ACROSS THE AUCTION BLOCK

14-foot vintage sailboat floats away with \$2,800 bid

West Olive, Mich. — The owner of a recent collection offered by Finders Keepers Auctions evidently had a wide

range of interests. This 500-lot auction was conducted at the Lakeshore Event Center in West Olive. Tressa Mills monitored the online portion with over 600 people

viewing it and auctioneer Dale Flokstra, of Dale's Auctioneering, handled the live auction for the crowd gathered there. Prices do not include the buyer's premium.

The highest bid of the day went to a sailboat with trailer. The vintage boat was a single mast wood vessel 14 feet long in excellent condition. It sold for \$2,800. An 18 foot partially restored Boston Whaler brand boat in good condition but needing a motor was offered along with an excellent trailer and was taken with a high bid of \$550.

Quality art was well represented, starting with the Frederic Remington bronze figure titled "Bronco Buster".

This figure of a bucking horse with a cowboy on its back was mounted on a marble base and stood 24 inches tall by 16 inches long. It bore the name "Frederic Remington" and the numbers 34/100

on the base. Listed in excellent condition, it was eagerly claimed with a final bid of \$2,000. Moving to a more ancient period, there was a carved stone head, listed as possibly of Aztec origin, that

was mounted on a post secured in a plastic base. The eyes were closed, and the nose and mouth were very broad. It measured 6 inches tall by 3 inches

Beech-Nut Peanut Butter still tickles collectors' palates

March 1 was National Peanut Butter Lover's Day, which was first celebrated on March 1, 1990. This date commemorated the anniversary of when peanut butter made its commercial debut in the United States. Up until

this time, peanut butter had been available in the US only as the hand-made variety.

One theory on the origin of peanut butter suggests that, in the 1840s, a New York woman, Rose Davis, began making peanut butter after her son witnessed a Cuban woman grinding peanuts and smearing the smooth peanut paste on bread. Marcellus Gilmore Edson is credited with being the first person to patent, in 1884, a peanut butter paste. In March 1890, an unnamed doctor was given credit for being the first doctor to provide peanut butter to his patients who had difficulty chewing. And

in 1904, Beech-Nut became the first major food brand to market and sell peanut butter.

Beech-Nut's roots go back to 1891 when Raymond Lipe and John Zieley funded The Imperial Packing Company in Canajoharie, New York. The company's first product was Beech-Nut ham. In 1899 the company was incorporated as the Beech-Nut Packing Company. Early engineers with Beech-Nut patented the first vacuum jar, with a design that included a gasket and top that remained sealed in transit. This jar became a standard in the food industry and directly led to the creation of Beech-Nut Peanut Butter.

Beech-Nut became the major manufacturer

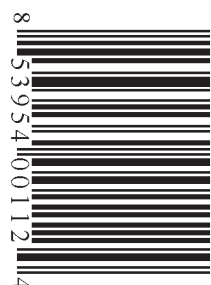
of peanut butter in the early 20th century. The company quickly followed with jams, jellies, pork and beans, and catsup. By the early 1960s, Beech-Nut was a popular chewing gum.

In 1915, during the Golden Age of Beech-

Nut Peanut Butter, a Beech-Nut magazine ad read: "In the age of Domestic Study, the feeding of children has changed—wholly for the better. Nowadays the Mother consults a child's tastes—knowing that a Beech-Nut pea-

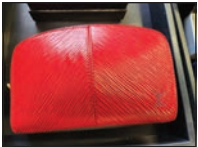
nut butter sandwich, for instance, is all the more nutritious because it appeals to the palate." And a 1923 Beech-Nut advertisement in the People's Home Journal seemingly

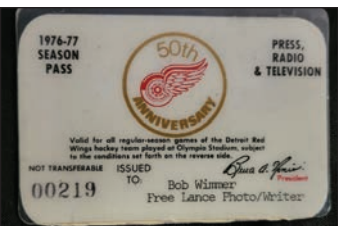

wide and this unusual curiosity was taken with a high bid of \$500. For something completely different, a sample of original art embellished a standard red car door. There were five cowboy boots, each uniquely decorated, bearing images of a hula girl, a colorful parrot, a VW bus, a palm tree, and a flamingo. This creative display was taken with a high bid of \$350.

Antiques that once served a useful purpose were also plentiful, and most were in very good condition. A sturdy ash burl bowl measuring 16 inches wide was presented as a Native American hand carved specimen. It had an old repair to the rim, but that did not

deter bidders who drove the final bid to \$425. A fascinating collection of Roman and Egyptian glass dating back to the first to third century CE contained various interesting items. They included a 6 inch long Roman green glass double unguentarium (a bot-

tle used for ointments, perfumes, or balms), along with other bottles and jars. Most were intact and it required a bid of \$375 to claim the lot. Tall wood racks on wheels drew \$175-275 bids while an antique step back style oak postal sorting table, consisting of numerous compartments and standing 65 inches tall, drew a \$250 bid.

Spool cabinets are always popular, and those featured here were no exception. A handsome 5-drawer walnut spool cabinet from the Willimantic Linen Company of Willimantic, Conn., stood 16 inches tall and 28 inches wide. The company switched from linen cloth production to cotton thread and this unit likely dated to the late 1800s. The original yellow and black decal with the slogan “Willimantic the best thread for sewing machines” remained intact on one side. In very good condition, this treasure was claimed with a final bid of \$425. An attractive 11-inch-tall oak 3-drawer spool cabinet with brass draw-

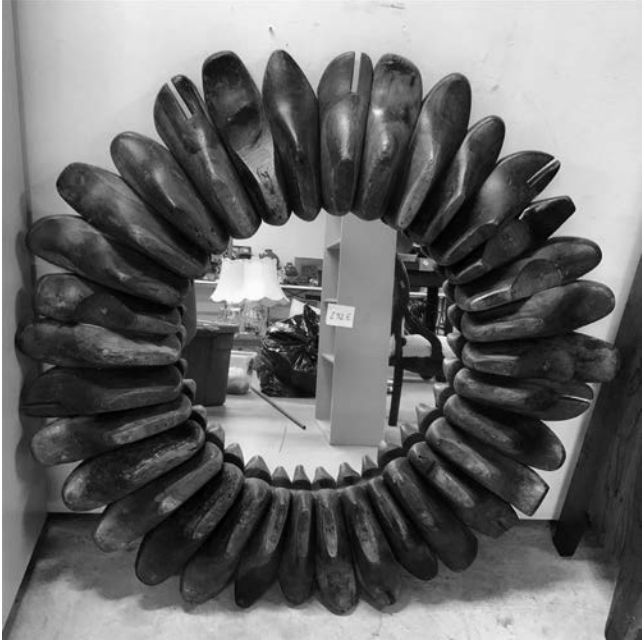
er pulls and drawer face tin inserts labeled “R.B.”, “Braid”, and “Dress” was taken with a final bid of \$250. Two others sold for \$90 each. A similar 5-drawer oak Jessen & Rosberg watchmaker cabinet standing 14 inches tall drew a \$150 bid.

Decorative accessories were very attractively presented and appreciated by the bidders. A bold vintage galleon model ship in excellent condition housed inside a large wood and glass showcase commanded a final bid of \$200. Three decorative tiles from Pewabic Pottery of Detroit, Mich., Motawi Tileworks Ann Arbor, Mich., and Tyge Tile Traverse City, Mich., left together to embellish a new home with a final bid of \$175. Another lot consisting of two large handmade Pewabic tiles drew a final bid of \$150, and an eight-inch tall Motawi Tileworks hummingbird decorative handmade tile also drew a \$150 bid. A fragile 10 inch tall Italian Murano glass vase consisting of blues and greens was taken with a high bid of \$175.

Smoking pipe collectors had a field day at this auction with several unusual options to choose from. The most popular lot consisted of four pipes, including one displaying an intricately carved man’s head with a flowing mustache. This selection cleared a final bid of \$225. A delightful collection of 27 pipes of various sizes and shapes was taken with a high bid of \$200. A horn-shaped pipe described as a “Sherlock Holmes pipe” proved popular drawing a final bid of \$175. There was also a light wood pipe with a woman carved on the front simi-

lar to a maidenhead, or figurehead on the front of a wood ship. This eye-catching option left with an \$80 bid. A beautiful hand-turned, full size wood cowboy hat created from Norway maple was signed by artist Robert Sloan, 2008, and left with a bid of \$250. A smaller one went for \$125. Then there was a

unique round wall mirror that was surrounded by 33 antique wood shoe forms. This extremely heavy accessory measured 41 inches in diameter and was claimed with a high bid of \$80. Ray Tosch is inducted into MAA Hall of Fame

MOUNT PLEASANT, Mich. – The late Ray Tosch from Tosch Auction Services in Capac, Michigan, was recently enshrined in the Michigan Auctioneers Association Hall of Fame. The prestigious honor is bestowed after a rigorous qualification process and ultimately voted by the Hall of Fame committee. Being inducted into the Hall of Fame is the highest recognition any auctioneer can receive in the auction industry.

“Several qualified candidates were nominated, but one former member stood out from the pack – and that was Ray Tosch. Sadly, Mr. Tosch passed away in 2014, but the Hall of Fame committee felt strongly that this man deserved a place in the Michigan Auctioneers Association Hall of Fame. His reputation within the industry and community was impeccable, and his contributions to the Michigan Auctioneers Association will forever be appreciated. Importantly, several members of his family were present during the induction, and they were taken aback by the warm reception Mr. Tosch received after all these

years.” Said Executive Director and fellow Hall of Famer, Tricia Wiltjer.

Tosch was born in 1929. While working on his parents 2,500-acre farm, he became a real estate broker and sold farm and industrial equipment. In 1955, he graduated from Reisch Auction College in Mason City, Iowa, and worked with one of the most prominent auctioneers in the livestock auction industry, CB Smith, from Williamston, Michigan. Meanwhile, he established Ray Tosch and Associates. His son, Ron, would join him in 1977, along with his son Bobby.

He was a longtime Capac State Bank board member, and a lifetime member of the Michigan Auctioneers Association. He was universally known as “a man of his word” with time, money, and knowledge. He aided the Boy Scouts of America, Capac area churches, private schools, and more. He worked for nearly 60 years as a professional auctioneer and conducted approximately 4,000 auctions in his lifetime.

His most significant contribution to the Michigan Auctioneers

Association came in the 1950s when the association was in dire financial straits, and the future of the association was bleak. Stan Perkins motioned that the association sell Life Memberships to provide instant relief. The motion passed, and three members, Stan Perkins, CB Smith, and Ray

Tosch contributed. Seventy years later, the Michigan Auctioneers Association is thriving, and it is one of the most successful associations in the country.

Thousands of auctioneers have become members of the Michigan Auctioneers Association.

besmirched other peanut butter companies when Beech-Nut advertised, "No shells or skins, no stones or broken kernels, find their way into this flavor-some Beech-Nut product."

During World War II "monkey butter" became a slang term for all peanut butter. This term supposedly originated when a monkey visited the Kellogg's laboratory one day and dipped his banana into a jar of peanut butter. Human's have been ape over the combination of peanut butter and bananas ever since. It is well-known that Elvis Presley loved a peanut

butter and banana sandwich. A sandwich he first tried after hearing the monkey butter legend.

Some facts concerning peanut butter include—it takes about 540 peanuts to make a 12-ounce jar of peanut butter, and Americans spend almost \$800 million a year on peanut butter.

Today, collectors consider Beech-Nut Peanut Butter cross collectible since it attracts several categories of collectors.

Vintage magazine ads are the largest category of Beech-Nut Peanut Butter collectibles, but patient collectors will find different Beech-Nut Peanut Butter jars and signs too. The signs all date to the second decade of the 20th century, and the signs are mostly

Butter advertising available, be aware that most of it is reprints on poster board. These make wonderful wall displays but know what you are buying since decorative poster board signs are not as valuable as authentic signs or advertising.

The sweet sounds of the 1970s live on in albums

Earlier this year, the music world lost Burt Bacharach, one of the most prolific songwriters of the 20th century. It's hard to imagine the number of his songs that people know by heart. Bacharach's work stretched back to the 1950s but he is best remembered for his contribution to the sounds of the 1970s. Arguably his most famous tune, "Raindrops Keep Fallin' on My Head," hit number 1 in 1970. His other chart-toppers included Jackie DeShannon's, "What the World Needs Now," handfuls of songs like "Walk on By" written for Dionne Warwick, and "Close to You" for the Carpenters.

Just months before Bacharach's death, another 70s icon, Olivia Newton-John, lost her extended battle with cancer. While she may be best known for her role in the musical Grease, it was angelic songs like, "I Honestly

Love You" and "Have You Never Been Mellow" that endeared legions of fans. Burt Bacharach and Oliva Newton John were

part of a generation of astonishingly talented musicians who helped create what we now call soft rock or easy listening. Singer/songwriters of the 70s most often wrote, sang, and played their own material - taking transcendent themes like first flames, coming of age, and tragic loss, and turning them into some of the greatest lyrical poetry ever recorded. That genius didn't come out of the bubble gum 50s nor the counterculture of the 60s. It began disappearing in the 80s when popular music turned vapid.

Easy listening is often scoffed at, yet its influence is profound. If you are unconvinced, chase down a 70s ballad on YouTube and check the statistics. Most have millions of views and

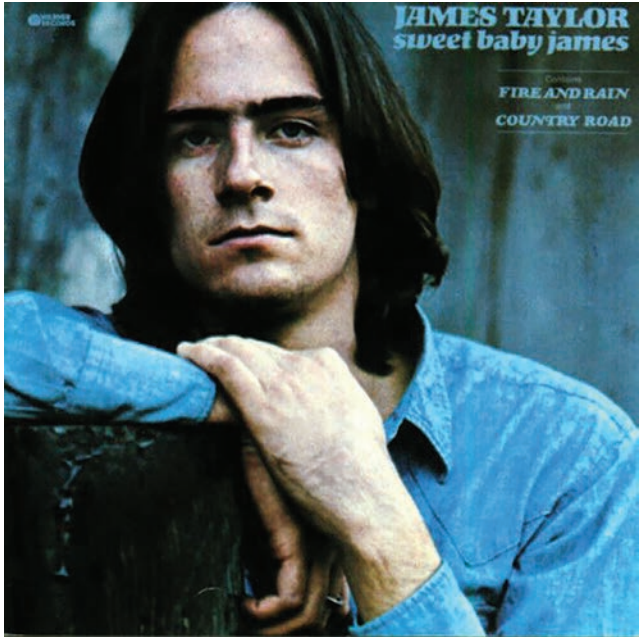
comments running thousands deep. Read the comments, and you will discover how impactful those songs can be. Grown men openly admit to tears upon hearing a verse forever linked to a life event. Millennials proclaim they were born in the wrong decade. Commenters express gratitude for words that carried them through life. As one person so eloquently proclaimed, "Thank God I heard

angels and poets who gave their gifts through the most amazing music..." If you would like to bring home some of that artistry, here's some inspiration: ... Winter, spring, summer, or fall...all you have to do is call...

Carole King has blessed the world with an astounding number of songs. Not commonly known, she wrote popular 60s tunes like "Up on the Roof" and "The Loco-Motion." She even wrote for the Beatles. But it was the emotion-laden songs she penned during the 70s that became cherished. Many appeared on her classic 1971 album Tapestry. The dozen tunes are resplendent - but one simple lyric stands out - "you've got a friend."

...I've seen fire and I've seen rain... James Taylor wrote "Fire and Rain" dealing with the tragic suicide of a childhood friend. It first appeared on the 1970 album Sweet Baby James. On a later album, alongside Carly Simon, Taylor beseeched listeners to, "Shower the people you love with love." In between, he took listeners down country roads, exalted his native North Carolina, and wove a south-of-the-border fantasy. Start a collection with the 1975 James Taylor's Greatest Hits which holds many of his iconic songs. ...Hey, have you ever tried, really reaching out for the other side... It opens with crystal clear guitar that makes listeners pause. By mid-tune, instrumentation segues to dreamy violin. Perhaps no band embraced romantic ballads better than David Gates and Bread - their lyrics and melody are simply enchanting. "Make it With You" has

been a lover's aria for five decades. Other touching tracks include "Lost Without Your Love" and "Anything I Own," in which Gates speaks of the heartache of losing his father. The best of Bread Volume 1 compiled in 1973 and Volume 2 from 1974 are good places to begin a collection of their work.

...There's a warm
wind blowin' the stars
around and I'd really
love to see you tonight...

England Dan and John Ford Coley were one of the most recognized songwriting duos of the 70s. They gifted the world with unforgettable tunes like "I'd Really Love to See You Tonight," "Nights are Forever Without You," and "We'll Never Have To Say Goodbye Again." Their second single, "Love is the Answer" released in 1976, went to gold in months. Their albums, *Nights are Forever* (1976), *Dowdy Ferry Road* (1977), *Some Things Don't Come Easy* (1979) and *Dr. Heckle and Mr. Jive* (1979) are all definitive
