2019 Mustang GT revved up bidders to \$30,300 bid

ASHLEY, Mich. — Bidders at the Gary Hoffer estate auction were able to bid with the assurance that the vehicles and equipment offered were well cared for as Gary worked as a

skilled diesel mechanic for many years. He also enjoyed hunting, riding his motorcycle, and was passionate about his horses. An Army Vietnam War veteran, he continued to be involved in veteran organizations. All these areas were repre-

sented in this sale conducted by Pioneer Auction Service. Prices do not include the buyer's premium.

Two items were listed with reserve prices, and both met their goals. The 2019 Mustang GT California Special veloci-

ty blue convertible was a powerful package. Equipped with a 480 HP 5.0L V8 Coyote engine and 10 speed R80 transmission, it was built for speed and handling. The handsome suede-trimmed seats and high-performance audio system added to the enjoyment of the ride. With only one owner, 27,941 miles, and a vehicle that both ran well and looked great, it left for a new garage with a final bid of \$30,300.

The 2009 Honda Gold Wing Roadsmith bloodstone red trike was the other very popular vehicle. Loaded with features and ready for the road, this bike featured a GL 1800 engine, deluxe chrome package and wheels, leather operator and Pillion seat, and ample storage space.

With 25,863 miles it still had many more years of adventures ahead and was taken with a final bid of \$16,100.

The 2020 New Holland Work Master compact tractor provided plenty of power with the Yanmar 25HP diesel engine and Hydro transmission. This 4WD workhorse included

540 RPM PTO, 3 pt hitch, good turf tires and a roll over protective structure. It was supplemented with a New Holland 100LC quick attach loader and a 60-inch belly mower to complete the package. This original owner only put 110 hours on it, and it

Flamingos have been decorating our yards for 80 years

Modern American society may one day be judged on the social icons

it collects. Among these will be the cheap, plastic flamingos that have sprung up everywhere in lawns and gardens and have become an icon of

American pop culture.

The history of pink yard flamingos began in 1946 when Union Products of Fitchburg, Mass., first manufactured "Plastics for the Lawn." Among the many animals homeowners could purchase were ducks, frogs, dogs, and, yes, flamingos (early in their history labeled Flamingo Plasticus, Latin for "plastic flamingo"). These earliest yard ornaments were two-dimensional, making for rather cardboard appearances in the yard. That changed in 1956 when Union Products hired Don Featherstone.

Union Plastics hired Featherstone, a serious art student and sculpture,

to redesign its yard products into three-dimensional objects of plastic-realism, beginning with their most popular animal — Charlie the Duck. The company made social history when it assigned Featherstone the task of redesigning its yard flamingo.

Featherstone used pictures out of National Geographic for his models, and, from them, he made an original clay model sculpture. His clay model was used by Union Products to make a plaster cast, which was then used to create aluminum molds for plastic flamingos. Featherstone originally designed the birds to have detailed wooden legs (that showed the bird's unique elbow joints), but Union Products decided the cost of production was too

high, so they substituted straight metal rods for legs, and these same metal rods are still used today. Union Product's pink flamingo was officially born in 1957.

Luckily for Union Products, the 1950s proved the perfect era in which to unveil such a worthless trinket. Eisenhower was president, the word "beatnik" was coined, and Velcro was patented in Switzerland. During this same period, bright, bold colors were in designer vogue, and America was moving to new housing tracts in the suburbs. Advertisers convinced Americans that a natural lawn was one that was treated with chemicals and mowed, and all lawns needed a lawn ornament. In stepped the brightly colored pink plastic flamingo. These flamingos

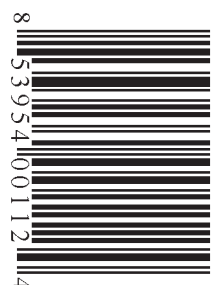


Above: Two plastic yard flamingos, circa 1980s. These flamingos have been popular since the 1950s.

quickly became accessory pieces to homes that prized pink refrigerators, pink washing machines, and, thanks to Elvis, pink Cadillacs.

Sadly for the pink flamingo, love children of the 1960s labeled the pink flamingo the stereotype of everything

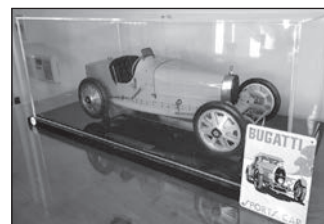

ran and operated flawlessly. It found a new job with a high bid of \$9,100. Following closely behind, the John Deere 2012 1023 E compact utility diesel tractor with similar features plus a front mounted snow blower drew a final bid of \$8,000. Other equipment for outdoor maintenance included a Swisher 60-inch electric start tow behind finish mower that closed at \$900, a Woods 7 foot 3 pt landscape rake that went for a bid of \$500, and a Howse 6 foot 3 pt hook up brush hog at \$475.

At the heart of any farm operation is a reliable pickup truck and the 1989 F250 XLT Lariat filled that role

well. The 7.3-liter diesel Power Stroke engine provided reliable service. Other features included a 2WD automatic transmission, extended cab with long box, dual fuel tanks, and newer tires. This clean and desirable model with 19,377 miles was claimed with a high bid of \$5,100.

Several large items

related to horse ownership were offered. Although the steel Viking horse trailer was a 1977 model, it was still a nice, solid option. This bumper pull tandem axle trailer featured a rear ramp for loading and unloading. The wood deck floor was in great condition and there was a built-in saddle rack inside. It was hauled away with a final bid of \$2,300. The New Idea manure spreader was another equine necessity. With a 540 RPM PTO, rear tines and dual beaters, and a clean, intact wood box, this essential item was taken with a final bid of \$1,800. There were also gates, round pen panels, posts, and feeders available.

Moving indoors, there were many great options for bidders to select. A handsome, dark wood king size bed frame housed a Sleep Number 360 Smart Bed. This innovative, highly customizable design provides sleep comfort by incorporating biometric sensors to adjust characteristics inside the mattress while one sleeps. It was claimed with a high bid of \$3,000. A sturdy 72 inch by 42 inch dark wood dining room table was outfitted with 6 chairs and a long bench. The set was in like-new condition and was claimed with a high bid of \$1,400. A Samsung washer and dryer closed at \$275 each. An ornate pair of Starwood

F u r n i t u r e Manufacturing nightstands made of cherry with marble tops finished as a set for \$225.

The bulk of the auction consisted of hundreds of tools, both large and small, in excellent condition and ready for their next assignment. Leading this category was the Snap-On 23 drawer rolling tool cabinet that included storage in the hinged top. Standing 71 inches tall by 73 inches wide, it provided a great location for workshop equipment. In exceptional condition, it was taken away with a final bid of \$3,000.

This auction provided the opportunity to add a rugged Bend Pak 2-post automotive lift to the garage. This model S203.5T-5071 held Automotive Lift Institute ANSI Accredited Certification and was ETL Listed for safe operation. It was rated for a lifting capacity of 10,000 pounds. This 220 V electric lift earned a final bid of \$2,600. Other equipment options included a Snap-On 80 Gallon 220V air compressor that was claimed for \$1,100, acetylene torches with tanks and cart for \$550, and a Snap-On automobile diagnostics tool with software containing OEM information, data, and tests that drew a \$500 final bid. Many more tools were also available for a well-stocked repair operation.

The only firearm offered was the Savage Arms, Westfield, Mass., Hiawatha Model 567 series E 12-gauge pump action shot gun. This well cared for weapon was taken home with a final bid of \$170.

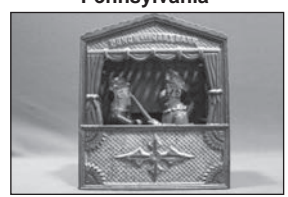

Vintage juice reamers are a collector's main squeeze

Want a glass of orange juice? Easy enough. The grocery store shelves are loaded with a variety of ready made; ready to pour OJ. One can also buy a can of concentrate and make “fresh” orange juice at home. Fresh being the operative word here. Truly fresh orange juice only comes from slicing an orange and squeezing the juice. There are lots of electric juicers on the market today as well, but if being “old school” is the goal, start collecting reamers.

Orange juice reamers were once a household staple. The examples that usually come to mind are the glass varieties where a half an orange is placed on the ribbed peak of the reamer and a push down and a couple turns resulted in orange juice in the moat below.

In her book “Reamers – 200 Years,” author Mary Walker details the history of the juice reamer. “The earliest traceable reamer, registered in 1767, is French and is of nickel silver and porcelain,” Walker wrote.

Like many other collectibles, reamers were first produced in Europe.

European reamer producers include fine china examples created by Royal Bayreuth, R.S. Prussia, Meissen, and Limoges. The upper class loved juice but their reamers had to be the best.

In the United States, reamers had a more humble beginning. Though Charles L. Tiffany offered a reamer at the Tiffany and Co. store in New York in the early 1880s, the first juice

extractor patented in the United States was on May 30, 1865, and it was made of wood.

The hand-held lemon squeezer created by George Cornford was the first clear glass reamer to be patented (August 19th, 1884) in the U.S. and looked like a darning egg according to Walker.

Lemon squeezers pre-date orange juice reamers, but those who collect juicers go for both. Reamer collectors are also very passionate about the history behind the designs, and the designs really took off after 1900.

The first reamers were for extracting

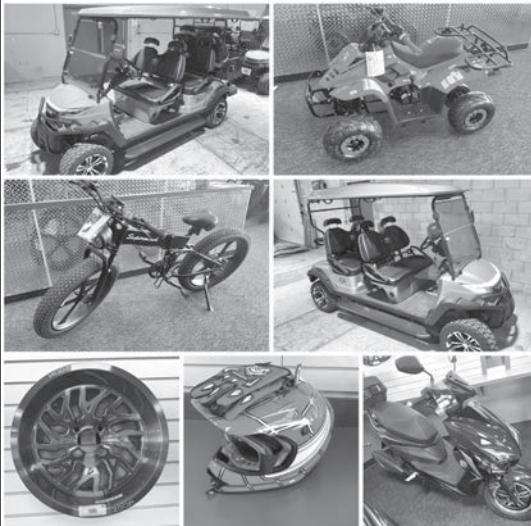

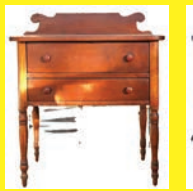

that was bad and distasteful in America. Plastic was out and nature was in, so shockingly pink flamingos became the epitome of bad taste in America. By the 1970s, pink flamingos

were considered "trailer trash" trophies, and people placed them in their yards simply to "bug" their neighbors. More than one fight ensued over these kitschy, pink birds.

The true turning point in the life of plastic pink flamingos seems to be the

early 1980s. College students across America made the gross-out flick Pink Flamingos a cult film. This inspired people to rethink their opinions of pink flamingos, especially when rich hotels and casinos were using the pink flamingo motif. The premier of Miami Vice on television in 1984 moved pink flamingos from trailer trash lawn junk to true yard art.

1985 marked the first year that Union Products sold more pink flamingos than any other yard animal, including its famous duck. And, today, these cheap plastic pink flamingos are sold for every purpose known to "civilized" man, including wedding decorations, reindeer replacements at Christmas, house warming gifts, and even nativity scenes. And some people actually travel with their pink flamingos, taking the plastic birds camping, skiing, and even on European vacations.

The pink yard ornament

has also grown to be one of the most stolen items in America, where every year thousands are stolen from yards and gardens. Some pink flamingos have even been kidnapped and held for ransom. And, to directly flout laws banning pink flamingos in yards, Union Products introduced blue flamingos.

If you wish to collect the authentic bird, look for Don Featherstone's signature beneath the bird's tail feathers.

A flock of flamingos is actually known as a "pat."

Human's love for flamingos may be traced all the way back to ancient Egypt. A prominent and easily recognized symbol of Egyptian hieroglyphics is the flamingo symbol (dsr in Egyptian) that literally means "red." Egyptians used the flamingo symbol often, showing their love for the color and the exotic bird. Others, over the years, have also shown their love for this loveliest of all God's creatures, making some flamingo items quite

valuable to collect.

Flamingo items worth collecting include casino chips, cookie jars (one by Metlox now sells for over \$600), cut crystal flamingos by famous glass artists like Swarovski, hand-blown glass finials and other flamingos that sell for over \$100 each, and a great pink potpourri of other flamingo collectibles. For the true pink procurer, there are trash cans bearing flamingo pictures, decks of cards, art work from Alice in Wonderland,

"Pink Flamingo" bubble bath containers, Mojolica flamingos, beautiful porcelain pieces (such as Will George's "Flamingo and Dish"), and even flamingo cigarette lighters.

With each passing year, more and more items are manufactured as flamingo items, making the availability of pink flamingo collectibles seemingly inexhaustible, and the love of pink forever in the blood of 1950s collectors.

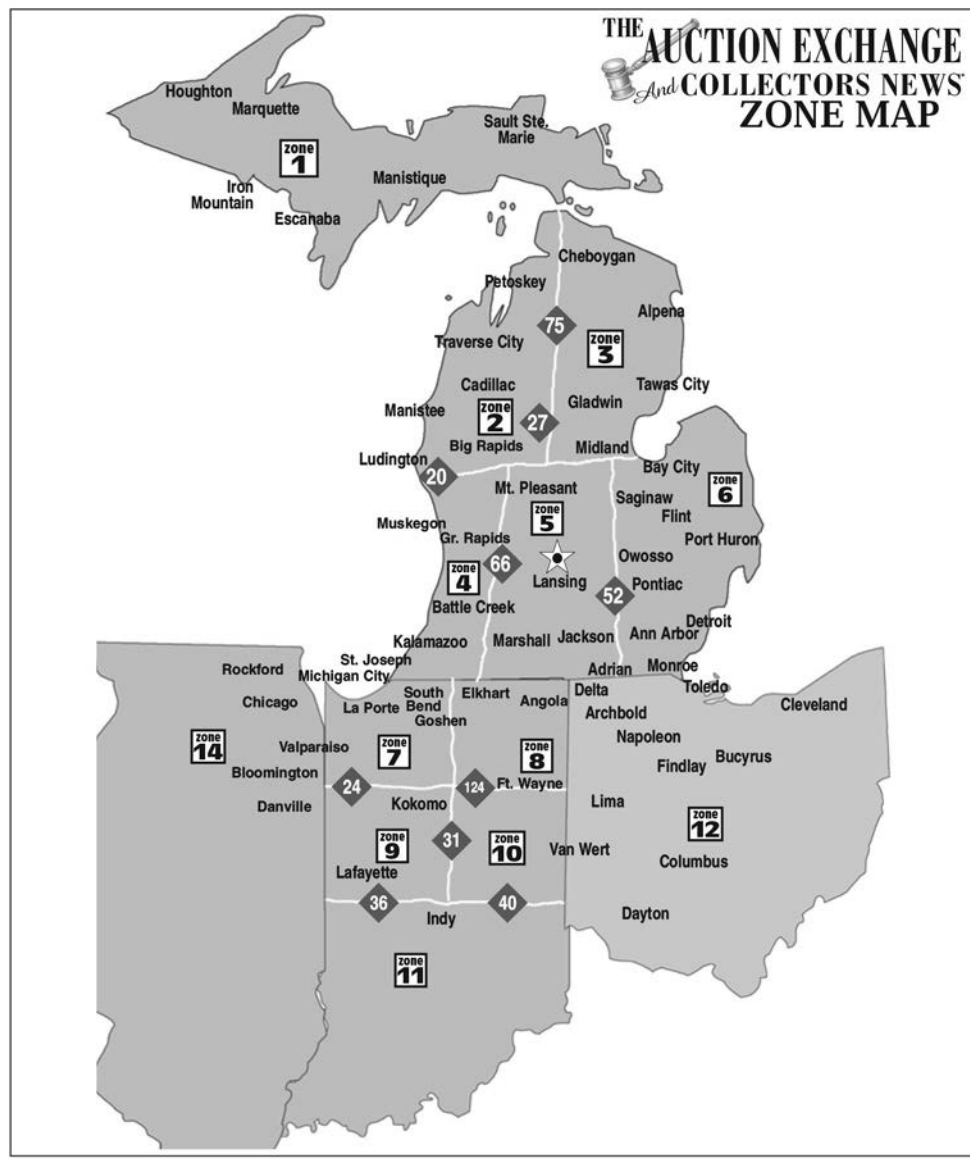

Vintage Juicers

lemon juice for cooking or flavoring; not necessarily oranges for making orange juice to drink. But that changed in 1907 when Sunkist (initially established as the trademark for the California Fruit Growers oranges) came about and by 1916 Sunkist began offering glass reamers as a way to promote oranges even more.

The design of the orange juicers were different from the lemon juicers. Lemon juicers did not require a "bowl" or area on the juicer to catch the juice; but orange reamers did which ignited major changes in reamer designs.

Sunkist was the leader in design change offering reamers with juice receptacles as well

as reamers with embossed lettering spelling out "Sunkist Oranges and Lemons" or "Sunkist - California Fruit Grower's Exchange."

According to Walker these reamers "were vigorously marketed through department and variety stores, grocery outlets, and by mail-order." Sunkist continued to offer reamers until 1961 with many being made by the McKee Glass Company, according to Gene Florence's book "Kitchen Glassware of the Depressions Years" (Collector Books), though not all were.

In the 1920s and 30s, glassware began being produced in colors. In 1922, the Fry Glass Company offered reamers done in "Pearl Glass", and by 1925 reamers could be found made of everything from

Vaseline glass to amber, pink, cobalt blue and emerald glass. With the coming of the Depression, Walker notes, "More American glass reamers were produced than ever before and after." Reamers made of Depression glass are a popular addition in many reamer enthusiasts' collections.

Other reamers produced in the 1930s include the "Servmor", the "Handy Andy" and the "Jiffy Juicer." It was also during this time the measuring cup set reamers (where the juicer sits atop a measuring cup) came to be. This design challenged one-piece glass models as the reamer of choice.

Ceramic reamers are another category in this collecting genre and are very popular.

Nelson McCoy Pottery

produced a high-gloss stoneware example in the 30s, while Lenox, Inc., made a traditional eggshell and gold china reamer in the 20s. During Prohibition, Walter Kazoian of San Quetin, Calif., registered a ceramic reamer; the "Ade-O-Matic." Walker states this reamer was "manufactured in Coorsite porcelain by none other than the Coors Bottling Company."

By the 1930s, the flood of Japanese made ceramic reamers undercut the popularity of the more expensive colored glass models. Still, Japanese-made reamers are also popular with collectors. Clowns seem to be a dominate design and fruit shaped reamers were commonly found. By the end of the 1930s, kitchens were becoming

more "kitschy" and the funky Japanese ceramic reamers better suited the décor.

Then came 1939 and frozen orange juice signaling the end of the age of the reamer.

Collectors of reamers love the fact that so many different reamers were created. The glass and ceramic varieties are most prevalent, but plastic reamers exist, as do ones made of cast iron or sterling silver.

Collectors build their stash based on patent dates, company names, designs, or even color.

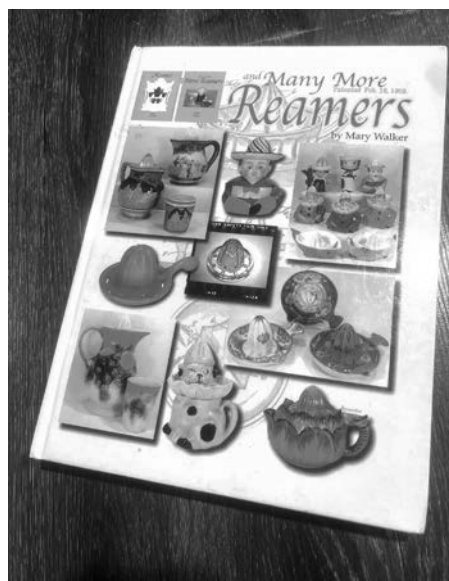
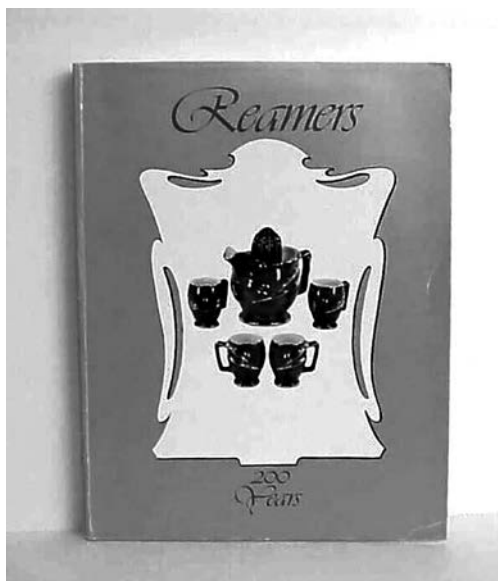
There are baby reamers marketed towards new mothers, suggesting the best for their baby was freshly squeezed juice. Many of these reamers have the words "Baby's Orange" or simply "Baby" on the reamer.

There are figural ceramic reamers (usually made in Japan or Germany) with everything from clowns to swans, fish, and even Winnie-the-Pooh examples out there for the finding. Know many of these ceramic novelty reamers were more for show than functional. Sometimes their construction makes it almost impossible to clean after use, so it possibly was never intended to be used as a reamer, but more as a decorative novelty.

With so many options for collecting, current collectors suggest "newbies" acquire what they like and what their wallet can handle. Luckily, vintage juice reamers are still very affordable and a fun and functional decorative item.

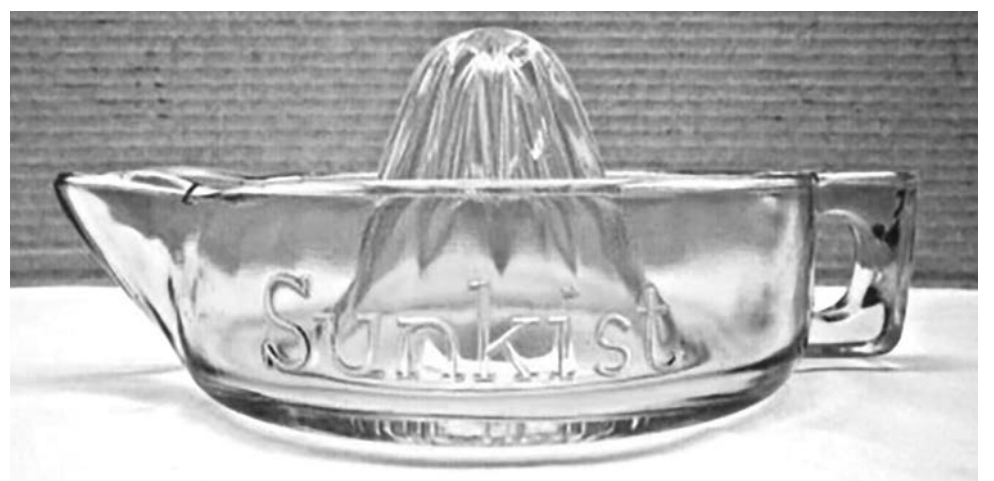
