ACROSS THE AUCTION BLOCK

Skelton lamp lights up Leonard's

OTTAWA LAKE, Mich.—Leonard's Auction Company held its 21st annual two-session New Year's Auction on two different weekends. They sold over 1,000 lots during those two days with a large variety of items put on the auction block.



Bringing some Halloween feel to the auction was a miniature oil lamp. It was a skeleton head and upper chest area. This captivating figural skeleton had bright green eyes that really seemed to bore into anyone looking at it. There was one hand that appeared to be reaching out from the base, while

the teeth made him appear to have something special to smile about. It was made of bisque and brought \$1,440.

A Bradley & Hubbard slag glass panel lamp was a beautiful piece. This lamp had a cream-colored background with gorgeous decoration on top, which was much darker, so it really stood out. It had what appeared to be small fan decoration around the top, with some lacy-looking pieces draping down from that and flowing into the bottom area. It was an electrified

lamp, and the final bid reached \$1,160, a price as impressive as the lamp itself.

Another Bradley & Hubbard lamp was a hanging Victorian lamp, which brought a final bid price of \$430. It had beautiful prisms hanging from both the top and middle areas to catch the light and throw a variety of rainbow colors from the sunshine. It was mostly a dark golden color that made it appear elegant.

Another lamp, made by

Euorpean penny banks save a collector's money

Everyone likes piggy banks, but few people know that a quarter of all piggy banks produced in Europe before World War I came from the Austro-

Hungarian Empire. Before World War I the Austro-Hungarian Empire included Austria, Bohemia, Hungary, and Czechoslovakia.

The problem with identifying where a piggy bank originated when so

many different countries fell under one empire is immense. Some collectors classify a piggy bank's country as Austria while other collectors classify the same piggy bank as being Czechoslovakian. If that is not bad enough, the countries that rose from the breakup of the Austro-Hungarian Empire shared pottery types and designs, so even differentiating 1930s French pottery from Czechoslovakian pottery is sometimes difficult, especially with figural piggy banks or penny banks as they are sometimes called.

A short history of Czechoslovakia helps to explain the country's ceramic problems and why it had a greatly interrupted pottery business in the 20th century. Czechoslovakia is a land-locked country in Central Europe that was created

in 1918 when it declared its independence from the Austro-Hungarian Empire. In 1938, Germany seized Czechoslovakia, and the country ceased to exist. Following World War II, Czechoslovakia was re-established as a nation; however, in 1948 the Communist Party seized power, and from 1948–1989 Czechoslovakia was part of the Eastern Bloc controlled by the Soviet Union. The Soviet Union collapsed in 1989, and Czechoslovakia split into two sovereign states —



Slovakia and the Czech Republic. Two-decade period, vintage Czechoslovakian piggy banks from the 1930s could still be found. The Czech Republic produced many figural piggy banks from 1980–2001. Also during this




the Laurel Lamp Company and marked "1536 MCM," was an impressive piece. It was shaped like a calla lily and cattails, so it was very pretty. It had two calla lily flowers and one cattail sweeping up gracefully from the round base. It was a golden color, which added to the beauty. It sold for \$440.

A Victorian brass and uranium-slag glass floor lamp sold for \$270, while a Miller reverse-painted table lamp brought a final bid of \$285.

Some jewelry pieces were in demand. A pair of 14-carat gold wide-band earrings drove bidding to \$480, making them the top-selling jewelry item in the auction. A pair of 14-carat gold diamond-cut hoop earrings sold for \$225, while a second pair, very similar, sold for \$200. A more contemporary pair, which was

A Harry Bertioa MCM asymmetric chair and footstool. You could see all the way through this matched set as they looked like a mesh material. The asymmetric chaise was designed and prototyped in 1952, but was not mass-produced until 2005. East Greenville, Pennsylvania, remained the main United States production location of the Bertioa chairs for decades. All production of the chairs

was shifted to Verona, Italy, in 1986. This chair and footstool brought a high bid of \$475.

A mahogany carved side table had a lot of detail and sold for \$230. This piece featured herons at the bottom of the legs, skillfully carved. There was fancy leafing forming the center of the leg sections, tying the piece together. This was a wonderfully detailed table with carvings that would make it a conversation piece.

A barrister oak bookcase was popular. This six-stack unit with glass doors had an impressive vintage look. It was in good shape and sold for \$400.

There were two slot machines offered. The highest-selling one was a five-cent slot machine. It was from the 1930s and was made by Caille. It brought a final price of \$400. The second machine was a nickel candy machine. This particular one was a Stoner Univendor candy machine. It sold for \$305.

"The turnout of more than 135 registered in-person bidders proves that auction goers still enjoy the excitement of a live auction and the auctioneer's chant," Heimel said.

An unusual spool cabinet took high honors with a bid of \$3,750. It featured the lettering "Merrick's Spool Cotton." A salesman sample blue stove made by the Qualified Range Co. reached \$1,075.50.

A set of eight Standard Oil bottles marked "Polarine" and rack reached \$880 while a Raymond Guerbe bronze reached \$935.

Heimel said furniture sold well with a triple

door bookcase reaching \$2,090.



everywhere throughout Europe and in America.

One interesting aspect of these early piggy banks is that they did not have stoppers underneath them to shake the money out of. A hard rap of a hammer broke open these piggy banks once they were filled with coins. This system of breaking the banks when full aided potters because once a piggy bank was broken, it had to be replaced with a new bank.

The evolution of the words "piggy bank" is also fascinating. One of the earliest known uses for the word "pig" (circa 1440 AD) is for an earthenware pot or jar. During the Middle Ages, when banks were unheard of, a family who might have some extra money dropped the money into a "pig," the name for a bowl or jar sitting on a shelf, for safekeeping. It wasn't long before a jar

(pig) used to hold money was referred to as a "pig bank." An early English spelling for the word "pig" is "pigge," which equates to "pigge bank" being an earthenware jar to keep money in.

The evolution from "pigge bank" to "piggy bank" happened in 1941 when the Butler Brothers Dry Goods, Home Goods, Toys Catalog advertised "Piggy Banks...flesh

colored composition" for the first time, but no matter how you study the history of piggy banks, the pig bank came centuries before the actual figural piggy bank.

Many of the Czechoslovakian figural piggy banks come from the 1930s and are made of majolica, which is a decorative ceramic technique of painting with glaze materials on top of an opaque, tin-based white glaze. Majolica is a ceramic process first used in the Middle East to imitate Chinese Porcelain. The Moors brought this ceramic process to Spain, and it soon spread throughout Europe. The term

"majolica" is an English variant of the word "maiolica," which is an Italian word describing this ceramic process during the Renaissance period, making majolica an imitation of Italian maiolica.

Majolica is actually two distinct types of pottery. The type used in Czechoslovakia and surrounding countries is a simple process of painting and firing green ware where the colored lead silicate glazes are applied directly to the ware or piggy bank and then fired. This type of majolica results in brightly colored, hard-wearing, inexpensive ceramic ware, which is

exactly what piggy banks are. This type of majolica was first introduced at the Great Exhibition in London in 1851.

Czechoslovakian figural piggy banks often depict the head of a young boy or girl wearing a historically accurate head scarf or hat. A coin slot is in the back of the head.

Hand-painted, Czechoslovakian figural piggy banks have a whimsical, old world charm that collectors' love.

To get started collecting Czechoslovakian figural piggy banks, take your child to any antique store. For the

relatively inexpensive price of around \$50 you can buy a nostalgic Czechoslovakian piggy bank of a young boy or girl, allowing your child to save money and, in the process, become a collector or, at least, an appreciator of early 20th century European pottery.





You can meet the Flintstones via their collectibles

On a chilly November morning in 1959, Midwesterners woke to headlines hinting that the nation's cranberry supply might be poisoned. The warning, unexpected, scientific and fear-soaked, swept across the region faster than a lake effect snowstorm.

Government officials announced that some cranberry fields had been treated with aminotriazole, a weed killer that caused cancer in lab animals. No one could say which berries were safe, and so, in a fit of national uncertainty, the Department of Health, Education and Welfare simply told Americans to stop buying cranberries.

Farmers and producers watched their livelihoods trickle away as grocery bins remained untouched. By December, cranberries were so unpopular that President Dwight Eisenhower skipped them at the White House, eating apple sauce instead. Growers faced their bleakest holiday season ever.

Fortunately for the growers, the scare turned into a long-term

blessing. Previously unaware that cranberries were available in forms other than a jellied cylindrical blob, post-scare Americans learned how to make their own sauces and dozens of other cranberry recipes. Annual consumption has never declined since 1960.

Neither have the number of antique and vintage cranberry collectibles. While some items have achieved prices in the thousands of dollars, plenty of interesting pieces can still be had for a few dollars. A cranber-

ry collection is an ideal accompaniment to other holiday collections or as a collection on its own.

Long before Europeans arrived, Native American tribes in the Northeast and Canada harvested wild cranberries for food, dye and medicine. The Wampanoag and other coastal peoples mixed their dried cranberries with venison and fat to make pemmican, a portable, high-energy staple that kept all winter.

Colonial 17th century settlers adopted cranberries after watching

Indigenous harvesting practices and discovered the berry's natural keeping power. By the turn of the 18th century, Euro-Americans were stewing cranberries with maple sugar or honey to make sauces and relishes.

Serious cranberry cultivation didn't begin until the 1800s, when growers in Massachusetts, New Jersey and Wisconsin learned to manage naturally boggy land and flood it at will. By the Civil War, cranberries were a recognizable American product, tart, durable and increasingly tied to holiday meals.

The late 19th and early 20th centuries brought refrigerated railcars and cooperative marketing groups such



as Wisconsin's American Cranberry Exchange, transforming a regional fruit into a national industry. Cranberries moved from fresh and

dried berries to juices, sauces and concentrates, becoming a year-round commodity rather than a





seasonal curiosity.

To be clear, while historians agree that cranberries were present in 1621, they were almost certainly not as a sweetened sauce. Sugar was scarce and expensive in primitive Plymouth. They were more likely used as a tart element or a thickening agent in stews, relishes or pemmican, meaning the berry was at the first Thanksgiving, just not yet in its holiday form.

Although cranberries historically are associated with the Northeast, Wisconsin's glacial marshes and sandy, acidic soils were perfect for large-scale cranberry cultivation, allowing growers to expand production far beyond what Massachusetts' small coastal bogs could sustain. Wisconsin produced more than half of all cranberries grown in the United States in the 21st century and is the source of most berries on Midwestern holiday tables.

With a coastal-sounding name, Ocean Spray began in 1930 when several Massachusetts cranberry growers joined forces to stabilize prices and market their fruit cooperatively. Fellow grower Marcus Urann had invented canned cranberry sauce in a can in 1912. The cooperative gave growers the collective muscle to sell cranberry sauce nationwide

rather than bog-by-bog.

Ocean Spray expanded aggressively during the rest of the 20th century, adding juice production, frozen fruit, candy and research into cranberry hybrids that improved yield and flavor. In the process the cooperative transformed cranberries from a regional New England crop into an everyday American commodity, even surviving the near-catastrophic 1959 scare.

A variety of early cranberry growing implements have become prized by cranberry collectors. An early 20th-century wooden sifter box, used to clean, size and sort wet harvested berries and with the name of Massachusetts agitourism pioneer Ellis D. Atwood stamped on its handle was priced at \$1,200. More generic wood and metal sifters, some dating to the 19th century, sold for between \$400 and \$900. Since the harvesters were used in water, condition is of primary concern among surviving examples.

Cranberries have always been sorted by

bouncing them. Berries that didn't bounce high enough were considered soft or damaged. Modern day separators use rollers but old fashioned packing house sorting tables or "bounce boards" were gravity-driven. Prized and collected, examples sell for \$200 to \$1,200 or more depending on condition.

To allow workers and horses to walk on the soft, mucky surface of a cranberry bog, so-called cranberry bog shoes were used. They were wide, flat wooden or metal attachments worn over regular boots or attached to a horseshoe, similar to snowshoes.

Originating in the mid-19th century in Massachusetts and New Jersey, few agricultural occupations beyond cranberry harvesting required specialized footwear, making the shoes a unique piece of agricultural history. As such, antique wooden examples sell for \$100 up to \$600 depending on condition.

As mid-19th century transportation improved, cranberry growers used woven wood baskets, barrels and burlap bags to ship their produce. Although they were easier to transport than oranges and apples, cranberry growers switched to the same kind of wooden crates by the late 19th century and cranberry crates became standard until the 1950s.

While the bags and baskets don't seem to exist anymore, old surviving barrels, some dating to the late 19th century

tury, sell for \$50 to \$200 or more for rare examples. Crates sold online for \$40 up to \$300 for boxes in good shape and with interesting graphics.

Like oranges and apples, stenciled names on the crates gave way to more colorful lithographed labels as well.

The Wisconsin-based American Cranberry Exchange marketed the state's fruit under an "Eatmor" label beginning in 1916, advertising in various women's magazines. To distinguish their state of origin, Wisconsin growers often used red labels, New Jersey yellow and Massachusetts blue with pilgrim or Thanksgiving themes.

Like most other 20th-century fruit labels, stand-alone cranberry labels sell for \$10 to \$50 apiece in the 21st century depending on grower and location. Attached to an antique or vintage crate, prices crossed over \$100 and more related to a crates's condition. A rare early 20th-century cranberry crate stencil from New York's Fulton Market sold on eBay for \$625.

Ocean Spray introduced its version of canned strained cranberry sauce in 1930. Surviving empty cans sell for \$50 to \$100. The cooperative canned whole, unstrained cranberries and a canned

version of cranberry orange relish. Ocean Spray also sold more decorative glass strained cranberry sauce jelly molds in the 1960s and 1970s for consumers who wanted something more decorative than a traditional canned cranberry blob.

Ocean Spray began selling bottled cranberry juice "cocktail", a special mixture that contained only 27-30 percent juice, in 1945. In a mid-century era of sweet juices like orange, the very tart cranberry juice cocktail caught on less as a breakfast drink and more as a drink mixer with vodka, creating a visually appealing, fruity drink called a "Cape Codder."

To many 21st-century Americans, the traditional cranberry sauce blob, the ridged straight from the can cylinder, was a powerful reminder of childhood and family holidays. For others, the same rubbery canned sauce was a major culinary faux pas, condemned for being too Jell-O-like and lacking the taste of whole fresh berries.

Regardless, vintage collectible glass and ceramic dishes, like the modern-day Mud Pie "can-berry" server, were shaped and textured to nestle a ridged-can cylinder of cranberry sauce and often came with a matching server/spatula.

Many glass manufacturers, like Anchor Hocking's vintage Wexford pattern and Avon's retro Cape Cod Collection, produced cranberry colored or clear glass plates specifically marketed as "cranberry dishes". These often came in two-piece sets with a matching wide silver-plated spoon and sold for less than \$60 with spoon or \$25 without.

Rare Victorian-era condiment sets often featured multiple small, clear or cranberry-colored glass cruets and shakers for various condiments, including cranberry relishes, and were housed in elaborate silver-plated frames. Sterling silver sets have sold for as much as \$5,000, silver-plated sets for up to \$300 and cranberry glass sets from \$150 to \$1,000.

Antique sterling silver versions, especially those from high-end manufacturers, commanded higher prices. Tiffany's "Vine" pattern, featuring naturalistic leaves and vines, and its late 19th-century "Saratoga" pattern were often sought after, particularly their rare cranberry servers.

One of the most popular sterling flatware patterns of all time, Gorham's "Chantilly", was known for its elegant rococo scrolls and flourishes. A smaller sauce or cranberry server in this classic pattern, especially if it is an early or well-preserved example, could be sold for \$69 to more than \$400 depending on condition.

Despite the devastating shadow cast by the 1959 pesticide scare, the cranberry industry proved the fruit's safety and nutritional value to a wary public. The crisis also spurred innovation and stricter quality standards, leading to the lasting success enjoyed by Ocean Spray and growers who continue their abundant harvest today. The festive crimson of the cranberry will continue to grace American tables for end of the year holidays to come.
