ACROSS THE AUCTION BLOCK

Elephant jardiniere trumpeted \$8,000 at Strawser

WOLCOTTVILLE, Ind. — Strawser Auctions recently held a

six day auction that was held both online and in person. The event was separated into art pottery, Staffordshire,

Majolica, and other smaller subcategories, which allowed bidders to pick the day with the items that most interested them. The Majolica pieces generated the most interest.

Bringing in a fantastic bid of \$8,000 was a monumental circa 1880 Delphin Massier elephant floor jardiniere. Measuring approximately 31 by 34 inches, this was an impressive piece. It looked very natural as the elephant stood ceremoniously, supporting a beautifully painted, hexagonal howdah on a tasseled saddle blanket. One of his tusks had been repaired. He was

the top-selling piece at the auction.

Coming in just slightly behind, with a bid of \$7,500, was a Minton Majolica centerpiece. This piece was breathtaking and needed to be center stage somewhere.



This majestic elephant was the top-selling piece at \$8,000.

It had two mermaids at either end who were holding up a seashell. The colors were still brilliant, and even though it had some repairs to both the mermaids and the base, it was well worth

the excitement. It measured an impressive 40 by 25 inches, and the mermaids were so graceful looking that one could picture them just surfacing from the bottom of

Collectors toss their money at vintage ring toss games

As most people know, Ring Toss is a game in which players try to throw a ring so that it will fall over an upright stick or pole. It's basically a very simple game.

Ring Toss is also known as Muckers or Quoits. Ring Toss and Muckers are actually spinoffs of Quoits. Quoits is a traditional yard game that employs rings of metal, rope, or rubber. Players toss the rings over the top

of a spike for points. The spike is also called a hob, mott, or pin. Myth states that the Greek god Apollo was playing Quoits with his lover Hyacinth when he died. The name "quoits" is derived from a Greek word.

Ring Toss has been played for centuries, but around 1815 Ring Toss became a popular yard game, especially on the Eastern seaboard of the United States. In 1836, the National Intelligencer (Washington DC) ran newspaper advertisements touting the "Manly and healthy amusements of quoits and Muckers," as they were being played at the Coffee House in Berkeley Springs,

Virginia. Official rules of Ring Toss appeared in the April 1881 edition of The Field. A body of pub players in Northern England defined these rules.

Today, Ring Toss is still played in backyards and at carnivals and amusement parks. The game has not changed, so children and adults toss rings around a peg sticking up

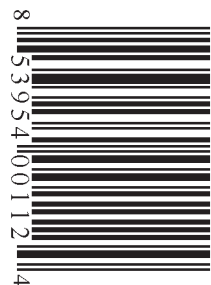
from the ground or holder. At carnivals, the pegs are replaced with bottles. Parents have popularized Ring Toss in the late 20th century as a game that helps in the development of motor skills and hand-eye coordination in children.

Collectors eagerly search for Ring Toss and Quoits games from the

1800s; however, many collectors selectively search for Ring Toss games from mid-20th century America that featured cartoon characters, such as Mickey Mouse, on the box or pegs. These Ring Toss sets are colorful and make excellent displays in game rooms.

Collectors usually have

the sea, working together to hold the seashell. What a fabulous piece this was.

Birds, dragonflies, cat-tails, and water lilies made a George Jones piece stand out. This garden seat piece appeared to have a wooden base and seat, although it was actually made of pottery. Beautifully made, this turquoise pottery measured 19 by 14 inches. It had a few minor nicks to some of the high points, but was still a great piece. This particular piece achieved a final bid price of \$ 6,000.

Another Majolica piece was a fox peering down the hole of a rabbit. This was another George Jones compote. The bowl above the fox is supported by an oak

tree, complete with oak leaves and acorns. It measured about 10 by 8 inches in height. The rabbit was clever enough to stay just visible at the front of the hole, waiting for the fox to find other prey. This piece features the beautiful turquoise color that is frequently seen in Majolica, used for the bowl above the fox's head. The bowl was rimmed with a yellowish-brown hue, which

made the turquoise stand out. The fox and oak tree brought a bid price of \$5,500.

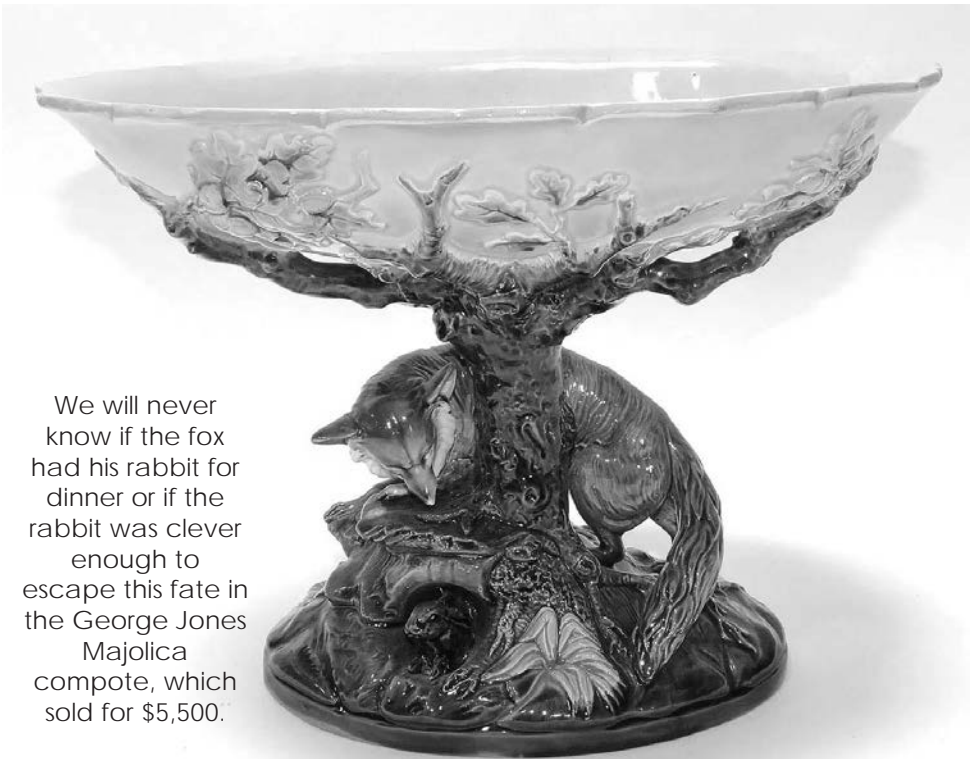
A Minton Majolica pheasant jardiniere was gorgeous, thanks to the high relief used. The pheasant was running. This pottery featured some molded ferns and leaves, and the back side included thistle and leaf details. All this was set on a rock base strewn with fallen flowers. There was an impressed Minton mark on the base, dating from 1863. It measured 19 inches wide and was a stunning display piece. It sold for \$4,750.

There is nothing that appears more graceful than a standing stork. A Minton Majolica umbrella or stick stand certainly appeared graceful. This stork was lucky as he had his dinner caught in his beak in the form of a snake. There was a frog under his foot, which he was saving for dessert. The bullrushes formed an open pocket area that allowed for an umbrella or walking stick, creating an excellent background for the primary focus of the piece. There was some professional repair work done on the leaves. This piece stood around 40 inches high. It sold for \$4,500.

Bringing in a piece with the same \$4,500 price was another Majolica item. This one was by T.C. Brown Westhead. It was a beautiful grape pitcher produced by the Moore

We will never know if the fox had his rabbit for dinner or if the rabbit was clever enough to escape this fate in the George Jones Majolica compote, which sold for \$5,500.

Company. It stood 8 inches tall and had an impressed registration lozenge to the underside of the base. It had excellent colors, with grape leaves at the top and a delicious-looking bunch of grapes covering the bottom half.

There were a couple of Majolica pieces that sold for the same bid of \$4,250. The first was a mushroom garden seat from Choisy-Le-Roi. This realistic toadstool mushroom was 20 inches tall. There was a snake surrounding the base, along with a frog and several snails, which were added to the pottery. It did have a professional hair-line repair to the base. The piece inspired attention as it was studied more, and the more it was studied, the more it was noticed. The snake was slyly coiled along and under the large toadstool, while the frog sat unaware on top of a smaller mushroom. The snails were scattered around the base of the piece.

The second majolica piece selling for this bid price was a Sarreguemines majolica pair of monumental trumpet vases with birds and leaves. Measuring about 17 inches tall, this quality pair was indeed a rare treat. The dark blue background and the gold trim made this matched pair really stand out. The birds featured appeared to be flying right at you, and the added green leaves on the bottom made this set desirable.

A Hugo Lovitz Majolica piece was sold for \$4,000. This clever piece was modeled with a tree trunk with branches as the base. Ferns and leaves were covering the ground and the tree trunk. A couple of foxes are peering carefully around the side of the trunk, watching a pair of mallard ducks who have no clue they are being sized up for a quick meal. The pottery measures 16 by 6 inches. The piece is in excellent condition, and the color is vibrant.

A Minton majolica pair of figural comports

was sold for \$2,750. These reticulated bowls, supported by a pair of putti, underwent professional rim repair on one of them. They stood almost 10 inches tall. A putto is a figure of a chubby male child who is usually shown naked and sometimes has wings. The matched pair brought a bid of \$2,750.

A breathtaking George Jones Majolica dresser tray also sold for \$2,750. It measured 11 inches and was beautiful with the butterflies that highlighted the tray. With one butterfly enjoying the iris it was sitting on, the other looked like it still fluttered above the other irises, trying to decide which one to land on.

A pair of Minton Majolica figural posy holders looked dainty. One was a boy harvesting wheat with the wheat tossed over his shoulder. The other was a girl with a cup, probably taking the boy a drink. A posy trough surrounded each figure, and there were two holders with each figure. Each figure stood 8 inches tall. These brought a respectable high bid of \$2,200.

With a height measurement of almost 11

inches, a pair of very royal-looking white dogs were guarding the spill vases. They were the center of this Staffordshire display. The spill vases were yellow, had a pale green edging, and the dogs were sitting on some pale green grass. The muted colors used on this piece made the dogs the center of attention. The pair was sold for \$2,500.

All items sold at this auction had a 19 percent buyer's premium added to the final sale price and all measurements were rounded up.

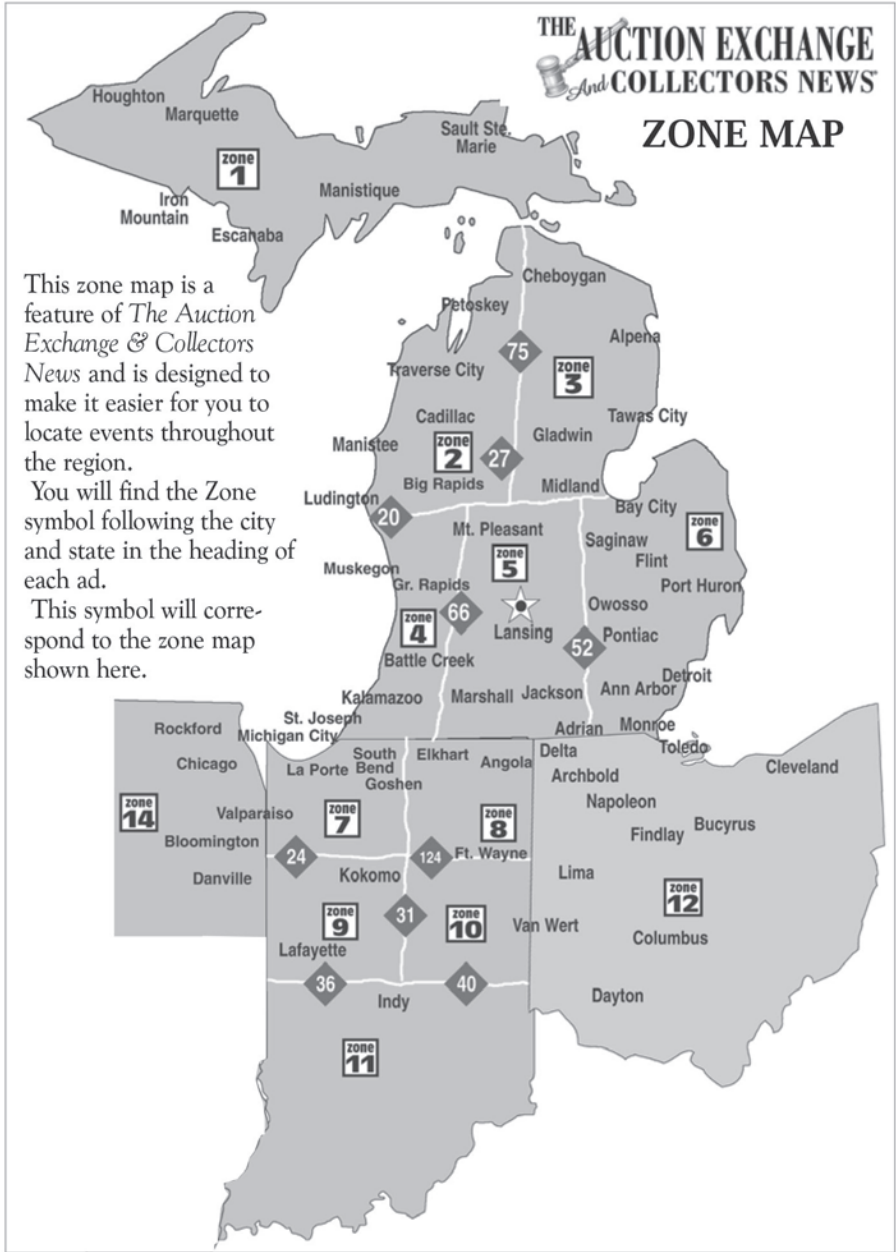



one or two simple ring toss games — plain Jane games — in their collections, but most collectors enjoy finding the character related ring toss games of the 1950s, such as the Popeye the Sailor Ring Toss game from 1957. This game, with original box, is valued at well over \$200.

Other cartoon character ring toss games include the Beany and Cecil Ring Toss game from 1961, and the Jiminy Cricket game, issued by Walt Disney, from the 1950s. Walt Disney actually released ring toss games using most of his animated characters. Some of these games that are fun to search for are several Donald Duck ring toss games, 101 Dalmatian ring toss game, Mickey & Donald ring toss, Dumbo ring toss, Finding Nemo ring toss, Mickey Mouse ring toss, and a very rare Eastern Airlines action-matic Mickey Mouse & Pinocchio ring toss game that comes in a plastic globe. This last game is valued at \$70 and is a cross collectible since Eastern Airlines ceased operations in 1991.

Whether you concentrate on Walt Disney character ring toss games or search for movie tie-in ring toss games, like the Incredible Hulk ring toss game from 2008 that is valued at \$20, it is easy to see that there is an endless supply of these games for the collector to find.

Johnson gasoline sign winged
its way to \$13,000 at auction

PEOTONE, Ill. — It doesn't get much better than the Check the Oil Promotions, LLC's Fall Peotone Gas, Oil, & Advertising Auction held in conjunction with their Fall Peotone Show at the Will County Fairgrounds in Peotone. When it comes to all things having to do with advertising in this collecting category, Check the Oil has been the go-to organization where collectors are concerned whether it is finding out information

about an item or actually finding and acquiring some gas or oil rarity.

The Oct. 17 event included close to 600 lots of everything from gas pump and gas globes; to neon signs and neon clocks, to oil cans, countertop displays — you name it.

Leading the day was a Johnson winged 70 gasoline die-cut identification sign. Double-sided and comprised of paint on tin, this 37.5 inch by 48 inch rarity was taken to \$13,000. Prices listed are hammer prices. This sign was not in the best of condition with paint flaking and edge bends, but since it is so difficult to find, condition was not a big issue.

In contrast, a painted tin sign in a frame and wearing its original shipping label on the back; with just some minor scratches to the field but being a more common example - "Osceola Gasoline Ahead" with a Native American chief graphic - sold for \$6,000. It measured 49 inches by 96 inches. Identical in shape, size, and color to the above but with the words "Zephyr Gasoline

Ahead" and the Zephyr logo, this example made \$3,200.

Porcelain signage pieces are always popular with oil and gas collectors. The top lot in this category was the 71.5 inch in diameter "Old Dutch" red, white, and blue sign with a windmill graphic that brought \$8,000. Another difficult to find service station sign, this double-sided piece did well despite some chipping to the porcelain.

Coming in at \$7,000 was a sister sign to the above; another Old Dutch brand and also 71.5 inches in diameter, but this version stating "Aro-Speed" with the center "S" being larger in size. It

was red, white, and blue, and again this sign is very difficult to find. Advertising clocks, license plates, and gas pumps also had representatives in the top lots of this sale. A 1906 porcelain Virginia First Issue Type 1 license plate with three digits was bid to \$8,500. Measuring 5 inches by 10 inches, this difficult to find, type 1, first issue Virginia three-digit license plate sold with a note stating, "this plate was originally issued to Dr. Harry Jenkins of Norwalk Virginia 1906. The back is marked 8 indicating it was produced in August 1906, which would be the second production run for Virginia license plates." Leading the gas pump

category was a Tokheim Volumeter 850 clock face example which sold for \$3,400. Standing 80 inches tall, this pump did not have the glass globe often associated with old gas pumps, but a dial face though it was missing its outer glass cover. It also sported old decals with one stating, "property of Bermuda Airport."

And where advertising clocks were concerned,

the "Atlas Tires-Batteries and Accessories" neon example was hard to beat. All original and in working condition with just some light wear, this 19 inch by 18 inch by 6 inch example realized \$2,400.

Then there was the item that had little to do with oil and gas but was very cool none-the-less. Selling for \$2,250 was the 1925-1926 Cleveland
