ACROSS THE AUCTION BLOCK

Sohio globe pumped an \$800 bid

GRAND RAPIDS, Ohio — The prices kept ticking up as clocks were sold at a recent Whalen auction. A surprising item at the top of this category was a

clock originally from Virginia. This round, neon clock measured 30 inches, lit up, and ran when tested prior to the auction. It said “Bank of Virginia Danville” around the outside. The white lettering stood out

against the dark blue background. This was surrounded by a white circle enclosing the clock. The clock itself was black in the center with white numbers and hands. It sold for \$750.

A neon Folgers coffee clock did light up and run but it was dim. It measured 18 inches around and brought a high bid of \$450. An onyx-based clock also sported an ashtray and a lighter. This piece was very elegant looking. The clock took center stage, perched at the top of the piece, with the ashtray and lighter below. It sold for \$425. An onyx-based light stand

featuring an airplane appeared to fly at the top. Lit up, it complemented the clock and lighter, and sold for \$400.

A Hubley cast-iron airplane was in good condition for its age. It said “America” on the wings in red and had some red stars on the edge of the wings and the tail. It measured 17 by 15 inches and sold for \$550. A Line Mar mechanical Minnie Mouse toy sold for \$325. It had Minnie sitting in a

clock originally from Virginia. This round, neon clock measured 30 inches, lit up, and ran when tested prior to the auction. It said “Bank of Virginia Danville” around the outside. The white lettering stood out against the dark blue background. This was surrounded by a white circle enclosing the clock. The clock itself was black in the center with white numbers and hands. It sold for \$750.

Collectors jump for joy over Jack

One of the oldest known children's toys that are still manufactured today is the Jack-in-the-Box. A

Jack-in-the-Box is a spring-loaded children's toy that plays music, has a crank, and has a puppet inside the box. When the crank is turned, music is produced, traditionally “Pop Goes the Weasel.”

Towards the end of the song, where the lyric “POP” would go, a latch is released and a spring-loaded puppet is propelled out of the box. Traditionally, the puppet is a clown or jester;

although, the original, historic puppet was a devil.

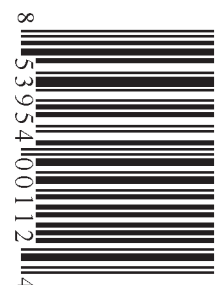
Most toy historians believe that the idea for a Jack-in-the-Box toy dates to 13th century England when Sir John Schorne, according to English folklore, cast the devil into one of his boots in order to protect the town of North Marston in Buckinghamshire from demonic possession. Drawings of Sir John often depict him holding a boot with a devil head popping out of it. This early history of Jack-in-

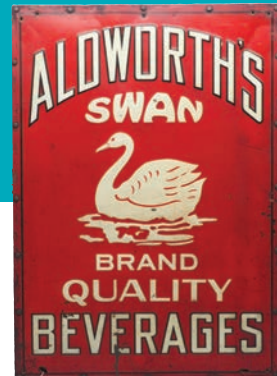

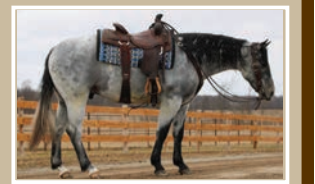

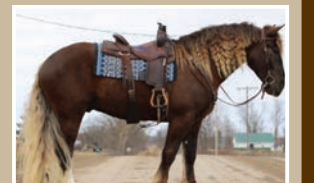

toy chair. It came with the original box, but was missing a cloth on one side. The bright yellow of the chair contrasted with the red of Minnie's dress and shoes. Minnie would rock in the chair while knitting. She was still holding her knitting needles.

A miniature toy display advertising peanuts measured 20 by 12 inches. It sold for \$400. It had a small carousel at the bottom, visible but protected by a clear plastic enclosure. "Lift the big top and get 'em hot" was written across the top of the toy. It had the animal trainers around the entire toy, and the brilliant red and blue colors would have attracted anyone.

Signs took over the auction with some top prices. A Ford sign measured 39 by 25 inches. This was a simple sign that said "Ford" in the center of a white oval, surrounded by a dark blue border. It had some paint scrapes, but it didn't seem to bother the bidders much. One had to dig into the wallet for a total of \$750 to take this

advertising piece home. Pennzoil was the next company to take the spotlight at the auction. This sign measured 60 by 12 inches and was a bit unusual because it was vertical. It showed off the usual red and yellow colors associated with Pennzoil. It said "Thrilling, Falls City Beer" and seemed the fisherman was still trying to pull in the fish. It was in a nice wooden frame and sold for \$500. A P & H porcelain sign sold for \$500. It represented Pawling and Harnischfeger, manufacturers of industrial cranes and excavators, founded in the 1880s. The sign displayed a large P & H on a dark blue background and measured 20 by 48 inches.

A Uniroyal sign was probably the biggest offered for sale. It came in

six sections and measured an impressive 27 by 3 feet when assembled. It showed some signs of wear, but that just added to the vintage look. It sold for \$600.

A Falls City Beer sign showed a fisherman with a fish on his hook. It said "Thrilling, Falls City Beer" and seemed the fisherman was still trying to pull in the fish. It was in a nice wooden frame and sold for \$500. A P & H porcelain sign sold for \$500. It represented Pawling and Harnischfeger, manufacturers of industrial cranes and excavators, founded in the 1880s. The sign displayed a large P & H on a dark blue background and measured 20 by 48 inches.

There were two DeKalb flying ear signs: a 6-foot white Masonite sign sold for \$500, and a double-sided plywood sign measuring 5 feet by 32 inches sold for \$325.

A Sohio X-tane glass gas pump globe was very popular. With black bold lettering on a white background, one couldn't miss that it was Sohio X-tane. It had red at the top and bottom of the globe, which enhanced the graphics. It sold for \$800.

A second glass globe was definitely a thing of the past, as it came from a Bell System public telephone booth. It measured 12 inches around and said "Public Telephone" around the outside curvature. The white interior background featured a bell, indicating it was a Bell telephone. It sold for \$700.

And a one-of-a-kind sports car kit brought a

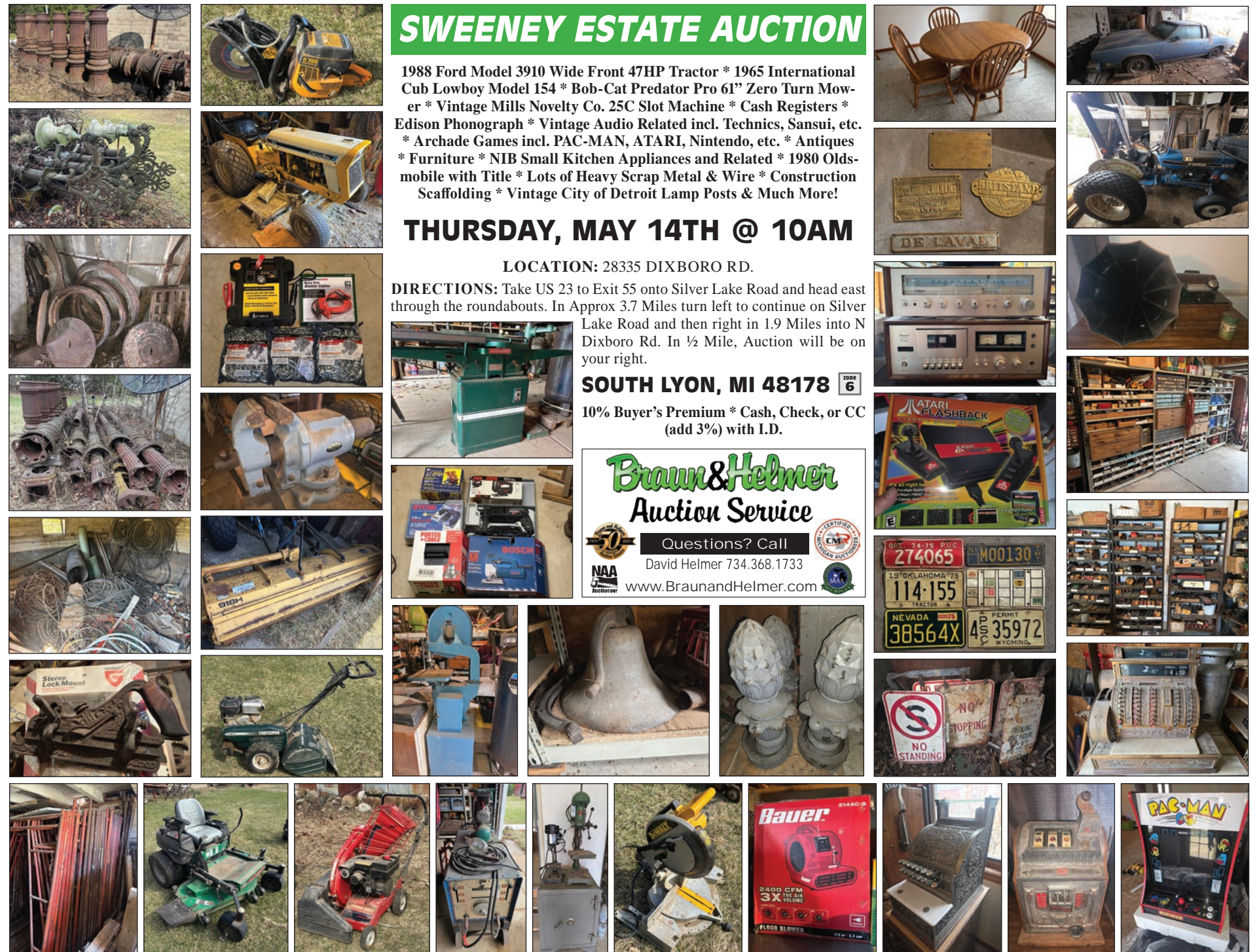

Jack in Box

the-Box explains why a Jack-in-the-Box in France is called a diable en boîte, which is literally translated as "boxed devil."

History cannot pinpoint when the first Jack-in-the-Box was made; however, clockwork-type toys have been made since the early Greek and Roman times. Toy historians date the first modern Jack-in-the-Box to the mid 1400s in Nuremberg, Germany.

The Nuremberg Toy Museum documents that the earliest known Jack-in-the-Box was made by a German clock maker in the early 1500s as a gift for the son of a prince. This Jack-in-the-Box was a plain wooden box with a crank that played a simple tune. The "Jack" was a comical-looking devil with a "leering smile." Soon after this box was made, other rich noblemen requested Jack-in-the-Boxes for their own children. And Jack-in-the-Boxes have never been out of production since.

Around 1600, jesters began replacing devils as the 'Jack' inside a Jack-in-the-Box. Jestors still remain the traditional "Jack," but clowns, nursery rhyme characters, Disney characters, ninjas, bears, dragons, and even politicians have been used as "Jacks" inside Jack-in-the-Boxes. And while "Pop Goes the Weasel" is still the traditional music for a Jack-in-the-Box, many other tunes have been used, including "Mary Had a Little Lamb."

Many people have debated the origin of the name "Jack-in-the-Box." "Jack" is considered a slang term for "everyman," so the jester popping out of the box could represent the mass of desperate men. Another theory states that "Jack" is a reference to the devil, so a Jack-in-the-Box is literally a devil in a box, which fits with the French

name.

The English, during the 16th and 17th centuries called a Jack-in-the-Box a "Punch-box," basing the name on the popular English puppet Punch from Punch and Judy puppet shows. With his white painted face, Punch does look like a traditional "Jack."

Whether you call them Jack-in-the-Boxes, devil boxes, or Punch-boxes, Jack-in-the-Boxes are still popular toys with children and have become highly sought after nostalgic collectibles in the last half of the 20 century.

Early Jack-in-the-Boxes were made of wood and had Jacks made of wood or papier-mâché. These earliest Jack-in-the-Boxes were heavily played with, and most did not survive, so collectors hunt far and wide to find a wooden Jack-in-the-Box at auction and often pay dearly to own one.

The 1930s produced many highly sought after Jack-in-the-Boxes. These boxes were made of tin and were lithographed with images from nursery rhymes, Disney, or other popular cartoon characters.

Today, Fisher Price, Ideal, Mattel, and Hasbro are just a few of the companies still producing Jack-in-the-Boxes.

Jack-in-the-Boxes have remained popular children's toys for nearly 600 years. The Encyclopedia of American Folk Art credits "the element of surprise" for Jack-in-the-Boxes continued appeal. Children of all ages love

to turn the crank, anticipating the flutter of excitement when Jack jumps out of his box, which is why, in any antique store, you will find adult children still playing with Jack-in-the-Boxes.

Harris Strong tiles still brighten the walls of homes

Before Harris G. Strong, 1950s wall décor was just an afterthought. The innovative designer's framed ceramic tiles essentially created the market for decorative wall hangings. "I was the first person to show them," recalled Strong. "Previously, furniture stores would say 'I only buy lamps — they go with the sofa.' We'd say, 'these will go, too.' And they did. Years later, over 50 percent of the exhibitors in New York's lamp building were showing wall décor."

Strong was born in Waukesha, Wis., in 1920. Early artistic influences included legendary carnival artist "Snap" Wyatt, who patronized the Strong family diner, and gave Harris art lessons in exchange for meals. "He did the weirdest things," noted Strong, "like side-show paintings of 'The Snake Lady.' Not really 'The Snake Lady' you'd find inside, but what you thought she should look like."

More lasting was the influence of his artist aunt, 'Brownie,' who ran a greeting card company. Said Strong, "she had a little place in the village — 'Brownie's Block Prints' — and I used to go there. Well, I just got the idea that this was what I wanted to do — not to make greeting cards, but to be an artist. So I drew a lot."

Strong later enrolled at North Carolina State, studying ceramic engineering. "That way," he said, "I could always do engineering. It was the Depression, and your education was your meal ticket. But my hope was that I could start making pottery — manufacture it, not just 'play

with it."

After service in World War II and completion of his college degree, Strong moved to New York in 1946, and was associated with the Brooklyn pottery, Kelby Originals. After a year, Strong and co-worker Robert Krasner left to found their own firm, Pottery of Wall Street. "Basically," said Strong, "we made ceramic lamps, ashtrays, and small wares. I did all the glaze chemistry."

After dissolving the partnership in 1951, Strong set up a pottery for American Art Industries, devising all glazes and casting techniques. It was during this brief period that the ceramic tiles for which he would achieve his greatest acclaim made their debut — as an experimental by-product.

"There were not enough hours in the day to work on glazes, and I loved to work,

so eventually I bought myself a little home kiln — I could fire seven tiles in it. I'd come home after work, and go down in the basement where I had this little thing. Well, I didn't want to do casting and mess up the whole house, so I bought tiles — eight cents apiece in those days — and I worked out all my glazes with those. I couldn't see throwing those glazes away, so I'd keep them. When I got my results

back, I'd say 'oh this is nice,' and then I did designs on them. We used them for trivets.

"One of my former accounts was an outfit called 'Lampland.' Their representative came out to dinner one night, saw the tile trivets and said, 'my God, these are beautiful — I could sell these things. How much do you want for them?' I said, 'they're just tiles — they're nothing. A buck apiece. I only paid eight cents for them.' I had two hundred tiles, so he

gave me \$200 cash. This was in 1951 — it was like finding money in the street!

“He called me up two weeks later and said ‘I sold all of those — I want some more. And if you put frames on them, we could really do a big job.’ So we added frames, and he kept selling them like crazy.”

The novelty of Strong’s tiles appealed to the buying public, and initial success led, in 1952, to the establishment of Strong’s own firm, Harris G. Strong, Inc. Located in the Bronx, the company began with a staff of four, with Strong doing all glaze chemistry. From single framed tiles, Strong moved on to tile groupings, and eventually complete tile “paintings” — scenes and portraits comprised of multiple tiles. Subjects covered a wide range — among them, landscapes, urban settings, fanciful abstracts, Etruscan nobility, harlequins, and knights-in-armor. The vivid colors and rich detail-



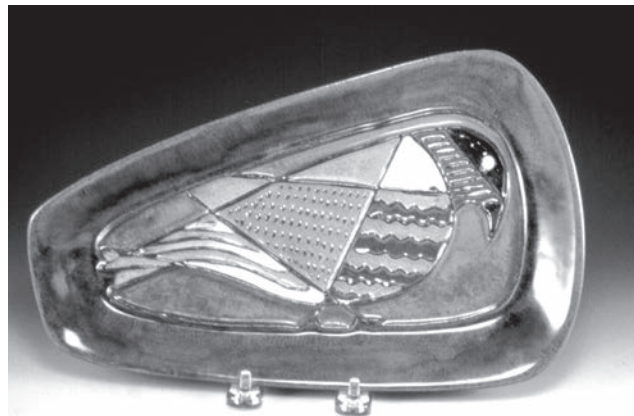
Above: “Nightscape” framed tile. 10-3/4” square, \$150-175.

ing of the ceramic wall hangings helped brighten often-stark ’50s-modern decorating schemes, “People thought they were colorful and very well done,” said Strong. “I had some really fantastic artists working for me. The quality of the designs was excellent and the price was low: originally they retailed for \$6 per tile!”

Strong’s tile scenes,

framed or mounted on burnished wood backings, proved popular with architects, interior decorators, and consumers seeking contemporary wall art at affordable prices. Hallmarks of a Strong work are vibrant color combinations, the three-dimensionality of the figures and scenes depicted, and specificity of detail.

The sheer size of larger

Strong pieces made them ideal for wall accents in hotels, office lobbies, restaurants, and other public spaces where arresting visual focal points were needed to break up vast expanses of wall, or to contrast with minimalist modern furnishings. Strong proved adept at adapting his work to the needs of almost every locale. Among the most unusual were ship’s lounges, office facades, elevators, and even bowling alleys.

A healthy balance between practicality and creativity best character-

izes Harris Strong; his art was also his livelihood. When asked about sources of inspiration, Strong replied, “I’d look at the calendar and say ‘I’ve got six weeks before market! I’d better damn well start designing something!’ That first design you get out can be very difficult, but while you’re working on it, you get more ideas in your head, because now you’re focused. You can’t wait to finish one and start the next!”

Because paper labels were generally used on the back of Strong plaques, rather than signatures on the tiles themselves, attribution over the years has often been haphazard. In fact, Harris Strong has become so identified with decorative tile, that even unsigned tiles of the 1950s and ’60s are often credited to him, even when the styles are markedly dissimilar. In the absence of a label, reliable indicators of a genuine Strong tile plaque are its distinctive heart-shaped hooks for hanging.

Although tiles were the cornerstone of Strong’s early success, the company eventually phased out tile production. “Two things happened,” Strong said. “First, we reached a plateau where we were doing about all the business we could in tiles, and I wanted to expand. We

came up with the idea of doing multiple paintings, and just couldn’t make them fast enough. So we raised the price — and sold more!

In 1970 Harris G. Strong, Inc. relocated to Maine. The firm closed in 1999, and Strong filled his active retirement with private design, stamp collecting, travel, and following with curiosity the popularity of his early work on the secondary market. “It’s like serendipity, finding something you weren’t looking for. You have no idea what it does for your ego! People always say ‘weren’t you clever!’ I wasn’t clever — it was just the way I could sell. Like I always say, I was standing on the right street corner when the bus came by.”

Chicago button supporting McGovern could play a \$6,000 tune

Thanks to the many readers of AntiqueWeek for continuing to reach out to me about their campaign memorabilia finds and questions! In this column we will try to catch up on the old mailbag.

Q: In 1972 the band Chicago issued a button supporting the can-

didacy of George McGovern for President. I have one in very good condition. Is it selling for much these days? — H.W.

A: Absolutely! The rock

group Chicago's benefit concert for George McGovern in San Francisco in May of 1972 may not be remembered by many, but the creation of this fantastic 2½-inch celluloid pin-back campaign button is memorable in of itself. One sold in the last year in a mail order auction for a most impressive \$6,000!

Q: I've been told that you're a Willkie specialist. I recently purchased a 1¼ inch Willkie CHEMURGY pin which has led me to wonder whether it was ever reproduced. Would you please provide me with the benefit of your knowledge on the matter? — J.K.

A: You've come to the right place! I have been collecting the 1940 campaign of Wendell Willkie for over 40 years now. It is amazing that I still find previously unknown buttons and items every year. However, I am very familiar with the Chemurgy button you referenced. "Chemurgy is a branch of applied chemistry concerned with preparing industrial products from agricultural raw materials. The concept developed by the early years of the 20th century," according to Wikipedia. The concept became an issue during the 1940 FDR Roosevelt v. Willkie campaign, resulting in the production of this neat little 1¼ inch celluloid pin-back button. It has never been reproduced to my knowledge and frequently sells today in the \$250 range.

Q: I have a question for you about cam-

paigned buttons with a copyright mark on them. Are they authentic or reproductions? I have a feeling that they were made after the campaign. Any feedback would be helpful. — B.Z.

A: Thanks for asking. The existence or non-existence of a copyright mark on the edge or back of a political button (or any kind of pin-back button for that matter) has been a matter of concern for collectors for years. I can tell you most definitely that a copyright mark on an item does not necessarily indicate an item's authenticity either way. It only in-

dicated if the design or subject of the button has registered copyright protection or not.

Q: I recently inherited an extensive accumulation of White House Christmas cards and gifts dating back to 1929 including FDR, Ike, Kennedy and others. Do political collectors find these to be of much value? — R.F.

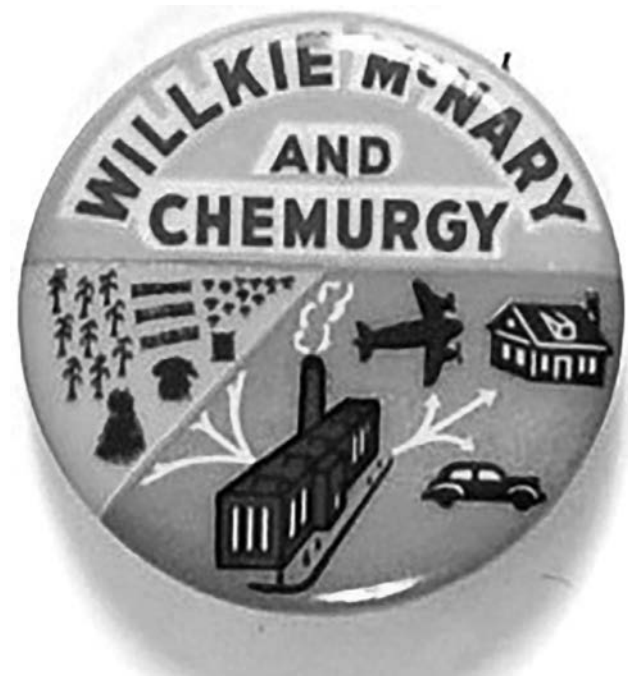
A: Everyone has their favorite types of items to collect. Some folks collect specific candidates and seek buttons, signs, badges, books, Christmas cards and anything they can find attached to their favorite campaign. White House Christmas Cards run from \$20 to several hundred dollars depending on the desirability, condition and number produced. One of my personal favorites is the 1962 Kennedy White House card. A horse and sleigh help create a peaceful image on the front and the inside features the presidential seal and Christmas greetings from the Kennedys with copies of their signatures. Hard to find, the card can command over \$300 when found.

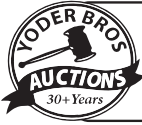

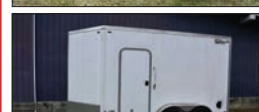
