1570 map showed the way with \$4,500 bid at Schmidt

YPSILANTI, Mich. — An incredible selection of 69 antique maps dominated the early portion of Schmidt recent



Antiques fall auction. This in-person auction included an online option complete with audio and video so that bidders at home could also enjoy the astute descriptions and playful banter. The relaxed pace efficiently went through 385 lots in four hours. Prices do not include the buyer's premium.


With maps from the 1500s-1800s, each was in immaculate condition, some were framed, and many were hand colored examples of the world as it was perceived in the

past. Leading this inventory, the ornate 16th century map entitled "Americae Sive Novi Orbis, Nova Descriptio", a 1570 edition by Abraham Ortelius depicted the Western Hemisphere with both North and South America and was embellished with sailing ships and sea monsters. Framed under Acrylite OP-2, it measured 27 by 22 inches and proved very popular, with a final bid of \$4,500.

Not far behind, an 18th century map by Matthaus Seutter, circa 1734 showed the country from Canada south to Florida. It included a corner insert depicting a satirical scene portraying the generous



Jaws is viewed on several levels since, like Moby Dick, it swims towards the classic battle of man versus nature and good versus evil. It has been written that "the film, Jaws, explores themes of primal fear, the fragility of civilization, economic greed, and even Cold War-era paranoia," which might be a stretch. "The shark ultimately







Mississippi river as a female pouring out riches and jewels for a French speculative scheme (dubbed the Mississippi Bubble). The elaborate, hand-colored engraving measured 30 by 27 inches and exceeded its estimate, ending with a final bid of \$4,000.

Another 1500s Western Hemisphere map by Abraham Ortelius, also elaborately embellished,





finished at \$3,500. Ten other antique maps also sold for four figures. The artwork and condition of all these maps made them outstanding investments. Each map had its own story, but Chuck Schmidt shared a humorous one about an 18th century map entitled "Carte Des Lacs Du Canada" by J. N. Bellin, which illustrated a mountain range running the length of the lower peninsula of Michigan. Evidently the map maker saw the tall trees from his view on the shore and assumed it was a moun-

Some top-notch wall art was available and well appreciated, starting with an Edgar Alwin Payne 1920s oil on canvas Normandy, France, coastal scene, titled "Day Out to Yport". This expressive painting with intense blue water and rugged rocks measured 22 by 18 inches and was rehomed with a final bid of \$4,000. Mauricio Lasansky, created a 1960s color etching with aquatint and drypoint on BFK Rives paper, titled "El Cardenal" (The Cardinal). The stern figure clad in red garments was claimed with a final bid of \$3,750.

A whimsical display of colorful animals was featured on a lithograph by Alexander Calder as part of the "Our Unfinished Revolution" portfolio. Titled "Animals", this signed 37 by 29 inch piece was taken with a final bid of \$2,600. Famed artist and photographer William Wegman is known forhis Weimaraner dogs that he has photographed in various settings. Here he created an interesting lithograph titled "Ray




Above: According to this 18th century map, Michigan had a mountain range running the length of the lower peninsula. This unique map was claimed with a final bid of \$1,300.

Cat" that shows a photograph of one of his dogs with cat features drawn around it. This fascinating depiction proved very popular, requiring a final bid of \$1,700 to claim it.

There was no shortage of dazzling jewelry offered. A very unusual Art Deco platinum and diamond engagement ring featured a 1.65 carat diamond surrounded by multiple diamond accents and elaborate engraved detail. It was eagerly taken with a final bid of \$3,000. A handsome engraved 14k gold and 1.25 carat diamond signet ring was claimed with a final bid of \$2,400, There were many other gold items, including a stunning Greek 18k gold and lapis lazuli pendant necklace featuring a 10 by 19 millimeter brilliant blue stone. Mounted on a snake chain necklace, it left with a high bid of \$1,100.

A pair of 19th century French percussion .52 caliber muzzleloading pistols with carved walnut fluted grips and elaborate metal engraving on the sides and trigger guards sold for \$1,300. They each measured 15

Attendance strong for Indianapolis Fall Advertising Show

LEBANON, Ind. — It was the end of September, but balmy summer-like temperatures in the low 80s greeted vendors and visitors at the Indianapolis Fall Advertising Show at the Boone County Fairgrounds, Lebanon, Ind.

Show management said the event drew record attendance and the dealer numbers were filled to the max. Also drawing visitors was a National Association Breweriana Advertising sanctioned sales event and a two day auction on Sept. 30 inch-diameter light-up 25 and 26, all on the fairgrounds. 30 inch-diameter light-up neon Coke clock, with advertising marquee, that

A mint condition doublesided 1950s Around the World brand glass gasoline pump 17-inch globe made shoppers take a second look at the colorful graphics —s then the price, \$31,000, at the booth of Prock's Crocks and Antiques, Springbrook, Wis. At the same spot, a 15 by 18-inch die-cut RCA Radiola porcelain advertising sign was tagged \$1,350.

Coca-Cola collectors hovered around the 1950s 30 inch-diameter light-up neon Coke clock, with advertising marquee, that could light up your life for \$3,750. Ohio dealer Dave Wolfe also showed off three identical 1940s Porcelain Prestone Anti Freeze advertising thermometers priced between \$450 to \$600 each.

Breweriana collectors were drawn to the preprohibition Mankato Beer 18 by 26-inch advertising sign offered for \$15,000 by 10 year ad show veteran Arron Martin who drove over 12 hours to Indy, from Fargo, N.D.

It was a short drive to the fairgrounds for Doug Miller ofnear-by Nobilsville, Ind., bringing along an old hardware store full dimension tin constructed 3 foot tall Taylor Padlock, circa 1920-30s priced at \$350. Automotive buffs checked out his 1920s wood constructed Ford Model T self locking steering wheel tagged \$285.

Farm related salesman sample collectors were drawn to the booth of 30 year Indy veteran dealers Dave Smith and Allie Smith of Bartlesville, Okla., for a closer look at a 28-inch long steel and wood cultivaor, priced \$2,500. Still others hovered around their late 1800s 24-inch-tall Smith Ok tin and wood silo salesman sample with canvas carry case priced at \$4,200.

blue ocean, the yellow barrels signify the lurking presence and threat of the shark, reminding the viewer of the frailty of mankind.

At the time Jaws was filmed, Spielberg was a nearly unknown director and the show's three stars (Robert Shaw, Richard Dreyfuss, and Roy Scheider) were accomplished but still relatively unknown actors. Jaws changed Hollywood by becoming what some movie historians call a "watershed"

moment in film history. Jaws became the first true summer blockbuster movie, and for a couple of years it held the title as the highest-grossing film in movie history.

The original movie Jaws was followed by three sequels, none of which involved Spielberg or Benchley; however, together these four movies spawned a shark frenzy of promotional and collectible merchandise.

It has been written that "Jaws was accompanied by what was 'probably the most elaborate array of tie-ins' including a sound-track album, T-shirts, plastic tumblers, a book about the making of the movie, the book the movie was based on, beach towels, blankets, shark costumes, toy sharks, hobby kits, iron-on transfers, games, posters, shark's tooth necklaces, sleepwear, water pistols, and more.

Ideal Toy The Company, for instance, produced The Game of Jaws in which the player had to use a hook to fish out items from the shark's mouth before the shark's jaws closed."

A recent search for "Jaws Orca," on eBay, had 155 search results pop up. The Orca, of course, was Quint's shark hunting boat, which was destroyed by the shark in the final minutes of the movie. Lots of people collect model boats, and the Orca is found in most of their collections. The most expensive Orca model on eBay when I searched was a 1/18th scale model being offered for \$1,800.

One interesting collectible is the original movie poster. The Seiniger Advertising agency spent six months drafting just this one poster. Principal designer for the poster was Tony Seiniger who, when

interviewed at the time, explained why a single movie poster took six months to create, "No matter what we did, it didn't look scary enough." As the months began to pile up and no poster was in sight, the book publisher, Bantam, agreed that the paperback book and all advertising, including the poster, for the film should portray the same scene. Finally, the poster image was finished — it featured a huge shark swimming beneath a lone, nude, female swimmer. The shark's mouth

is open and rows of razor sharp teeth are preparing to rip the swimmer apart.

This scene of the shark rising through the water to eat the woman swimmer is the iconic scene of the entire movie. Today, an original Jaws motion picture poster can sell

for thousands of dollars, depending on the poster's condition.

As Quint said when demanding his \$10,000 bounty, "This shark-swallow you whole." Apparently, this shark swallows collectors as well as swimmers.



Jenkins (her preferred title), happily obliged, donning full angelic regalia — flowing robes, wings, and a tinsel halo. Soon, word got out: these recitals were something to see (and hear).

In 1944, 76-year-old Florence Foster Jenkins finally made her Carnegie Hall debut. Tickets had been sold out for months. Madame gave her audience what they'd been craving: an evening's caterwauling of the highest caliber. Her "Clavelitos," encore, found Jenkins decked out in a Spanish lace shawl and jeweled hair comb, enthusiastically tossing carnations to her delighted fans. At the number's conclusion, she also tossed the flower basket. When the audience demanded a repeat, Florence's accompanist was forced to crawl through the audience retrieving flowers (as well as the basket).


Jenkins died a month after her Carnegie Hall engagement, having finally achieved the pinnacle of her career. As the New York World-Telegram put it, "She was exceedingly happy in her work. It is a pity so few artists are. And that happiness was communicated as if by magic to her hearers."

Other recording artistes of questionable artistry have also had unshakable faith in their abilities. The 1960s saw the emergence of Elva Miller, a California housewife whose wobbly renditions of such pop hits as "Downtown" and

"These Boots Are Made For Walkin" caught the attention of Johnny Carson. Mrs. Miller's unique vocalizations, sometimes accompanied by equally unique whistling, made her a favorite with "Tonight Show" audiences; her album, "Mrs. Miller's Greatest Hits" became a best-seller.

Carson also championed the career of another of the era's more unusual talents, ukulele-playing, falsetto-voiced Tiny Tim. Thanks to "Tonight Show" publicity, Tiny's one-of-a-kind interpretation of "Tip-Toe Thru The Tulips" became a chart-topper. Unlike Mrs. Miller, however, the musically-adept Tiny Tim had a very clear image of the persona he was creating.


Television exposure seemed to draw neophyte vocalists to the recording studio like moths to a flame. TV hunks Jeff Chandler ("Our Miss Brooks") and Vincent Edwards ("Ben Casey") gave fans what they'd been dreaming of: soulful cover portraits, and heartfelt renditions of pop standards. Could they sing? The album liner notes carefully skirted that topic. Chandler was "no Johnny-come-yesterday to the recording business—listeners already know his wonderful speaking Edwards blurb was more circumspect, stating only that, when it came to singing, he offered "a wealth of natural feeling."

Some vocalizing newbies took the bull by the horns, downplaying their singing prowess before the critics could. Andy Griffith's album, "Andy Griffith Shouts Blues And Old Timey Songs" carried this disclaimer by Andy himself: "I will admit that I'm not the best-but in all modesty, I will have to say that I expect I'm the loudest." The most musical, too. In later life Andy's recordings of traditional tunes earned him rave reviews plus a Grammy award.

Sometimes, $\quad \text{entire} \quad$ television casts gathered around the studio mics, perhaps hoping for safety in numbers. The Cartwright clan, from that durable Western hit "Bonanza" —Lorne Greene, Pernell Roberts, Dan Blocker, Michael Landon — came out with "Ponderosa Party Time," featuring their "fiddlin', banjo pickin', guitar strummin" (and of course, singing).

While the Ponderosa ing its gang revisited cowboy tunes, other TV casts opted for original songs after hailored to their series characters. On "The Beverly Hillbillies Album" West". all the Clampetts are heard on such howlers as group

Prime acquisitions for oddity aficionados are recordings by original "Star Trek" cast members. William Shatner ("Captain Kirk") has churned them out over the years, each featuring his distinctive vocal intonations, but in even greater demand is "Leonard Nimoy Presents Mr. Spock's Music From Outer Space." From its captivating cover photo (Nimoy, in full pointyeared Vulcan drag, hoisting a model of the U.S.S. Enterprise), to the opening strains of Alexander Courage's mesmerizing 'Star Trek" theme, there's no doubt this album is indeed a voyage "where no man has gone before".

Interspersed with Nimoy's plaintive vocals on such melodies as "Lost in the Stars" are Spockish narrative ruminations ("Twinkle, Twinkle Little Earth"), plus the occasional bouncy instrumental ("Music To Watch Space Girls By").

In 1966, Tower

Records took "extraordinary pride in introducing its sensational new rock 'n roll discovery — Mae West!" Decades after her reign as a 1930s screen queen, Mae recorded "Way Out West". Accompanied by "the dynamic young group Somebody's

thing from "Day Tripper" to "Twist and Shout." Plus, the heavily retouched cover photo of a septuagenarian evening-gowned Mae, surrounded by her youthful, and somewhat nervous-looking backup boys, is alone worth the price of the album.

For appreciators of the absurd, the list of album

absurd, the list of album oddities is (fortunately) endless. The prices are right, too. "Christmas with Colonel Sanders" will set you back just a finger-lickin'-good \$5-10. Robert Redford narrating "The Language and Music of the Wolves" is in the \$10-15 range, probably because the album also includes a full side of actual wolf noises. In the \$20 and up category are albums boasting themes completely out of synch with the performers. TV's pis-"Paladin" tol-toting recorded "Richard Boone Reads The Story of Jesus For Children." The cover features the grizzled Mr. Boone, ready to recite from his favorite book to a somewhat apprehensive youngster.

When you spot an album oddity at the next garage sale, take an inexpensive gamble and snap it up. Regardless of

what it sounds like, just remember: it took plenty of old-fashioned fortitude to brave the terrors of the microphone. Celebrity is fleeting. Cashing in on it remains a time-honored tradition.






