Toy tractors harvested sizeable bids at Sheridan sale

LESLIE, Mich. Collectors of farm toys and diecast vehicles had a field day on March 2 during Sheridan Realty and Auction Company's toy tractor and shop tool liquidation auction. 540 lots were offered online via bid.com, spanning everything from a vintage horse-drawn buggy to hundreds of diecast tractors and vehicles, to enough tools to fill a International Harvester garage.

card was toy tractors. More than 160 lots held models in every scale from 1/16 to 1/87, from makers like ERTL, Toy Farmer, and company

The highest sum for a model tractor lot went to a complete set of 18 vintage 1/64scale toy tractors. The collec-The auction's calling tion sold for \$181.50 on 21 bids. Coming close at \$170.50 was a new-in-box ERTL 2005-era Oliver 2655 Tractor in 1/32 scale. A 1/16 scale, Firestone branded 1970Right: Multiple scales of model tractors were offered, like this ERTL 1:16 Allis Chalmers that sold for \$71.50

72 Massey Ferguson diesel 1150 went for \$154. It was new-in-box, complete with a disc attachment, and had its serial number document

Not all the tractors



went for such outstanding bids. Many bidders picked up models for under \$10. Among them was a lot of three that

went for the opening bid of \$5. It contained a 1920s antique Case, a 70s-era International, and a fertilizer tanker attachment.

Another auction draw was the 230 lots of diecast model vehicles that

Step right up and win the lucky lady a walking stick

Carnival midways are a place where the lights are always flashing and the barkers are always calling for people to come play a game for a chance to win a

The term "midway" originated at the World's Columbian Exposition in Chicago in 1893, which actually served as a type of world's fair. Midways have always been separated from the rides and exhibition halls at carni-

Eventually, all children and adults who are children at heart want to try to win a carnival souvenir. Carnival game souvenirs have become highly collectible over the years. One such collectible is carnival walking sticks, which were short, about 34 inches long, for children to use but long enough for adults to cherish as a token of their trip to the carnival.

Carnival walking sticks, often called carnival circus walking sticks since the same walking sticks were sold at circuses, were designed to capture a child's curiosity. Children could use these

walking sticks as real walking sticks or canes, but these flimsy walking sticks lacked stability and would often snap if downward pressure were applied.

Beginning in the 1930s, barkers would wear straw hats, red vests, and red arm-garters while waving carnival walking sticks in the air. Shouting, "Step

right up folks and try your luck. Three balls for a dime; how can you lose?" But lose most of them did. Still, if you were able to knock over the milk bottles (or whatever other game the barker had going), you could walk away with a carnival walking stick.

In the 1930s, these walking sticks were "Made in Japan" with porcelain heads as handles. Famous cartoon characters such as Mickey Mouse and Donald Duck adorned these sticks. By the late 1940s, celluloid (plastic) dog heads topped the walking sticks along with other circus animals such as elephants, and by the late 1950s to early 1960s, carnival walking sticks

were made of wood with a painted wooden handle.

Today, these walking sticks are highly collectible, especially the ones considered cross-collectible such as Mickey Mouse, elephants, and celluloid. These sticks make interesting wall displays, reminding owners of times and places that are now lost to history.










included everything from trucks and semis to race cars and even snowmobiles. As with the tractors, a spectrum of scales was represented, from Matchbox-type 1/64 scale to shoebox-size 1/18. Many were new-in-box.

The auction's highest figure for a diecast vehicle went to a 1/24-scale Danbury Mint 1972 much attention these Chevrolet Cheyenne pickup truck with a Danbury title. 18 bids took that to \$412.50. Another Danbury Mint vehicle, a 1957 Dodge Sweptside D100 pickup sold for \$115.50. Yet another Danbury pickup truck - a 1957 Chevrolet Cameo Carrier with its title went for \$71.50.

days. Yet, old-time vehicle models did quite well at this sale. A Danbury Mint 1/24 scale 1931 Ford Model A Pickup grabbed \$71.40 and a Danbury 1931 Chevrolet roadster pickup came in solidly at \$44. Even a collection of eight antique car banks did nicely at \$66.

As with the tractors, The lineup of diecast there were plenty of diecast vehicles acquired for moderate bids. For example, a lot with a pair of 1/32-scale truck banks in original boxes - a 1942 Chevrolet delivery truck made by Liberty and a 1940 Ford pickup originally sold by Tractor Supply went for the opening bid of \$5.

Not everything on wheels was a scale model. Four pedal cars attracted plenty of attention. A blue Ford 6000 Commander pedal tractor in good condition sold for an impressive \$1,210. A contemporary pedal fire truck went for about 3 times its market value at \$412.50 on 22 bids, while a 1966 International Harvester pedal tractor, in as-found condition with worn paint, reached \$330.

Not surprising, a handful of full-size commercial vehicles commanded the



climbed to \$412.50 on heavy bidding

auction's highest bids. The auction's top bid of \$4,180 went for a 2002 PACE former Matco Tool sales trailer with two roof A/C and heater units, steel drawer storage and shelves, and an Onon Cummins quiet diesel 7500 generator. Bidding was competitive, sometimes jumping by \$500 per bid. A Layton Bunk House travel trailer, weather-damaged but restorable, went for a modest \$577.50.

For the mechanic, 54 lots of tools were available. The variety was considerable. It included power tools like a Campbell Hausfeld air compressor (\$104.50) and a die grinder (\$33) as well as hand tools like a Lufkin fiberglass long tape measure (\$22) and a collection of chisels (\$5).

Several interesting one-off items rounded out the sale. Two noteworthy ones were a vintage

GasBoy 190 farm gas pump made by William M. Wilson's Sons in Lansdale Pennsylvania. Seventeen bids landed \$302.50. An old horsedrawn buggy attracted intense bidding among

three prolific bidders; one took the rig home for \$302.50.

Ice saw chopped its way to \$140 and museum home

CONCORD, Mich. — Tim Bos Auctions & Appraisal Services LLC brought together two partial estates to present a very interesting auction. There was something for everyone and it was hard to find a seat once the crowd had settled in.

A one-handed large ice saw was an unusual item. It had been in the same family for generations and was used to cut the ice from the lake in squares so it could be sold. Bos said he had an absentee bid for this item from the local Concord museum and the bidding was off. The final bid was \$140 and the crowd clapped enthusiastically as Bos confirmed that it would indeed be owned by the museum.

Another feature in this auction was a 1901 Jackson plat map book. Since this sale was held in Concord, Mich., just outside of Jackson, this piece drew a lot of interest. A lot of potential bidders were standing in line waiting for a chance to see this collectible piece of history. It was in decent condition considering the age and one had to be very careful if you turned the fragile pages. A final bid of \$360 brought the gavel down to pronounce it sold.

A Bernina Aurora model 440 sewing and embroidery machine had many

people studying it carefully. It was complete with accessories, owner's manual, and foot pedal. This quilter's edition machine was used only once and sold for \$650.

Guns always draw a lot of attention and the ones offered at this sale were no exception. A Winchester 278 Model thirty-seven was a 28-gauge rifle. It sold for \$1,400 and was the star of the ammunitions category. A Moore and Company double barrel was sold for \$120 while a Hopkins and Allen Arms single shot brought a bid of \$210. An American gun company double barrel 277733 was sold for \$110. A Winchester Model twelve, 12-gauge 2 34, #1040147 brought a competitive bid of \$550 and a Ward Hercules Model eleven, 16-gauge A911829 sold for \$130.

A two-seater child's school bench was a popu-

lar item. This wooden piece brought a high bid of \$65 before it was sold. A press side parlor table was quickly sold for \$200. A beautiful cherry side table with a batwing pull brought a bid of \$30 and was quickly carried out the door. A tilt-top table was small in size and sold for \$18 while a fern stand with a round top and twist support sold for \$40. 


umns looked stately. It sold for \$100.

A sideboard was in mint condition. This oak piece had two glass doors on top which still had the original wavy glass that showed the age of the piece. With two smaller drawers below the display top and two doors under that, this was a useful piece that could serve in just about any room in the house. It brought a final bid price of \$310. An oak table with sides that fold down came with two stools. The entire set sold for \$100.

A four-piece set of Kindle bedroom furniture kept raising in price. Bos showed where the hidden drawer was in the dresser while the bids kept coming in. The hammer fell on this gorgeous set at \$460. It consisted of a dresser, a bed, and two nightstands. A stacked unit of four glass-door bookcases sold quickly for \$425. An oak ice box that was all original and in great condition sold for \$220.

Keeping with the useful furniture, a very unusual pair of chairs was put on the auction block. Bos

announced that these had been put in the attic in the early 1970s and had been stored there ever since. These were a pair of vintage MCM Castelli Plia chrome and Lucite folding chairs. There was a bit of damage on the chrome legs on one chair from sitting in the attic for years, but that could be addressed and these would make a great conversation piece. It looked like you would be sitting on nothing but air as they were clear Lucite. The pair sold for a bid of \$100.

A large Waterford cut glass vase brought a bid price of \$50. Two smaller

Waterford vases sold for \$30 and \$10.

A vintage large round speaker didn't look like much sitting on a dresser. But it was obvious several bidders noticed and knew what it was when the biding started. It took a bid of \$110 to win this one.

And a wood stove which had been used in a garage for over 50 years was offered up. It was in all original condition and brought a bid of \$240 before it sold.

father. Bollheimer continued to enjoy the energetic atmosphere of auctions and the world of outdoorsmen, as he showed 4-H in his scholastic years, became an avid hunter, and went on to attend Jackson College and The Ohio Auction School. He received an Associates Degree in Business Administration and completed the program for auctioneering. From selling his toy animals to his family, to preparing 4-H livestock for sale to the local communities, and finally to taking the stage himself, auctioneering has always been a strong passion for him.

Ridge launched his offi-

cial auctioneer career when joining the Michigan Auctioneers Association and continued his devotion for the outdoors with the purchase of his own farm, Lane View Farm, located in Lake Somerset. Mich.
