ACROSS THE AUCTION BLOCK

Deere zero-turn mower rounded up a \$2,750 bid

GLADWIN, Mich. — Collectors, outdoorsmen, and equipment buyers all found something of interest at the May 13 Greaves family auction hosted by John Peck Auctions. The eclectic 326-lot event was

held both on-site in Gladwin and online. Highlights included a Honda Super 90 motorcycle, a John Deere zero-turn mower, snowmobiles, deer blinds, restoration bikes, antiques, primitives, tools, and farm-related items.

The sale opened strong

in the farm and yard equipment, where a John Deere Z445 zero-turn mower with 469 hours, 25 hp Kawasaki engine, and 54-inch deck led the day at \$2,750. Other equipment followed steady bidding, including an 8-foot driveway grader/leveler with a 3-point hitch that reached \$1,574, a 6-foot Bush Hog Razorback brush hog at \$1,250, and a 10-foot pull-behind cultipacker that finished at \$810.

The outdoor and recreational equipment continued into the sport vehicle category, led by a 2009 Arctic Cat Z1 snowmobile

with a 1,100cc four-stroke engine, electric start, and studded track, which sold for \$1,775. A 1997 Arctic Cat ZL440 snowmobile, described as running but in need of work, brought \$310. Doing better was a three-place snowmobile trailer with a ramp and

new deck, which made it to \$1,375.

Interest continued into two-wheeled machinery, led by a restored 1968 Honda Super 90 motorcycle with title that bid to \$1,550. Restored approximately 10 years ago and stored indoors, it retained

many original components, including the seat and repainted tank. Other motorcycles included a Suzuki 125 Enduro dirt bike with title, manual, and key at \$860, and a titled Kawasaki 125

Red Wing had many names but collectors love them all

German immigrant John Paul founded the Red Wing Stoneware Company in Red Wing,

Minn., in 1861. He is said to have found a large deposit of clay beds near Hay Creek. He built a small railroad line between Hay Creek and Red Wing to carry clay to his factory.

Red Wing pottery refers to the pottery company Paul started; however, the company name of his pottery changed several times over the years. The company finally selected Red Wing Potteries, Inc. as its permanent name in 1936.

A quick field test for Red Wing pottery is to look for the maker's mark on the pottery. Red Wing

used two maker's marks—a maple leaf and a wing. Most Red Wing pottery has one of these marks on it, but some Red Wing pottery was unmarked, causing problems with identifying the pottery. Experts in Red Wing pottery, who know the characteristics of Red Wing, such as salt glaze, white glaze, or brown slip, are usually needed to identify unmarked pieces.

The complete history of the names Red Wing pottery operated under is long, but it is important for any collector who wants to search for and purchase Red Wing pottery, regardless of its name.

John Paul produced Red Wing pottery until 1863, but at the height of the American Civil War,

William Philleo took over pottery production under the name Red Wing Cotta Works. Philleo changed Paul's pottery production recipe by adding silica sand to the natural red clay. The silica served as a filler material in the clay, providing strength and reducing shrinkage.

From 1880–1906, the company was known as the Minnesota Stoneware Company. It was an offshoot company of Red Wing Terra Cotta Works, and it produced salt-glazed pottery

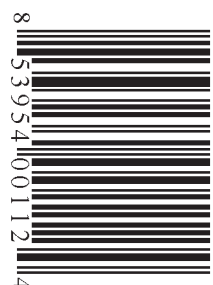
During the same period, the Red Wing Stoneware Company operated from 1877-1906.

Then, in 1906 the Red Wing Union Stoneware Company merged all of the offshoot companies

Enduro dirt bike, bringing \$760.

Additional off-road and recreational vehicles included a 1986 Honda TRX200SX all-terrain vehicle with newer tires but not currently running, which reached \$1,350. Bids went to \$540 on a two-seater go-kart sold as-is with a motor setup.

Shifting to watercraft, boating items were led by a Mercury 9.9 HP four-stroke outboard motor with tank, described as like-new with minimal use and stored indoors, which went for \$1,500. A Yamaha 2.5 HP four-stroke outboard, also stored indoors and running, brought \$400. A pair of Pamlico two-person kayaks got \$320, while a 16-foot flatback Michi-Craft aluminum canoe in good condition hit \$290, and a Sun

Dolphin two-person paddle boat finished at \$110. A pair of Carlisle paddles rounded out the group at \$61.

Among the most heavily represented categories was hunting and sportsman equipment, led by a new 6 by 6-foot octagon deer blind featuring a camo steel exterior, insulated construction, RV access door, spray-foamed blacked-out interior, and Deer View tinted win-

dows, which took second-high honors at \$2,000.

The firearms-related offerings continued with more than three dozen lots of ammunition, selling from \$3 for a carton of 12 rounds Speer .480 Ruger to \$52 for 30 rounds Winchester Super-X .410 slugs. Scopes also drew eyes, with a Lyman Alaskan scope going for \$110, a Weaver K-2500-B for \$78, and Weaver V7 and Weaver K-25 models, each bringing \$67.

Another strong area of interest was collectible knives, with nearly a dozen offered. The group was led by a Marbles bone-handle knife with sheath that brought \$150, followed by a Marbles No. 005 pocket axe with box at \$120.

The sporting goods offerings featured several vintage items, including three pairs of wooden snowshoes (two Lund), which sold for \$49, \$50, and \$120, with the Lund pairs drawing the stronger bids. A set of 17 #110 Conibear traps and hide stretchers scored \$66, while a trio of old Coleman stoves finished at \$20.

Antiques followed, beginning with eight lots of vintage cast iron cook-

ware. A 14-inch skillet led at \$87, followed by a 10.5-inch skillet and a lot with two 6.5-inch skillets, each hammering at \$50. A Wagner Ware 9-inch "O" 1401C pan realized \$48.

Antique crocks came next, with two pieces each landing \$51: a Robinson Ransbottom 10-gallon crock and an 8-gallon example. A 20-gallon Western Stoneware crock with a crack followed at \$46, while a 5-gallon unmarked stoneware jug closed the offerings at \$25.

Advertising and petroliana collectors also had plenty to pursue, with nearly a dozen mixed lots offered. A grouping of two dozen cans featuring Meritine, Union Leader Tobacco, and White House Coffee hit \$61. An oil-related lot with a dozen examples, including Sapphire and Quaker State, sold for \$40. Smaller mixed oil lots brought \$25 or less, while a 12-piece license plate grouping got \$67.

One of the more unusual offerings in the middle of the sale was a matched pair of antique Jamesway barn cupolas measuring approximately 4.5 feet wide by 7 feet tall, which sold for \$420, reflecting the wide-ranging mix that carried through the entire event.

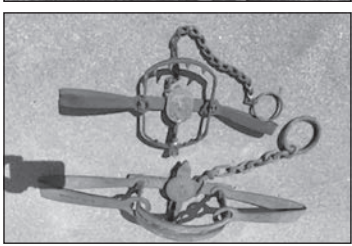

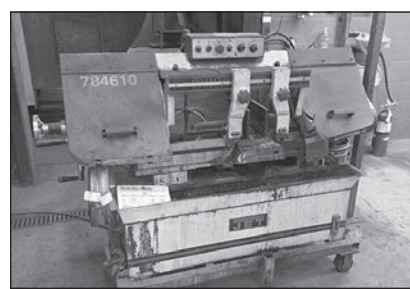
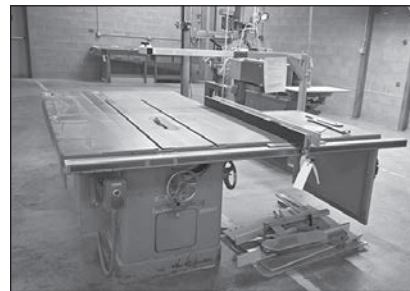

under one name—Red Wing Union Stoneware Company. This company continued producing Red Wing pottery until 1936. Included in this merger were the Red Wing Terra Cotta Works, the Red Wing Stoneware Company, and the Union Stoneware Company that produced from 1894-1906. In 1926, the Red Wing Union Stoneware Company began producing Art Pottery. The first Art Pottery produced by the company was Brushed Ware, and for the first time in the company's history, every piece was marked with ink stamped numbers.

In 1936, the company changed names once again, taking Red Wing Potteries, Inc. as its final name. This name lasted until 1967 when the pottery officially closed.

During the 1930s, Red Wing changed the clay used for its pottery, importing a finer-bodied clay.

Today, collectors like most Red Wing pottery, regardless of which company made it and when

it was made. Some of Red Wing's art pottery is especially sought. Red Wing produced RumRill Art Pottery for George RumRill from 1933-1937. RumRill did not have a pottery, but he was an art pottery designer and salesman, so he contracted with Red Wing to make his art pottery. Beginning in 1938, RumRill was made by other potteries.

In 1938, after seeing the interest in RumRill art pottery, Red Wing began producing art pottery under its own name and trademark. Many of Red Wing's art pottery pieces, however, were nothing more than remarked RumRill shapes and designs.

Since the 1870s, Red Wing has produced utilitarian stoneware pieces. By the 1930s, the company produced a fine line of dinnerware, which helped boost sales as refrigeration cut into the need for household stoneware.

Red Wing dinnerware is brightly colored, and later pieces were hand painted, and much later some of the pieces were stenciled. Red Wing monitored its dinnerware sales closely, so non-performing dinnerware lines were quickly dropped, making some of these pieces quite rare today. Red Wing also produced special-order dinnerware for other companies and restaurants, such as Diamond Jim's and Sweden House.

Many collectors consider the year 1967 the end of Red Wing Potteries, Inc. However, Richard Gillmer, the last president of Red Wing Potteries, purchased the company out of liquidation and reopened as Red Wing Pottery. Gillmer continued the company, primarily as a retail business, until 1996 when a third generation of his family began producing Red Wing pottery once

again.

In 2013, Bruce and Irene Johnson acquired the company and renamed it simply Red Wing. In August 2019 Red Wing pottery ceased production.

Tiki lovers proved to be much harder than Mother Nature

CUYAHOGA FALLS, Ohio — Since 2017, Tiki Underground, the Polynesian-inspired bar near Akron, Ohio, has drawn collectors, vintage lovers, and tropical enthusiasts to its popular Tiki Flea. Over that decade, the outdoor market seemed blessed with flawless weather — until May 16, when Mother Nature finally decided to crash the party with an unexpected downpour.

Despite the sometimes heavy rain and gusty winds that started almost immediately, most vendors stayed put, determined to ride out the storm. Shoppers proved just as dedicated. Umbrellas in hand, many continued strolling the aisles, browsing booths that were often shielded beneath makeshift tarps. Fortunately, the skies finally cleared around 2 p.m., and the remainder of the event carried on at full strength.

The strong turnout served as a reminder of the loyal following Tiki Underground has built over the years. The business started in 2017, inspired by co-owner Sean Coffey's passion for tiki culture and his elaborate basement bar. With help from his wife, Jessie,

along with friends and colleagues, Coffey opened the original Tiki Underground (TU) near Hudson that year. As the lease on the first location neared its end, Coffey learned of an available space in downtown Cuyahoga Falls, a growing tourist destination in the midst of major redevelopment. Just months later, in September 2023, the new Tiki Underground opened its doors - and business has been booming ever since.

During the Flea, the street beside the bar was closed to traffic and transformed into a pedestrian-friendly marketplace filled with more than 20 vintage vendors, including a mobile boutique. Guests could browse for retro treasures and modern Polynesian art, while enjoying tiki cocktails, Pacific-inspired food, and a full slate of entertainment.

The vendors and artists represented a slice of the tiki and vintage community, with many specializing in Polynesian Pop collectibles and décor, and others showcasing original tiki-inspired artwork. More than half were returning vendors, including Old Wahine Wares, whose collection of mid-century

Hawaiiana, clothing, and collectibles helped inspire the first Tiki Flea in 2017. Another longtimer was

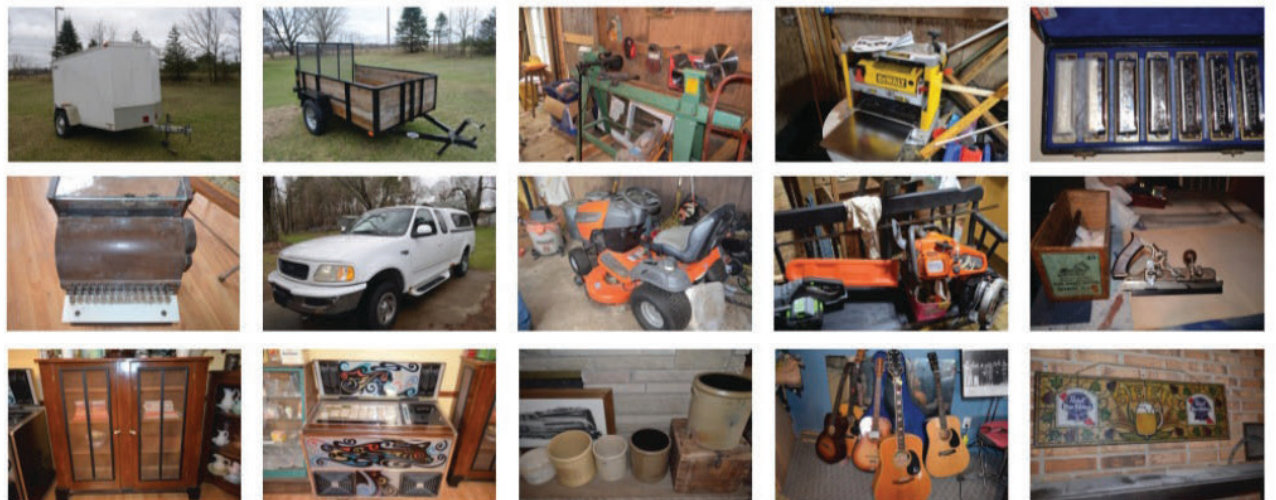

Ohio Tiki Nuts, known for an enormous selection of aloha shirts and tiki mugs, and the swizzle-stick swap events they organize. Arriving from Michigan, Colonel Coconut offered a blend of vintage tiki finds and original artwork, while Chicago artist Kymm! Bang brought everything from custom swizzle sticks to newly produced Zombie glasses.

Five vendors made their Tiki Flea debut this year, bringing fresh vintage finds and origi-

nal creations. Among them was Great Lakes VNTG, an estate auction company that came with a host of recent picks, and Travel Through Time Vintage Bus, a mobile vintage boutique specializing in clothing and décor from the 1930s through the 1990s. Their retrofitted bus-turned-store proved especially popular once the rain began. New artists also joined the lineup, including Cleveland Firebrush, whose wood-burned creations captured tiki and Disney-inspired themes, and Michigan-based Tropical Drey, who showcased custom-printed tiki

mugs, swizzle sticks, and other tropical-themed creations.

Returning for the second time was Gay Fad Studios, the revived glassware company originally founded by pioneering entrepreneur Fran Taylor. From 1939 to 1962, Gay Fad was one of America's leading decorative glassmakers, known for its hand-painted barware and atomic-era designs. The brand was resurrected by Jason Anney and David Anney, who continue to offer surviving pieces of Taylor's original merchandise alongside newly produced cocktail glasses inspired

by the company's mid-century designs. At this year's Flea, they introduced "Tikitomic," their first tiki-themed collection, featuring vibrant hand-painted cocktail glasses accented with ceramic enamel and 24-karat gold detailing.

When not browsing vendor booths, many attendees gathered at the bars to sample a special cocktail menu built around newly-released rum expressions from Tanduay Rum, with tiki favorites like the Chief Lapu Lapu, Pain Killer, and the ever-popular Dole Whip. Drinks were served at multiple locations, including the main indoor bar, the outdoor patio bar, and a beer tent operated by Market Garden Brewery. Thanks to Cuyahoga Falls' Designated Outdoor Refreshment Area (DORA), visitors could also carry drinks through approved sections of the district while they shopped and explored.

When it came time to eat, options matched the event's island-inspired theme, including Polynesian-style dishes

like Spam fried rice and crab Rangoon mozzarella sticks. For a quick bite, the Metropolis Popcorn food truck was set up in the side lot.

Music was scheduled all day, but the weather pushed performances into the afternoon. Once conditions improved, the stage came alive with three bands: Cleveland's Lords of the Highway, Michigan's Texas Surfboard Massacre, and Akron's own Jupiter 2, delivering a mix of exotica, surf, and rockabilly. Between sets, DJ

Max Payola, returning for his 16th Tiki Flea, kept energy going. The weather simply couldn't dampen spirits; one attendee exclaimed, "So fun dancing in the rain!"

For those looking ahead, the Tiki Flea takes place annually on the third Saturday in May. It's free to attend and family-friendly, though the patio and indoor bar are strictly 21+. For more information on upcoming events at TU, visit tikiunderground.com.

Cookie jars are a sweet treat for many collectors

Snickerdoodles . . .
Oatmeal Scotchies . . .
Black-and-Whites . . .
Toll House, Pecan Sandies,
Windmills, and Oreos.

The names alone call out the "Cookie Monster" in each of us. Cookies, those oh-so-tempting tiny treats, personify the phrase "something for every taste". There are nut cookies. Date cookies. Nut-and-date cookies. Cookies you bake. Cookies you don't bake. Cookies you mold, press, roll, drop, fold, or fill.

You enjoy them until the last, appetizing crumb has disappeared, and the cookie jar is empty.

Although cookie-like wafers have been around since baking began, the earliest incarnations bear little resemblance to our modern cookie conception. Not particularly sweet, these early baked hard crackers were prized for their ability to with-

stand the rigors of travel. "Hardtack", that indestructible staple of pirate-ship lore was a close relative.

When sugar tickled the taste buds of seventh-century Persia, a goodie more familiar to today's cookie-minded sensibilities made its debut. The sweet snacks journeyed to the Western world in

the 14th century, and "travel cakes" were soon being hawked on every

street corner.

The word “cookie” comes to us courtesy of the Dutch, from the term koekje, or “little cake”. The earliest Dutch versions were just that: little bits of cake batter, used to test oven temperature before a cake was baked. The resultant “little cakes” proved so scrumptious that they became sensations all on their own. Brought to America with Dutch settlers, the newly christened “cookies” quickly found favor. Homemakers enjoyed a dessert that could be prepared with minimal fuss. Hungry hordes liked their crisp texture, lighter than the heavy cakes previously in vogue. One and all found them irresistible, a popularity that

has only increased. Today, cookies can be found in over 95 percent

of American homes. We gobble down over two billion of them annually. In case you’re keeping count, that’s about 300 cookies per person each year.

No matter how quickly they disappeared, some type of convenient storage container for freshly baked cookies was still called for. The first cookie jars were known as “biscuit barrels”, the moniker a holdover from the British term for “cookies”.

The biscuit barrel, (a glass jar, often pink or green, with a screw-on metal lid), was primarily utilitarian; decoration was secondary. Metal variations were known as “biscuit tins”, and some thrifty housewives even made do with repurposed oatmeal boxes or coffee cans.

In 1929, the Brush Pottery Company of Zanesville, Ohio, changed all that. Brush introduced the first ceramic cookie jar. It was green, and emblazoned with just one word: the self-explanatory “Cookies”. Other manufacturers quickly followed suit, and the biscuit barrel became a thing of the past. From the 1930s onward, cookie

jars were expected to serve a dual purpose: to store cookies, and to do so attractively. Over the years, although glass, metal, plastic, and even wooden cookie jars had their adherents, the ceramic cookie jar held sway. Ceramic proved the most versatile medium for decoration and shape. More importantly, ceramic cookie jars were non-porous, keeping their contents free from the absorption of unwanted outside elements. Ceramic cookie jars soon became a whimsical, welcoming fixture in every home kitchen.

America’s appetite for decorative ceramic cookie jars lasted from the late 1940s well into the 1970s. Prominent among manufacturers satisfying that hunger were McCoy and American Bisque. Other notable cookie jar creators: Shawnee, Hull, Hall, Robinson-Ransbottom, Treasure Craft, Abingdon, Brush, Lane, Metlox, California Originals, Regal, and Red Wing. Cookie jars even appear in the inventories of such unlikely contenders as Roseville and Gilner.

The first ceramic cookie jars were simple cylinder or pot shapes, minimally adorned with floral or leaf decoration, applied via paint or decal. Then, in response to buyer demand for variety, imagination took over, in the form of “shaped” jars.

An entire storybook-full of nursery rhyme and fairy tale character jars ranged from “Red Riding Hood” and “Peter, Peter, Pumpkin Eater”, to “The Wizard of Oz” and the (particularly apt) “Little Gingerbread Boy”. There were cookie jars based on

silver screen and TV favorites, including "Pinocchio", "Donald Duck", and "Howdy Doody". Generic whimsy found expression in such themes as playful kittens, frolicking clowns, winking owls, and grinning alarm clocks. Advertising icons such as "Elsie the Borden Cow" also found their way onto jars. And, since a cookie jar's home was in the kitchen, there was an overabundance of food-based figurals. Among them: apples, strawberries, pumpkins, and watermelons, along with such unlikely cookie companions as tomatoes and green peppers.

Any verbiage was simple and to the point: "Have A Cookie"; "Try Mom's Cookies"; (as well as the less accommodating, "Did You Ask First?"). The California Cleminsons went a step further, with jars bearing such folksy mottos as

"The Way To A Man's Heart. . ." Some cookie jars did double-duty: American Bisque's "Blackboard Girl" toted a functioning chalkboard, on which household necessities could be noted (for instance, cookie ingredients!) Nearly any theme could conceivably be re-imagined as a cookie jar. . . and was.

Although other types of ceramic cookie jars (stoneware, yellow ware, and even porcelain) were produced, the best-seller by far was white clay earthenware. Jar decoration utilized three primary techniques, either singly or in combination: glaze, cold paint, and transfer decals.

Today, the appetite for cookie jar collecting only continues to grow. Due to their innate fragility, and because some jars only received limited production runs, prices on the rarest examples have skyrocketed. Even as far back as 1987, artist Andy Warhol's collection of 175 ceramic jars, almost

every one an inexpensive flea market find, brought \$250,000 at auction!

Fortunately, ceramic cookie jars were mass-produced, so many tasty examples can still be acquired at affordable prices. Best of all: a cookie jar that's been carefully passed down in your family from generations past. Its paint may be weathered, its lid chipped - but defects disappear in the blinding brilliance of the memories such a

well-loved treasure can conjure. Fill it with fresh-baked favorites, and you'll be singing along with "Cookie Monster":

"C" is for Cookie, that's good enough for me! - Joe Raposo, 1971

Gibson Emmylou Harris flat-top guitar plucked \$2,750 at auction

WEST FRANKFORT, Ill. — On May 16, Taylor Auction & Realty hosted a large auction representing the estate of Nathan Lewis. The nearly 500-lot sale, held entirely on HiBid.

The auction's top lot — fetching \$2,750 — was perhaps the most distinctive piece: a Gibson L-200 Emmylou Harris acoustic guitar with its original case. The L-200, a slightly scaled-down mini-jumbo version of the iconic Gibson SJ-200, is widely regarded as the “king of the flat-tops.”

Second place was the 1992 Buick Century with 93,785 miles rolling off at \$1,800. The very clean four-door coupe featured automatic locks, power windows, power mirrors, cruise control, power steering, ABS brakes, A/C, tilt steering, and AM/FM radio with cassette player. While in good running condition, and showing only age-related scratches on the exterior, there was evidence of an oil leak, and new tires needed.

A common sight in most 1960s/70s households was a console stereo. Bridging furniture and electronics, the large RCA stereo offered at this auction featured a wood cabinet, turntable, AM/FM radio, and built-in speakers, along with its original instruction book. It reached \$85.

More traditional electronics also crossed the block, including a Shure SM48 Share Vocal microphone that hit \$40, a vintage pink rotary landline telephone, picked up for \$25, and a pair of 80s-era “Walkman” type portable cassette player/radios with their headphones, managed \$17.50.

Furnishings were prevalent, spanning the late

19th through the late 20th centuries. Bidding hit \$75 on a post-war French Provincial-style four-drawer chest. It was followed closely at \$65 on another French piece - a Louis XV-style wingback chair of approximately the same era.

A collection of seven vintage pocket knives carved out a respectable \$45.

There were approximately two dozen Judaica items. The highest bid in the category, at \$25, went for a miniature replica of “Ark of the Covenant”, manufactured by Holy Land Market. Later, a vintage enameled brass Passover Seder plate and a footed serving bowl with lid, each found homes for \$12.50.

Glassware spanned multiple eras and makers. Bidding hit \$30 on a 1940s floral biscuit barrel. Meanwhile, a mid-century green glass pitcher, believed to be Blenko or Italian “Empoli,” was picked up for \$20.

Textiles included three vintage quilts - a wedding-ring pattern and a friendship star pattern were each wrapped up for \$70, while a flower block variety came close at \$65.

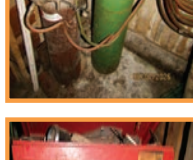
