### The natural world comes alive in majolica at Strawser event

WOLCOTTVILLE, Ind. — Colorful majolica continued to be a hot sell-

er for Michael Strawser. Two pieces by Minton took top honors at a recent auction with identical bids of \$6,500 each. First was a rare Minton

Mushroom game tureen. Circa 1880, Minton introduced majolica in 1851, elevating tableware into sculptural works of art. Despite the piece having a rim chip, hairline clip, and professional repairs, its price revealed that collectors were willing to pay for rarity, especially of a natural theme.

A 2-foot-tall Minton majolica conch shell floor jardinière with shell supported by coral and a rock base was the second top selling item. It had a professional hairline repair. Victorian designers drew inspiration from both the garden and the sea, and few majolica creations were more dramatic than a towering decorative plant container.

A 10-inch 1876 Centennial Memorial vase was hammered at \$6,000. It featured three

back-to-back eagles guarding a 37-star American flag. With a professional repair to one of the spouts, it was still a

natural tie-in with the forthcoming semiquincentennial celebration. A traditional French-made Sarreguemines majolica

roe deer head majolica wall pocket went for the same price.

### Stewart recognized need for realistic lures vs flash

As most of us know, fishing lures are artificial baits designed to attract fish by using movement, vibration, and color to mimic food. Lures are often categorized into types, such as hard baits, soft plastics, jigs, spoons, and spinners.

Fishing lure collectors often seek either a type of lure or a popular brand of lure, such as Shakespeare, especially the older lures in a popular brand. Other collectors enjoy collecting handmade lures, especially those lures created by a single individual. One man that many collectors enjoy collecting is Elman "Bud" Stewart.

Stewart (1913-1999) lived nearly his entire life in Michigan. As a young

boy, living in Flint, he fell in love with fishing and worked as a fishing guide. He began whittling fishing lures when he was just 8 years old, but his claim to fishing lure fame began when he was 14

years old, and he whittled a Crippled Mouse lure, which quickly proved to attract bass better than commercial lures. Soon he was selling Crippled Mouse lures to other fishermen just as fast as he

could whittle them.

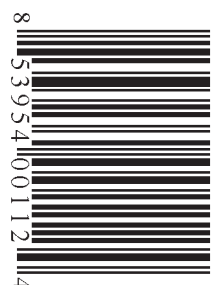
This was his very first successful lure, and being the granddaddy of all of his other lures, collectors

love having a Crippled Mouse in their collections.

Stewart once said that he began making his own

lures because he was disappointed in commercial lures that did not look

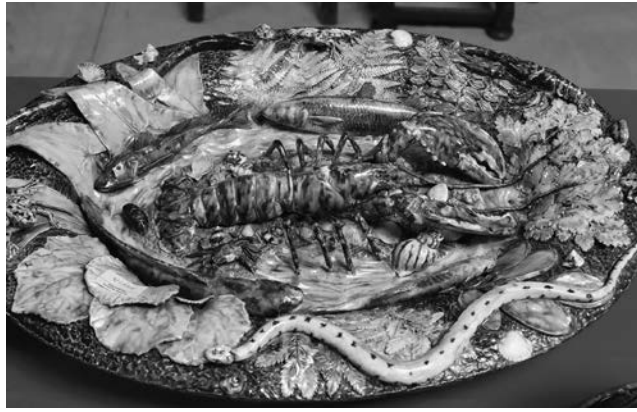

A 5-inch circa 1880s George Jones majolica pitcher with a Father Christmas face underneath its spout and a mottled holly berry container was priced at \$5,500. Jones' Stoke-on-Trent pottery was one of the premier suppliers of Victorian majolica. What set him apart was that his designers were given permission to let their imaginations run wild, especially with a Father Christmas-type figure.

A pair of matching 15-inch Staffordshire free leg copper over-glazed enamel spaniels sold for \$5,000. With rare free-standing front legs and almost all of their original copper gilding,

these dogs "stood head and tail" above dozens of other dog examples.

An 11-inch three branch Hugo Lonitz majolica candelabrum circa 1880 went for \$4,500. Lonitz was a German ceramics manufacturer

active in the late 19th century that specialized in highly naturalistic majolica. The leaf-patterned candle holders in this piece distract from a duck in grass below and a predatory fox behind him, all upon an earthy leafy ground.

A circa 1875 Thomas Sergent majolica Palissy revival lobster charger was hammered at \$3,000. Measuring 26-by-18 inches, the part platter, part natural-history exhibit represented the contents of a tidal pool transformed into ceramic art. Inspired by the creations of Renaissance potter Bernard Palissy, it celebrated nature in all its grotesque and beautiful abundance. Of note, the center was modeled as a large lobster with crab and shellfish detail surrounded by four swimming fish and a fern and leaf border with snake, eel, and frogs. A sure winner in any science fair.

Two nature-inspired majolica pieces sold for **Left:** An American arts and crafts-era Roseville umbrella stand was auctioned at \$2,200. Introduced in the 1930s, the tall cylindrical shape worked well with a sunflower motif.

\$2,500 apiece. Beyond viewing tidal pools, Victorians had a fascination with studying, cataloging, and decorating the natural world and both of these pieces attested to that interest. A high-relief George Jones covered bowl featured a game bird surrounded below by rabbits and a 24-inch Minton platter reflected a passion for gardens, ponds, and botanical subjects, pursuits as interesting to Brits today as they were 140 years ago.

Not far behind in price was a \$2,400 31-inch high Chinese-inspired Minton majolica pedestal vase. Produced during the 1880s Aesthetic Movement, it had a Qing Dynasty look with pierced panels and other bits of geometric latticework found in Chinese garden pavilions. Eastern decorative ideas and colors influenced much of the most sophisticated ceramics produced in late nineteenth-century Britain, especially majolica.

A circa 1880s George Jones swallow pitcher was a departure from other showier pieces in the sale, a more intimate and artistic statement at \$2,200. As with other top selling pieces, the swal-

low bore testimony to buyers' interest in examples with exceptional modeling beyond the famous majolica colors.

A Staffordshire "Jumbo" elephant was auctioned at \$2,100. Living a short by elephant standards 24-year life, Jumbo died in an 1885 train accident which probably dates this piece.

The top selling art pottery piece was a 20-inch American arts and crafts-era Roseville umbrella stand which auctioned at \$2,200. Collectors found plenty to admire in the circa 1917 sunflower vase, including its impos-

ing size, vibrant glaze, and one of the firm's most sought-after floral patterns. Particularly appealing was the survival of an original Roseville Pottery foil label on the base, the rarest of the four different Roseville identification marks.

Coming in second and third among art pottery were a Roseville 8-inch flared vase at \$1,900 and a 7-inch \$1,700 Newcomb College vase. The former featured an early 1920s open touring automobile, a detail that certainly caught bidders' eyes. The latter was produced as part of a unique commercial art program at the New Orleans'-based Newcomb College, then the women's college associated with Tulane University.

real and did not attract fish. He began a life-long career of inventing and selling realistic lures that truly looked at home in the water.

He once claimed to have “discarded more than 10,000 shapes in his quest to achieve effective lures.” The shapes he kept, though, all became bestselling lures that collectors still seek today. A few of his most popular lures are his Crippled Mouse, Crippled Frog, Crippled Wiggler, Bloody Chicken, and Pad Hopper. He honed his tendency to whittle “crippled” critters in order to take full advantage of the natural instinct of predatory game fish. Game fish strike at wounded animals in the water because they are easier to catch

and eat.

In 1933, Stewart founded the Bud Stewart Tackle Company. He was just 20 years old at the time. He immediately began a life of 12-14 hour workdays as he marketed his handcrafted lures at sports shows. A typical advertising pitch of his was, “Goofy things, torpedoes, spinners on front and back-there’s no such thing if you look in the lake. There’s 100 companies making doorknobs, funny shapes, and broom handles. They put a big eye on it, give it a special name, and you will find some fisherman will buy it. Fish are susceptible at times to strange critters, but we have to refine the bait so the fish cannot see anything artificial.” His sales pitch paid off since he claimed to have sold more than 100,000 lures of a single design.

Today, Stewart’s lures

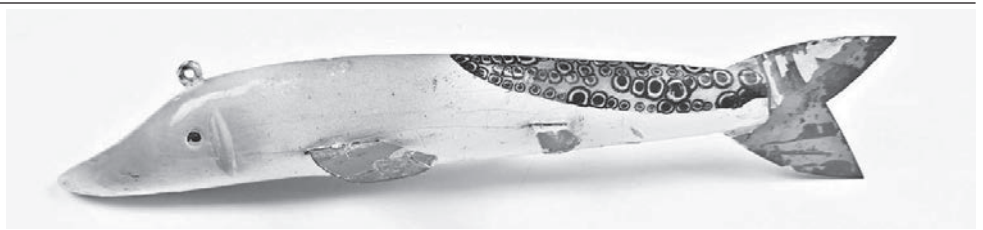
as just as collectible as when he first began whit-tling them. There are many fishing lure collections that are dedicated to Bud Stewart lures.

Stewart also made amphibian and reptile lures, such as snakes and frog lures. Often these were large-scale lures that were collected as decoys as much as lures. He is also collected for his amazing fish lures and decoys.

He also made both a Pad Hopper and a Cockeyed Pad Hopper lure. These are lifelike lures that replicate bait-fish that are natural food for predatory gamefish. A Cockeyed Pad Hopper has its face angled downward and small wings that come out of the side. Both of these lures have multiple variations, which, again, inspire collectors to search for and find them.

Dan Basore, in the book “Too Pretty to Fish With,” reminded readers that hand crafted fishing lures are often some of the best examples of folk art in America. The Smithsonian Institute named Bud Stewart “one of this country’s great folk artists” because his lures are beautiful and qualify as fine folk art, and the National Fishing Hall of Fame in Hayward, Wis., named Stewart a “Legendary Angler.”

To the untrained eye,



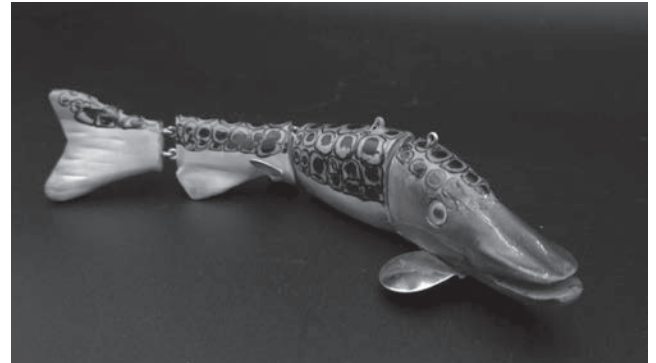
Above: This early, circa 1930s, Bud Stewart “Pike Spearing” decoy lure is over seven inches long and was offered on eBay for \$450.

some of Stewart’s lures may appear crude or uninspiring, but his crude look became his passion. Stewart wanted lures that looked nothing like the slick commercial lures, and he achieved his goal by becoming one of the best-loved fishing lure designers of the 20th century.

Today, at many auctions and Internet stores, Stewart’s lures still hook prey—collectors with dollars to spend and the name Bud Stewart on their minds and in their hearts.

# Collectors don't have to reach far to find stretch glass

BY BARBARA MILLER BEEM

Tastes change. In the early years of the 20th century, wares that came to be called “Carnival glass” were in high demand. Functional items such as plates, bowls, and vases were bright and fancy, while decorative items that reflected light were hung on interior walls by fashion-conscious homeowners as they embraced a new modern age.

Personal finances change. With the devastating effects of the Great Depression, discretionary funds dried up, and money allocated for home decor took a backseat to feeding the kids, paying the bills, and keeping a roof over the family's head. Any glassware

items purchased during that time had to be, by necessity, both utilitarian in nature and inexpensive.

But sandwiched between the heyday of Carnival glass and years of financial austerity was the emergence of an irrid-



ized glassware, handsome and refined in appearance, and yes, a luxury item. Called “the poor

man's Tiffany,” stretch glass captured the imaginations of those seeking to give their homes a touch of class. And now, approximately a century later, stretch glass remains popular among dedicated collectors who

are determined to keep the tradition alive.

Decorating trends come and go, and so it was with Carnival glass. Introduced in 1907, what had at first been in great demand suddenly looked gaudy and felt dated. Those involved in the making and marketing of glassware recognized that a change was imperative in order to stay in business. Customers were looking for something new and different. So in 1912, the Imperial Glass Company of Bellaire, Ohio, produced a lampshade using a new technique.

Four years after the introduction of Imperial's new line, the Fenton Art Glass Company of Martins Ferry, Ohio, as well

as the H. Northwood & Company of Wheeling, West Virginia, followed suit.

This newly refined process began with the transfer of glass from a pot into a hinged mold. A plunger was lowered into the mold, thereby pushing the glass into every nook and cranny of the mold. Next, the piece was briefly moved from the point of highest heat to a “glory hole.” Sprayed with metallic salts in order to achieve surface iridescence, it was then briefly reheated. At this point, pieces could be “worked,” resulting in finished products that were flared out, cupped in, or crimped, before being reheated.

Distinguishing it from both pressed and blown glass was the fact that this glassware was molded. It was not art glass. It had little or no pattern. With a cobweb-like appearance that might display a velvet or a shiny luster finish, these pieces looked as though they had been stretched, hence its name. Because every piece of stretch glass was made by hand, the process was labor-intensive, requiring multiple steps. Nevertheless, it was clear that this was the antidote for sluggish sales. The time for “stretch glass” was at hand.

Six additional companies are known to have produced stretch glass by

the 1920s, including three Pennsylvania-based companies (the Diamond Glass-Ware Company of Indiana; the Jeannette Glass Company of Jeannette; and the United States Glass Company, Factory K- King Glass of Pittsburgh); one from New Jersey (the Vineland Flint Glass Works of Vineland); and one from Ohio (the Lancaster Glass Company of Lancaster), as well as a West Virginia-based company (the Central Glass Works of Wheeling).

Of the nine, “Fenton, Imperial, Northwood, and US Glass are considered the ‘Big 4,’ in terms of the amount and variety of stretch glass produced,” noted Cal Hackeman. But while the others produced less stretch glass in quan-

tity, their output included beautiful stretch glass pieces, some in unique colors, according to Hackeman, president of the Stretch Glass Society and himself a longtime collector.

Among the pieces of stretch glass produced from 1916 to the mid-1930s, the wares of Fenton were the most expensive, Hackeman continued. Catering to well-to-do buyers, Fenton offered vanity sets, which included cologne bottles and jars for powder puffs, bath salts, and cotton balls, he explained. Decorative items included candleholders and matching bowls, “lots of vases,” and candy jars. In order to suit every taste and decor, customers were given a choice of “many, many dif-

ferent colors,” he said, “all the colors of the rainbow plus black, white, and gray.” The iridescent quality of these wares was thought to be calming.

Many of the pieces produced were intended to be used at small social gatherings. In-home card parties, for instance, called for sandwich plates, salad plates, and cups and saucers. Often, these pieces were sold in sets. Hackeman added that large salad bowls with underplates were popular, as were bowls with matching ladles for serving mayonnaise.

Due to high demand, factories were equipped to turn out hundreds of pieces of stretch glass in a four-hour period, running multiple furnaces at one time. But then came the Great Depression. And with no money for luxury items, production of stretch glass ground to a halt.

Interest in stretch glass, however, did not die. In April of 1974, the Stretch Glass Society was formed, with the stated mission “to promote and preserve stretch glass.” Thanks to an early member's request in 1975, Frank Fenton agreed to make souvenirs for club members. This led to a Fenton revival (the “late” period), with the production of new wares. Hackeman stressed that these pieces were not reproductions. Identifiable, they are not confused with the factory's output made earlier in the century. That said, the factory finally

vases, others enjoy collecting plates that they can regularly use. An initial outlay might be as little as \$20 to \$25. Members are looking forward to their upcoming convention, to be held in August in Denver, Pa.

As for the “holy grail” for stretch glass collectors, Hackeman suggested it might be a Fenton ruby triple dolphin rose bowl, a second example of which only recently surfaced. Similarly, two florentine green bowls are known to exist, one of which sold several years ago for \$10,000. In all, eight bowls of this design are known to have survived the years, all of which goes to show that even after all these years, there are still discoveries that thrill even the most seasoned collector. And when a piece of stretch glass with an identifying label, Hackeman concluded, “we're pretty excited.”

closed in 2011.

These days, the Stretch Glass Society remains active. A recent undertaking is the installation of a permanent exhibit at the National Glass Museum in Wellington, Kansas. Here, some 70 pieces of glass are on display, intended to educate the public and showcase the beauty and diversity of stretch glass. Examples from each of the nine companies that produced stretch glass are included, with selected pieces representing a variety of shapes, sizes, and colors. As Hackeman pointed out, the exhibition, in terms of inclusiveness, represents the “all-around best” of a genre of glass that collectors are dedicated to keep alive for future generations.

Collecting stretch glass can be an affordable pursuit for beginners. While some collectors focus on
