ACROSS THE AUCTION BLOCK

Outdoor collectibles make a splash at Steffen auction

FORT WAYNE, Ind. — Just before the Independence Day holiday, Steffen Group held a personal property auc-

tion featuring sporting items, antiques, collectible firearms, vintage boats and outboards, tools, and vehicles. The auction offered 754 lots via HiBid.

The top bids went to

two vehicles. The highest at \$8,850 went for a 2017 4-door FWD Ford Escape SE with 60,933 miles. The silver-on-silver vehicle, Ziebarted when new, featured a 1.5-liter EcoBoost engine, 6-speed

automatic with select shift, AC, and more.

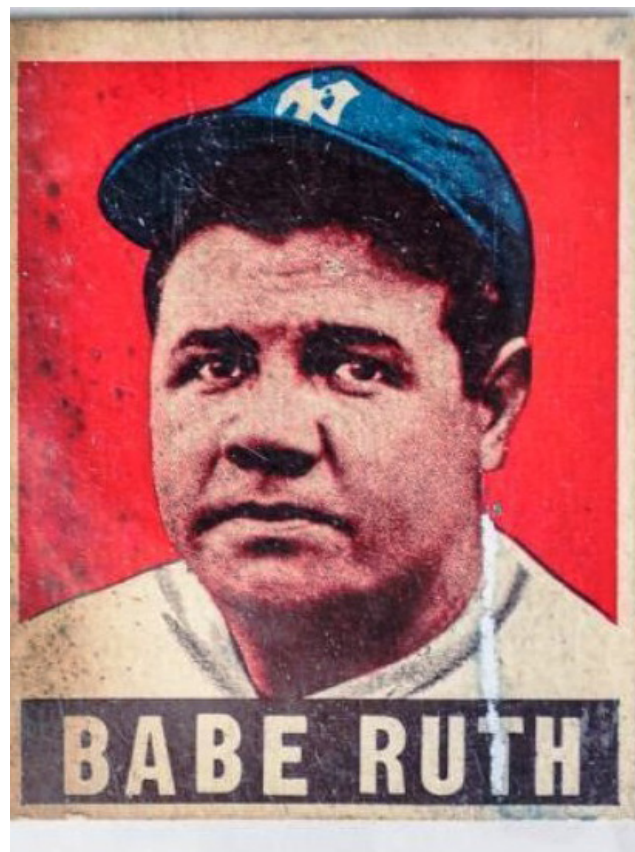
Next was a 2000 Chevrolet LS 2500 Silverado extended cab pickup truck, hitting \$4,360. It had 115,225 miles and needed minor mechanical and cosmetic work. Silver with grey leather interior, it featured a 6.0-liter Vortec gas engine, automatic transmission, 8-foot bed, third door, and 5th wheel hitch attachment.

Beyond the vehicles, vintage field and stream

American Period furniture encompasses broad range

While all furniture can be placed into an era or period, the term "American Period Furniture" applies, according to Ken Johnson on

periodfurniture.com, to "American furniture built between the mid- to late-1600s through, approximately, 1840."

Within the roughly 140 years span encompassing the American Period Furniture era, there are

several mini-divisions or periods. The two large periods are the Colonial Period (1620 – 1780) and the Federal Period (1780 – 1820). And within these two periods are several sub-periods. The Colonial Period is comprised of Colonial and Jacobean (1620 – 1720), Queen Anne (1720 – 1750), and Chippendale (1750 – 1780). The Federal Period began following America's Revolution and includes the following periods—Hepplewhite (1780 – 1800), Sheraton (1790 – 1810), and Classical (1810 – 1820).

As the above dates indicate, many of these American Furniture Periods overlap, since "each subsequent period influenced the style of its

successors," Johnson wrote.

Furniture makers during the American Period Furniture era tended to live on or close by the eastern seaboard since that is also where most of the population was centered. Key cities of manufacture included Charleston, Boston, New York, and Philadelphia. Rhode Island, although a state not a city, produced two of America's premier furniture making families — the Townsend and Goddard families. Furniture demand tended to be strongest along territorial regions since Charleston was the center of the southern plantation market for furniture and



Boston and New York the north — where were the largest, shipping money helped commercial furniture manufacturing areas of

items drew strong interest and a range of bidding. Top among them was a vintage Mercury Super 10 Kiekhaefer Hurricane Model KG7 outboard motor, in unknown condition, sold for \$2,750. Thirty other vintage outboards sold from \$10 for a rough, restorable Johnson Sea-Horse to \$140 for a 10-hp Johnson Sea-Horse QD-12 in good cosmetic but unknown operating condition.

Boats included a 12-foot Thompson wooden fishing boat with Indiana registration that went for \$750. A 13-foot 1950s Thompson wooden boat with trailer and vintage Mercury Kiekhaefer Dyna Float outboard (titles included) brought \$625. Two differently designed home-built wooden racing boats, one an 8-foot hydroplane, the

other a 10.5-foot traditional style, each sold for \$325. Other watercraft sold for much less, including a 12-foot Alumacraft outboard boat that fetched just \$22.50. Boating accessories included items like a 1998 CYO Model K08 boat trailer with title that brought \$75. A lot with three small-boat anchors managed \$50, and a vintage motorboat windshield was picked up for \$13.

For watercraft enthusiasts not desiring a full-size boat, there were a dozen model and toy boats and nearly two dozen model outboards and accessories. A three-piece lot including a Cragstan battery-operated speedboat, Fleet Line

plastic boat, and Batta windup speedboat went for \$10. Two wooden handmade canoes (18 and 27 inches) fetched \$80. Miniature outboards sold from \$11 for a plastic electric toy variety to \$85 for a fuel-powered vintage Allyn Sea Fury model.

Other water-oriented gear included four pairs of vintage water skis - selling from \$11 for a pair of 5 foot 10 inch wooden Sea King Combo Deluxe models to \$42.50 for white ash Thompson skis. A lot of five vintage fishing poles (all but one with reels) sold for \$13. A mixed lot with a wooden ice fishing box, poles, and accessories went for \$10.

Back on land, a pair of stag handle hunting knives (one small bone handle fillet knife; the other possibly a scrimshaw and etched ivory piece) brought \$35. Two animal traps fetched \$32.50, while a tote of ice skates in various sizes left for \$6.

Sporting goods offerings extended to four dozen lots with antique and collectible firearms and accessories. Those

included pistols like a Colt 1816 Sesquicentennial single-action Frontier Scout 22LR revolver with its wood box that bid to \$550, a probable reproduction Ethan Allen pepperbox (six-shot 36 caliber) percussion single-action revolver by Hoppe's going for \$110, and a German-made Burgo .22 caliber short pistol that pulled \$65.

Long guns included a Marlin original Golden 39M .22 S.L. & L.R. lever-action rifle with micro-groove barrel that landed \$775. A black powder muzzleloader of unknown era brought \$220, and a Remington Arms .22 single-shot rifle sold for \$170.

Shooting accessories include a wooden crate with six cans of Superfine black powder plus two 1¼-inch lead cannon balls that scored \$130. Bidding reached just \$60 for a 77-inch-tall solid walnut gun rack. Later, a pair of likely reproduction gunpowder flasks were grabbed for \$16.

Beyond all the sporting goods, there were some interesting antiques and collectibles, including a nice selection of baseball and other sports cards. Leading the pack was a 1949 Leaf Babe Ruth baseball card with some tape residue on the back that fetched \$1,500. Two other cards hit three figures, including a Play Ball 1941 Hank Greenberg baseball card with glue residue on the reverse that went for \$160, and a 1941 Play Ball Jimmie Fox baseball

card, with creases and glue residue that hit \$150.

Other interesting pieces included a box with five cast iron cannon barrels (up to 33 inches) and wood accessories that sold for \$55. Tools were led by a half-dozen antique anvils priced from \$12 for a child's size (part of a three-piece kid's tool lot) to \$325 for a 22½ inch by 10½ -inch antique blacksmith anvil on a woodblock stand. Sold separately was a set of nine blacksmith tongs, picked up for \$27.50

Heading back into the wheeled category, two Manco go karts with Tecumseh PowerSport gas engines, each needing some work, sold for \$625 apiece. A non-running 1982 Suzuki 300 GSL motorcycle rolled off for \$180, and a vintage child's 4-wheel scooter in usable condition was taken home for just \$35 - each helping cap this enticing auction rooted in outdoor recreation.

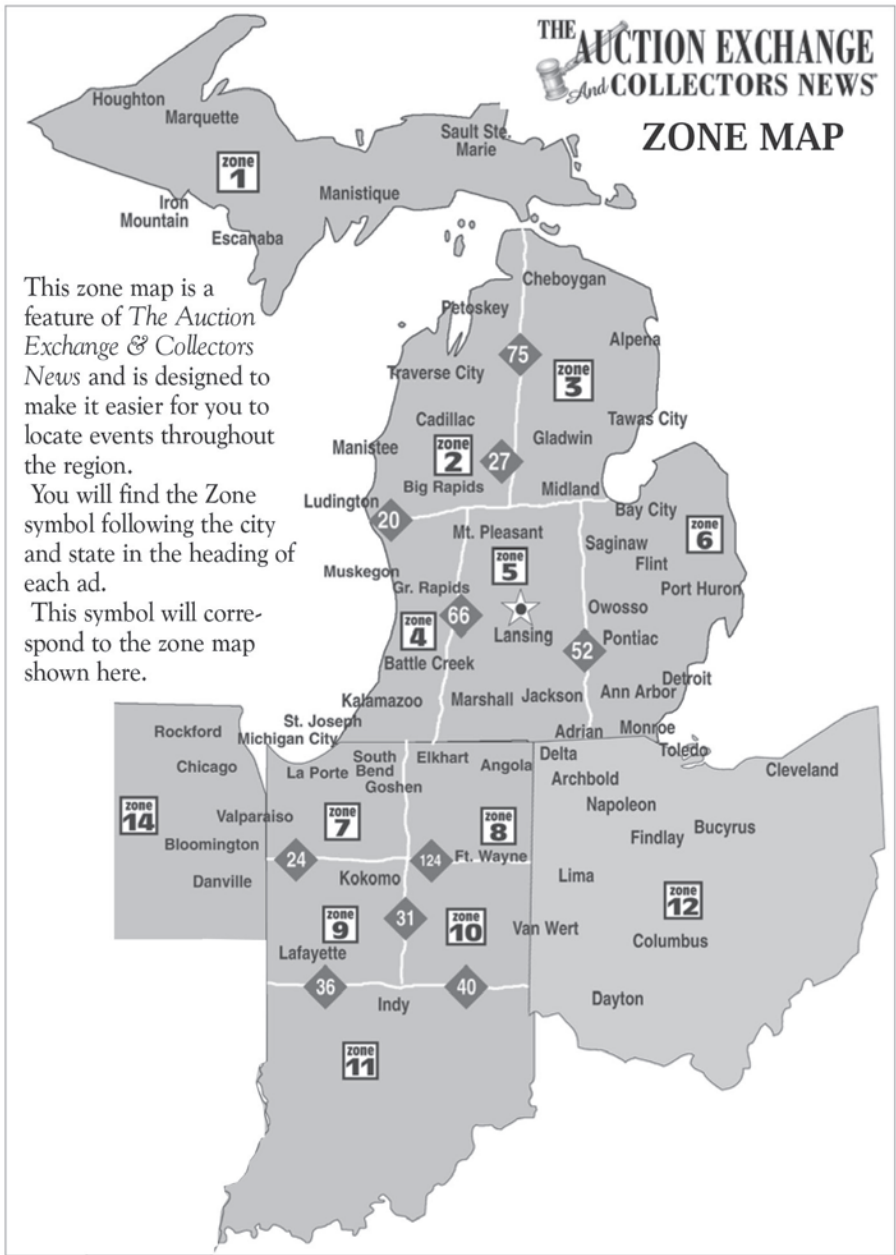

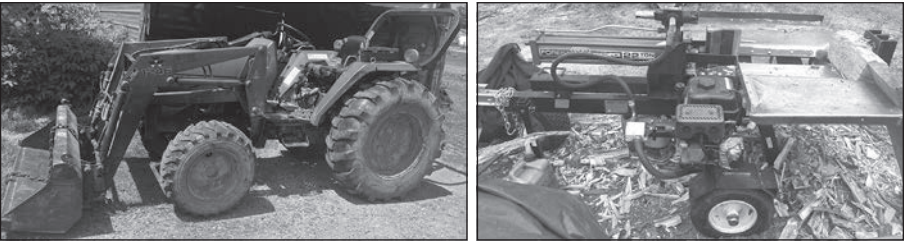

create an ever growing market.

The seemingly high quality of furniture crafted during the American Period Furniture era appears to indicate that craftsmen of this era were more skilled than furniture makers of later eras; however, Johnson points out, “Many people today believe that these furniture makers (Period Furniture makers) were just businessmen trying to make a living by exercising their skills and talents.”

When looking for American Period furniture to add to a collection, one must determine the furniture’s value. It may prove helpful to remember Robert Bishop’s (How to Know American Antique Furniture, 1973)

observation, “Not everything that is old is valuable. If a piece was poorly made originally, its worth has not increased just because it has aged. To understand the value of a piece of furniture, one must fully analyze it. When was it

made? Where was it made? Who made it? How was it made? Is it aesthetically pleasing? If it is to be used in the home, is it sturdy? Has there been any restoration? If there has, how does it affect the overall appearance of the piece and will it alter its market value?”

When looking at the list of Bishop’s questions, it becomes obvious that American Period Furniture collectors should constantly try to improve their knowledge since it takes a lifetime to learn enough to become an amateur furniture collector.

Bishop believes that the place to begin your quest for knowledge is the 1876 Centennial International Exhibition held in Philadelphia. At this “World’s Fair,” Americans were first introduced to “nostalgic Colonial displays.” One exhibit, “A New England Kitchen of 1776,” was constructed with a beamed ceiling, leaded casement windows, and a great fireplace. The kitchen was furnished with pieces dating from the 17th, 18th, and 19th centuries.” This exhibit was hugely successful, and “The ensuing craze for collecting and decorating in the ‘Colonial’ or ‘Early American’ style caused manufacturers to turn their workmen from the production of French-inspired Victorian pieces [of furniture] to the crafting of modern ‘antiques’ or reproductions.”

Colonial furniture, according to www.colonialfurniture.us, “is made to serve three chief purposes, (1), to put things on, (2) to put things in, and (3) the stool.” Obviously, from this definition, the emphasis

on Colonial furniture was the chest or other box-like furniture and a comfortable place to sit.

Within the Colonial Period reside the Queen Anne and Chippendale furniture periods. The Queen Anne (1720-1750) is an American furniture style with its most relevant feature the cabriole leg. The cabriole leg is a bowed, offset leg that grows from the floor around the entire piece. Walnut, maple, and cherry are favorite Queen Anne Period woods, but towards the end of the period, mahogany gained favor.

Thomas Chippendale’s work enjoyed an unchallenged influence on American furniture during the late Colonial Furniture Period. According to www.furniturestyles.net, “The designs of Chippendale, a pared down, Anglicized version of French rococo Louis XV furniture, were quickly taken up and the old Queen Anne style faded into history. The distinguishing characteristic of American Chippendale was more emphasis on symmetry of line and proportion.” It is during the Chippendale

era that American Pembroke tables became popular.

Hepplewhite furniture is the first period furniture in the Federal period. Hepplewhite is conservatively designed with a light appearance, but it does retain the cabriole leg of the Queen Anne style.

Finally, the Classical period (1810-1820) effectively ended the age of American Furniture Periods. The Classical period (also called Empire) furniture used broad expanses of beautiful veneers and carved ornamentation. During the Classical period, Baltimore became known for its painted, decorated furniture, very similar in style to Philadelphia’s pieces.

Ken Johnson summed up the American Period Furniture era best when he wrote, “After 250 years these pieces of craftsmanship still instill awe and respect in museums, exhibits, and homes around the world.” It is highly probable that collectors will still be seeking these beautiful examples of American furniture building in another 250 years.

Don’t wait until Christmas for the perfect table cover

Most people would agree that now is not the time to be decking the halls with boughs of holly. Nor is this the season to be jolly. For that matter, isn’t it a bit too hot outside to be celebrating with a “blazing yule”? On the other hand, for many vintage tablecloth lovers, collecting Christmas-themed table linens is a year-round activity. And there is no better time than now to get a head start on the holiday season, according to longtime collector Jimmie Bucci.

Beginning in the 1930s and stretching into the 1970s, “tons of companies” manufactured Christmas tablecloths to suit every taste and holiday decor, Bucci said. With a tablecloth to fit every budget, Christmas linens, sometimes in boxed sets with match-

ing napkins, were sold at a range of shops, including high-end department stores. A popular size was an oblong tablecloth measuring 54 by 62 inches,

suitable for either a kitchen or dining room table. Square cloths measuring approximately 36 by 36 to 52 by 52 inches were perfect for a host-

ess’ card table. Designs ranged from traditional to whimsical in nature. The best tablecloth was used on Christmas Day. As family life in Amer-

ica changed and became more informal, a freshly ironed tablecloth was no longer a priority. But decades later, the status of tablecloths seems to have been elevated as people rediscovered these examples of kitchen textile art. In the summer of 2002, the Vintage Tablecloth Lovers Club (VTLC) was formed. And thanks to dedication and perseverance, the online club remains active, providing support to both new and seasoned tablecloth aficionados.

As president of VTLC, Bucci noted that even

though Christmas carols might not be on their playlist, many antique malls are celebrating “Christmas in July.” Yard sales abound with out-of-season offerings. And a recent check of eBay listings revealed nearly 8,000 “vintage Christmas tablecloths” for sale. Starting a new collection or adding to an existing one might be the perfect antidote to the summertime blues, he suggested.

Fortunately, starting

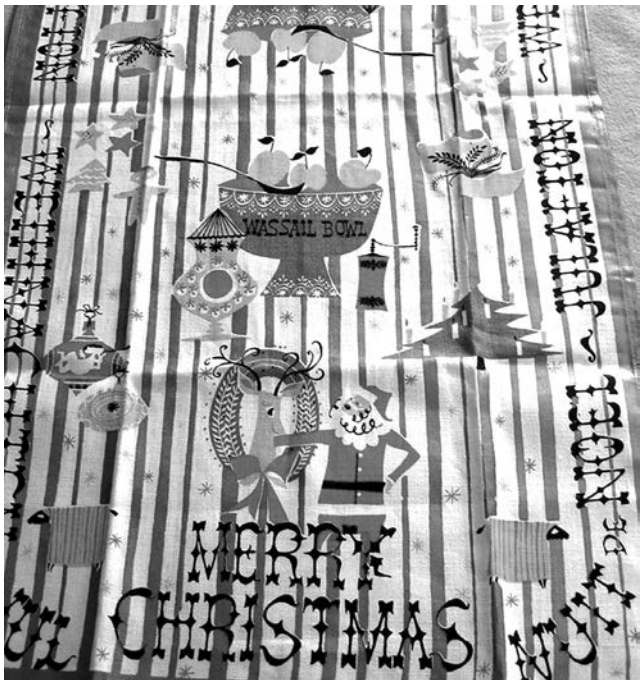

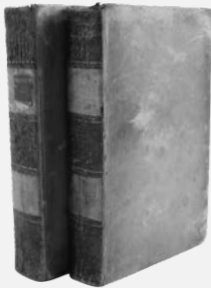

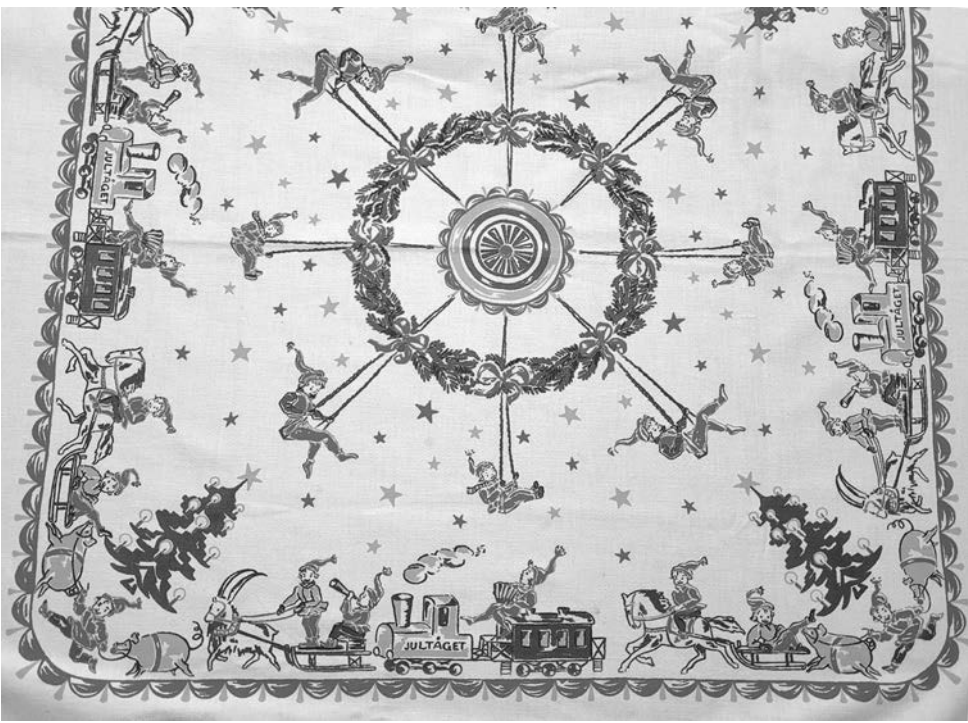

a collection of vintage holiday-themed tablecloths need not be an expensive undertaking, Bucci continued. A decent cloth with a typical design (poinsettias, candles, and holly, for instance) can be found for as little as \$10. On the other hand, many serious collectors consider a Calaprint tablecloth that depicts cheery snowmen (and women) to be the “holy grail” of Christmas tablecloths. “It could sell in the range of \$200,” Bucci estimated.

Another highly prized example is a stylish cloth designed by Pat Pritchard. Its memorable graphics, which include a “hip” Santa, coy reindeer, and a wassail bowl, pop, thanks to a color scheme of black and white, metallic gold and pink. In good condition, one on which the gold metallic is intact, could easily sell for \$300.

Somewhere in between are interesting (and amusing) choices; among Bucci’s favorites is a tablecloth that pictures a jack-in-the-box Santa, his head on a spring, with the elves looking on.

Among those linen

companies that produced what are now collectable tablecloths are “Willendur” (renamed “Willendure” in 1959.) Makers of a Christmas tablecloth that stretches 102 inches long, the company is valued for linens that do not fade. Bucci added that

sometimes, the only indication that a Willendur (or Willendure) tablecloth has been used is a frayed label. California Hand Prints, another favored manufacturer, marked every one of the tablecloths with a cloth label. Identifying them is complicated if the tag was removed. And because “vintage” now extends into the 1970s, Christmas table linens by Vera now fall into this category.

Understandably, the condition of vintage tablecloths may vary, therefore affecting its value. Bucci said that many decades-old linens can be found in mint con-

dition, saved for a special occasion that never occurred, or put aside in a cedar chest because it was too nice to use. As a result, he said that estate sales are often a good place to find tablecloths in excellent condition. On the other hand, others have been the backdrop for many family holiday gatherings and might have residual

stains and tears. Bucci credited members of the VTLC with sharing methods to restore soiled tablecloths that are in otherwise good condition.

Which brings serious collectors to the question: To use or not to use? When a tablecloth is found in mint condition with a paper tag, “you

have to decide if you're going to keep it that way or use it as it was originally intended," he said.

Like other popular collectibles, vintage Christmas tablecloths have been (and are being) reproduced. But for the seasoned collector, there are ways to help identify those that are not originals. The cotton fabric that was used to make early tablecloths feels heavier than the fabric of newer ones ("you can tell by feeling it," Bucci said). Additionally, while new tablecloths are seamed on all four sides, only two sides of older cloths were stitched, with salvage edges on the other two. There are subtle differences as well. Sometimes, what was black on the original cloth appears to be brownish on the copy. And finally, reproduction tablecloths often fade with the first washing. Bucci said he doesn't have a problem with using a reproduction tablecloth as long as it is recognized as such. "Just don't expect it to last."

Even after years of collecting, there are still

new discoveries to be made. Although Bucci has seen tablecloths with wisemen, angels, and twinkling stars, "I've never seen one with the nativity scene."

But if it's out there, rest assured that members of the VTLC will track it down. Bucci explained that to date, club members have identified some 183 different patterns on its online database, one that lists more than 3,000 tablecloths by name, pattern type (be it, for instance, an overall design), theme, and keyword.

Today, vintage Christmas tablecloths are an easy way to decorate the home throughout the holiday season. Bucci continued that these tablecloths are suitable for use on both kitchen and dining room tables. "I definitely have enough that I could do a different one every day, beginning when Thanksgiving is put away." If a cloth is too small to cover a table, he suggested layering it diagonally over a solid-colored cloth. Folded tablecloths can double as dresser scarves or table runners, used on a coffee table or at the foot of a bed. Regardless of where and how they are used, vintage Christmas tablecloths "add a touch of hominess that fits in with the holiday." What else would you expect from the president of a club whose stated mission is "Making the world a cozier place, one table at a time?"
