Diesel crawler tractor pulled \$116,000 at Don Smock

PENDLETON, Ind. -Smock Auction Company (DSA Auctions) held its 32nd annual summer truck and trailer auction It was a substantial

offered live and via Proxibid. Available was an array of small construction tools, construc-On June 14th, Don tion material, heavy equipment, trucks, trailers, and more. A public inspection was offered the week of the auction.

It took three rings to sale, with 1,042 lots auction all of the lots. Ring 1 held most of the heavy equipment. Not surprisingly, it was those that commanded the auction's highest bids. Taking first place, at \$116,000 was a 2019 John Deere 700K diesel crawler tractor with 1,800 hours. The rig was outfitted with a six-way

blade, steel tracks, and heat and A/C in the cab.

A bid of \$96,000 took second place for a 2021 Hitachi ZX225USR-6 excavator. The unit, with 1,106 hours, had an Isuzu engine, plus a oneyear Hitachi certified warranty on the powertrain and hydraulics. Accessories included a front glass brush guard, heat, and A/C. Another crawler tractor, a Komatsu D61PX-24 LGP, came in third at \$85,000. The diesel machine had 3,745 hours and was equipped with a six-way blade, rear drawbar, heat, and A/C.

Eight other pieces of heavy equipment picked

up bids north of \$50,000. Those included a John Deere 180G LC excavator that went for \$84,000. The cab rig with 2,401 hours had been serviced just 40 hours pre-auction. It featured a hydraulic quick coupler, mechanical thumb, tooth bucket, and heat and A/C in the cab. A Volvo L150Grubber-tired Loader with 7,462 hours also did nicely \$70,000. The diesel machine had a GP buck-

et, hydraulic quick coupler, bolt-on cutting edge, air ride seats. backup camera, radio, heat, and A/C. Bidding hit \$66,500 for a Komatsu HM300-1 diesel haul truck with 56,868 miles and 7,759

Ring 1 also held 30 truck tractors. Several sold as low as \$4,000, including a

Uncle Sam has stood tall, never bending to the ill winds of war or the injustices of tyranny. When the going got tough, Uncle Sam got America going!

The legend of Uncle Sam was born in reality. On September 15, 1961, the 87th Congress of the United States adopted the following resolution, honoring the real Uncle Sam —Sam Wilson: "Resolved by the Senate the house

Congress salutes Uncle Sam Wilson of Troy, New York, as progenitor of America's National symbol of Uncle Sam."

Most of Sam Wilson's claim to fame was accidental. In 1789, Wilson walked from New Hampshire, to New York of to start a new life. Wilson a




broke out, at the age of 46, Wilson contracted with the United States Army to provide salted meat to the troops. Soon, Wilson was shipping large quantities of meat rations in wooden barrels stamped with the initials "U.S," intending for the "U.S." to mean "U.S. Government Property."


















It was equipped with a Cat 3406B diesel, automatic transmission, locking differential, air brakes, air ride suspension, aluminum wheels, and niceties like power windows, power locks, heated mirrors, and cruise control. Bidding in the category ran as high as \$48,000 for a 2020 Volvo VNR

tandem-axle day cab with 319,000 miles. It was powered by a D13 500 HP diesel engine paired with automatic transmission.

Trailers were also offered from Ring 1. Winning bids on those started at \$1,000 for items like a 1987 Great Dane GPS-45 53-foot tandem-axle stake-side flatbed with air brakes. They topped out at \$65,000 for a 2022 East Manufacturing Corp 8-foot-by-48-foot tandem-axle walking floor

unused orange safety cones, hit \$550 each. Three lots held collections of Louisville extension ladders. Those sold from \$100 for a group of three in 20, 24, and 32-foot lengths, to \$175 for a trio of 16-foot ladders.

Ring 3 had 446 lots, with an array of items

with an array of items ranging from lighter-duty construction equipment to heavy equipment accessories. Much of it was new. Twentynine lots held AGT and MIVI mini-excavators. Prices ranged from \$3,000 for a brand-new 2024 gas-powered AGT H12R with a canopy, mechanical thumb, leveling blade, and rubber tracks, to \$4,400 for a similarly equipped and unused 2024 AGTQK16R model.

Machine accessories

included pieces like a brand-new 2024 GIYI skid loader mulcher that scored \$3,500. An unused GIYI hydraulic excavator clamp grabbed \$550. Later, 14 lots with various unused Swift skid loader GP Buckets, in widths spanning 60 to 84 inches, landed an average of \$400.

Fifteen other lots held worksite equipment like air compressors and generators. Those pulled winning bids from \$700 for a 2013 tandem-axle towable Doosan G125 diesel generator with 7,915 hours but a disassembled engine, to \$3,600 for an Ingersoll Rand towable air compressor with 1,587 hours.

A slate of weekly auctions, including antique auctions on Wednesdays and livestock auctions on Wednesdays and Thursdays, are held year-round, with as many as 10 auctioneers calling.

In addition to the flea market and auctions, Shipshewana Trading Place also hosts special events, including an antique market held the first Saturday in August, craft and vintage shows held three times each year, and swap meets held monthly during warmer weather. In colder months, there's the Shipshewana Across the Road indoor market held on Fridays and Saturdays.

When not shopping or dining, visitors can enjoy activities like visiting the Menno-Hof Museum to learn about the history and life of the Amish, Hutterite, and Mennonite communities, taking buggy rides, or enjoying local theater. Ample lodging options allow visitors to extend their stays to take in everything.

If you plan a visit, you can download the Shipshewana app for iPhone and Android. It features up-to-date information about flea market vendors and events, provides a directory of dining, shopping, and lodging options, and even provides exclusive deals for visitors.





However, someone who knew Sam Wilson jokingly said that the letters stood for "Uncle Sam" Wilson, who was an "uncle" to all the boys fighting. Soon everyone, from townspeople to soldiers on the frontline, was saying the shipments came from "Uncle Sam," making the name symbolize the federal government. By the end of the war, the term "Uncle Sam" clearly and forever symbolized the American government.

Famed 19th century illustrator Thomas Nast drew some of the earliest Uncle Sam images for Harper's Weekly. Some historians argue that

Nast drew images of "Yankee Doodle" "Brother Jonathan," not Sam. These Uncle collectors are probably Brother right since Jonathan was cleanshaven and wore a feather in his cap and Uncle Sam has a beard and never wore feathers. It is easy to these confuse characters since they both wear star-spangled suits of red, white, and blue.

British cartoonists of this era, in the humor

Regardless of how the image began, James Montgomery Flagg created the modern image of Uncle Sam in 1916-17 for a World War I Army two recruiting poster campaign. The single most famous rendering of Uncle Sam is on Flagg's "I WANT YOU" poster, showing a stern-faced Uncle Sam pointing a finger at America's young men and challenging them to report to the "Nearest Recruiting

This image became the modern icon that is now known around the world as Uncle Sam.

Uncle Sam has been a patriotic popular collectible since his conception because, in any form, he symbolizes America. When collecting Uncle Sam, colored material is more desirable than black and white; however, if you are a collector of political cartoons, much of your collection will 2-dimensional and in black and white. If you are a cartoon collector or poster collector, mix a few 3-dimensional Uncle Sam statuettes in with your collection. Colorful 3-D objects can add texture, depth, and balance to a collection.

There are many ways to design an Uncle Sam collection—Americanmade only, foreign images only (both positive and negative), or "other" Uncle Sams where one collects "other" people or characters depicting Uncle Sam, such as Mickey Mouse.

An Uncle Sam toy collection would be fun to hunt for and fun to own. American The industry has been a leading promoter of the Uncle Sam image since the late 1800s. Uncle Sam toys flooded the market in both 1876 and 1976 (America's Centennial and Bicentennial). During the 1930s, American Flyer led a resurgence of Uncle Sam toys with its

inexpensive version of "an earlier lithographed tin, flat-sided Uncle Sam bicycle string toy." This toy is a rare and valuable collectible today. Look for this toy as a crown jewel in an Uncle Sam toy collection.

The United States just entered her fourth century and Uncle Sam has passed his 200th birthday. No doubt as the 21st century moves along, Uncle Sam will evolve

The Beatles: Collecting with 'a little help from your friends'

Beatlemania is alive and well. And for those preteeners who first saw them on "The Ed Sullivan Show," the Beatles continue to hold a place in their hearts, not to mention their closets and attics, basements and storage units. When the Beatles invaded America, they awakened the entrepreneurial instincts of those who recognized a prime opportunity to make a dollar and, to a lesser extent, a British pound.

Now, some 60 years later, the merchandise bearing the images of the Beatles is collectable, not only by the fans who remember them "when," but also by subsequent generations, including their children and grandchildren. As Tom Anderton pointed out, regardless of who you are (or how young or how old you are), "It's not uncool to say you love a Beatles' song."

Anderton should know. As proprietor of "Tom's

Music Trade" in Red Lion, Pa., Anderton boasts an inventory of more than 60,000 items, including vintage albums, 45's, CDs, and cassettes, as well as turntables, receivers, speakers and memorabilia.

Buying and selling is nothing new to the native of Birmingham, England. "I grew up going to 'car boot' sales on the weekend," he said. But when he came to the States in January of 2000, he had nothing more than a month's rent and a change of clothes.

That all changed in a hurry. Living in south central Pennsylvania and working on construction jobs, he supplemented his income at local record shows. "I'm a real rummager," he said with a smile. "I got the bug all over again."

In March 2006, Ander-

ton learned of a vacant storefront in the York County borough of Red Lion. The \$300 monthly rental fee was "cheaper than what I was paying for storage," he recalled. Thus was born "Tom's Record Trade." The first Saturday that he was open for business, "it took off."

With his shop's success, Anderton made plans to expand his empire by opening a rock-and-roll themed coffee bar with memorabilia-filled walls. When the pandemic nipped his dream in the bud, he shifted gears, knocked down a wall in his shop, and transformed what had been his storeroom into "Tom's Homegrown Rock-N-Roll Museum." Filling the space from floor to ceiling and wall to wall, his mind boggling collection is an egalitarian tribute to musicians, as artifacts from local bands share space with bands that are beloved around the world. For his part, Anderton conceded that his museum gives him an excuse for more collecting.

And although he is passionate about a host of bands, Tom's face lights up when talking about the Beatles. "Being British, I can't help but to love the Beatles," he said. "They've stood the test of time," he continued. "Everyone seems to have a connection with them," he said of their universal appeal. Collecting Beatles memorabilia has its challenges, however. Even though "there is a lot out there," Beatles fans "don't want to part with it, and those that are willing aren't giving it away." Chalk it up to sentimentality. On the other hand, he said, you never know what you're going to discover. Take, for instance, one of his recent finds, a pair of lowtop "Wing Ding" women's tennis shoes. Picturing individual Beatles with their printed signatures, these pale blue shoes were found in like-new condition, with their original box and packing paper. Anderton shook his head in wonderment at their condition.

An early acquisition for his museum was a Beatles leatherette pocketbook, purchased along with an original ticket to the band's August 16, 1966, show at JFK Stadium in Philadelphia. But that's just a taste of what's in store for Beatles fans who visit this museumwithin-a-shop.


Where else will you see a photograph and letter, accompanied by the original mailing envelope, from the Brian Epstein Fan Club? (As an aside,



who even knew that "the man who discovered the Beatles" had his own fan club?) Nearby are the three covers of the Beat-"Yesterday and Today" album, including the "butcher cover" (probably the "Holy Grail" and worth "a few thousand dollars"), along with a poster promoting the album ("among the best of the best").

How about four paper clothes hangers, each one picturing a Beatle as seen in the animated feature, "Yellow Submarine"? Noted Anderton, "I've never seen anything like them before."

Among the other treasures on view are a Beatles wig in its original packages; early 1964 NEMS dolls and later bobbleheads, and a 1964 metal lunch box (alas, missing the thermos bottle). Take a trip down memory lane with the "Flip Your Wig" game, complete and in like-new condition; several round plastic record cases for 45s; and Beatles wallpaper. A Christmas card from the official fan club, a Beatles scarf, and a wrapper for a Beatles ice cream bar. A "Yellow Submarine" pop-up book and an "official fan club jigsaw puzzle." Many of the pieces on exhibit, Anderton added, are "one-offs." And yes, there is at least one thing in the museum that a Beatle has touched, that being an autograph in Ringo Starr's scrawling handwriting. "He rarely signs anything except for charity," according to Anderton.

On the other hand, there are pieces that are a bit more within the reach of the average collector, such as fan magazines, pinbacks (beware of sloppy reproductions), and hundreds of Beatles collectors' cards, affordable for the casual collector, except for the ones that

have been graded as "mint 10s." Although the Beatles were British, Anderton agreed that most of what's being collected today was made in America and marketed to American fans. There were no licensing deals, he said; the money that band members lost as a result is incalculable.


Anderton said that a new collector could get started with less than \$100. He recommended buying "a handful of albums in good condition. Enjoy the music. And that will make you want more," he predicted.

These days, Anderton can be found in his shop six days a week. "I rarely take time off," he explained, as he continues "24 years of non-stop buying. I still have a passion for it, like I did when I was a kid." And as for the Beatles, "There will never again be another band like them."


Below: "Imagine" a metal lunchbox (without the thermos bottle) surviving more than half a century and still in excellent condition.
