Jaymar puzzles and dolls provide hours of fun


Jacob Marx, father of famed toy maker Louis Marx, founded the Jaymar Specialty Company,

along with his son Da- ing wooden puzzles. vid and daughter Rose, in the 1920s. Located at 200 Fifth Avenue in New York City, Jaymar specialized in wood jointed string dolls and interlock-


Jaymar manufactured wood jointed string dolls from the late 1920s until just after about 1952. Most of these dolls were character pieces, repre-

senting radio characters or cartoon characters of the time; although, generic dolls, such as ostrich, sailor, pelican, and witch can be found. Mickey Mouse, Popeye, Puss 'n' Boots, Amos and Andy, and Little Orphan Annie are just a few of the famous Jaymar dolls. The majority of the character faces were stamped on, not hand painted.

These simple, wooden toys were held together using small, cloth-covered rubber cords, which ran inside the arms and legs. Unlike Schoenhut, who also made such dolls, Jaymar terminated each end of its rubber cord with a small metal ring or

Pair of Percheron mares pull a \$2,600 bid with Goebel

PLYMOUTH, IND. — An 8 year old's reaction to her mother's \$2,600 bid was the highlight of a recent auction conducted by Sam and Dave Goebel of Oak Crest Auctions.

The young horse lover became the new owner of horses, Belle and Babe, for her 4-H project. She was jumping up and down and ting a good home, but once made no effort to contain her excitement as she went to pet her new hors-This pair of dapple-gray Percheron mares were 18 and 19 years old. They were machinery trained to pull with harnesses and were sold together. Knowing they were up to giving hay rides and sleigh rides, just sweetened the deal for young Paisley. A pair of harnesses for the horses sold for \$600 and the col-

lars went for \$250. This will be her first year in 4-H and if her enthusiasm continues, she will go a long way with Belle and Babe at her side. Knowing they were going to a great home also helped owner John Childs to feel better about selling them. This pair had been with Childs for a long time and he was worried about them getthey were sold and he saw how excited Bowerson was, he knew he didn't have to worry about them anymore.

John and Phyllis Childs had two properties and had decided to consolidate into just one home. There was a lot to sell as they were not only selling personal household items; they were selling a home and 45 acres of land. The Yellow River ran through part of the land and the

woods that stood on the property made it more appealing. There was a 30 by 50 foot pole barn with two lean-tos, a 16 by 49 foot pole building, two metal storage buildings, and several utility sheds. John Childs had purchased this acreage in 2006 and had enjoyed living on the all organic-certified land

Goebel decided to auction the property in two tracts, and then together as one unit, then sell for the highest price. Tract one consisted of the house and outbuildings and 10 acres of land. Tract two was made up of 35 acres ofwoods. The first bid was an impressive \$100,000



for tract one and it rose to \$230,000 before the auctioneer switched over to tract two. With the Yellow River giving frontage on

these 35 acres, the price just kept rising. After the bidding was closed on tract two, the auctioneer added the two bid prices

together for a total of \$355, 00. And then he opened the bidding back up for the entire 45 acres.

eyelet. These wooden treasures measured from 4.75 inches tall up to 10.75 inches tall.

Stamped on the bottom of a doll's foot is "Made in USA," and the doll's name, such as" Betty Boop," is often stamped on the doll's body.

Today, collectors cherish these toys. A Jaymar wood jointed doll can easily cost \$300 or more, and they often bring as much as \$500 or more at auction. This seems excessive, but these prices have been tested on the secondary market for years, and they still hold up well. If you find a Jaymar wooden string doll at an estate sale, consider buying it since the potential for profit is excellent.

Beginning around 1942 and continuing un-

til the company closed its doors, the Jaymar Specialty Company also manufactured beautiful cardboard puzzles. One of its most prized puzzle themes was its "Modern


Fighters for Victory," which depicted pictures of modern weapons and fighting men, including puzzles depicting the "Bombing of Tokyo." These interlocking puzzles, many of them containing 300 or more pieces, are highly sought after today both as Jaymar collectibles and as early jigsaw puzzle collectibles.

During World War II, many raw materials, especially metals, were rationed, and many toy companies were forbidden to use metal in production of toys. As a result, most of the toys of this era were made of paper and wood. Jaymar Specialty Company become one of the major niche manufacturers of jigsaw puzzles, figurines, pianos and other wooden toys, such as its dolls, keeping it a viable company during the lean war

Although the Jaymar Specialty Company operated from the 1920s until 1990 when it closed its doors, it was not in direct competition with Louis Marx and Company, owned by the more famous Marx child — Louis. Louis Marx pro-

duced tin lithographed metal toys and Jacob and Rose Marx manufactured wooden toys, so, if anything, the two companies served to complement each other, often sharing office space, sales personnel, and distributors.

Jaymar is not as famous as Louis Marx, but Jaymar was influential in the American toy market. For instance, Jaymar was instrumental in promoting the popularity of the wooden yo-yo, serving for more than

20 years as the distributor for Duncan yo-yos. Jaymar also held the Disney license for die cut, cardboard jigsaw puzzles during the late 1940s and much of the 1950s. And Jaymar held a Disney license allowing the company to produce Mickey Mouse wooden, string jointed dolls.

When new, during the Great Depression years of the 1930s, Jaymar's colorful wooden dolls cost about a dime, which seemed high to a lot of

poor parents at the time. But children spent hours playing and laughing with these tiny, elastic dolls, making the poverty of the Depression years so much easier to endure for thousands of children.

Today, collectors still smile when they see a Jaymar jigsaw puzzle or wooden doll, knowing they are looking at a piece of American's toy history, and hoping to add another valuable Jaymar toy to their collections.



"We're going to the bank," said Childs with a huge relaxed grin as the auctioneer marked the property sold for \$365,000 for both tracts combined.

Once the home and property had been sold, the auction moved inside the house to sell the contents. A Whirlpool washer and gas dryer were sold with the high bidder having the option to take one or both. It took a bid of \$275 to be that top bidder and he quickly said he wanted both. The Gibson refrigerator and freezer combination sold for \$80 and the LP Maytag gas stove with five burners sold for \$90.

A nice Ethan Allen dining table and chairs sold for \$50, and a beautiful china hutch brought a high bid of \$185. This unit had glass doors on top and two drawers in the middle. There were two additional doors on the bottom of this mint condition hutch.

A bedroom set consisted of a mirrored dresser, the queen bed, a nightstand and a tall boy dresser. It was a gorgeous set that looked like it had seen very little use. With the bidding on this set rising, Auctioneer Sam Goebel said, "We got a new dog on the track," as a new bidder joined in. For 100 years Madame Alexander dolls have delighted

"A child's doll is precious. It is a friend who shares her secrets, joys, and sorrows. . . something beautiful that is a joy forever." — Madame Alexander

Madame Alexander was the grand dame of dollmaking. From the debut of her first dolls in 1923, New York-born Beatrice Alexander made it to the top of the toy heap, and continued to reign supreme. Under her guidance, fairy tale figures such as "Sleeping Beauty," fictional favorites like "Anne of Green Gables," and newsmakers of the day (Dionne Quintuplets), achieved doll immortality. Alexander dolls ran the gamut of popular culture, and, as Madame herself put it, "once you have one, you will want to have another until vou have collected friends from all around the wide, wide world."

Born in 1895, Beatrice Alexander seemed predestined for her future career — the family lived above her stepfather's doll hospital. In a rare 1978 recording for collectors, Madame Alexander recalled her humble beginnings:

"As far back as I can recall, I have always been surrounded with dolls. When my father came to America, he brought with him the profession of doll repair, which he learned in Germany. People came from far and wide. The doll hospital was located on the East Side of New York. I can still see the tearful faces of the children holding their broken dolls. Although we were in limited circumstances, we were never poor. Our lives were filled with love and appreciation. I learned

then something I have never forgotten: how important a doll is to a child's world.

"We could hardly get by on the income from the doll hospital alone, so we bought shopworn sample dolls from the German representatives. My mother would clean them, comb their hair, and make them as presentable as possible, and we would sell them in our shop.

"After the first World War began, the importation of all dolls ceased, and we found ourselves with no dolls to sell. They always say 'necessity is the mother of invention,' and it certainly was true in our family! To help my parents, I designed my first dolls that year. They were a little Red Cross nurse, and a baby doll. The demand for them was so great, my father had to work day and night to fill the orders. This helped them through the most difficult times.





"When my child was ten years old, I made my first step into the commercial field. My little daughter was the inspiration for my first commercial baby doll. We called her 'Billie,' and this is how the Alexander doll began.

"Throughout the passing years, the style and composition of my dolls have changed, but one thing remains the same: the doll must be sturdy and beautiful."

Beatrice Alexander's first dolls (beautiful, but nearly impossible to find today) were of cloth. Next up: "composition" dolls, also beautiful, but, as their cracked faces will testify, not particularly high on the sturdiness ladder. Then, in the years following World War II came the innovation that cemented the Alexander reputation for durability: the hard plastic doll, beloved by baby boomers everywhere.

Throughout career, Madame Alexander was a canny entrepreneur, ready to capitalize on the trendsetters of the day. Her were headline-grabbers

globe. the Madame Alexander made sure her tiny fans could acquire their own set of authorized quint dolls, releasing varied versions of the famous five. Some even came with accessories: sleep baskets, a wooden bed, and a rendition of their physician, Dr. Dafoe.

Multiples proved an Alexander specialty: for the 1953 coronation of Queen Elizabeth II, a set of three dozen renditions of the Queen-to-be and her entourage were released. "First Ladies of the United States" in their inaugural gowns provided an ongoing treasure trove of possibilities, as well as the basis for a lavish 1976 Smithsonian exhibition in honor of America's Bicentennial.

Over the years, Madame Alexander dolls encompassed almost every imaginable category. There were "Storyland Dolls," such as "Alice in Wonderland" and "Snow White". "Friends From Many Lands" were decked out in their native costumes ("how wonderful it would be if each of us could have a friend in every country in the whole wide world!"). "Portraits of History", such as Josephine and

by the colorful past." "Portrait Dolls" ("as elegant as the finest portrait taken from the masters"), included representations of works by Monet. Toulouse Lautrec, and Goya, while "Dolls From The Opera" featured such fiery divas "Carmen" as"Salomé (each "glamorgowned ously coiffed").

Some subjects called for more than one interpretation. A slew of "Little Women"-inspired dolls depicted them in everything from aproned at-home wear to full winter apparel, including ice skates.

Generics also proved staples of the Alexander line. There were "Beautiful Baby Dolls," including the perennially popular "Pussycat" and "Puddin" ("so real to look at and feel"). The "exquisite girl doll," "Elise," was often outfitted as a ballerina, a bridesmaid, or now and then a bride. "Wendy Ann," a young girl doll, particularly proved resilient, equally at home in a frilly party dress, or in playclothes pulling a Radio Flyer wagon.

Once the traditional inventory had been worked through, there was one more doll need-Napoleon were "inspired ed to complement a

Early Alexander dolls (and even their clothing) can be pricey, at times running into thousands of dollars. More recent dolls are more reasonably priced: 21-inch dolls top the price list in the low hundreds, followed by 14-inchers, and the 8-inch "Alexander-kins," introduced in 1953. Find one in its original blue box (as you often will), and your shopping day is complete.

As durable as the she created, dolls Beatrice Alexander continued to spearhead the Alexander Doll Company well into her nineties, passing away in 1990. Her dolls, however, continue to live on, through vintage inven-

tory and collector clubs, as well as through new from releases still-thriving company. The dolls that delighted baby-boomers, (and their mothers, and perhaps their grandmothers as well), continue to delight the collectors of today, who appreciate their imaginative themes and beautifully detailed quality—the heritage of Madame Beatrice Alexander.

"Some people think that dolls are only for children," said Madame Alexander. "They are wrong. You must never underestimate the marvelous ability to appreciate beauty wherever you find it, in dolls and in life. We must always look for what is fine and beautiful in every person."
