ACROSS THE AUCTION BLOCK

1969 Camaro Z28 sells for \$46,000 with Vander Kolk

DORR, Mich. — When Kevin McNamara's family moved to Kentwood, Mich., in the 1960s he and his school friend Karl used to race each other.

First, it was bicycles. Kevin had a Schwinn

5-speed Stingray with cross bar shifter that Karl envied. Then they moved up to a homemade lawn mower motor go kart nicknamed "Putt-Putt", and then mini bikes.

Cars were the natural next step. Kevin's high school graduation present was a 1973 Camaro Z28.

And from there he never stopped buying and selling cars, mostly Chevrolets and muscle cars, until his death in 2024.

Kevin McNamara's remaining 20 car collection went on the block on a fine fall Saturday, Oct. 25, in Dorrr in an auction conducted by Vander Kolk Auctions. Listed prices included a 10% onsite buyers premium or 15% online.

The highest priced seller was a bright red and white 1969 Chevrolet Camaro Z28 which with spirited bidding sold for \$46,000 to an online buyer in Iowa. The 4-speed manual transmission had a mere 3,834 miles, an installed Chevy small block 327 engine

and aftermarket tachometer, oil and temperature gauges. The dark-colored interior looked almost new.

"That was a really nice car, in very good condition," auctioneer Scott Vander Kolk said. "We knew it would do well".

A similarly bright red 1970 Chevrolet Chevelle SS with 59,476 miles was

Jesse James rides again in the world of collectors

Of all the legendary outlaws of the Old West, Jesse James remains the best known. His story has been told in songs, biographies and movies. He has been called both America's Robin Hood and a "cold-blooded killer." He supposedly

gave his ill-gotten money to anyone in need, but among his victims, he is accused of shooting down a 5-year-old girl who got in his way during a holdup.

For 15 years, Jesse and his brother Frank roamed the countryside robbing banks, trains, fairgrounds, and stagecoaches. Living by the gun, Jesse James died by the gun on April 3, 1882 when that "dirty little coward" Bob Ford "shot poor Jesse in his head," according to the lyrics from the ballad "Jesse James."

Today, nearly 143 years since Jesse's death at age 34, historians still argue over what turned a Baptist minister's son into America's most famous outlaw. Some say it was the cruel treatment that Jesse received at the hands of Union soldiers

following the Civil War; he was shot and wounded while attempting to surrender. Others say that riding with William Quantrill during the war turned Jesse into a killer. Most think he did it for the money.

The legends surrounding Jesse James began shortly after his death. A popular song throughout the United States in the late 1800s was the Ballad of Jesse James. The author of the song was Billy Gashade, but credit for saving it belongs to Vance Randolph of Arkansas who collected the lyrics



and tune in 1920 from a man who supposedly learned it from his father-in-law years before. One verse reads, "The people held their breath/ When

they heard of Jesse's death/ And wondered how he ever came to die./ It was one of the gang called little Robert Ford/ He shot poor Jesse on the

sly." As the legend grew, so did souvenirs and collectibles. Today, many

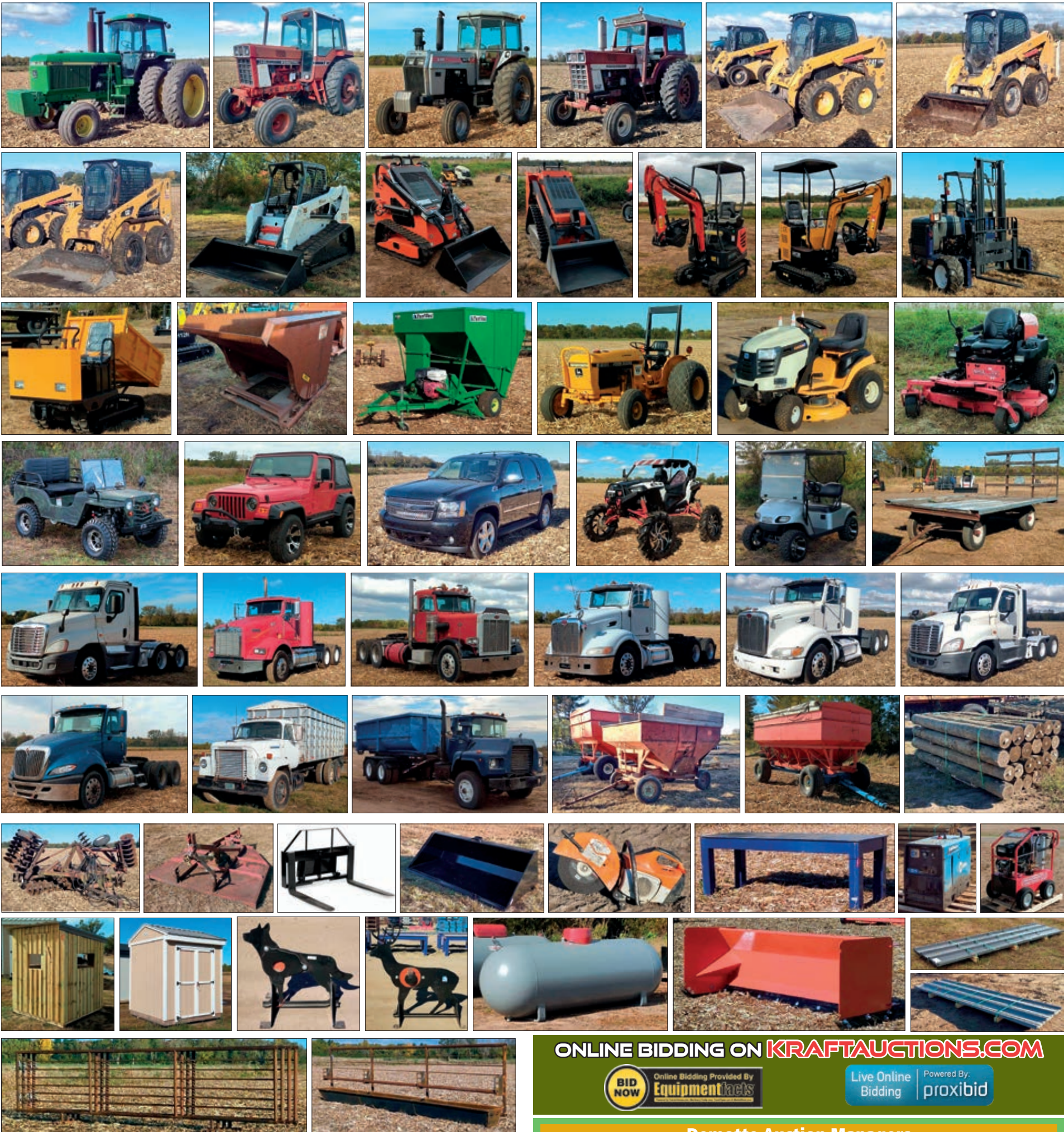

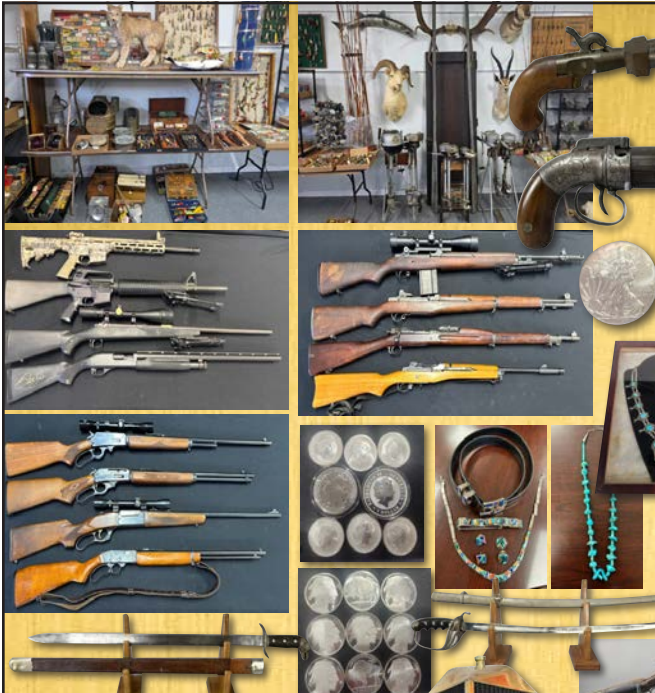

the next highest seller at \$39,600 onsite. A Chevy 454 big block engine had been installed in the automatic transmission equipped car. Tach, oil and temperature gauges were aftermarket but the original factory AC controls were still present.

A white 1968 Plymouth GTX with 52,393 miles, Gator top and automatic transmission sold for \$37,400 onsite. A previous owner had installed a 1968 Plymouth Roadrunner interior in the car, which was in very good condition. Interestingly, the GTX was the upscale version of Plymouth's muscle cars, with a very nice interior of its own and sold for more than its more youthful Roadrunner counterpart. The original Plymouth 440 Magnum engine had been replaced with another 440.

Ashiny 1968 Chevrolet Chevelle SS 396 sold for \$35,850 onsite. It had 20,493 miles and featured an installed Chevy 396 big block engine with a 4-speed manual transmission and Hurst shifter. The burgundy car had an aftermarket factory-barrel style tachometer with oil and temperature gauges.

A metallic green with cloth roof 1969 Chevrolet Camaro SS badged as 396 with 17,070 miles was purchased for \$32,450. With 17,070

miles it featured a high performance 454 block engine, automatic transmission and aftermarket tachometer, oil and temperature gauges.

A copper with black stripes 1973 Chevrolet Camaro SS badged as a 396 with automatic transmission sold for \$30,250 onsite. With 59,511 miles, it had a small block Chevy engine. It tied in price with a bright yellow 1968 Dodge Coronet Super Bee 4-speed manual transmission labeled as a clone. The assumed 440 engine was actually determined to be a 383 crate engine. Its trademarked Super Bee logo was in excellent condition on both rear ends.

Two more Chevrolet Camaro Z28s, one a yellow 1970 and the other a gold with black stripes 1973 model, sold for \$32,450 and \$18,150 respectively. The yellow car had a 4-speed manual transmission and Hurst shifter with 25,235 miles. The gold Z28 was Kevin's high school graduation car and one of only two cars at the auction that wouldn't start.

The auction also featured two other Chevelles. The oldest car in the sale, a 1967 blue/green Malibu with 91722 miles, sold for \$20,900 onsite. Badged as a 327, it had a 400 h.p. small block engine installed in it with Hurst Quarter Slick automatic transmission shifter, a sport comp tach, Edelbrock intake and aftermarket oil pressure and temperature gauges.

A bronze 1971 with SS badging and 10,936 miles decoded as a 1971 Malibu 6 sold for \$22,000 onsite. The automatic transmission car had been upgraded with a Chevy small block performance engine, Dart aluminum headers and intakes and a sport comp tachometer.

A black 1971 Chevrolet Nova SS badged as a 383 sold for \$24,750 onsite. It had an automatic transmission with a B&M shifter, aftermarket tachometer and aftermarket oil, temperature and volt gauges. There were no climate controls but the car did have a battery shut off switch.

McNamara also had five newer "muscle" cars in his collection. An orange 2008 Dodge Challenger SRT with 37,849 miles had a 6.1 litre Hemi engine and was hammered down for a price of \$28,600 to an onsite bidder. A red with black stripe 2011 black convertible Chevrolet Camaro SS with 37,817 miles brought a winning bid of \$29,900 to an online bidder. It featured an Edelbrock Force Supercharger and was sold new by a nearby Grand Rapids Chevy dealer.

Three more locally sold Chevrolets also crossed the auction block. A white with black stripes 2001 Camaro with an original Z28 badge had only 8,060 miles and sold for \$27,500. It had an upgrade to make it into an SS equivalent with 6-speed manual transmission and 5.7 litre engine with maximum 380 h.p. A red with black convertible top 1998 Camaro SS with 22,538 miles sold for \$15,400. And a blue with white stripe T-top 1998 Camaro SS with 52,610 miles sold for the same price to an online bidder. It featured an automatic transmission and a nitrous switch for fast Friday nights at the drag strip.

McNamara had an interesting collection of lesser everyday vehicles. A 2015 blue Harley Davidson Road Glide FLTRXS with 13,489 miles commanded a price of \$11,000 to a happy onsite bidder. A well used 2008 yellow Jeep Wrangler Unlimited with 160,734 miles sold for \$6,050 onsite. A 2008 GMC 2500 Sierra pickup truck and Western plow with more than 114,000 miles went for \$13,750.

A good looking Grey 2005 Hummer H2 with a leaky sunroof and almost 175,000 miles still went for \$5,225. A burgundy

2008 Chevrolet Suburban LTZ 4x4 with 168,509 miles went to an onsite bidder for \$3,575. A non-running 2005 Chevrolet Avalanche with nice-looking Western snowplow was a bargain to an onsite buyer at \$2,750. And not to be overlooked, an undated Kubota BX 2660 with Kubota LA243 front-end loader and three part 60-inch mower deck and hydrostatic transmission commanded an onsite price of \$8,800.

Two gasoline golf carts were offered. A 2008 Club Car cart sold onsite for \$4,125 and a 2009 Club Car cart went to an onsite buyer for \$2,860.

McNamara also had a small but impressive gun collection that was sold onsite. A vintage Remington Model 11-87 semiautomatic shotgun,

made in 12 gauge only, sold for \$742. A Marlin Model 55 12 gauge lever action, often known as a "Goose Gun", changed hands for \$550. An older Remington 1100 12 gauge was priced at \$300. A Marlin 39A .22 rifle sold at \$495. A vintage Remington Model 7400 .30-06 was priced right at \$550 and a Remington 870 hand-pump 12 gauge was purchased for \$357.

An Italian-made F.T. .380 semiautomatic handgun sold for \$220. A Taurus 92 9mm was priced at \$550. And two Iver Johnson long barrel handguns were bargains. A Western-style 8-shot .22 had a high bid of \$94 and a vintage .22 revolver handgun sold for \$66.

Windmill salesman sample blew in \$20,000 bid at Chupp

SHIPSHEWANA, Ind. - Chupp Auctions comes up with the neatest sales and the Friday, September 19 and Saturday, September 20 auctions were no different.

Day One was packed with unique antiques, advertising, farm primi-

lous vintage petroleum and soda signs, country store pieces like coffee grinders and seed counters, plus unique toys, lamps, and even a Winchester cannon.

The top lot of Friday's sale was the salesman sample of a Butler Mfg. Co. wooden windmill which sold for \$20,000. Prices do not include the 17 percent buyer's premi-

the base "by Beard Mfg Co. of Angola, Indiana," then on the fantail; one side was stenciled "BUTLER MFG. CO., BUTLER, IND." and on the other side just the word, "BUTLER."

Other salesman samples that sold strong include a 24 inch wide by 24 inch long reaper with brass wheels and a maker's tag for "C.M. Clinton, Model Maker, Ithaca, NY." Though it had been repainted it still brought \$9,000. A salesman sample of a hay spear measuring a whopping 17 inches long was bid to \$8,500, while a World Champion Corn Sheller #2 salesman sample wearing a patent of March 24, 1891 brought \$6,000. It measured 12 inches high.

Graphically appealing was the 48 by 58 inch

"Domino Feeds" sign featuring a man carrying a sack of feed with the image of the man being made out of domino tiles. It sold for \$9,000. Large in size at 59 by 34 inches was the SST Minneapolis Moline die-cut sign for "Mech & Sons Implt Co., Marshfield, Wis." that realized \$4,750. It was mounted on a wood back frame.

Day Two saw fantastic advertising signage taking top honors. Finding vintage neon signs in great working condition with their glass tubing intact is no easy feat. Though it was a very basic sign with the neon simply spelling out "OFFICE" the 27 inch by 7.5 inch example was highly desired by at least two people being bid to \$10,000.

Condition was a major factor where the final bids garnered for advertising items offered up on Day Two. A great example was the self-framed Francisco Auto Heater sign. In fabulous condition with great automobile graphics, this stun-

Jesse James

Americans collect Old West items. Some collectors specialize in outlaw items. And, even in collections, the most popular outlaw is Jesse James.

A recent search of eBay for "Jesse James outlaw" had over 1,400 results listed. The most expensive offering that day was for a 1870s Jesse James tintype photograph that was offered for \$749,000. The least expensive item was a 2006 Topps Jesse James trading card from the "Outlaw Old West" series. It was offered for \$3.

Original tintypes occasionally are sold at auction, depicting Jesse, Frank, or one of the gang. An original tintype of Jesse will cost you but be aware there are numerous

reprint photos of Jesse and of Frank as an old man. Also abundant are reprints of old wanted posters. It is rare that an original wanted poster surfaces, and, if one does, be prepared to pay plenty for it.

While rare, it is still possible to locate newspapers from 1882 that announce Jesse's death. His killing made headlines across the nation. Dime novels are another popular collectible from the 1800s. And there are many biographies of Jesse or his gang members. One rare book is a 1st edition of James Buel's "The James Boys" from 1883.

Jesse's homestead still stands and is a museum today. Souvenir hunters chipped his original monument away long ago, but the museum sells many collectible items.

And nearly every family in western Missouri has a story to tell about Jesse or a family heirloom that, according to family history, is connected to Jesse. My own family hails from the vicinity of Butler, Mo., and family history states that Jesse and Frank James were served dinner on our great-great-grandmother's porch more than once. An uncle still has an old blue-willow coffee cup that he swears Jesse drank coffee from.

On exceptionally rare occasions, guns reportedly owned and used by Jesse go to auction, but they are usually only found in museums. And, if you are a rugged adventurer, treasure maps and stories of buried loot from the James' gang are found in many states, including Missouri and Oklahoma.

include Jesse James action figures, movie posters from a score of Jesse James movies (even Roy Rogers depicted Jesse in a movie), Jesse James gaming tokens, postcards, commemorative steins, bronze statues, and belt

buckles. The list of collectible James memorabilia is substantial.

If you or your entire family wishes to begin collecting James memorabilia, the logical place to start is a trip to Clay County, Missouri.

with a metal wall-mount frame that brought \$4,750 despite some porcelain chips.

And about that cannon? Well, it wasn't a full-size cannon, but a Winchester breech loading cannon in its original wooden crate that measured 19 ½ by 8 by 8 ½ inches. The cannon takes 10 gauge blanks, and it sold for \$2,500.

Collectors with outstanding advertising material know to turn to Chupp Auctions when it is time to down-size. The buying community takes note and shows up seeking ownership ensuring these wonderfully cared for pieces find new homes.
