ACROSS THE AUCTION BLOCK

Harley-Davidson roared off with \$6,105 bid online

ARMADA, Mich. — Cryderman Auctions recently held a living estate auction with online bidding only. This gets

the auction worldwide, attracting many more potential bidders. It only takes one item to attract the right bidders, and this auction had one. The variety of items offered

was indeed diverse, with something for everyone's interests.

The item that attracted the most attention was a 2003 Harley-Davidson Softail Fat Boy, which

was the hundredth-anniversary addition. It showed only 8,053 miles. With all the chrome artfully applied to this beauty, bidding kept rising. It also had some minor gold touches that helped raise the look to a special standard. This rideable piece of history brought a final bid of \$6,105, pushing it

Collectors buckle up for roller coasters collectibles

In 1964, the wooden roller coaster at Playland Park in Council Bluffs was taken down and sold off when the park's size was reduced by nearly 40 acres. This was the roller coaster of my childhood, where I learned to fear a vertical plunge even more than I feared English tests. When this old roller coaster was removed, a piece of my childhood was forever lost.

Many of you probably feel about a childhood roller coaster as I did about Playland's roller coaster. We all remember the breathlessness, excessive sweating, dry mouth, shaking, heart palpitations, inability to speak, the fear of dying, and the unmistakable detachment from reality when experiencing a full blown anxiety attack.

Yet we rode these harbingers of fear over and over again.

Contrary to the hot summer days on which roller coasters are ridden, these screaming rides had a very cold beginning. The earliest roller coasters were modeled after Russian winter sled rides held on specially constructed hills of ice. In the 17th century, the

slides were built to a height of 70 to 80 feet and consisted of a 50° drop. By the late 1700s, ramps and slides with various vehicles replaced ice hills.

Modern innovations were made with each new ride until the forerunner of the roller coaster was built in Paris, France, in 1812. The Les Montagnes Russes à Belleville and

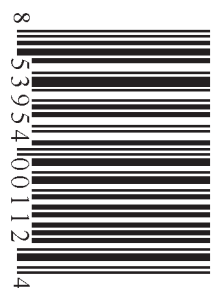
the Promenades Aeriennes both featured wheeled cars securely locked to the track, guide rails to keep them on course and higher speeds

than anyone, living then, could imagine.

There are several explanations of the name roller coaster. One explanation for the name

is that it originated from a ride located in a roller skating rink in Haverhill, Mass., in 1887. A

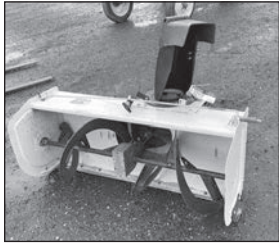

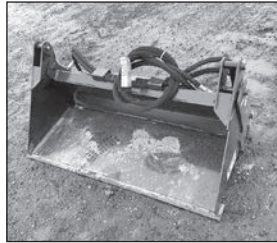

Roller Coaster

toboggan-like sled was raised to the top of a track that consisted of hundreds of rollers. This Roller Toboggan then took off down gently rolling hills to the floor. The inventors of this ride, Stephen E. Jackman and Byron B. Floyd, claim that they were the first to use the term “roller coaster.”

As roller coasters grew in popularity, experimentation in coaster design and dynamics took off. As early as the 1880s, the concept of a vertical loop was explored, and in 1895 the concept came into fruition with “The Flip Flap,” located at Sea Lion Park in Brooklyn, and shortly afterward with the “Loop-the-Loop” at Olentangy Park near Columbus, Ohio. These roller coaster rides were incredibly dangerous, and many passengers suffered whiplash. Both were soon dismantled, and looping coasters had to wait for over a half century before making a safer reappearance.

By 1912, John Miller invented the first under-friction coaster. Soon, roller coasters spread to amusement parks all around the world. Perhaps the best-known historical roller coaster, The Cyclone, was opened at Coney Island in Brooklyn, New York in 1927. Like The Cyclone, all early roller coasters were made of wood. Many old wooden roller coasters are still in operation.

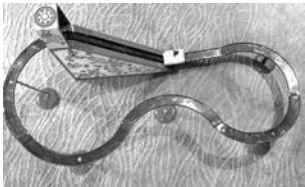
The Great Depression marked the end of the first Golden Age of roller coasters. Theme parks in general declined until 1972. In 1959, the Disneyland theme park introduced a new design breakthrough in roller coasters with the Matterhorn Bobsleds.

This was the first roller coaster to use a tubular steel track. Unlike conventional wooden rails, tubular steel can be bent in any direction, which allows designers to incorporate loops, corkscrews, and many other maneuvers into their designs. Most modern roller coasters are made of steel but wooden roller coasters are still being built.

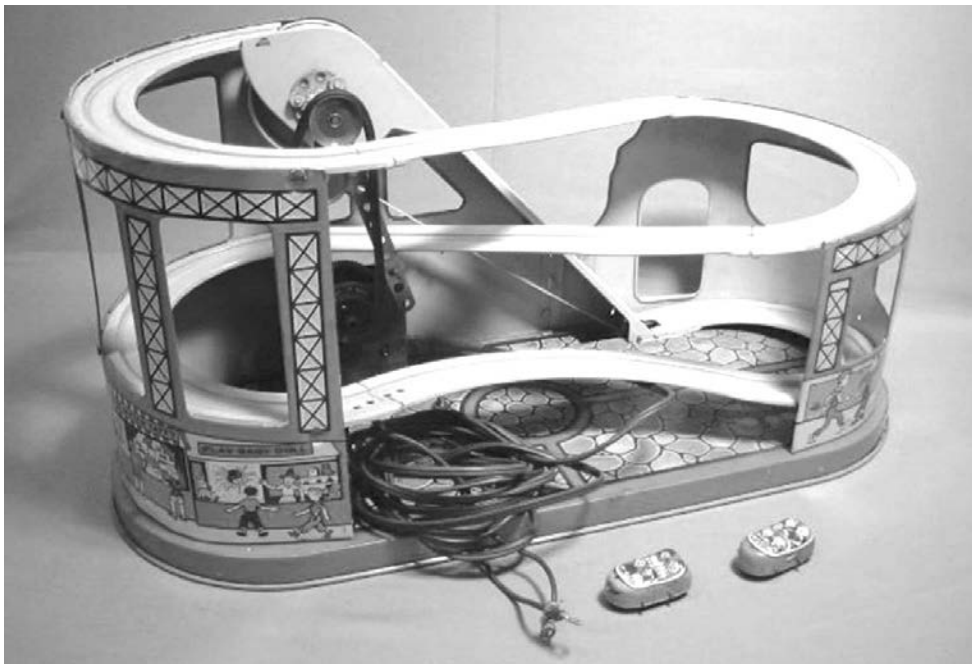
Today, collectors help keep the golden years of roller coasters alive, but few people can afford a real roller coaster in their back yard, so collectors usually limit their roller coaster collections to two themes — postcards and toy roller coasters.

Coney Island postcards remain some of the most popular roller coaster postcards, but some of the obscure roller coasters from amusement parks scattered around the country make for interesting searches.

The heyday for tin, lithographed roller coaster toys was the late 1940s and the 1950s. Some of the companies that manufactured toy roller coasters include Goso (German), Wolverine (American), Technofix Company (German), and J. Chein & Company, an American toy manufacturer.

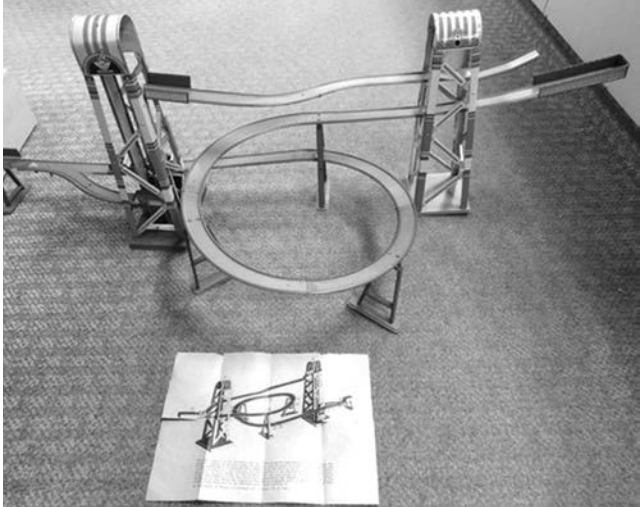
There will always be thrill seekers, riding roller coasters for the high it gives them, but the true longevity of the roller coaster, and its assured place in the future of amusement parks, can best be found in this story about the most famous roller coaster of all time-the Coney Island Cyclone. In 1948, a coal miner diagnosed with aphonia visited Coney Island. According to legend, the miner had not spoken a word in years, but he screamed that day while going down the Cyclone’s first drop. As the roller coaster returned to the station, the miner told his companion, “I feel sick.” Upon realizing that he had spoken, the miner promptly fainted on the platform.

Right: Coney Island “Loop the Loop” roller coaster, circa 1910, postcard. This postcard is valued at \$15.

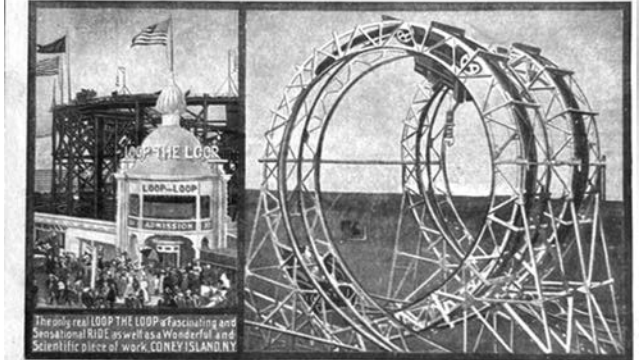

to the top of the sales list.

An original Picasso exhibit poster that was hand signed in pencil sold for \$3,300. It was titled Three Drinkers Sala Gaspar. It was marked as an edition of 500, with only 50 hand-signed. It measured 28 by 36 inches and was number 17 of the 50 signed. It dated from 1961 and was in great condition.

Having four wheels beneath one when traveling brings to mind a much smoother ride, but that's not always true. A white Vis-à-Vis horse-drawn carriage with shafts had four wheels, but they were wooden, so they

would not necessarily help with the bumps. This one was fancy with a folding roof. There were two separate seats, with the riders facing each other as they traveled. The driver sat in an elevated seat at the front and handled the carriage's operation. It sold for \$1,386.

Titled the Great Resurrection of Sounds

was from a book that was illustrated by Kandinsky. It was published in 1912-1913 and was number 13 of 300. It was 16 by 16 inches with the frame. This is a rare piece to have survived all those years in this great condition. It sold for \$396.

A rare piece to help celebrate the Christmas

season was a Hubley cast-iron figure. This was a Santa and reindeer, and was all original. It was from around 1906 and was in great shape. It sold for \$396 price.

An Old Milwaukee shadow box was unusual. It had two cans of the beer and one bottle. There was also a large fish inside the frame with some kelp growing along the bottom. A rather large rope held the sign, which said "Old Milwaukee, America's Light Beer. Selling for \$693, this different advertising piece was obviously in demand.

Any type of gun is always a draw at an auc-

tion. This auction offered a Harter's 1850 United States muzzle loader that sold for an impressive bid of \$385. A second gun was sold, which was attributed to the Navy. It was a Model 36 caliber made in Italy. This black powder revolver with a leather belt holder was sold for \$248.

A common item in any home is a clock. This one was a wall-mounted bubble clock. "Drink Cheer-Up Sparkling Lemon Lime," was emblazoned in large letters around the clock. This one was electric. It was a bit faded from all the years, but the lettering was clear. The bubble that covered the

clock itself was a bit foggy, but the clock would still make a great conversation piece to hang on the wall. It sold for \$737.

There were two opium pipes made of bone that both sold quickly. They were both hand-carved and very different. The first one was the larger of the two and was heavily carved and curved sold for \$237. The second one sold for \$150. It was straight and appeared to be all bark on the outside.

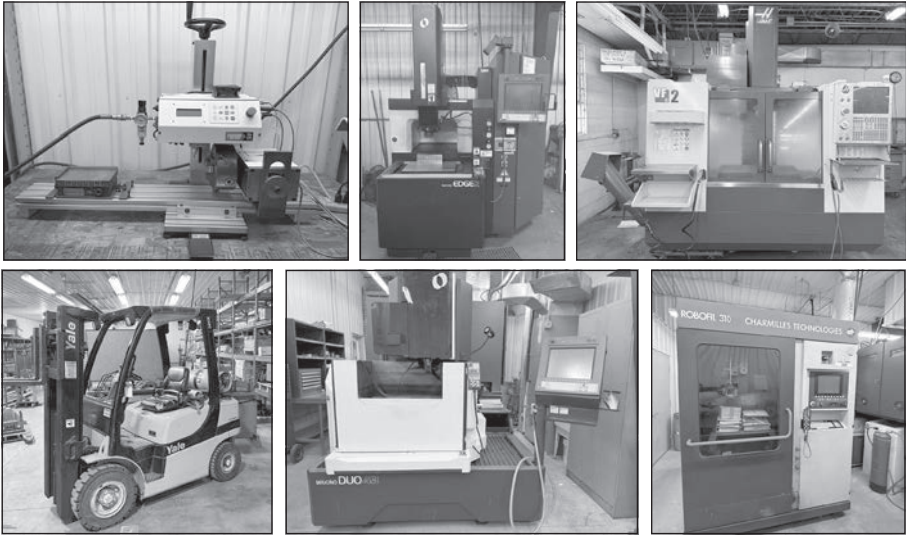

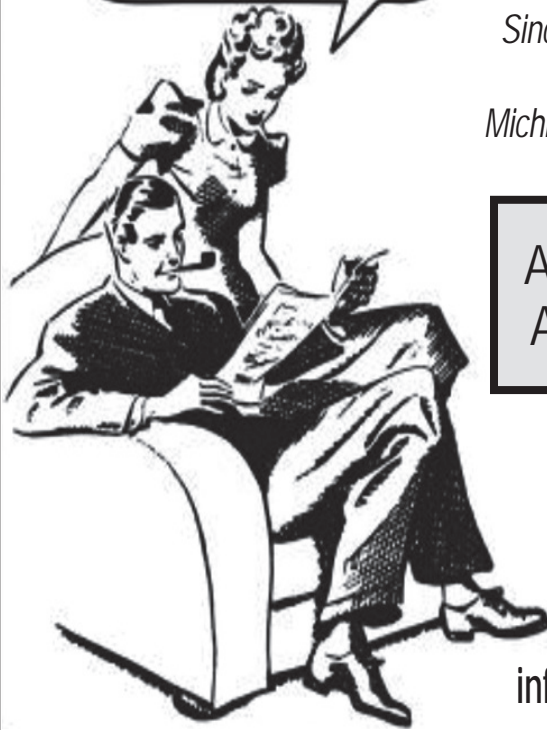

Cream Ale sign lit up bidding at Forsythes’ with \$3,000 bid

CINCINNATI, Ohio - Forsythes’ Auctions, LLC, did not wait long after the holidays before giving collectors another reason to open their wallets and shop. A large multiple consignment event hosted by Forsythes’ Auction of more than 440 lots of a little bit of everything took place Jan. 4.

Advertising was hot at this new year event with the Select 20 Grand Cream Ale Cincinnati light up sign in a aluminum frame crushing its presale estimate of \$600 to \$900 ending instead at \$3,000. Prices listed are hammer prices. In good condition, this sign measured 12 inches high by 9.5 inches wide and 3.5 inches deep.

A reverse painted FW Woolworth Co. sign where the lettering was gold also did well bringing \$2,200 against an estimate of \$300 to \$600. It was 20.5 inches high by 66 inches wide. A wonderful Cleveland Aztec neon clock that was 26 inches in diameter sold within estimate for \$1,300, and a fabulous early wooden painted “Cat Nap Inn” sign featuring a painted lying cat was won with a \$800 bid.

Advertising pieces were not the only items up for sale at this Forsythe’s event. Selling strong was an early Gen-

dron Packard pedal car that brought \$2,700. This early chain drive pedal car had a wooden radiator on the front which had “Packard” written on it. This was attached to the car’s original metal body and it still retained its original metal crank. A decal on the rear of the car read “Pioneer.”

An unusual garden gnome also sold this day. Usually garden gnomes are tucked in with the flowers, but this example was a hitching post.

Wearing good old paint and standing 43 inches tall, this cutie sold for \$2,600.

Stoneware was also in the mix this day. Stamped twice with “RA & G.B. Weaver Roseville”

a large 6-gallon example sported a lovely blue floral decoration. Measuring \$16.5 inches high, the jar sold for \$1,200.

Very rare indeed was the 19th century oil on board painting of a young

African American girl. What made this work stand out was it being a full-length image. The girl wears a red bandanna and is shown seated peeling apples in a bowl on her lap. Also shown in the image is a mantel holding a pewter plate and jug behind her. A sweet painting, it sold for \$1,600.

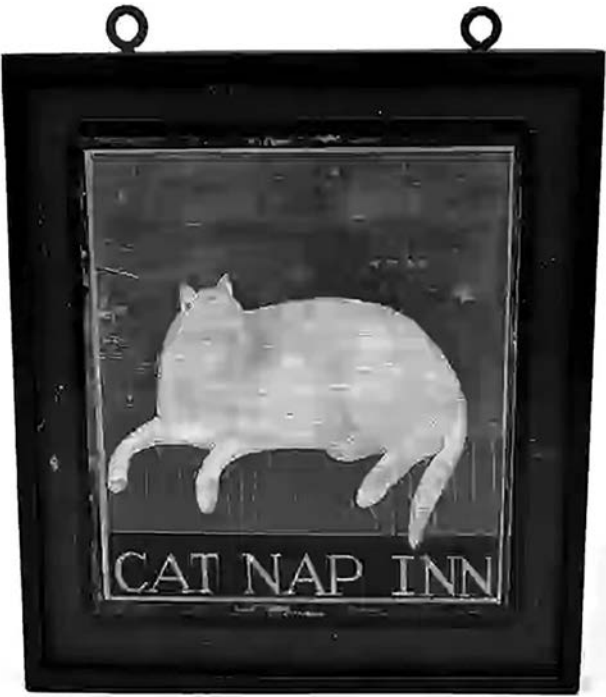
