

Timber and Bone Dry" sign that closed at \$20,000, a colorful 20 inch tall metal flanged sign boasting "We sell Auburn Wagons" finished at \$14,000, and a black and white tin "The Studebaker Is Sold Here" 10 foot by 20 inch sign drew a final bid of \$13,000.

The wagons at this auction provided a wonderful glimpse into the past, with most consisting of original paint and parts. Leading this pack, the horse-drawn wood wheel John Deere box wagon complete with John Deere seat, like-new paint and stenciling, and matching serial numbers provided the best all original example many had ever seen. The bidders agreed, with a final price of \$22,000 required to take it home. A heavy duty, 100 percent original horsedrawn Deere & Webber Co. Flax Tight, flare side





wood wheel box wagon in exceptional condition was claimed for \$21,000. A vintage Studebaker wood box wagon made for J.W. With Skinner the and Studebaker logos on the side, it left with a final bid of \$14,000.

Other wagons served specific purposes, such as the horse-drawn Molers' Milk, Belmont Dairy Co., Dayton, Ohio, milk delivery wagon with very good

original yellow paint and stenciling and graphics of a cow on both sides. This fun blast from the past was claimed with a final bid of \$7.250. A repainted but still attractive horse-drawn wood huckster fruit wagon was shown with open sides to allow the display of produce or flowers. This unusual piece was taken with a final bid of \$3,750. There was even an early wood horse-drawn hearse with original paint and elaborate decorations including two hearse lamps in nice condition that finished at \$1,600. Another popular catego-

ry was salesman samples, and several examples did very well. The 19-inch-tall wood and brass Monitor Manufacturing Company of Auburn, Ind., windmill was presented with an original carry case, all original parts, and exceptional detail and stenciling. This accurate miniature was eagerly claimed with a final bid of \$17,500. An intricate salesman sample horse-drawn Adriance Buckeye sickle mower with case featured many moving parts. Complete with wood box it left for a new collection with a final bid of \$14,000. An unusual 7-inch-tall brass salesman sample horse-powered corn grinder was an interesting example of another useful tool. This collectible closed with a final bid of \$4,250. There were 22 examples of

various displays used to market merchandise to customers door to door.

Two other items stand out from the rest. A very hefty cast iron F.E. Myers and Bro of Ashland Ohio Pumps store display featuring seven different pumps as well as a pump jack provided a variety of choices to the shopper at the time. This unique selection was claimed with a final bid of \$6,500. Finally, for fans of historic firearms, there was a hard cover book titled "Colt's Story In Miniature" which displayed miniature Colt Patent Repeating Pistol models from 1836 to 1862. While described in fair condition, this collectible reference still drew a final bid of \$1,600. This auction provided a once in a lifetime opportunity to bid on treasures rarely seen for sale.







Disk drives were memorable technology



Let's travel back to the 1970s when home computers from Apple, Commodore, and Tandy were first hitting the market. As innovative as they were, early units suffered from a major issue they didn't have any on-board storage. Every time you turned off the computer or the power was cut, all of your programming and data disappeared.

Hobbyists loved early personal computers (PCs), but the need to re-enter everything really undermined their usefulness. What they needed was some form of permanent storage and it didn't take long for manufacturers to provide a solution. Taking their lead from the tape drives used on huge mainframe computers, PC makers turned to a similar technology — the humble cassette tape. A specially-made cassette recorder could permanently record both programs and data on a cassette tape, much like recording a song. The recording could be 'played back' into the computer when needed.

Popular brands from Atari to Texas Instruments sold external cassette recorders as accessories that plugged into their machines. One pio-Commodore neering model, the Pet, featured a built-in cassette data recorder, although other Commodore models relied on plug-in accessories.

Although cassettes solved the storage dilemma, they had multiple shortcomings. First, they offered only minimal storage. A cassette tape could hold around 100 kilobytes per side, which is only about 50 pages. They were also quite slow recording and uploading information. Imagine waiting 10-15 minutes more commonly used in for a large program to load before you could use it! Plus, if the original recording was interrupted or flawed in any way, it would probably be unusable. The biggest issue was that tape was

linear. There was no way to insert, delete, or modify a previous recording. Even accessing specific information required advancing through to where it was located.

All of those problems were solved when floppy disks were introduced. Floppy disks were thin, circular pieces of recording media inside a rectangular vinyl jacket. The media spun like a record but recorded magnetically like tape. 'Floppies' rectified virtually all of the limitations of cassette storage. They eventually provided greater storage than cassettes, were fast and more reliable than tape, and most significantly, data was randomly accessible. That meant information could be accessed almost immediately, plus deleted, added to, or changed without issue.

The first PC floppies, measuring 8 inches, were business settings than personal ones. The late 1970s Radio Shack/ Tandy TRS-80 Model II, a popular professional

computer in its day, offered a built-in 8-inch drive. Yet, those early drives could only hold 80 kilobytes of data, and the limited capacity was problematic from the outset.

In 1976, Shugart Associates introduced the 5.25-inch disk, which took the personal computing world by storm. Early single-sided versions could hold 160 kilobytes of information, double the capacity of the larger 8-inch disks. Also,



it didn't take long for manufacturers to make the disk's reverse side available, creating diskettes that could store up to 360 kilobytes of information.

Every major personal computer manufacturer - Apple, Atari, Commodore, Tandy - made 5.25-inch drives available. Originally, the drives were external accessories: but, by the end of the decade, most manufacturers offered computers with internal disk drives. Particularly significant was IBM's entry into the personal computer market, with a machine featuring an internal 5-25-inch drive and Microsoft's operating system on 5.25-inch disks. It signaled the era of personal computers as professional tools.

In 1981, Sony introduced a much smaller 3.5-inch disk, encased in a sturdy hard plastic case. Their small size made them easier to handle and store, yet they could hold 790 kilobytes of data per disk, eventually expanding to 1.44 megabytes (over 800 pages of information). Apple popularized the media when it introduced the Macintosh in 1984, with a built-in 3.5-inch drive. Other manufacturers followed, including IBM, which quickly transitioned from the 5.25inch format to 3.5-inch drives. By the end of the 1980s, 3.5-inch disks had essentially supplanted the 5.25-inch format.

The first company to introduce a hard drive for PCs was Seagate Technology in 1980. It was an external box about the size of a briefcase and could hold a whopping five megabytes of data (that's more than the written works of Shakespeare, but in comparison, about half the size of a modern high-resolution photo!). Early models were sometimes referred to as "Winchester Drives" after pioneering hard disks made by IBM for mainframe computers. Companies including DEC, Hitachi, and Toshiba were early hard-drive manufacturers.

1980s-early 1990s, some devices offered the best of both worlds — immense storage and removable media. First came the Bernoulli Box, released in 1982. It was effectively a removable hard disk that employed cartridges in capacities from 10-230 megabytes. They were particularly useful in professional settings for making system-wide backups and transferring large files between computers and offices. In 1994, the Iomega Zip Disk was released. It was based on a cartridge similar to a 3.5-inch diskette and could hold 100 megabytes of information, enough to completely back up most business computers of that era.

In the 1990s, another storage medium called the CD-ROM (Compact Disk-Read Only Memory), came on the scene, based on popular CDs developed for the music industry. CD-ROMs used a laser to optically read/ write data to plastic disks. Their storage capacity was impressive — initially 650 mega-

forever changed how people could access information. One of the first products released on a CD-ROM commercial was Grolier's Electronic Encyclopedia, which contained over nine million words, along with photos, sound, and video.

While the storage capacity of early CD-ROMS was impressive, the first models could only write data on a disk once, exhuming the limitations of cassettes from 20 years earlier. Eventually, CD-RW (read/write) technology would take their place. In the late 1990s, DVD-RW systems were developed, with capacity exceeding 4.3 gigabytes (about $3{,}000$ of the earlier $5.25{\cdot}$ inch disks!). The popularity of recording digital sound, photos, and video sparked their development.

By the end of the 1990s, flash memory was also introduced, which eventually led to today's flash drives and tiny memory cards used in equipment like digital cameras. 'Flash' represented another milestone in technological development, as it used electronic circuitry to store information rather than recording media, and it did not have any moving

parts. The technology supplied huge capacity in minuscule size, perfect for today's digital devices

For collectors, any storage device predating the CD-ROM era can be considered vintage. Each format is era-specific, providing a natural technological timeline. Thus, a cassette data recorder would date to the late 1970s, while a 3.5-inch disk drive would be from the mid-1980s to the early 1990s.

Finding a drive compatible with a specific system is vital because brands often made proprietary gear. That's the case for Apple, Atari, Commodore, Texas Instruments, and many earlier Tandy models. Things began to change around 1981 when the IBM/Microsoft association led to more standardized computing technology.

Given that these devices are now a quarter-century or older, certainly scrutinize the condition. Non-working pieces abound, and unless the drive can be tested or is certified by a reputable seller, it's best to treat them as if they are parts/ repair and pay according-Recall that while ly. many storage devices were external accessories, many were built-in.

There is a huge market in drives that have been removed from their computers and are very hard to test for functionality.

With the above in mind, here are some snapshots on cost: Cassette decks for 1970s/80s machines will typically run under \$50 for untested units up to \$100 for working ones with original packaging. 8-inch disk drives will sell for over \$100 in any condition — if you can find one. 5.25-inch drives can run under \$10 for an untested Microsoft-compatible piece to as much as \$300 for a proprietary example in clean, usable condition. Prices on early hard drives vary considerably. A fairly typical Microsoft-compatible drive from the early 1980s can run under \$50, even in non-working condition. Conversely, a rare early Commodore model can top \$1,000.

Now storing in "the cloud" is typical, so not much thought is given to how information is ultimately kept. It's hard today to even purchase a computer with a CD/DVD drive, let alone any kind of diskette storage. It's a technology whose day has passed. That is, unless you are a vintage computer enthusiast who needs to outfit a completely working machine!


