





The Overland Model Company made a set of two bridges, including a Strauss Trunnion Bascule lift bridge in double and single versions. This set was unique because it was #12 out of only 99 made. It brought a high bid price of \$700 and includ-





Patriotism runs high with sheet music from World War I

"Over there, over there, Send the word, send the word, over there!

That the Yanks are coming, the Yanks are coming,

The drums rum-tumming everywhere!" George M. Cohan,

1917

On July 28, 1914, World War I was officially underway.

But is wasn't until April 6, 1917, that the Yanks finally were coming. That's when Congress officially approved President Woodrow Wilson's declaration of war on the German Empire. Until then, the United States had remained steadfastly neutral. Then, in response to increasing provocation by Germany — the sinking of the Lusitania (and the resulting loss of American lives); the fear that Germany was recruiting the support of Mexico, in exchange for the eventual repatriation of Texas, New Mexico, and Arizona -America said "enough."

That decision of 100plus years ago resulted in an outpouring of patriotic expression not seen since the Civil War. Now, however, the United States was no longer rocked by internal dissension, but joined together in facing an external enemy. Defeating that enemy called not only for military might, but also for a unified effort on the home front. Carrying the banner for that home front effort: American popular

music. Prior to the war, popular song themes followed predictable routes: heart-tugging love ballads, paeans to bygone days and lands, and comic turns. America's entry into the war changed all New that. themes emerged, with themes of the past adapted to suit the needs of the present. And, while patriotism was paramount, music publishing remained just as lucrative as before. A song about a soldier bidding his sweetheart a fond farewell could sell just as many copies as a song about a prewar couple in the same situation.

Major categories for the songs of World War I included:

Recruiting songs, such

as "If I Had A Son For Each Star in Old Glory, (Uncle Sam, I'd Give Them All To You)."


Peppy morale boosters, including "Liberty Bell, It's Time To Ring Again." ("Though you're old and there's a crack in you, don't forget Old Glory's backin' you!")

Romanticized looks at military life: "The Rose of No Man's Land" ("mid the war's great curse stands the Red Cross nurse she's the rose of no man's land!")

Visions of life after wartime: "When I Come Back To You (We'll Have A Yankee-Doodle Wedding)."

Weepers, including "Hello Central, Give Me No Man's Land." ("I want to know why my mamma starts to weep, when I say 'now I lay me down to sleep'.")

Comic novelties. Among the favorites: "Would You Rather Be a Colonel with an Eagle on Your Shoulder or a Private with a



Chicken On Your Knee?" and "If He Can Fight Like He Can Love, Good Night, Germany!"

Almost every denizen of Tin Pan Alley churned out suited-to-the-occasion songs during the war years, but two composers stood head and shoulders above the rest: George M. Cohan and Irving Berlin. Their names (and their songs) continue to resonate, over a century after their initial impact.

George M. Cohan liked to say he was "born on the 4th of July." (Actually, it was July 3, 1878, but why quibble?) From the early 1900s onward, Cohan took the country by storm, with a series of stage hits featuring such musical rousers as "Give My Regards To Broadway" and "You're A Grand Old Flag." However, it took just one song — 1917s "Over There" to win Cohan an enduring spot in the popular culture of World War I. It energet-

ically captured America's Enrico Caruso. Its sheet can-do spirit, and was recorded by practically everyone, including Cohan himself, and opera legend



reissue, the cover illustrations varying from patriotic scenes, to depictions of the song's latest star interpreters.

Morale-building paid off: Cohan's wartime contribution was recognized with a Congressional Gold Medal in 1936. In 1959, a bronze statue of George M. Cohan was placed at the heart of New York's Times Square, where he now "gives his regards to Broadway" in perpetuity.


At the outset of World War I, Irving Berlin kept America's toes patriotically tapping with such best-sellers as "They Were All Out Of Step But Jim," and "The Ragtime Soldier Man." Berlin's major contribution, however, came after his enlistment ("Army Takes Berlin!"). Stationed at Camp Upton in Yaphank, N.Y., he was given an assignment right up his (tin pan) alley: creating a stage production as a camp fund-raiser.

Below: It's all in how you see it: a determined sweetheart insists "They Were All Out Of Step But Jim." (Irving Berlin)






Above: One of the most iconic versions of "Over There," with military-themed cover art by Norman Rockwell.



grabbag. There were acrobats, jugglers, military drills, and even a boxing demonstration by lightweight champion Benny Leonard. Tying it all together: an all-new Berlin score. Its most unique aspect was the cast. All were Army recruits (even the towering "Ziegfeld Girls"). Among those recruits: Sgt. Irving Berlin himself, bringing down the house as he plaintively wailed "Oh! How I Hate To Get Up In The Morning.'

"Yip Yip Yaphank" concluded with "We're On Our Way To France," as the soldier/performers marched up the theatre aisles, and returned to their barracks. The final Broadway performance on September 14, 1918, however, had a different ending. This time, as the military cast (led by Sgt. Berlin) exited singing "We're On Our Way to France," they actually were. Their march took them to the

troop carrier destined to transport them overseas. For his contributions, Berlin was also awarded the Congressional Gold Medal.

Even 100 years-plus since the pages were hot off the presses, World War I sheet music remains surprisingly accessible. Literally millions of copies were printed — and, when no longer current, instead of being discarded, the music was simply stacked up and forgotten. Since sheet music of the early 20th century was generally larger than that of today (about 13 1/2 inches long by 10 3/4 inches wide), the increased size, on paper of limited stamina, often led to creases and dog-ears. Fortunately, many copies were carefully kept in piano benches or music cabinets, and remain in relatively pristine condition. Safe from sunlight, moisture, and frequent handling, their colors remain vibrant,

the horse-and-buggy days of the late 1800s, and charged full speed ahead into the 20th century. Popular song was there, doing its bit for victory, helping define an era. Sheet music, its tuneful souvenir, provides a colorful, ongoing reminder of this proud heritage.


