ACROSS THE AUCTION BLOCK

Carousel giraffe stands tall with \$30,000 bid at Schmidt

YPSILANTI, Mich. — Exquisite items filled the

auction hall at a recent Schmidt's Auction event including a 6 ½ foot giraffe from a carousel.

The giraffe was made by the Philadelphia Toboggan Coasters, circa 1905. It was in marvelous condition with a beautiful carved saddle and harness, glass eyes, and the original polychrome painted finish. There were some minor touch ups, some surface wear, and chips, but overall, this animal was a commanding presence, and it trampled the \$2,000-4,000 pre-auction estimate with a final bid of \$30,000.

Four other carousel animals were also offered, each attributed to the early 20th century. There was an English "Gallop-

Cockerel" by Frederick Savage Co. with expertly carved feather and saddle detail that measured 66 inches long and equipped with two seats on its back that closed at \$2,300. An American white horse jumper with jeweled accents closed at \$450, a Continental horse jumper, possibly German or French, with carved detail finished at \$250, and a rooster went for \$200.

Elegant furniture abounded, and the carved pieces were especially well received and appreciated by the bidders. A 19th century Anglo-Indian Raj Period center table of rosewood construction featured an intricate design with carved birds, fruit, vines, and faces around the 46-inch diameter top, along with full bodied birds and lion mask feet

on the stem and base. Standing 31 inches overall and with only minor damage it was gladly taken home with a final bid of \$5,000.

Another stunning example of impressive

workmanship was the late 19th century Italian Renaissance Revival Period walnut buffet with extensive hand carved detail. Measuring 44

Gebrüder Eifalt made marvelous windup toys

By the time Gebrüder Eifalt, also known as Technofix, of Germany, made its Jiggs Bumper

Car, circa 1926-1930, Technofix was famous for its windup toys. One example of German technology was Technofix's Eifalt/Nifty

"Maggie & Jiggs" tin-litho windup toy, circa 1924. This toy was an instant success because Eifalt built the toy for Nifty toys.

Nifty specialized in character toys, and "Maggie and Jiggs" were two of the most popular comic characters of the 1920s. Maggie and Jiggs were the two main characters of the comic strip Bringing Up Father, which cartoonist George McManus created and King Features Syndicate distributed. Bringing Up Father ran for 87 years in the newspapers around America. In its later years, the comic strip was known as Jiggs and Maggie. The plot was simple: Maggie and Jiggs were always at odds with their newfound wealth and how to spend it and secure or deal with their place in society. Eifalt/Nifty, later Technofix, produced an entire line of Jiggs & Maggie tin-litho windup toys, and since

Bringing Up Father was well known in America, it attracted collectors to Gebrüder Eifalt toys.

Eifalt/Nifty also produced a tin windup train. The Eifalt Technofix 235 tin-wind up "Miniature Railway" was offered around 1937. Today, this is one of the rarest of the Eifalt Technofix line of

toys. In good condition, with original box, this train set sells for around \$3,500.

Bumper cars, in general, were also known as "dodgems" and were amusement park rides that consisted of multiple small electrically

inches tall by 79 inches wide, there was much to appreciate. A full battle was depicted on the front panel with knights on horseback framed by two carved drawers. There were many other decorative images throughout of carved masks, shields, and foliage, all supported by a base with two carved lions. Showing some wear and minor damage, it still commanded a final bid of \$4,250.

Seascapes and landscapes proved to be the most popular subject for wall art. A late 19th century oil on canvas view of Cotuit Beach in Cape Cod attributed to Edward Boit presented an aerial view of buildings along the shore and sailboats in the distance. Measuring 24 by 18 inches in a gilded wood frame, it earned a final bid of \$4,000. Not far behind, a very breezy scene by William Louis Otte, titled "Cedars of Lebanon (Carmel Coast / Santa Barbara, California)" was an early

20th century oil on board landscape with trees and water being whipped by the wind. This 22 by 18 inch creation drew a final bid of \$3,500. A beautiful view titled "The White Mountains" by William T. Richards, a late 19th century gouache on paper landscape, was taken home with a \$2,300 bid.

Unusual and eye-catching lighting options were offered, with the name Tiffany leading the charge. An early 20th century Tiffany desk lamp with an iridescent green domed glass shade

signed "LCT Favrile" featuring a "King Tut" pattern decoration was supported by a bronze base. Standing 14 inches tall, it was taken with a high bid of \$3,250. There was a Tiffany Favrile Glass boudoir lamp that wore a conical glass shade with a gold/amber "Arabian" pattern decoration. It measured 14 inches tall and left with a \$2,900 bid. Featuring shades of blue, an early 20th century Tiffany lamp featured a ruffled iridescent blue glass shade on a candlestick base with a swirled design. Showing only minor wear and standing 14 inches tall, this graceful item closed at \$2,600.

Another outstanding category was the decorative pieces, starting with three early 20th century Pewabic Art Pottery miniature vases. This desirable group featured a variety of forms, each with multi-color iridescent drip glaze, one gold, one turquoise, and one reddish brown, and impressed with "Pewabic". The tallest of the three stood just 3 inches tall, but they were gathered up with a final bid of \$3,250. A 17-inch tall slender Daum Nancy Cameo glass vase with multi-color floral decoration on the blue/green background bore the signature "Daum Nancy" with Cross of Lorraine at the side. It exceeded estimates, finishing at

\$2,400. Another Daum Nancy "Paysage Mauve" cameo glass vase with asymmetrical rim and multiple tall trees as decoration standing 9 inches tall also did very well, closing at \$2,200.

Two unexpected items stood out that were popular with the bidders. A two-sided sheet metal porcelain sign advertised the Dixie Oils & Gasoline company. Measuring 47 inches by 34 inches and showing rust and wear, it still earned a final bid of \$2,600. Three Civil War Period collector's items drew from their own fan base. There was

a Colt .44 caliber model 1860 army revolver with walnut grips, a belted leather cartridge pouch holding ammo tins, and a framed quarter plate tintype photo of a Union soldier photographed with his revolver and

dog. Offered in amazingly good condition, this historic lot closed at \$1,700.







powered cars that drew power from an electrical rod attached at the ceiling. Operators used a bumper car to bump or slam other bumper cars as often and as hard as possible, and the last car moving was the victor.

Technofix sought to replicate, in a small scale, not only a bumper car but also the excitement of operating a bumper car. The company succeeded.

Technofix toy company became what is arguably the largest German toy company, manufacturing tin-lithographed

toys. Brothers Johann and Georg Einfalt founded Gebrüder Einfalt or G.E. in Nuremberg, Germany, in 1922. Gebrüder Einfalt originally produced tin windup "penny" toys, which were made of metal with painted surfaces.

While inexpensive, penny toys often included elements that facilitated movement, such as a windup device. Many of the penny toys produced by Gebrüder Einfalt included windup toys of animals, people, airplanes, and more complicated toys such as boxing matches where the boxers were a man and a kangaroo.

By 1935 Gebrüder Einfalt had left penny toys behind and sought to have its company identified with a name that would match the rising technology of the times, so the brothers changed their company name to Technofix. The

name accurately reflects the changing technology of the 1920s and '30s.

Today, collectors all over the world seek out Gebrüder Einfalt and Technofix tin-lithograph toys, which are mechanically made toys produced from tinfoil with colorfully painted chromolithography scenes that resemble a character, vehicle, or some other easily recognized feature, such as the comic characters Jiggs and Maggie.

Technofix also produced one of the finest toy motorcycles ever built—the Einfalt YZ 243, which was made in the late 1930s until around 1940 when World War II broke out. The YZ 243 ran in circles,

fell and righted itself, and produced sparks from the exhaust system. Following World War II, this motorcycle was manufactured in the US Zone of Germany, making it quite collectible. In good condition, expect to pay between \$300 and \$400 for this toy.


Prior to the 1935 change of name, a Gebrüder Einfalt toy may be identified by the initials "G.E." or "G.E.N." that are scratched into the paint and metal. Under the Technofix brand, the toys are identified by the trademark "Marke Technofix" inside a triangle, which is affixed as a red sticker to every Technofix toy.



Above: The Einfalt YZ 243, which was made in the late 1930s. This toy motorcycle sold for \$320 at auction.



The show will always go on with a collection of programs


“Come on along and listen to—
The lullaby of Broadway!
The hip-hooray and ballyhoo—
The lullaby of Broadway!”

Al Dubin, 1935

For true Broadway buffs, spring is the race to the finish line. “The Season,” which began in early fall, ends with a flurry of last-minute theatrical entries, opening just in time for awards consideration. Among those prize hand-outs is the grande dame of them all: the Tony Awards, which were held on June 16.

For collectors, theatrical memorabilia offers a wealth of opportunity — and the most collectible Broadway treasures are those absolutely free for the price of an admission ticket: theatre programs!

Since the dawn of Broadway, show programs (now known as Playbills), have proven irresistible combos: informational listings, treasured souvenirs of a memorable evening, and mini-time capsules all rolled into one. In addition to the “who’s who” and “what’s what” of a specific production, Playbills are chock-full of wonderful retro ads,

plus a look at what else was happening on the arts scene at a specific moment in time.

Valuable as frame-of-reference points are the casting lists and performer bios. (Did you know that the “Archie Leach” listed as a cast member in the 1928 musical play Golden Dawn was a pre-Hollywood-name-change Cary Grant?)

Playbill constants have also always included interviews with entertainment professionals, who often reveal interesting bits of theatre trivia. Did you know Mary Martin turned down the chance to star

in My Fair Lady? Her response, upon hearing the Lerner & Lowe score: “the boys have lost their touch.”

Paging through past Playbill advertisements offers a fascinating look at what long-gone theatre-goers found most enticing. Other than the play, of course. Restaurants, for example. Some dining establishments even geared their menus to specific shows. Strange Interlude, Eugene O’Neill’s drama of the late 1920s, was so endless — it ran nine acts — that audiences were granted a “dinner intermission of one hour.” Program ads for the Sevilla Restaurant dryly noted, “the strange interlude in this play

gives theatergoers ample time for fine dining.”

Wondering what to do once the curtain came down? No shortage of options there, either, particularly if your tastes ran toward the racy. A 1928 program for the musical Good News presented a tough choice: dueling invitations to visit “Texas Guinan and Her Merry Gang of 18 Lovely Girls,” or Parisian Nights (“20—Gorgeous Girls—20! A Revelation in Dazzling Entertainment!”)

By the 1940s, late-night offerings were even spicier. The 1945 program for Carousel heralded “The Indescrib-

able Dorothy Ross and Her Frisque Songs.” Oklahoma! winked at “The Naughty But Lush Ditties of Justine Wayne,” while The Skin Of Our Teeth got right down to the nitty-gritty, with an ad for the “screamingly funny” Strip For Action.

Always worth a chuckle are Playbill ads for items that must have seemed like good ideas at the time: a belt-like reducing contraption from “Savage Health Motors” (“take a turn

with ‘Health Motor’, arch foe of lethargy, lassitude, and laziness”), and “Marmola Prescription Tablets: The Pleasant Way To Reduce” (“all who seek to please, in movies, stage, or society, must banish excess fat”). Both remedies were available to full-figured audience members of the 1920s.

Along with the to-be-expected advertisements for perfumes, liquors, and (on almost every back cover), full-color promos for “Lucky Strikes,” are those ads hawking long-forgotten trends of the times. Among them: “Leon Goodman Felt Hats” (“draped right on your head”); “Dermophile—the Men’s Underwear Luxurious” (“made of Pure Australian Wool”); “Phoenix Silk Hosiery” (“daintily veils trim ankles”); and “A.S. Beck Shoes” (“Renowned for Reptilian Effects”). Audiences who found the onstage goings-on less than entrancing could evidently while away the hours until final curtain putting together personal wish lists.

For most Playbill collectors, however, it’s the program cover that initially attracts, and here





the visual feast is varied and sumptuous. Up through the 1920s, covers featured romanticized color illustrations promoting idealized "art" images, bearing little relationship to a specific show. Program covers for the John Golden Theatre depict a sailing ship on the high seas; Cohan's Theatre featured a jester. Beginning in the 1930s, salesmanship took over, as black-and-white photos of show stars achieved cover prominence: you weren't just seeing Annie, Get Your Gun —

you were seeing Ethel Merman as "Annie!"

In recent decades, producers have taken advantage of lavish, yet cost-effective color printing, and the selected cover images center on what will sell. If the X-Men's "Wolverine", Hugh Jackman, is taking a Broadway turn as the star of The Boy From Oz, the cover had better show Hugh. If the concept is more important than the star, then go with that: those glowing feline eyes from Cats, for instance, or that sad-faced little girl from Les Miserables.

Pricing for theatre programs depends on

their vintage and rarity. Those from the turn-of-the-20th-century may feature stars you've never heard of, but their scarcity puts them in the \$30-50 range. Also valuable are the oddities. Programs from flops are always popular. Do you have a Playbill from the musical version of Carrie? At \$75-100, lucky you! An opening night program from 42nd Street, at which "Abominable Showman" David Merrick announced the death, that very afternoon, of show director Gower Champion, will run in the same range. Programs from the annual Tony Awards,

(one per audience member, no matter how famous you are), resell at \$50-75. In the \$25-40 ballpark are those programs across which a gracious star has scrawled a signature, for an erstwhile fan waiting outside the stage door.

Programs personalized by starry-eyed theatre aficionados possess a certain nostalgic appeal. A 1928 program for the comedy And So To Bed at the New Bijou Theatre bears a handwritten note that the performance was attended by "Mildred and I"; the girls found the show "very humorous," if "a trifle shady." Another ardent fan turned his Playbill for 1950's musical hit Guys & Dolls into a mini-scrapbook, pasting news articles about the show on nearly every

program page. The going rate for such personal-touch programs: \$20-25.

Most Playbills, however, fall in an affordable \$5 to \$20 range. Asking prices should reflect their condition. Unless purchased solely for historical reference, Playbills with damaged, stained covers, or missing interior pages, have little value.

Framed Playbills make striking wall accents, either by themselves, or in groupings. Craftier theatre-folk often create their own shadowbox displays, utilizing programs. A framed Wicked tribute, for instance, could include your program, your ticket, a page of sheet music from your favorite Wicked tune, and, of course, one of

those ubiquitous Wicked souvenirs on sale in the theatre lobby.

Giving your regards to Broadway has never been easier — or more in season. As the Tony Award promos once put it, "there's a little bit of Broadway in everyone!"

"Listen to the lullaby of old Broadway!"
