ACROSS THE AUCTION BLOCK

1964 Ford Galaxie sedan drives off with \$54,250 bid

GLADWIN, Mich. — Classic cars took center stage during an online auction conducted by John Peck Auctions.



This online auction was hosted in Northern Michigan and consisted of 372 lots. The prices here do not include the buyer's premium.

The online auctions conducted by this firm are set up for a "soft close", which means if a bid comes in within the last two minutes the end time is extended another two minutes. An exceptional car required about 20 extensions before it finally closed. The True R-code 1964 Ford Galaxie 500XL hardtop

sedan came factory-equipped with a dual-quad carburetor and 427 cubic inch engine rated at 425 horsepower. It featured original exterior trim and interior elements, bucket seat, console 4-speed, and dual 4-barrel carbs. The odometer showed 50,675 miles. The car had been extensively restored and was reported to be rock solid and laser straight with a gorgeous, mirror-finish paint job. The extensive technical description of this vehicle in the online listing helped drive the interest as the bidders pushed the final bid to \$54,250.

A second vehicle also fared well. This one

owner, low mileage 1997 Dodge Ram 1500 SS/T truck was described as Dodge's answer to the Ford F-150 SVT Lightning. Featuring a regular cab and short bed, the truck

was built for street performance rather than heavy-duty work. It came with the powerful 5.9L Magnum V8, which produced 235 horsepower and 330 lb-ft of torque. The

sport-tuned suspension provided better handling, and the truck came with many additional features such as a CD/cassette stereo, power windows, and

Once a decoration on harness; horse brasses shine

Horse brasses are heavy, brass amulets or decorations that were hung on the harnesses of draft or cart horses. The majority of horse brasses are round, approximately 2 inches in diameter, with a flat bar across the top

so they could be easily attached to leather straps on the harness.

Decorating horses, especially war horses, probably dates to Roman times; however the oldest known horse brasses, made of bronze, were found in 2,000 year old graves in the Altai Mountains of Siberia. Seven frozen, mummified horse corpses, uncovered

in the graves, were adorned with horse brasses.

Collecting horse brasses dates to their earliest known usage in England, approximately 1685. The tradition of adorning draft horses quickly caught on with both the gentry and the working class Englishmen, and horse brasses soon became a common sight.

While dating horse brasses is problematic at best, there are some general guidelines that collectors follow. The earliest horse brasses were made of bronze. Next coated brass or steel was used, and then brass. Bronze and even coated horse brasses are normally only found in museums today.

Collectors love unusual pieces, and in the world of horse brasses, the brasses

made by T. Bolsover of Sheffield, England are highly sought after. Working around 1743, Bolsover produced horse brasses made of metal plate over copper. Copper was an easy metal to work with and with which to make the initial design, and then coats of bronze or latten brass (a brass or yellow alloy that resembled brass that was hammered into thin sheets and most commonly used for church utensils) was plated on.

However, until 1825, most horse brasses were hand-made of hammered brass from flat sheets of latten brass. As the

Industrial Revolution took root in England, around 1825, production of horse brasses turned to cast brass.

Cast brass horse brasses were made by pressing a group of

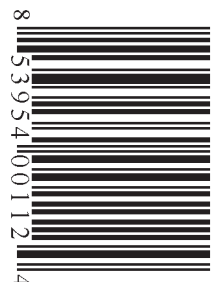

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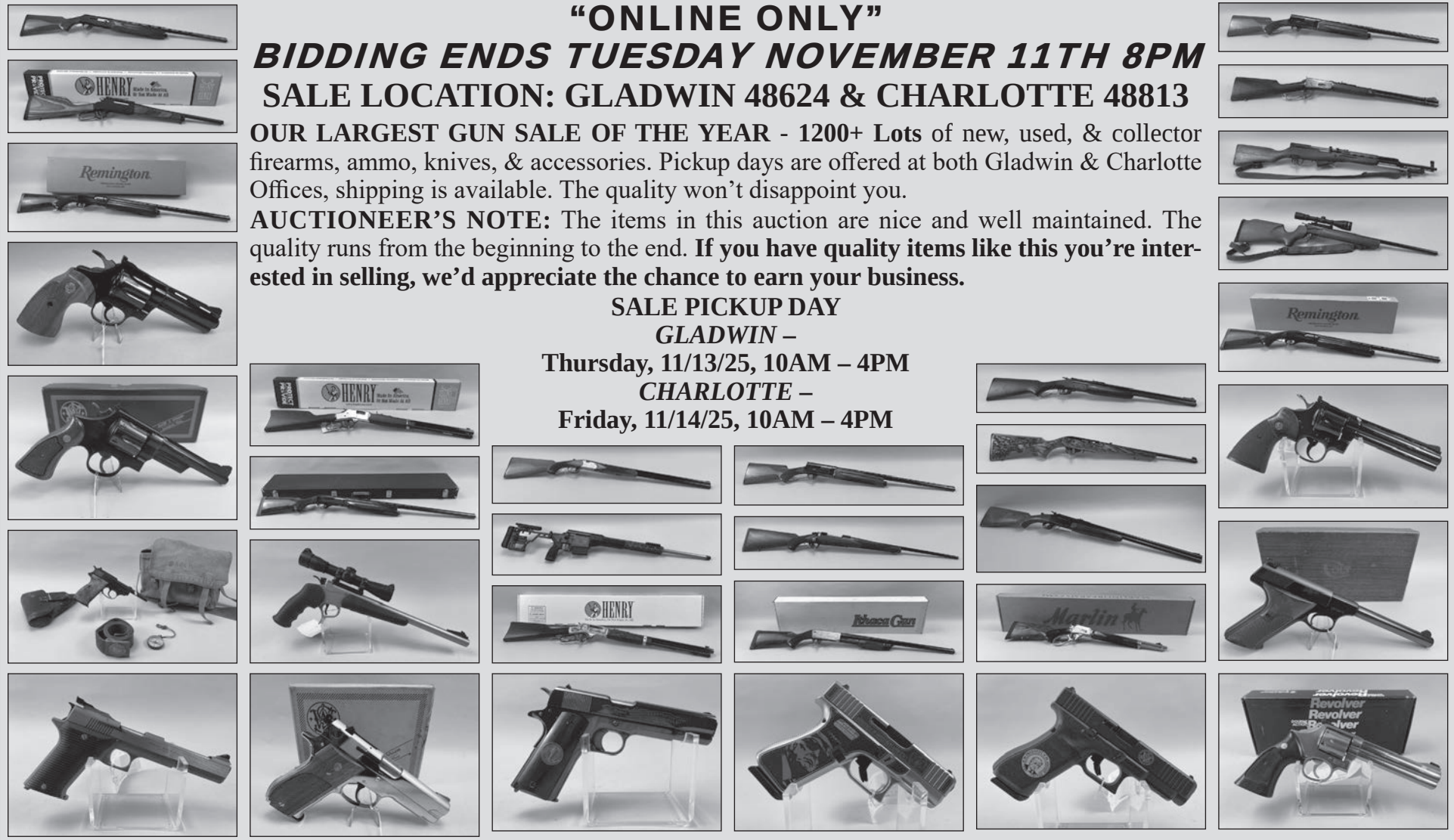

cruise control. There were just over a thousand of these trucks produced in this attractive black and silver color in 1997. After some competitive bidding, this well-maintained truck left with a high bid of \$16,000.

Somewhat related to motor vehicles, there was a Texaco Fire Chief Wayne 100B gas pump, originally from the 1940s. The internal mechanisms had been removed and some of the parts such as the pump plates and globe were reproductions. It was restored to very good condition, complete with bright red paint, hoses, and glass cover. It also lit up when plugged in with the added power cord. Standing 53 inches tall, it proved to be a desirable collectible, earning a final bid of \$1,250.

Seventeen long guns and five handguns were available. An attractive Remington SP-10 Magnum 10 Gauge semi automatic shotgun featured a full camo finish, 26 inch VR barrel, and three chokes. This model is no longer produced, making it a tempting purchase. It

was taken with a final bid of \$1,500. The next highest selling model was the Bushmaster XM15-E25 M4 223 REM/ 5.56mm with a 3-9 illuminated scope and 2 forends that earned a high bid of \$740. Assorted rifles and shotguns by Browning, Smith & Wesson, Ithaca, and others were taken with high bids ranging from \$170-550. Some impressive smaller guns were also offered, starting with a hard-to-find Beretta 92FS stainless steel “Ghost” 9 mm semi auto pistol. This nice, clean firearm included x6 magazines and an adjustable rear sight. It went home

with a final bid of \$810.

A vast assortment of coins was offered, with the American Eagle \$5 gold coin taking top honors. It was labeled as one-tenth ounce of fine gold and had two adult eagles on one side and Lady Liberty on the other. The Roman numerals MCMXC represented the date of 1990, and it was offered in its original display case. A high bid of \$420 was required to claim it. Unites States Mint Silver Proof Sets from the years 1999 through 2008 were taken with high bids of \$37-66. A nice selection of American Eagle One Ounce Coins, each with their COA ranged from \$56-200, with the 1986 American Eagle coin earning the top bid in this group.

Thirty-five lots consisted of sets of diecast model cars, several from the American Muscle Series. The group containing the Prototype 1969 Yenko paired with the 1970 Challenger T/A left the rest behind, finishing with a high bid of \$110. Another automotive-related collectible was a pedal car. This one was blue with orange racing flames on the side and a white number 5. It also had a silver jet mounted as a hood ornament, white wall tires, windshield and taillights. It was not identified in any way, but that did not stop it from earning a high bid of \$80.

An antique National

cash register Model 324 stood 17 inches tall, and the brass case was embellished with ornate decoration. The glass window was intact, and all the numerals and keys appeared to be in working order. A high bid of \$120 claimed this prize. A larger model similarly constructed closed at \$110 due to a broken glass top.

A few toys were also available, some antique and some more contemporary. An intricate 1950s Tonka aerial sand loader set included a two-tier frame, tram, and dump truck all in excellent condition. It earned a final bid of \$370. The massive GI Joe Command Center lot with extra GI Joe toys, F14 jet fighter, and manuals finished at \$140. An antique J Chein & Co rollercoaster tin lithography toy measuring 19 inches long provided a fun peek into the past. This red and yellow model with sweeping curves, complete with two cars full of people, was reported to be in working condition and looked great. It was gladly claimed with a final bid of \$53.

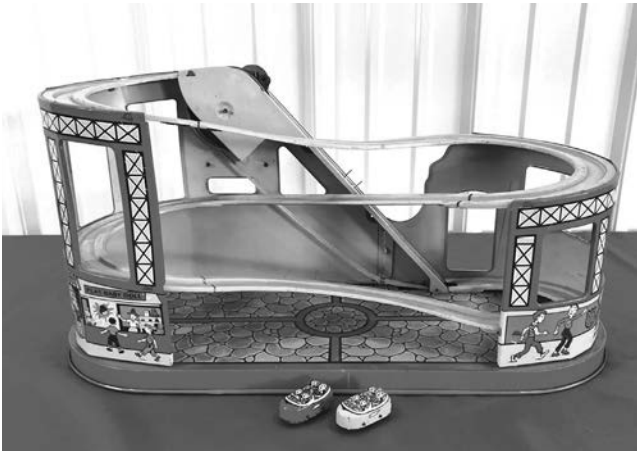

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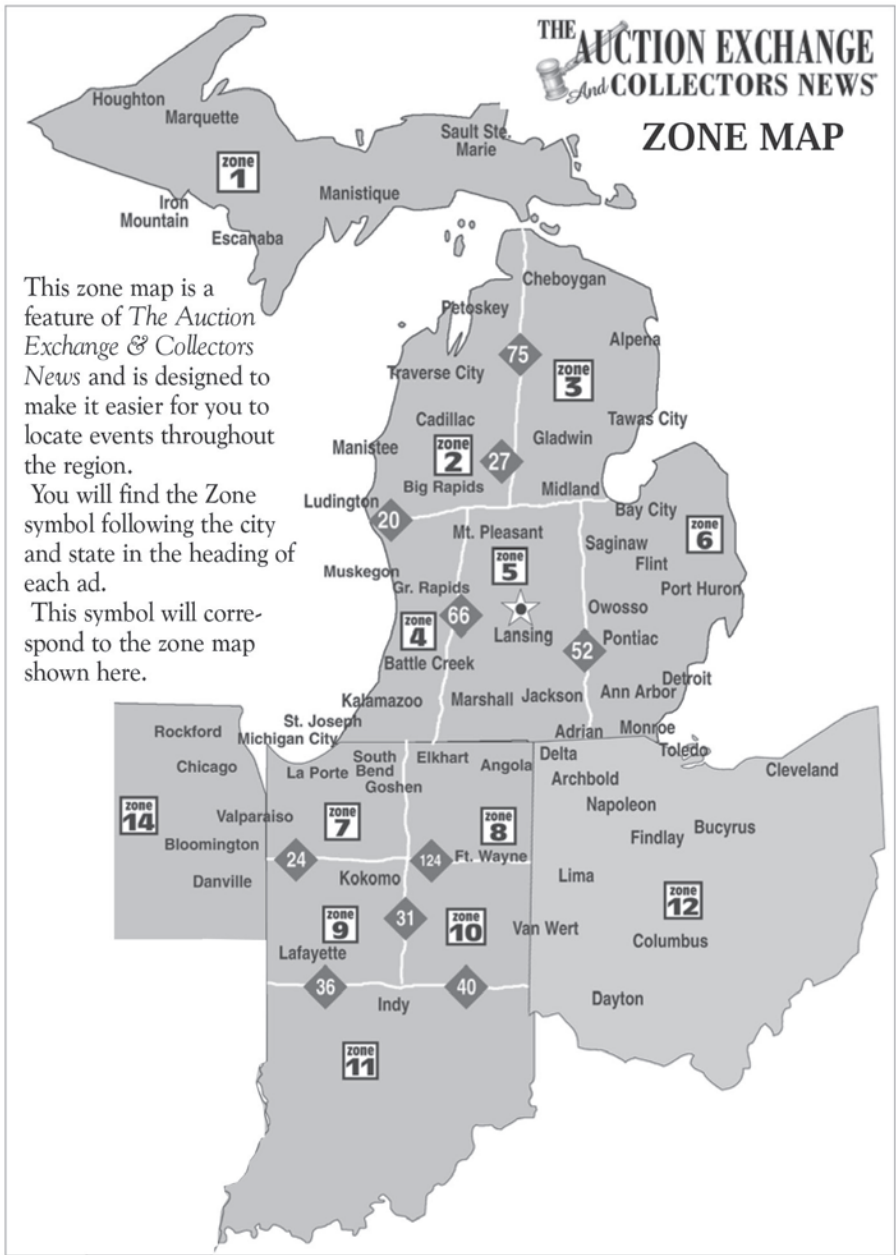

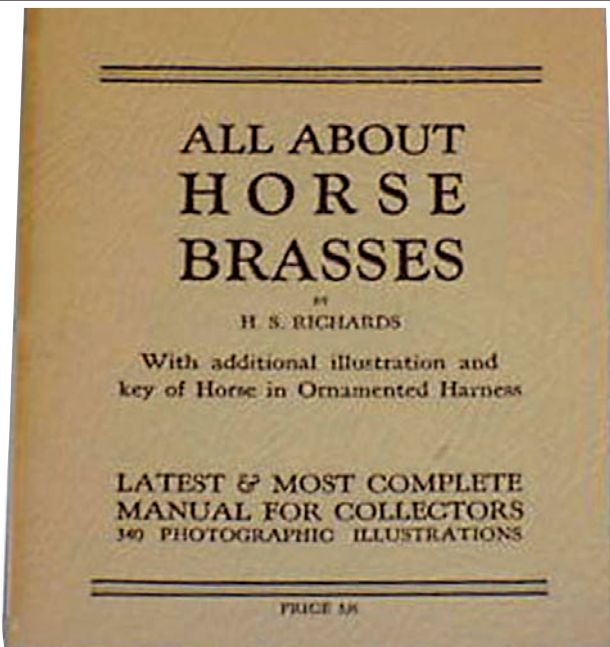

wooden designs into foundry sand. The designs were joined together with a shallow ditch, called a “get,” that allowed the molten brass to flow from one design to the next. The molten brass was then poured into the designs. After cooling, the horse brasses were trimmed, finished, and polished.

Around 1880 stamped horse brasses appeared. This was an expensive method of production since it required the fabrication of a metal die and a large press. Because of the cost, most companies producing horse brasses continued casting them.

By the beginning of World War I, horse brasses were, for the most part, no longer produced, making, for most collectors, 1914 the last year of the Golden Age of Horse Brasses.

The earliest horse

brasses were round. Crescent shapes and finally geometric designs, based on the sun’s rays, soon followed. Other common shapes include hearts and stars. And some of the figurative motifs found inside the designs include eagles,

owls, ships, horses, bells, dogs, lions, and phoenixes. Antiquhorse.com estimates that approximately 3,000 distinct designs and motifs have been used, making horse brass collections amazingly large.

Many professional groups commissioned horse brasses to reflect their trades. Some collectors concentrate on these designs, including trains for railway companies, barrels for breweries, and trees or crossed saws for lumberjacks or timber traders.

By the late Victorian age, horse brasses were primarily used to decorate carthorses or parade horses on holidays.

Today, horse brasses can often be seen inside pubs, adding to their English charm. Horse ranches occasionally nail a horse brass above a door, like a horseshoe, for “good luck.”

Few vintage horse

brasses are in bad shape since most never saw action beyond decorative usage. A little polishing usually makes the dirtiest horse brasses shine again.

Displaying horse brasses is easy too. Most collectors display horse brasses up and down pieces of old harness.

The majority of vintage horse brasses cost \$15 or less, so this is an inexpensive but satisfying hobby to get into. Some brasses cost \$50-75 each.

There are many books and Internet articles covering horse brasses. A good overview of horse

brass collecting is Discovering Horse Brasses by John Vince (Shire Publishing, 2010).

You can be a Pepper too when you collect Dr. Pepper memorabilia

Since ancient times, people have been creating and utilizing prosthetics to replace missing body parts. In some cases, the artificial device is functional while, in others, it is merely cosmetic.

Two of the oldest known prosthetics are toes which were unearthed in ancient Egypt. One – famously known as the Cairo Toe – was constructed of wood and leather over 3,000 years ago. The toe, complete with a toenail carved into it, shows evidence of having been fitted and refitted to the foot of the wearer several times. Archaeologists discovered the toe fitted to the remains of a woman via its being laced to a wooden corset-like structure which was slipped over the woman's foot. The other ancient prosthetic toe, constructed of linen and a sticky paper substance, was discovered with the remains of a mummy during the 1800s.

An artificial device known as the Capua Leg, was discovered in a Roman tomb in 1884 and thought to be from around 300 BC. Found next to the remains of a man who was missing the lower portion of his right leg, it was fashioned from three pieces of thin bronze nailed to a wooden core. It is one of the earliest prosthetic limbs to ever be discovered.

Plaster noses, ears, and lips have been described in ancient texts from around 300 BC. During the 15th and 16th centuries, prosthetic noses and ears were constructed of silver, gold and crystal and painted skin tone, to replace appendages lost due to disease or injury. The ears and noses were held in place by strings, harnesses or straps fastened around the head.



A 16th-century manufactured iron arm, complete with hand and fingers and believed to have been worn by German knight Gotz von Berlichingen after he lost his right hand from the effects of a cannon blast, is on display at the Jagsthausen Castle Museum in Germany. A marvel for its time, the prosthetic was made with buttons and levers so that it was functional.

Prosthetic legs can be transfemoral (above the knee) or transtibial (below the knee). During the 17th century, they were very rustic in design, often just a thin wooden post with an iron foot attached. It was that century in which surgeon Pieter Verduyn developed a transtibial leg with knee hinges that allowed for movement. But despite innovations, early prosthetic legs remained extremely uncomfortable for the wearer.

During the Civil War, the need for prosthetics quadrupled as battle injuries robbed hundreds of men of their limbs. Most who had lost a leg settled for a replacement in the form of a peg-leg – a simple wooden device that resembled a small crutch,

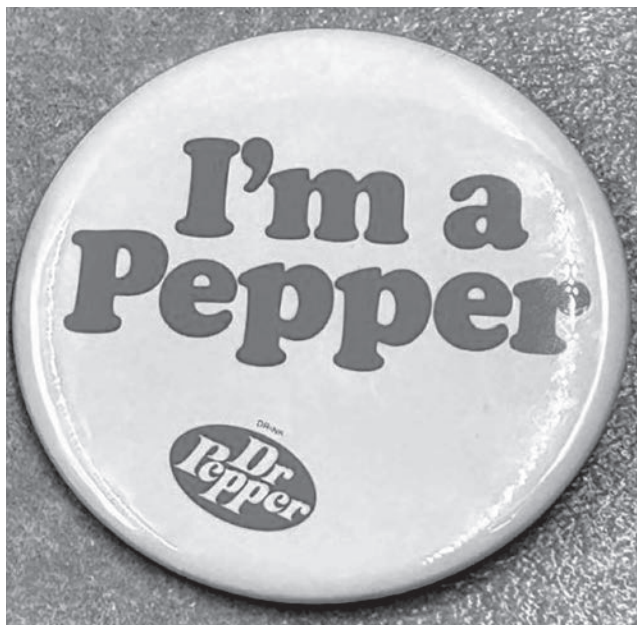
strapped to the existing portion of the leg with a belt-like leather strap. Often, a rubber knob was affixed to the bottom. Prosthetic arms of this time were made functional by the attachment of a hook or a double-hook at the end where a hand would be.

James Edward Hanger, who lost his leg while fighting in the Civil War in 1861, decided to spend his recovery time developing a better leg prosthesis. The result was known as the Hanger Limb. The device contained rubber cushioning and hinges at the knee and ankle which provided shock absorption. His venture was so successful that he founded his own company to manufacture the devices. Today, the Hanger Clinic is the leading provider of prosthetics in America.

Prior to Hanger's arrival on the scene, the largest manufacturer of prosthetics in America was the A.A. Marks Company of Broadway, New York, which was founded in 1853. Their slogan was "The nearest approach to nature."

Another successful American producer of prosthetics as the 20th-century loomed was the National Artificial Limb Company located on Dearborn Street in Chicago. The sole manufacturer of prosthetics composed of leather reinforced with aluminum, their artificial limbs were very light with a reduced risk of chafing. The company asserted that wearers could ride a bicycle as easily as if they had two natural legs.

While many amputees preferred the split hook arms for their functionality, others chose a more cosmetic version in the form of a leather and wood arm painted skin tone and affixed with a stuffed leather glove at the end. Other arm prosthetics had immovable hands with carved wood-

en fingers. Like prosthetic legs, they were made in two lengths – from the shoulder down, or from the elbow down. Some intricate artificial hands had fingers that could be mechanically cranked open and closed, although the action required a great deal of attention and effort on the part of the wearer.

In addition to arms and legs, humans have sought to replace other missing body parts over the centuries. Some of the earliest known dentures date to 700 BC and come from the Etruscans of Italy. They were constructed of human and animal teeth fastened together with gold wires.

In 1728, French physician Pierre Fauchard, who was known as "the father of modern dentistry" described in writing his inventive dental prosthetic, which was comprised of hand-carved animal bones fastened to wire brackets.

George Washington, who had but a single natural tooth at the time of his inauguration, wore dentures. Grover Cleveland, America's 22nd and 24th president, wore a rubber prosthesis after having five teeth and part of his upper jawbone removed due to cancer. Without the prosthesis, he was unable to speak normally.

Towards the end of the 19th century, comfort was becoming a greater consideration in the manufacture of dental devices. Whole and partial sets of artificial teeth were being inserted into vulcanite rubber as sharp wires and

hard woods took a backseat. Prosthetic dentistry eventually became a booming business.

The earliest prosthetics for a missing eye are believed to have been manufactured as the image of an eye painted on the surface of a small plate and held over the empty socket by a string tied around the head. An actual artificial eye that fit into the socket was discovered buried in Iran and dated to about 2900 BC. It was made of a paste and covered with a thin layer of gold.

It's believed that the ancient Egyptians began crafting glass eyes around 3000 BC. During the late 16th century, Venice began manufacturing artificial eyes made of lead glass. Some eyes were simple and clear, while others contained an intricately painted iris and pupil, with the color of the eye made to match the existing eye.

Glass eyes needed to be removed from the socket regularly to prevent infection. They were not functional and served only two purposes – one being cosmetic and the other being to prevent the eyelid from collapsing into the eye socket. By 1911, Germany led the world in the manufacture of artificial eyes.

With construction materials such as plastic, silicone and aluminum replacing the heavy wood and iron of days passed, modern-day prosthetics are much more lightweight and comfortable than their predecessors. In addition, advancements in robotics and artificial intelligence are adding to the ever-evolving technology that is bringing prosthetics from the

stone-age to the space age. These advancements add to the value of antique and vintage prosthetic devices.

Finding antique prosthetics isn't easy. Their rarity may be due to the devices being buried with their wearers upon the individual's death.

A prosthetic arm from the Civil War era – manufactured of wood with a metal bar affixed to the side and a hinge which allowed the device to bend at the elbow – was listed at a recent auction with a value of \$749. Condition and interesting innovation sometimes trump age as an artificial arm from the early 20th century was recently valued at auction for \$1,750. A vintage hook, once attached to the end of an artificial arm, was recently listed at auction for \$165.

Antique prosthetic legs are typically valued at anywhere between \$400 and \$1,300. The majority that come up for auction are the not as old as the mid-19th century nor as new as the mid-20th century, but fall, somewhere in between. They are often made of wood and leather strapping, with a metal bar screwed down the outer length to hold the artificial thigh, calf and wooden foot together.

Ear horns, also known as ear trumpets – which magnified sound for the hard of hearing – can resemble a bell with a handle-like tube that inserts into the ear canal, or an actual small trumpet. Often made of brass, they typically range in value from \$70 to \$900 depending on age, condition, and rarity. Antique and vintage eyes with a colored iris are typically valued at auction between \$70 and \$185, with clear, glass eyes valued at about \$55.

Vintage dental molds for making false teeth might sell for as low as \$40. An entire vintage boxed set of necessities for creating dentures was recently listed at auction, valued at \$320. Dated 1912, the set included impression molds, steel sizers and mold holders. Antique and vintage books centering on the manufacture of artificial teeth are often valued higher than the teeth themselves, lingering around \$200.

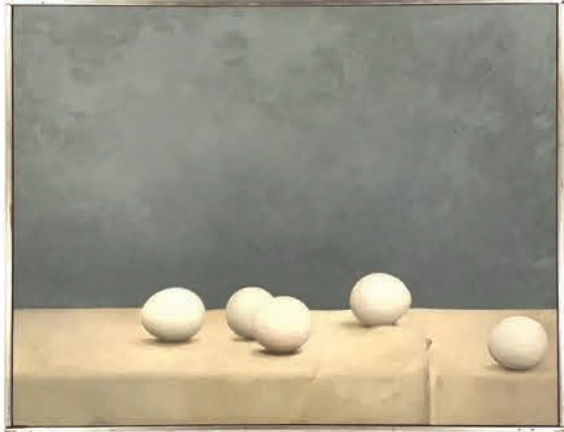
