maritime-themed crafts - and absent were dealers selling any kind of nautical antiques. Only two vendors had maritime merchandise. One of them was the sponsor; the other operated from a mobile boutique bedecked like a pirate ship. Both offered strictly new merchandise. Event sponsors seem to be receptive to potential new vendors, pointing to opportunities for nautical and related antiques and collectibles dealers to participate in the next show (scheduled for 2025).







father of Walter Reach, who was born in 1905. Since Erwin is indicated as the manager of the company, perhaps Walter was not the official founder of Courtland Toys. It is known that Walter married a woman named Marie, but children from that union could not be found either, so the exact family history involved with Courtland Toys is unknown.

It is known that sometime after the fire, Courtland Toys was relocated to Philadelphia. The fire and loss of merchandise and building may have led directly to the relocation of the company.

History does indicate Courtland Toys began by making die-cut cardboard/wooden toys, using lithographed paper images on the thick cardboard. Courtland's first two toys were a die-cut cardboard rabbit and cart and a diecut horse and cart, which are both highly collectible today.

1944 was a tough year to open a toy company; although, with the war's end hopefully in sight, the future must have looked bright for the company. Unfortunately the only material available for toys was cardboard, since metal and even wood materials were still being used strictly for the war effort.

Following the war, Courtland immediately began manufacturing tin toys with color-lithographed images. In the

toy market in an attempt to raise its productivity to pre-war heights.

As tin toys became Courtland's stock and trade, many of them had wind-up mechanisms (motors) in them to make the toy move. At the height of Courtland's popularity, roughly 1947 -1948, the company's sales surpassed \$1.5 million, and $_{\rm the}$ company employed over 600 workers.

After nearly 80 years, Internet auction sites such as eBay, are full of Courtland toy trucks in excellent condition that are relatively inexpensive to buy, making Courtland toys fabulous collectibles. If you are tempted to pay top dollar for a Courtland toy truck, make sure the wind-up mechanism still works.


The majority of Courtland's toy trucks have the Courtland logo on them, making field identification quite easy. Most often the logo was stenciled on the truck's cab doors.

nism came with a Motor Guarantee: "If the motor of this toy should ever cease to operate in a satisfactory manner, remove and return the motor to the factory with 15c to cover cost of handling, packing, and shipping. We will either put this motor in working condition or replace it with a new motor."

There is no doubt that Walter Reach had a vision. Like many mid-century toy makers, his toy designs and determination made him a leader in America's toy markets. Reach directly competed against J. Chein and Louis Marx, among others, as the largest producers of tin lithographed toys in the












Gas prices curbed shoppers at this year's Route 40 Yard Sale

The regional yard sale season is upon us. Several have already wrapped up for the year, including the National Road/Route 40 Yard Sale which ran from June 1-5. All told, the multi-day, multi-state sale came off successfully. Idyllic weather kept shoppers out all four days and there was plenty of activity.

Solid promotion set the stage for a successful event. The main Facebook page for the sale, the "Historic National Road Yard Sale - US 40 Sales" had nearly weekly postings dating back to February. Other Facebook pages and groups, like the 4,500-member "Historic National Road Yard Sale Festival - US 40 Sales and Information" provided abundant information on where shoppers could find individual sales during their travels.

While there was plenty in its favor, the sale and its participants were influenced by economic realities. Post-pandemic inflation seemed to have prodded more sellers than usual to participate. Budget-squeezed buyers were unashamedly after bargains, while gas prices and other rising costs may have led many to curtail shopping or even cancel their plans.

What was most apparent this year was the heightened number of sellers. In just one sixmile rural stretch between Springfield and Donnelsville, Ohio, more than a dozen sales were spotted.

Very likely, the proliferation stemmed from families taking advantage of the sale to generate extra income. Whether inflation drew out sellers or not, buyers were enthusiastic over the turnout.

The number of sellers was complemented by the volume of the merchandise available for sale. There were, of course, the typical household items and baby clothes - which many people were seeking. Yet, antiques and other collectibles were also abundant. Whether it was inexpensive vintage glassware, antique furniture, or even high-dollar collectible cars,

plenty was available.

By way of a few examples, just past the western edge of Springfield, one seller had a 1960s Sears tandem bike, in restorable condition, for \$50. On a rural stretch heading into Donnelsville, another sell-

er offered a 12-tin, squarenailed primitive jelly cupboard for \$200. A military collectibles dealer near New Carlisle had a vintage three-wheel Harley-Davidson for \$15,000.

Although sellers were plentiful, many of them reported less-than-stellar traffic. Historically, the Route 40 event attracts throngs of shoppers to most sale locations. This year, whether it was down a rural road at a barn sale or alongside a collection of houses, only one or two people were typically present. When others arrived, it wasn't in clusters like in previous years; instead, it

was typically a sole vehicle stopping.

For small businesses like National Antiques in New Carlisle, the scarcity of shoppers was glaring. Owner Larry Greene said he gets a big bump in business during the sale - usually five figures worth. This year, things didn't appear anywhere on track for that. Even individual sellers noticed the drop. One, near Vandalia Ohio, said traffic was way down compared to previous years. For her, Friday was particularly disappointing. Fortunately, like many, she noted that Thursday had been reasonably busy.

Undoubtedly, record high fuel prices applied some pressure.

Fortunately, patrons seemed to be buying. It was rare to see someone browse a sale and leave empty-handed. Repeatedly, shoppers vocalized how happy they were to snag a bargain on something they needed. For LeeAnn Demers of Lee's Dragonfly Boutique, business was brisk, and people were enthusiastically buying. It didn't hurt that much of her merchandise was vintage clothing - and sold from an alluring trailer-turned-boutique parked in her driveway. Like the seller in Vandalia, Demers noted Thursday's traffic was actually better than Friday's.

In 2021, the Route 40 Yard Sale benefitted from people's post-Covid pent-up desire to get out. This year, the sale took an odd turn it was fruitful for some, yet disappointing for others. Perhaps next year "normal" will be part of our vocabulary again, and regional yard sales like the Historic National Road/Route 40 Yard Sale will get back to their routine.
