Stanton's sells contents of Lesterhouse Antiques

"It was kind of creepy," Joyce Olson said. But her Uncle William loved 18th His niece remembers the and 19th century antiques painted portraits hanging like furniture, glass, on the walls of William ceramics, primitives, Lesterhouse's antique Asian art and paintings of long forgotten men, women and children forever staring into space.

Lesterhouse, 89, died

earlier this year. He operated his antique store in downtown Mattawan, Mich., for over 50 years until it closed in 2022.

The building was sold earlier this year and his personal lifetime collection of antiques was auctioned by Stanton Auctioneers on Sept. 13 in Hastings, Mich. Listed prices do not include the buyer's premium.

True to Olson's memories, a matched set of unsigned early childhood portraits, maybe of a brother and sister, were auctioned together for \$2,100. To many onsite the eyes of the children had a vague ghostly look, almost as if their sale had unsettled them. Itinerant folk painters traveled house to house in early

Humble flue covers can still decorate a wall in style

If you own or live in a home built after 1950 or so you probably have never heard of a chimney flue cover. But if inside a home, most you live in an older

covers in every room of your home.

A chimney flue cover is a decorative item used to cover a chimney or duct opening on a wall often in the kitchen, liv-

home you may have flue ing room, or bed room. Back in the days when houses were heated with coal, wood, or oil, heat was carried upward to second or third story rooms via brick or stone chimneys, called flues. Nearly every room in an

opening where a stove could be connected.

In the spring, after the last signs of cold weather, homeowners often removed the heating pipes and stored them in the basement or

pipes caused an open hole in the wall. These flue openings were usually covered to make the rooms more attractive and to keep small animals out of the pipes. Coverings for these pipe

old house had a flue shed. Removing the openings came to be called "flue covers."

Beginning in the late-Victorian Era, manufactured flue covers were made in wrought iron or brass grilles,





\$300.

Top selling honors went to an early 8-inch handblown goblet with a gold coin in the stem.

Spirited bidding drove the final price to the \$3,000 bid of a floor buyer. The coin was hard to read in the stem but such an example could have come from an 18th century Venice glassmak-

ofer as no other marks were paws.

"We ought to be selling tea and crumpets instead of hot dogs and pop," auctioneer Michael Bleisch quipped given the European and New England ambiance of the auction.

An early 19th-century 35-inch Aaron Willard single-weight shelf clock fit that bill as well. Willard and his brother established one of the first American clock factories in 18th-century Boston and their products were prized in early American high society. Spirited online and floor bidding led to a hammer price of \$1,900 to an online buyer.

A bronze sculpture of a pair of stylized slender women draped in black signed by French design-



gle-weight shelf clock. Willard's name appears below the face and the lower panel featured a box with divided interior naval war scene involving American and possibly and inlaid escutcheon British battleships. sold for \$400.

A pair of matched Galle porcelain lions reached a \$2,800. Manufactured in Nancy, France, probably in the 1880s, they were also made of a tin-glazed earthenware. Each was hand-painted and gilded and featured a mirror-opposite lions holding a turret between its front

er Romain de Tirtoff, better known as Erté, sold for \$1,500. Most appreciated for art deco designs like this sculpture, documentation revealed that Lesterhouse paid \$8,500 for the statue in 1989.

Two early Staffordshire spill vases of matching hand painted elephants went for \$1,300. Another group of giraffes, lions, and deer sold for \$225. Both groups dated to the 19thcentury Staffordshire region of England, famous for pottery dating back to the 15th century. Spills were thin strips of wood or paper stored in such containers.

Lesterhouse collected a variety of Asian-themed items. A large Chinese Wucai-style porcelain vase of undetermined age with a wooden stand and cover sold for \$1,300. An undated lacquered Chinese sewing box complete with lace, thread and a variety of sewing tools and decorations was

hammered down for \$850. A pair of export porcelain Chinese peacocks took \$700, and an undated early Chinese decorated bowl sold for \$175. A 19th century late floral patterns was priced at \$700. Such high-quality imported ceramics continue to be prized for vibrant colors, intricate designs and distinctive styles.

Auctioneer Steven Stanton noted that a few of the auction pieces had some damage, "but that's to be expected for items of this age." It was hard to say if one cast iron pedestal urn that sold for a high floor bid of \$300 was damaged or not. The urn itself looked in good condition, but Lesterhouse left a note that the hexagonal base the urn rested on had been made from an antique headstone.

A Dutch silver brandy

have commemorated a child's birth since an image of a baby was on each handle. It sold for \$250. A 33-inch goldtipped walking stick engraved "J. Skotzky from his son Abe" was bought for \$100.

Western Michigan hosted several waves of Dutch immigration in the 19th and early 20th centuries, travelers who settled in modern towns such as Zeeland, Vriesland and Holland. The Dutch city of Delft Japanese Imari bowl with first started producing porcelain in the 17th century to compete with Chinese imports. Dutch immigrants brought or sent such items to Michigan. Two lots of Delft apothecary drug jars, including a pair that read "morphine" and "arsenic", auctioned for \$325 and \$175 respectively. A Delft vase honoring William V, the last Stadholder or Dutch Republic prime minister, sold for \$300. Various Delft wall plaques were priced from \$90 to \$125. Two blue and white Delft-style tankards, with appropriate Dutch iconography, sold for \$150.

An undated but early bowl circa 1790 must 12-pane single door cor-

ner cupboard with original glass and re-grain painted 50 years ago was the top furniture seller at \$700. An early single door American curio cabinet was auctioned for \$250.

An early hanging wall display cabinet with a single four-paned door and scalloped interior shelves was hammered down for \$70.

Of the auction Olson observed that almost every item had a backstory, a unique provenance that only her uncle had known. "Too bad all that is all lost," she said.

Caesar Creek Flea Market closing

WILMINGTON, Ohio - On Sept. 22, officials from Caesar Creek Flea Market announced the facility will permanently close on Nov. 30, marking tiques and food trucks, the end of an era after nearly five decades in operation. The news came as a shock to vendors and loval customers alike, many of whom have frequented the market for generations.

Located just off Interstate 71 near Wilmington, Caesar Creek Flea Market has been a regional land-

mark. The sprawling complex includes eight indoor buildings with 500 climate-controlled vendor spaces and 60-plus acres of outdoor vendor areas. In recent years, the market added mobile boukeeping the atmosphere lively and fresh. On a typical weekend, more than 5,000 shoppers browse the offerings.

One of the market's long-standing appeals was its flexible vendor model. Spaces could be rented by the day, weekend, or month - no longterm contracts required. The closure has left many vendors scrambling, particularly those who relied on weekend sales to supplement their income. One vendor, Nicholas Starns, interviewed by a local CBS affiliate, expressed the sentiment, "It was a shock, you know. This place has been around forever," he said. "Now, we're all trying to figure out what we're going to do and where we're going to go." Another vendor, commenting on Facebook, shared, "I've been an outside vendor there since 1986." She added that many vendors are retirees who depended on the extra income to balance their budgets.

The loss is equally

heartfelt by area collectors and antique resellers. Caesar Creek has long been a prime hunting ground for everything from vintage toys and art glass to primitives and antique furniture, often at bargain prices.

Market leadership offered this statement, "The decision was not made lightly, and we will be saddened to watch Caesar Creek Flea Market, a community gathering place for almost five decades, close the iconic red doors for the last time." They also noted that the adjacent storage facility will remain in operation, with a separate announcement regarding its future expected at a later date.

Caesar Creek will remain open on Saturdays and Sundays from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. through its final day on Nov. 30. Starting in October, the usual \$2 admission fee will be waived. Scheduled events, including car shows and Halloween festivities, will go on as planned. "We encourage our friends and customers to come and support the outdoor market and eight buildings full of local vendors and artisans who will remain open for business during this time."



which homeowners could leave in place year around as a decorative cover. Other homeowners used removable metal or cardboard cover plates, which were often dinner-plate sized and often hand painted for decorative effect. Other flue covers had lithographic printed pictures applied under a thin rounded glass with a cardboard backing.

Although many different styles and variations of flue covers have been manufactured, majority were made of round pieces of metal, about 8 inches in diameter. These flue covers would hang using a chain or hook over a flue hole. These are the flue covers that are highly collectible today.

One interesting fact of collecting flue covers is that different flue covers were made to be used in different rooms. For instance, kitchen motifs were often found on flue covers in kitchens while pastoral scenes were on living room or dining room flue covers. Many flue covers had what were considered western or "open sky" motifs where the scene on the cover was truly as big as the open spaces out West. Over the decades, flue cover styles became symbols of the times with clothing and furnishing fashions displayed on the covers. Some flue cover collectors specialize in a single cover motif, such as dogs, or boats, or women with hats. Snowy wood scenes or scenes with deer are also popu-

Because flue covers were massed produced items, they were made more or less the same. A narrow or thin chain surrounds the flue cover's edge and becomes a loop at the top of the cover for hanging the cover over the flue hole.

Common flue covers had a three to five-inch center picture and a wide, basically un-ordained frame around them. Often the wide frame on the cover was painted a single, solid color, such as black or white, which became scratched over time.

Other flue covers had black bands circling the cover.

The majority of flue covers are round and dinner plate size, making collections, especially those collections displayed on walls, symmetrical in appearance. A few covers were oval or rectangle, which gives a collection interesting depth and eye appeal.

Flue covers are also

cross-collectible many of them represented early advertising promotions for country stores, doctors, dentists, home repair specialists, and other business people.

Collecting flue covers is also a relatively inexpensive hobby, so it attracts both young collectors and novice collectors. While there is no "average" price, expect to pay between \$10 and





Celebrate the women who helped win World War II

By WILLIAM FLOOD

"I wrote this because I knew their stories needed to be told..."

You'll see that sentiment repeated across the books in this article each author compelled by a commitment to give voice to the often-untold stories of the women of World War II. They served at home and near the front lines, in factories, in uniform, and as civilians. Whether portraved in a book or recounted personally, the stories of the women who served with strength and conviction during the war years are truly inspiring. For anyone drawn to their history, there's also a world of memorabilia that honors those women who sacrificed in so many ways during the Second World

Even before the U.S. officially entered the war, American women began stepping up. They filled vital roles — building aircraft, training pilots, interpreting radar, managing logistics, and keeping morale strong for soldiers and their families. Some were recruited straight from college for their language or science skills, landing in codebreaking units or laboratories. By war's peak, women made up nearly 40 percent of the entire U.S. workforce, proving themselves indispensable to the war effort both at home and abroad.

The welcome wasn't always warm. Women often earned less than men, were mocked for taking on "men's work," and frequently faced sexual harassment. Women of color dealt with both racism and sexism. Many women worked in hazard-

ous conditions, sometimes with such strict secrecy that many didn't speak of their roles for decades.

Women's military auxiliaries became a visible way many women served. In 1942, Congress created the Women's Army Auxiliary Corps (WAAC), and over 150,000 women enlisted, sometimes serving as cartographers, cryptographers, mechanics, and even meteorologists. Initially lacking formal military status, they became full soldiers in 1943 when WAAC became the Women's Army Corps (WAC), gaining rank, benefits, and equal pay. WACs served in every theater, including Utah Beach after D-Day. Mollie Weinstein Schaffer's memoir. "Mollie's War: The Letters of a World War II WAC in Europe," offers a firsthand look at this experience.


Also in 1942. President Roosevelt signed the Navy Women's Reserve Act, creating the WAVES (Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service). These women took on aviation support roles such as parachute rigging and radio communications, along with engineering and other technical duties. In 1948, WAVES became a permanent part of the Navy thanks to the Women's Armed Services Integration Act.

needed overseas, the U.S. faced a shortage of skilled aviators for support roles. In 1943, the Women Airforce Service Pilots (WASP) was formed by merging two earlier groups. Over 1,000 women ferried military planes, flight-tested repaired aircraft, towed gunnery targets, and trained male pilots. The program was abruptly shut down in 1944 as men returned from the front. For a fictional take on their story, "Flight Girls" by Noelle Salazar is a solid pick.

Just before Pearl Harbor, the Coast Guard created its own women's reserve, the SPARs (Sem-Paratus Always Ready). More than 10,000 women served. Over 200 went on to Naval Training

School. SPARs worked as air controllers, LORAN and radio operators, and even pharmacy technicians. Mary C. Lyne and Kay Arthur's "Three Years Behind the Mast" dives deeper into their story.

At home, women flooded factories, famously symbolized by "Rosie the Riveter," portrayed on the iconic 1942 "We Can Do It"

poster, part of Westinghouse's campaign to recruit women workers. The aviation industry led this surge, with over 300,000 women comprising 65 percent of the aircraft industry's wartime workforce. At Ford's Willow Run plant in Michigan alone, 14,000 women helped build over 8,600 B-24 bombers. Rosie

earned her nickname as each plane required more than 300,000 rivets. Similar efforts occurred at Douglas, Lockheed, and North American Aviation. Shipyards nationwide also saw similar transforma-

tions. In Mobile, Alabama, 2,500 women worked at the Alabama Dry Dock and Shipbuilding Corporation in jobs spanning welding to crane operation. Women also helped assemble over 600,000 Jeeps at plants around the country. Penny Colman's book, "Rosie the Riveter: Women Working on the Home Front in World War II," offers a great overview of this chapter in history.

Some of the most secretive work took place in locations associated with the Manhattan Project, such as Los Alamos, New Mexico, Hanford, Washington, and especially Oak Ridge, Tennessee — a federally created city carved out of the countryside that grew to 74,000 residents. Around 10,000 civilian women, many recruited out of high school, operated machines called Calutrons, which separated uranium. College-educated women with science or math backgrounds worked in labs and theoretical roles. The work was so secret that none knew what they were doing and were forbidden to speak about it. Denise Kiernan's "The Girls of Atomic City" offers a powerful account of their hidden contribu-

Women also worked in highly dangerous munitions plants across the country. Roughly 85,000 women, both civilian and military, served as Women Workers Ordnance (WOWs). At Holston Ordnance Works in Tennes see, christened "The Powder Plant," about 3,500 women helped make RDX,

the most powerful explosive predating the atomic bomb. Nicknamed "Bomb-Bomb Girls" or "Canary Girls" (from chemicals that yellowed their hair and skin), their work came with real risks — many were injured or killed in factory accidents. "Bomb-Bomb Girls: Trading Aprons for Ammo" by Barbara Dickson captures this dangerous side of the war effort.

Many women served as flight instructors, mainly handling ground training. Before the U.S. entered the war, British Flying Training Schools were established across the country to train Royal Air Force pilots. A British cemetery in Terrell, Texas, honors airmen who died training there. Throughout the war, women taught using Link Trainers (ground-based flight simulators) and taught essential subjects like navigation and meteorology. "The Girls of Flight City" by Lorraine Heath offers a good fictionalized account.

Codebreaking another area where women excelled. Many with math or language skills were recruited from top colleges to translate and decipher foreign messages. At Arlington Hall Station in Virginia, thousands worked as cryptologists breaking German and Japanese codes. Nearby, WAVEs at a former seminary turned Naval intelligence facility did similar work. In Dayton, Ohio,

WAVEs at National Cash Register helped build and operate the Navy's Cryptanalytic Bombe, used to break German Enigma ciphers. "The Codebreaker's Secret" by Sara Ackerman brings this hidden world to life.

In Hawaii, women served as radar operators in the Women's Air Raid Defense (WARD) after the Pearl Harbor attack. About 500 women tracked aircraft movements, freeing up men for combat roles in the Pacific. WARD was disbanded in 1945. "Radar Girls" by Sara Ackerman tells their story.

One of the most inspiring stories is that of the 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion, known as the Six Triple Eight — the first all-Black women's Army unit. Created in late 1944, they were sent to Europe to clear a backlog of over 3 billion letters and packages. Despite racism, sexism, a German bombing, poor conditions, and inadequate facilities, they got the job done. In 2019, Congress awarded them the Congressional Gold Medal. Their story is told in Kaia Alderson's "Sisters in Arms" and the film "The Six Triple Eight."

Nurses and Red Cross workers took on some of the war's most dangerous assignments, often serving near front lines — including at Normandy after D-Day. By war's end, 16 Army nurses were killed by enemy fire; nearly 70 were captured in the Philippines, and over 1,600 received medals. The Red

Cross had over 100,000 women serving worldwide, with over 50 dying in service

Back home, women volunteered at USO events and worked at places like the North Platte Canteen in Nebraska, located near the rail facility where nearly all deploying US troops passed through. The canteen served 6 million soldiers, often greeting trains with cakes and birthday celebrations for those onboard. Most workers were women who even used their personal ration coupons to help feed the troops. Meghan K. Winchell's "Good Girls, Good Food, Good Fun" recounts these homefront contributions.

When the war ended, most women were expected to leave their jobs and return home. Many were laid off or had to petition for a position or the recognition and benefits owed to them. But they'd already proven their value. In 1948, Congress passed the Women's Armed Services Integration Act, allowing women to serve as regular members of the military. Their experiences, along with those of the women who worked in factories and offices, changed opportunities for women in the workforce forever.

If these stories spark your curiosity, you might also enjoy hunting for related memorabilia at antique shows, auctions, estate sales, and online. Additionally, the Henry Ford Museum in Dearborn, Michigan, is currently hosting "Our War Too: Women in Service," a traveling exhibit dedicated to these unsung heroes
