Collectors hear the call of the wild for Jim Beam

whiskey Collecting decanters became hugely popular in the mid-20th century and is still a pop-



hobby ular today. Decanters in general are vessels that are used to hold the decantation of a liquid, so whiskey decanters hold whiskey.

Decantation is a process that separates a liquid from a solid, such as a solid mixture in suspension. Whiskey does not



need decanted since any suspended solid is separated from the whiskey long before it is bottled. However, cognac and single malt Scotch whiskey have been, historically, sold in stoppered decanters for centuries, mainly for advertising purposes. The main reason to put whiskey in a decanter is for sales appeal and style, and the volume found in a whiskey decanter is often equivalent to a standard bottle of whiskey (many decanters hold 750 ml of proof, Kentucky 80 straight bourbon whiskey). Decorative whiskey decanters are typically made of glass or porcelain, which helps to protect the whiskey from light and air. This is important since exposure to light and air may cause whiskey to oxidize and change in flavor. Jim Beam Distillery, in

ple and pink tourmaline cabochons, measuring approximately 10 by 14 millimeters. It was surrounded by round-cut, bezel-set diamond accents, measuring approximately 3.75 mm, with Tourmaline eyes and blue enamel detail. It was still in the original fitted "Poile & Smith" case. This piece was unmarked, but the head and chain both tested at 14 carats. The tongue tested gold-filled. There were some small holes to the gold underneath the head. The tourmaline had some inclusions and showed wear to the surface, and was enameled. It measured 16 ¹/₂ inches in length.

A 14-carat gold book bracelet was a popular piece. This bracelet featured floral enameled segments that folded into a "book", with red gemstone accents. It had a separate 14-carat gold slide clasp with a hanger. It was unmarked and weighed 56.3 grams. There were some minor losses to the enamels, and one hinge was slightly loose. It measured around 8 inches long when open.

Selling for \$1,700 was a beautiful 18-carat gold, ruby, and diamond bangle bracelet. This piece was a hinged bangle featuring graduated channel-set square-cut diamonds and rubies. It was made of 18-carat gold and weighed a total of 32.4 grams. There was some minor wear.

A vintage 18-carat gold and diamond necklace was highly sought after. It was custom-made by Stefani, from Cary Birmingham, Mich. It consisted of openwork in

There was some minor repair at the rim and some wear to the decoration, which had been touched up with paint. It also had a few burst air bubbles and measured about 12 by 12 inches overall.

A Zia Pueblo earthenware dough bowl was a bit different. It had a wider opening at the top and tapered to a smaller base. It had the same polychrome geometric decoration all around, with some wear to the design. It also had a few burst air bubbles. This one measured approximately 17 by 9 inches. It garnered a respectable bid price of \$ 1,900.

A four-piece Mexican sterling silver tea set was beautiful. All pieces had lobed bodies with floral decoration. It included a teapot, creamer, covered sugar dish, and an open waste bowl. The teapot was marked "Sterling Mexico." The creamer and sugar were marked with "Plateria Alameda Juarez" and "Sterling/ Mexico." The complete set weighed in at 70.48 troy ounces. There was some surface wear, and the teapot had minor damage at the spout and a bent hinge. The covered sugar bowl had a loose finial. This set sold for \$1,700.

Bringing in a high bid of \$2,300 was a set of 106 pieces of Gorham 'Chantilly" patterned sterling silver flatware. marks and 'Sterling". The This set featured 12 complete five-piece place settings with each including hollow handle dinner knives, butter knives, dinner forks, salad forks, oval soup spoons, , tea-

spoons, and iced tea spoons. There were also 23 pieces of additional flatware and serving utensils. All pieces were impressed with the Gorham maker's marks and "Sterling". Weighing a total of 106.31 troy ounces, the set showed some wear and tarnishing. Many of these items were monogrammed, and there were some instances of mismatched styles and sizes.

A 62-piece set of flatware also performed well. This set was the Whiting "King Albert" pattern. It featured 12 four-piece place settings and also included 11 additional flatware and serving utensils. There was a hollow handle spreader knife, butter knives, dinner forks, and teaspoons. Each piece was impressed with the Whiting maker's set showed some wear and weighed 52.16 troy ounces, excluding the hollow-handled spreader knives. It brought a final bid price of \$1,300. Α very unusual

19th-century Chinese Coromandel screen sold for \$1,700. The molded rosewood frames showcased six panels decorated with hand-carved vine and floral motifs on both the upper and lower panels. The black lacquer center panels featured hand-painted gold landscapes and carved jade and hardstone details, including waterfowl and foliage. There were also hand-painted gold landscape designs showing off mountain villages along a river on the black lacquer panels. The entire piece measured in at approximately 108 by 85 inches. This type of Chinese lacquerware was named "Coromandel" because it was made for export and shipped to European markets via the Coromandel coast of south-eastern India. A Loetz Cytisus art glass vase generated some interest. This piece featured a bulbous form in an enjoyable, mottled, May green to orange glass. This vase had linear decoration and some minor surface wear. It stood about 7 inches high. Loetz was a premier Bohemian art glass manufacturer during the Art Nouveau era, spanning approximately 1890 to 1920. This company became known for its innovative techniques, organic forms, and bold use of color. For more information visit w w w . SchmidtsAntiques.com.



Cats have sold everything from stoves to elixirs

Cat food. Cat litter. Cat treats, toys, and toothpaste. Nowadays, when you run across an ad with a cat in it, you can be sure whatever's on sale revolves around the cat, which is just the way cats like it. But that wasn't always the case. At the turn of the 20th century, these lovable bits of furry fun popped up in advertising for all sorts of things, from the likely (lactated baby food, and "palatable as milk" patent medicines), to the less likely (soap, flour, and fruit vinegars), to the amazingly un-likely (stoves, watches, brewer's yeast, and "miracle elixirs"). Why? Because Cats were cozy. Cats were comforting. And so, by extension, were the products they unwittingly peddled.

The cat's rise to advertising prominence in the late 1800s was a natural

outgrowth of the Victorian emphasis on hearth and home. Although decorated tins came into common use in the 1880s,

and porcelain signs in the 1890s, the majority of the era's advertising was produced in that most perishable of medi-

ums: paper. Advertising trade cards with cats as the featured attraction were roughly the size of either postcards or playing cards, and printed on heavy paper stock. A fetching color lithograph was featured on the card's surface; on the reverse, all the nuts-andbolts details of what was being offered such as "Reynolds Brothers Celebrated Fine Shoes! Acknowledged By All To Be 'The Best Made!' Constantly On Hand In Every Size, Width, And Style! C.A. McCune,

Boone, Iowa!" Pre-printed "stock' cards were supplied in bulk to local retailers, and overprinted with identifying information for each store. "Private design" cards were the bailiwick of individual companies, promoting inventory specialties.

Also popular with consumers were "premium" cards, included as a bonus with their purchases. In the 1890s,

Woolson Spice Co. found plenty of eager takers for its cat-themed picture cards, tucked away "in every package of Lion Coffee." Fairy-tale favorites in the 20-card series included, of course, "Puss in Boots" and "The Three Little Kittens." The cards were creased and notched for use as standing paper-doll figures, and a synopsis of the fairy tale story was included on the back along with a sizable ad for Lion Coffee, "used daily in a million homes".

"Miracle tonics," guaranteed good for whatever ailed you, were an overthe counter staple as the 20th century began, and plenty of consumers put aside their skepticism long enough to give them a try. In this case, manufacturers solved an advertising quandary in advance, by effectively

pussy-footing around it. No one wanted to see illustrations of folks on their sickbeds. It was a much more palatable sales tool to show those folks in the pink of health, the obvious result of quaffing the company's patented brew. Playful kittens contributed to an overall image of well-being.

"The Little Favorites," a cheery visual employed by Ayer's Pills, depicts a fresh-faced youngster, holding a cat in one hand, and cradling another in her apron. The tenuous tie-in? Just like the kittens, Ayer's Pills were also "Little Favorites," with "a world-wide reputation as the best remedy for Constipation, Dyspepsia, Biliousness, Dysentery and Other Disorders.'

Another belle of the Gay '90s, the winsome "May," also cradles a cat in her apron, while in the other she daintily hoists a package marked "BBB." As the copy on the card reverse informs us, "BBB" stands for "Burdock Blood Bitters," a sure cure for "sourness of the stomach, belching, and indigestion." Said the manufacturer, "You who are blue-faced, faint-hearted, low-spirited, weak or nervous, try them. Burdock Blood Bitters never fail to give satisfaction." Said May: "I honestly believe that I owe my existence today to Burdock Blood Bitters." And, if that sweet young thing cuddling a trio of kittens in an 1887



She's just downed (and evidently not minded), a soothing mouthful of Scott's cod-liver oil concoction, guaranteed to perk up "puny, sickly young folks," "nervous lady invalids," and other "feeble, attenuated adults." In case the illustration itself wasn't persuasive enough, Scott's copywriters went all out to get their point across:

In 1906, the Food and Drug Administration clamped down on the more over-enthusiastic patent medicine pitches, insisting on at least some factual basis for reputed curative claims. By the dawn of World War I, such products were more soberly (if less entertainingly) marketed.

Early cat-centric advertising is not just a

by the local sales agent. crisscross collectible. The appeal is a given for cat-lovers, ready to snap up anything featuring their fluffy friends. Equally intrigued, however, are collectors of vintage advertising, particularly those who specialize in paper goods, or advertising focusing on certain product lines. Among the myriad of firms featuring cats in their ads from 1880-1910: Acorn Stoves (Continental, too); Buffalo Soap; Solliday's Pure Fruit Vinegars; New Home Sewing Machines; Clark's Spool Cotton; Cream-Indigo Bluing; Gold Medal Flour; Burr Block Men's Collars; Fermentum Compressed Yeast; Quill Baking Powder; Agate Ironware; AST Co. Children's Shoes; Baker's Flavoring Extracts; and Metropolitan Life Insurance.

Paper advertising was never intended for longevity, simply as a means of boosting immediate sales. Most such ads were soon discarded, just as we now discard expired sales circulars. Fortunately, there were always those drawn to the colorful, homey illustrations. Cards were casually saved, with no realization that they would re-emerge decades later to delight new generations. Sometimes. entire scrapbooks and keepsake boxes filled with cat ads can be found at yard sales and paper

ly under \$5 per card.

Due to their ephemeral nature, inexpensive construction, and age, paper goods of this type are often very difficult to find in pristine condition. That's OK. These are treasures best appreciated "as is." That they even exist today is remarkable; the markings of age only add to their character. Enjoy them as fascinating remnants of a bygone time, when kittens in advertising were "the cat's meow!"







Beam, a farmer, began producing bourbon-type whiskey in the 1790s. By 1795, Beam was selling barrels of corn whiskey, calling his whiskey "Old Jake Beam Sour Mash." In 1854, the family whiskey business was moved Nelson County, to Kentucky, to capitalize on the growing network of railroad lines for the distribution of its whiskey. In 1880, the company began bottling "Old Tub" whiskey. This name stuck for over 60 years. In 1943, "Old Tub" whiskey was renamed "Jim Beam." The distillery remained in the Beam family until 1945 when Harry Blum, a Chicago spirits merchant, purchased Jim Beam

Decorative Jim Beam whiskey decanters brought style and "good taste" to anyone's home bar, which, often led to wonderful Jim Beam decanter collections, which were often kept in homes, offices, party dens, and even yachts.

Since the shapes and sizes of Jim Beam whiskey decanters are practically endless, collectors look for unusual decanters or decanters that reflect their hobbies or profession. One of the most sought after decanter collections is Jim Beam's wildlife decanters, which focused a vari-

ety of wild animals in their natural habitat. These decanters are cross collectible since whiskey collectors, decanter collectors, hunters, and wildlife collectors all search for Jim Beam wildlife decanters. There are basically two types of Jim Beam wildlife decanters — life like, statue-appearing decanters where the head of the animal is the decanter's cap and flat-faced decanter bottles with artistic renderings of wildlife on the front.

While many artists designed and illustrated Jim Beam decanters, James Leland Lockhart in collaboration with Regal China Company illustrated many of the Jim Beam wildlife decanters from 1970 through 1998.

Fortunately for collectors, Jim Beam wildlife decanters are, for the most part, affordable. On average, a Jim Beam

pheasant decanter, which is a highly popular decanter in Beam's wildlife series, sells today for around \$50; however, there are many Jim Beam wildlife decanters selling for around \$10, making Jim Beam wildlife decanters truly inexpensive to collect.


