ACROSS THE AUCTION BLOCK

Garden seat settled at \$3,500 at FBICC auction

DETROIT, Mich. — The Flow Blue International Collectors' Club (FBICC) celebrated

their 40th anniversary at this summer's convention with numerous workshops, receptions, and the much-anticipated auction. Auctioneer

Steve Stanton presided over the dispersal of approximately 300 beautiful Flow Blue and Mulberry pieces. Prices here do not include the buyer's premium.

The temperature rose in the room when a garden seat was brought to the block. This green ground stool with an intricate cobalt Chinese decoration pattern (PID # 0471) circa 1845 was produced by Thomas Dimmock & Co. It stood 18 inches tall by 11 inches wide and was in great condition except for a tight hairline crack primarily on the inside. The pre-auction estimate for this antique was far exceeded with a final bid of \$3,500. The term "PID" stands for "Pattern & Shape Identification Database", a resource available for FBICC members.

A pitcher also reached an impressive final bid. This 9.5-inch-tall example was crafted by Ridgway & Morley circa 1844. The Cashmere pattern featured cobalt flowers on a white back-

ground with delicate gold trim on the leaf edges as well as the rim and spout of the pitcher. Enthusiastic bidding drove the final result to

Confederate stamps offer a glimpse into postal history

In the history of philately, the study and collection of postage stamps, one of the most bizarre postage events occurred at the beginning of the Civil War.

The Civil War officially began on April 12, 1861, when Confederate forces opened fire on the Union-held Fort Sumter.



Although war had begun, the Confederacy did not have a working postal department, so postage for all mail in the Confederate States of America (CSA) continued to be US Post Office postage for the first seven weeks of the war.

The government's official position was, "Mail that was postmarked after the date of a state's admission into the Confederacy through May 31, 1861, and bearing U.S. (Union) postage

is deemed to represent 'Confederate State Usage of U.S. Stamps'." However, many express postal companies continued to carry mail into the South past the May 31 deadline. The US Post Office officially ended such illegal mail traffic on August 26, 1861. Even after this August deadline, mail to be delivered between the two countries could be sent under a "Flag of Truce."

While the Confederate Post Office was established on Feb. 21, 1861; the first CSA postage stamps were not placed in circulation until Oct. 16, 1861. Many different Provisional stamps were issued by individual Southern cities to fill in the void until the South

produced its own postal stamps. Since the Confederacy only existed for four years, only a handful of CSA postage stamps were ever placed into circulation. However, with different

stamps, coloring, provisional stamps, covers, and printing companies there is an abundance of collectible CSA postal items that collectors still search for today. The Confederate Post Office

contracted with five different printing companies to produce postage stamps, including one in London, England, which produced the only

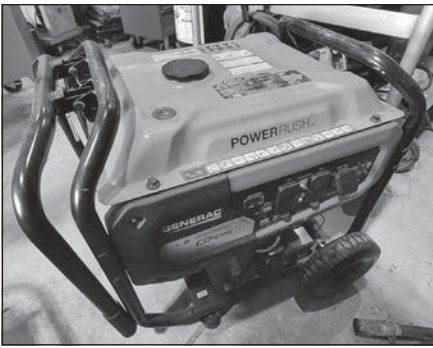
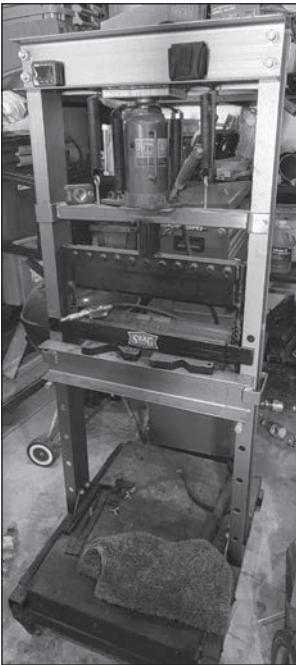

\$2,800.

An 8.5 inch tall tobacco-cigar holder was decorated with gilded cobalt bouquets all presented over a red ground background. This stately item supported a bell-shaped lid that was constructed with an elaborate finial. It was produced circa 1845 by an unknown maker. The only damage reported was three tiny flea bites on the lid. A final bid of \$1,400 claimed it. A similarly constructed tobacco jar with lid in the Chinese Temple pattern stood 10 inches tall at the peak. Produced by W. Smith circa 1845, the jar was in good condition, but the lid finial had multiple breaks and repairs. It still commanded a final bid of \$1,100.

A massive Flow Blue round bowl with a 16.5-inch diameter functioned as a sink, complete with a metal drain spigot and a ceramic overflow pipe on the side. Standing 8

inches tall, it was decorated with the Shell pattern and was produced by Edward Challinor circa 1860. In excellent condition, this unusual item was rehomed with a final bid of \$1,200.

A 10 inch reticulated fruit bowl and under tray presented a very complex open network cut directly into the earthenware itself. The workmanship on this piece was stunning. Featuring the Flow Blue Hong Kong pattern it had been produced by the prominent English potter Charles Meigh circa 1845. There was

some restoration and minor damage, but it still drew an impressive \$1,000 high bid.

It is hard to imagine giving a Flow Blue tea set to a child, but an exceptional antique 21-piece children's tea collection consisting of five dessert plates, five cups and saucers, a cream and a sugar bowl plus a beautiful teapot was presented. Done in the Sobraon pattern and created by S. Alcock circa 1850, the only reported imperfection was a professional restoration to the teapot lid finial. This charming set was captured with a final bid of \$900.

flowers and leaves trailing the length of the vase. It was embellished with two intricate, metallic-finished handles. The deep red base color and the yellow, red, and green flower hues distinguished it from the numerous cobalt blue offerings. It was taken with a final bid of \$600.

A few more unexpected pieces were also found in this auction. For the well-appointed bathroom one could have a 5.5-inch-tall soap and toothbrush holder done in the Anemone pattern. This Bishop & Stonier creation, circa 1892, had survived its years of service with only a minor chip and was taken with a final bid of \$200. For those desiring wall art, there was an attractively framed sales advertising

sample tile in the Kew pattern produced circa 1887. Measuring 12 inches by 10 inches, the wood frame set off the dark blue hues of the flowers handsomely. It was taken with a final bid of \$325.

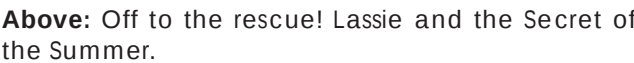

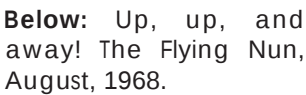

American postal stamp ever printed outside the United States. Three different printing methods were available —typography, lithography, and gravure. The CSA was unusual for a government in that it issued stamps using all three

printing methods, which gives collectors an interesting sub-category to collect. According to the Civil War Philatelic Society, the collecting of Confederate stamps still “appeals to the whole realm of Philately. Much of the history of the Confederacy is reflected in its stamps and covers. There are hundreds of varieties of stampless

(hand stamped paid) and manuscript covers as well as patriotic covers and provisional adhesive stamps and envelopes used before the Confederate government could issue regular stamps. “There are 14 major stamp catalog numbers of the general issue Confederate States stamps — also numerous varieties and shades.

The CSA Catalog and Handbook of Stamps and Postal History provides a detailed list and cross-reference of the catalog numbers for the general issues. There are prisoner-of-war and flag-of-truce covers, express company markings, blockade-run covers to and from Europe, college covers, official and semi-official envelopes, packet and steamboat

covers, patriotic covers with their war mottos, covers showing use of United States stamps in the Confederacy, and many interesting letters.” Along with stamps, collectors look for CSA related items such as Northern and Southern newspapers ads, soliciting sealed bids from printing companies for producing Confederate postage stamps. CSA Postmaster John Reagan ran such ads in April 1861, and the initial contract to print CSA stamps was awarded to lithographers Hoyer & Ludwig, a printing firm in Richmond, Va. The first CSA postage stamp printed by Hoyer & Ludwig was a 5¢ green depicting CSA President Jefferson Davis. These stamps were not perforated. In 1862, Hoyer & Ludwig issued a second 5¢ Jefferson Davis in blue.

An interesting sub-category of collecting Confederate stamps is collecting CSA provisional stamps, which were temporary substitutes, stamps, that were used for postal payment until official CSA stamps were printed and circulated. Today, these spontaneous stamps are known as “Postmaster Provisionals” and some are quite valuable so they make for good stamp hunting trips. In all, 39 known cities issued Postmaster Provisionals, which, again, makes for an interesting sub-category of CSA stamp collectibles.

McHale's Navy. Flipper and The Flying Nun had their own comics. So did the casts of Bonanza and Maverick. Even animated shows like Rocky & Bullwinkle and The Flintstones, already pretty comic-book-like on the small screen, made the leap to print.

Of course, you didn't always have to be tops in the Nielsen Ratings to rate a comic book. Cases in point: It's About Time, Garrison's Gorillas, and The Troubleshooters. None made the list of must-see TV, but their limited runs live on, thanks to the comics released to promote them.

This was a reversal of the trend of characters originating in comic books being brought to three-dimensional life on television. "Dennis the Menace," for instance, began as a comic strip in 1951, expanding to comic books in 1953. In 1959,

Dennis arrived on TV. While Jay North, television's Dennis the Menace didn't, look much like the

squat little fellow created by cartoonist Hank Ketcham, who cared? Now his legions of follow-

ers could see a live-action Dennis annoying Mr. Wilson, terrorizing Margaret, and exasperating his parents.

Series producers embraced comic book renditions as a means of keeping top shows at the top, building audiences for new shows, and (hopefully), coming to the rescue of shows with flagging appeal. Comics

could also hawk show-related products. One unlikely pair-up: the back cover of the December, 1961 Tales of Wells Fargo features an ad for the "Official Huckleberry Hound Club." Membership perks included your lifetime membership card, a "personal letter from Huck," and pictures of Huck and Yogi Bear to "decorate your room or

clubhouse!" All that for just 15 cents and one box top from Kellogg's Corn Flakes.

Comic books could also feature special effects well beyond the budgets of a TV series. Sure The Man From Atlantis was already pretty action-packed, but just imagine Mark Harris (that would

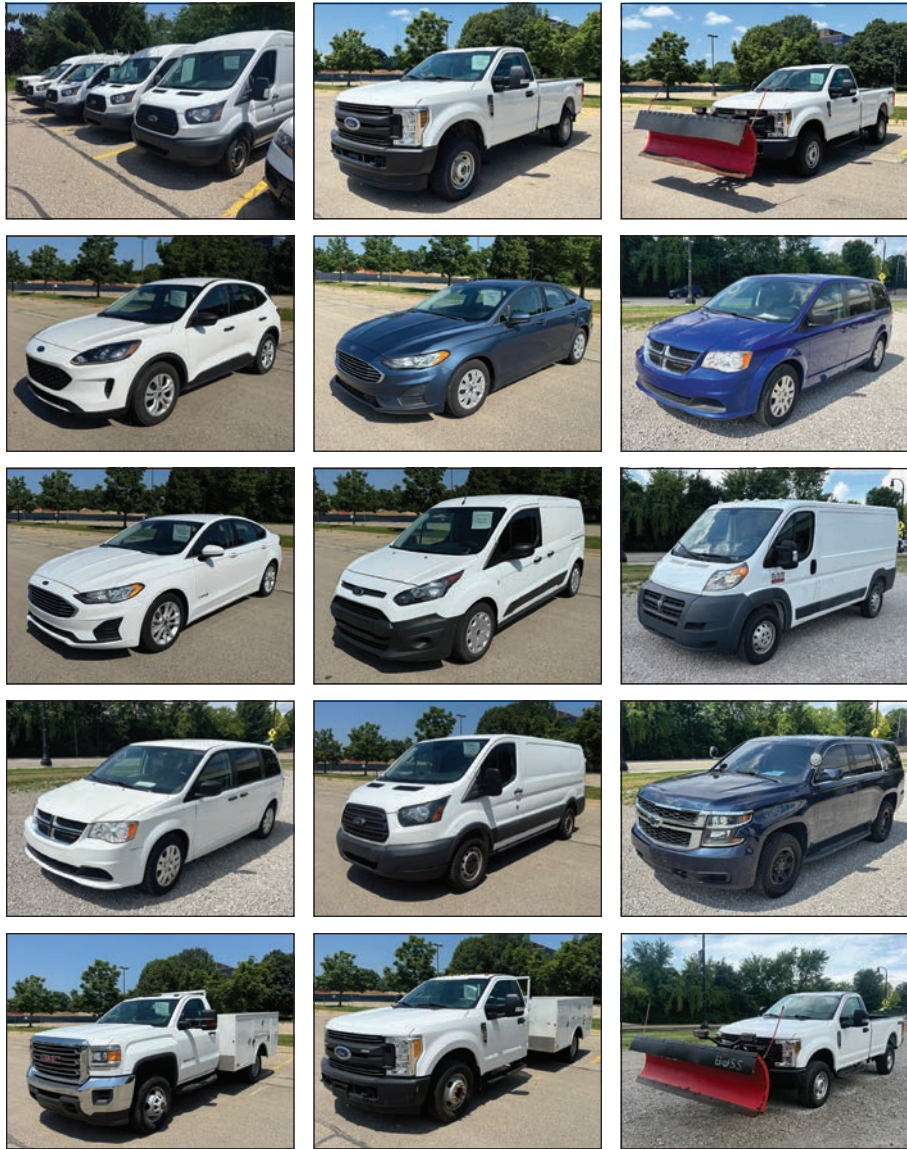

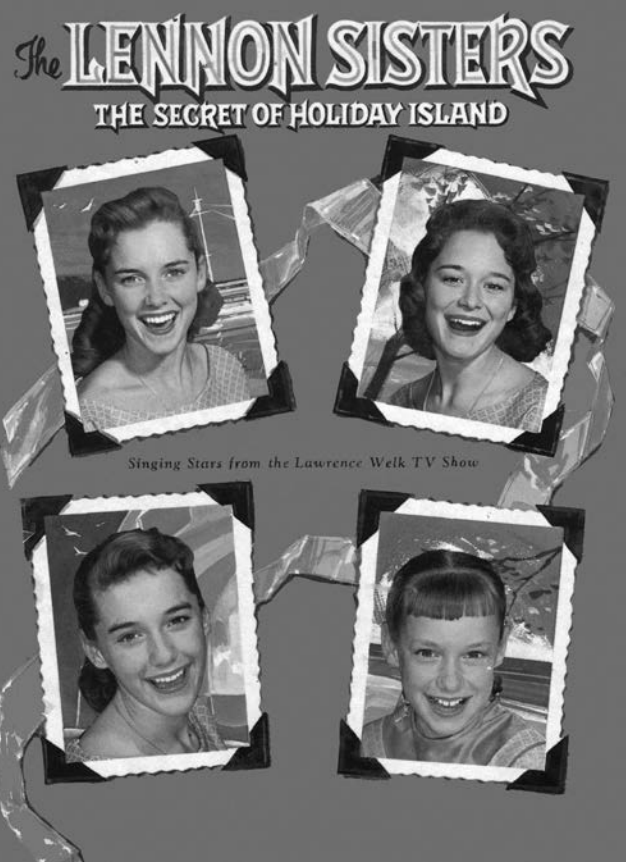
be the Man), almost getting chomped by an enormous whale! Or The Flying Nun using her winged coronet to attract a lightning bolt and explode a boatful of burglars! Comic book adventures like these may not have turned up on your TV set each week, but they sure kept you tuning in. . .just in case.

Prominent licensees for comic books based on TV series were Dell and Gold Key. Original prices crept from 10 cents all the way up to those \$1 “Giant Spectaculars.” Nowadays, most vintage TV comics average well under \$20. (But if you’re a really optimistic collector, be on the lookout for Star Trek #1, published in 1967 by Gold Key. One of those sold for over \$40,000!)

Once past the comic books stage, you could still enjoy your TV faves in print

thanks to Whitman Publishing of Racine, Wisconsin. During the 1950s and ‘60s, Whitman’s “Authorized TV Editions” filled the book-

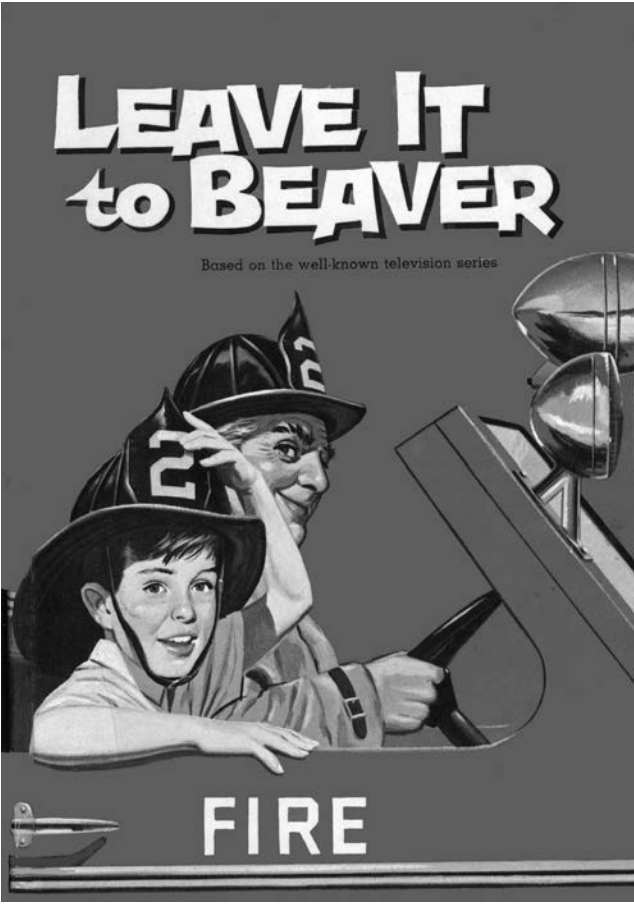

shelves (and filled in the imagination gaps) of many young fans.

Couldn’t wait a week for the next episode of Lassie? Well, you could probably wheedle Mom or Dad into springing for Whitman’s Lassie and the Secret of the Sum-

mer. (Spoiler alert: Lassie’s secret has her finding a valuable stash of old recordings). Pining for more of The Mickey Mouse Club? Curl up with Annette, as she puts on her Nancy Drew detecting hat for Annette and the Mystery at Smuggler’s Cove. And oh, those Lennon Sisters! With a hand-drawn map, they discover The Secret of Holiday Island, and reunite a shipwrecked boy with his long-lost father.

If the storylines sound familiar, it’s because they’re relatively interchangeable with the type of stories found in other popular Whitman book series (Donna Parker; Trixie Belden; The Bobbsey Twins). The difference is that the TV editions featured TV stars. And the more popular the star, the better the chances of a continuing series (Annette made her mystery-solving way to such locales as Moonstone Bay and Medicine

Wheel.) At just under two dollars, your folks could justify the cost. After all, these were books. You weren’t sitting there just staring at the TV. You were reading, even if you were reading about TV. And for once you weren’t reading comic books!

Celebrities sell—a fact that Whitman discovered early on. Beginning in 1932, its “Big Little Books” put comic strip favorites (Dick Tracy; Popeye), between the pages of tiny books just 4 inches high. Simple stories and black-and-white illustrations made these must-haves for the younger set.

Later in the ‘30s, Whitman branched out into standard-sized hardcovers with pop culture tie-ins. Many still celebrated funny paper favorites (Smilin Jack and the Daredevil Girl Pilot; Blondie and Dagwood’s Secret Service). Others brought real-life movie stars into the mix

(Betty Grable and the House with the Iron Shutters; Ginger Rogers and the Riddle of the Scarlet Cloak). Each Whitman book promised “the newest, up-to-the-minute mystery and adventure stories for girls and boys, featuring your favorite characters!”

When TV surged into prominence in the 1950s, Whitman was ready. Exciting, breezy, 200-page tales were headlined by faces who were tops on the tube, including Fury, The Real McCoys, and Gene Autry. (Autry had been the subject of past Whitman books, but 1951’s Gene Autry and the Badmen of Broken Bow was the company’s first official TV tie-in. Gene’s TV show premiered in mid-1950.)

Dr. Kildare. . .Leave It To Beaver. . .Annie Oakley. . .Maverick. As with comic books, you knew your TV show was a rip-roaring (or at least middling) success, when it was featured on the glossy cover of a Whitman hardback. Just about 100 “official” Whitman TV tie-ins were published; the series ended in 1975, with a half-dozen volumes starring The Waltons. Today, collectors can find Whitman books at bargain prices. Almost all are under \$10, with the exception of such rarities as (guess what?) 1968’s Mission to Horatius, the first original story based on Star Trek. Like its comic book cousins, that one could set you back considerably more.

Patience is required to find TV-based comics and Whitman books in collectible condition. The comics are often in a much-read (i.e., dilapidated) state. The laminated Whitman covers and spines have a tendency to peel. In both comics and hardcovers, the illustrations often brought out the crayon-obsessed among young readers. But for those of a certain age, wanting to relive a certain age, TV-based comics and books were, as Whitman ads promised, “delightful. . .intriguing. . .never to be forgotten.”
