Fenton cranberry lamp lit up Rowley auction at \$228

PORT HURON, Mich. - The recent Rowley Auction Service Marketplace Online auction contained some interesting and unusual items. An in-person preview was offered on the morning of the event, but the sale was conducted entirely online. The auction featured a "soft close", which meant that a bid placed in the last 5 minutes would extend the closing time of that item another 5 minutes. Prices here do not include the buyer's premiums.

The highest earning item in this sale was the Fenton Cranberry opalescent Coin Dot torpedo style hanging lamp. This vintage lamp, possibly from the 1950s, consisted of a 20 inch long glass shade, two ornate brass plated caps on the top and bottom, and a chain for hanging. The electric cord had a 2-prong plug for easy installation. This desirable fixture was rehomed with a final bid of \$228. A graceful set of nine 7-inch cranberry cut to clear wine glasses was claimed with a \$26 bid.



ture items were offered, including an eye-catching walnut Victorian era hall tree standing a stately 86 inches tall. It featured figural lion heads at the top, and surrounding the rectangular mirror. There

There were some hardto-find toys. Leading this category, the #551 Fleet Line Marlin Speedboat in its original box was very well made. This 1950s detailed model measured 16 inches long, and featured original paint in

Cracker Jack is ar







\$56.

Moving from water to rail travel, there were numerous tempting options for train enthusiasts. Leading the charge was the 4-4-0 Lionel Great Train Robbery set, still sealed in the box. This ready to run engine bellowed smoke and blew the whistle as it traveled on the 27 by 63 inch ovel track, controlled by the 40 watt transformer. Also included in the set were a powered handcar with bandit figures, a load of gold bullion in the mint car, and a fenced flat car with horses, along with the engine and tender. It was taken home with a final bid of \$98. Not far behind, the new in box Lionel U.S. Navy electric train set, complete with a crane car, boxcar, flat car, and sub-

marine, plus the diesel engine, track and more finished with a \$96 final bid.

An interesting subgroup within the auction consisted of eight toy collectibles originally from the 1984 estate sale of actor Steve McQueen. Each was accompanied by a certificate of authenticity. The 5-inch-long Marx green and orange tin racecar outpaced the other items, clearing a final bid of \$63. A 6-inch-long yellow Hubley cast iron wrecker

earned a final bid of \$56, as did a 3 inch twin light.

Various holiday items were scattered throughout the sale. The Empire 7-piece blown mold outdoor nativity was in good condition with nice color and most electric cords intact. The tallest figure measured 22 inches tall, and the set earned a high bid of \$100. There were also toy soldier, Santa, and snowman blow mold figures. A sweet Fitz and Floyd ceramic Christmas bunny wore brightly colored holiday decorations around its neck. In very good condition, it left with a final bid of \$87. For those in a spooky mood, there was a large jewelry selection consisting of 25 pieces with spider designs, including pins, earrings, charms, and a keychain. This sparkling group was captured with a \$60 bid. Any holiday can be enhanced with the presence of wine, and two Sheffield silver plate wine chillers were offered to take on the job. They measured 10 inches tall, and each was claimed with a final bid of \$72.

To cap it off, there was a 3 foot long 6 inch tall Franken Muth Beer and Ale light up sign. It read "brewed MEL-O-DRY to satisfy your taste!" This vintage plastic and metal advertisement topped out with a final bid of \$57. There were many more unusual, decorative, or useful items included in this online sale.

A substantial secondary collector's market exists for Cracker Jack Halloween toy prizes. Some are quite valuable.

Today, collectors search for Cracker Jack toys made before 1970 or so. These are considered the truly collectible toy prizes. Until 1937, all Cracker Jack toy prizes were made in Japan. Beginning in 1938, Carey Cloud designed them. TootsieToy made many of the metal toy prizes.

Fortunately for toy lovers, Cracker Jack toy prizes live on in collections all across America. Some of the best collections ever assembled are from the





Keychains can open up a collector's heart

BY BARBARA MILLER BEEM

Sometimes, it's the little things that matter the most. And so it is with keychains, small objects kept in a pocket, jostled amongst a handful of change, only to be tossed onto the top of a bureau at the end of the day. Collecting them can be challenging, as antique examples are often misidentified, mistaken for buttons or tie clasps, pins or watch fobs.

Complicating the situation is the fact that keychains do not conform to any hard and fast description, as they can be found as rings alone, rings with fobs, or fobs alone. And then there's the matter of what to call them: "keyrings" or "key-

lected," according to Patrick Cottrell, a longtime collector. Living in the outskirts of Asheville, N.C., Cottrell said that many keychains have been lost to time simply because they were "used and not often preserved." In addition, he said, "Most of those who have an antique keychain collected it for the subject matter, not because it was a keychain." All the same, for those seeking a challenge, a keychain collection can be satisfying and rewarding.

Locks and keys date back thousands of years, when ancient Babylonians and Egyptians devised ways to safeguard their belongings. Instead of keeping their house keys on a cord (as did the Egyptians), the Romans kept their keys close at hand, attached to rings. Cottrell cautioned that while these Roman relics, unearthed by metal detectorists, can be found for sale for as little as \$20, he recommended caution when purchasing them, because they may or may not be reproductions.

Centuries later, in the 1800s, locks and keys became increasingly common due to the rise in industrialization. Beginning in the 1830s, the earliest keychains were mass produced. The first U.S. patent for a keyring was granted in 1869. And during the 1890s, keychains became a popular

way to advertise businesses and products. By the 20th century, keychains were a part of everyday life.

Not surprisingly, this demand resulted in the making of a keychain to suit nearly every taste and interest. And for beginning collectors, this realization might prove to be a bit overwhelming. Sharing his own story, Cottrell said that his first keychain was one with a holographic design of a dragon, a "neat" Christmas gift when he was six years old from his Dad. Over the years, Cottrell has refined his search, and for the past decade, has concentrated on adding examples of antique keychains to his collection. He estimates his current collection of keychains to number in the neighborhood of "10,000 or so."

But where to begin if you are not so gifted as a child? "Puzzles might be a good place to start," Cottrell suggested. An initial outlay of \$50 to \$100 can procure an interesting lot of vintage keychains. Or concentrate on the more than 100 game-inspired miniature reproductions produced by Basic Fun, some of which are playable. Think "Don't Break the Ice" and "Monopoly."

A Disney fan? Love all things Barbie? G.I. Joe? There's a keychain for that, or perhaps even a set of keychains. Sports fans might consider collecting keychains from "Lil Sports Brats," he continued, noting that, as with all collectibles, those with crossover appeal might sell for a bit more money. Other interesting possibilities include novelty keychains such as Sankyo's miniature music boxes, which can be found for

\$10 to \$30, and eggshaped scenes with animated clockwork windings, issued in the 1990s by the toymaker Tocara.

Those up for a challenge might attempt to track down the keychains made by Tupperware; originally intended as premiums for sales associates, they were made to generate interest in all of the company's product lines. "That's a subset that's hard to get," Cottrell conceded.

Especially popular among Japanese collectors are keychains associated with "Sweet Orr," a



High-end collectable keychains abound, including "figurals" that were popular in the 1920s and 1930s, and vintage Swiss gold keychains by Reuge that feature a watch. Cottrell reminded that keychains were a popular fad in France during the 1960s; Francophiles might seek those keychains produced by the Bourbon Company, often with a clip in the shape of a rounded horseshoe. Also notable is the "Return to Tiffany" keychain, introduced in the 1960s.

But in Cottrell's opinion, the "Holy Grail" for collectors "at the moment" would be those made to commemorate the World's Columbian Exposition, held in Chicago in 1893; these silver keychains are considered to be the first ones intended as souvenirs. On the other hand, a collection of keychains associated with a favorite

vacation destination might be a fun category to pursue. And don't overlook the idea of making your own keychain, as Cottreel has done using a fishing lure found on a beach.

On the topic of condition, Cottrell said that flaws do not automatically negate a purchase. Because keychains were intended to be used, they often show signs of wear. He said that collectors need to weigh any lessthan-perfect condition against the possibility of never finding a similar

keychain that is more perfect.

As for how to best store a collection. Cottrell said that many enthusiasts display their favorites on a pegboard. He favors using a flat file cabinet, which allows him to view and appreciate his holdings. On the creative side, he has also repurposed an old spool holder to display some of his keychains. His earliest method, he said, a binder ring, has long since been proven to be inadequate. Meanwhile, he is reluctant to use his rarest

examples for their original intended purpose.


